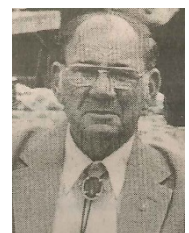

Longtime Lebanon businessman dies at 82

Longtime Lebanon used car dealer Charles Ingram Farris died Tuesday, Aug. 5, at Columbia Spring View Hospital. He was 82 years old.

Farris began selling new and used cars in 1935 as an employee of the Taylor Motor Company, located on West Main Street.

"He was a great car man," said A.A. "Sonny" Pickerill. "He worked for my uncle (Taylor) and my daddy (V.M. Pickerill) when they built the building in 1938."

Although he was officially retired from the used car business because of declining health, Farris “still dabbled in it,” said Lynn D. Farris, the youngest of his three sons.

On the Friday before he suffered a fatal stroke on Sunday, Farris sold a car to a Taylor County resident who had seen the vehicle parked in Farris’s yard.

“He was active up to the end,” said Lynn Farris. “He loved his work. He was very fortunate. So few people get to do something they love; they just have a job.”

A native of the Feather Creek area of Taylor County, Farris moved to Marion County at a very young age. He owned the family home place in Taylor County until recent months.

With the outbreak of World War II, Farris left the auto business briefly to work at Jeffboat in southern Indiana. At war’s end he returned to Lebanon, where he went into the used car business with his brother, the late Jim Farris.

After Jim Farris went into the service station business, Ingram Farris carried on the used car business at several locations in Lebanon’s downtown area.

The last business site was a lot on West Main Street adjacent to Higdon’s Foodtown, where he operated for more than 30 years. His son Larry was associated with him in the business there much of that time.

“He liked to talk and tell old stories,” said Sonny Pickerill.

“He was always looking for a deal,” said Lynn Farris. “He was always on the go; he loved it. He’d rather talk and sell than anything.”

Farris was active in several Masonic organizations, including the Kosair Shrine. He was one of the organizers of the Kosair dinner that raised funds for the Kosair Children’s Hospital in the Marion County area. The annual event was held here for many years before it was discontinued in recent years.

CRASH HURTS PROVE FATAL – Mrs. Charlie Ferrell Injured In Accident Last Week Passes Away – WRECK’S SECOND VICTIM

Mrs. Ruth Ferrell, wife of Charlie Ferrell, who was badly hurt last Wednesday night when the car in which she was riding left the road at the junction of the St. Mary’s and Loretto pikes, about a mile from town, and turned over against some trees, died of her injuries at Elizabeth’s Hospital Saturday afternoon at 4:30 o’clock. Miss Mabel Gibson, 18 years old, a niece of Mrs. Ferrell, who was also in the machine, was killed instantly in the accident. Three other occupants of the car, Mr. Ferrell, who was driving and Mr. and Mrs. C.W. Jarvis of Harrodsburg, who were guests of Mr. and Mrs. Ferrell, escaped serious injury. They received numerous bruises, however, in the crash.

Mrs. Ferrell was taken to Elizabeth’s Hospital immediately after the accident, but the seriousness of her injuries could not be determined at once. She suffered no broken bones, her physician said, but was hurt about the body and limbs. Pneumonia later developed causing her death. Miss Gibson, who was killed instantly, was a daughter of Mrs. Cyril Bickett of Raywick, a sister of Mr. Ferrell. She suffered a fracture of the skull. Her father, Hope Gibson, died a few years ago. The fatal accident occurred on a sharp curve.

Mrs. Ferrell, who was 26 years old, was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Tom Thompson of Raywick. She was born and reared there, and was widely known and had many friends in that section, as well as elsewhere in the county. For some time past Mr. and Mrs. Ferrell have been living on a farm on the Bradfordsville pike a few miles town which Mr. Ferrell purchased. Surviving her are her husband and two sons, Charles and James Ferrell; her parents; two brothers, Beaven and McHenry Thompson of this county, and four sisters, Mrs. J.D. Wells of Akron, Ohio, Mrs. W.E. O’Sullivan of Lake Wales, Fla., and Mrs. Earl Wimsatt of Loretto and Mrs. Della Costello of Raywick.
