Child Crushed to Death by a Falling Tree

A terrible accident occurred on the farm of John E. Isaacs on last Wednesday, situated on the North Rolling Fork near this place, which resulted fatally to at least one person – David Isaacs, a lad of about 9 years of age.

It seems from what we can learn that Mr. John M. Moore had gone into the woods, accompanied by two of Mr. Isaacs' boys, to cut a load of stove wood. While engaged in cutting down a sycamore tree the boys

remained playing around him until ordered away when they left. Mr. Moore, not dreaming of the proximity of the boys, proceeded to fell the tree, but it had hardly struck the ground when Mr. Moore heard a shriek, and hastening to the spot whence the sound proceeded, which was an embankment over which the tree had fallen, he found the little child Davie gasping in the last agonies of death. He immediately summoned assistance, and conveyed the unfortunate child home to his grief-stricken parents. Mr. Isaacs has been confined to his bed for some time, but when the child was brought in he would not be comforted, and it is feared that the blow will be too much for him.

Mr. Moore is a resident of Boyle County, and a son-in-law of Mr. Isaacs. He had come there only the day before, intending to spend a day or two with his wife, who was there sick also when the unfortunate accident occurred.
