### Well known pharmacist dies at age 86

Theo Walker, 86-year-old pharmacist who owned and operated the Corner Drug Store in Lebanon from 1941 to 1968, died suddenly at 10 a.m., Wednesday, Aug. 2, 1995, at his residence on East Main Street.

Walker's career began when he took a job at the Springfield Corner Drug Store as a high school student in February, 1925. His employer, John Hagan, was the father of Terry Hagan, for whom Walker later worked in Lebanon.

A native of the Pleasant Grove area of Washington County, Walker was born Feb. 18, 1909, the youngest of the nine children of Albert Browning Walker and Margaret Taylor Walker, all of whom preceded him in death. One of his sisters, Mary W. Overall, was a long-time Lebanon resident and public school teacher here.

Walker was proud to note that he was the fifth generation of his family to be born in the same neighborhood. The family home where he was born was later purchased by the state and torn down to make way for the pro shop at the Lincoln Homestead Golf Course.

He is survived by two daughters: Ann Taylor (Mrs. Darnell) Waters, of Springfield; and Matilda Walker of Louisville. He is also survived by three granddaughters, Susan Waters Mattingly of Lebanon, Beth Waters Alexander of Lexington, and Beckie Waters Burston, of North Port, Ala., and four great-grandchildren.

Walker was preceded in death by his wives: Sara Thompson Walker, to whom he was wed Sept. 2, 1929; and Shell Gibson Carrico Walker, whom he married in April, 1988.

After graduation from Springfield High School, Walker completed his training at the Georgia School of Pharmacy. Returning to Springfield, he started the Springfield Drug Company along with two other young partners, J.B. Williams and Billy Mudd. He filled his first prescription there on Feb. 4, 1929.

February was a significant month in Walker's life, his daughter Ann Taylor Waters pointed out. He began his first job as a high school student in Feb., 1925; he sold the Corner Drug Store in Lebanon on Feb. 1, 1968; his wife Sara died on Feb. 18, 1977; and his first great-grandchild was born in February.

After selling the Corner Drug Store to Gerald O'Daniel in 1968, Walker stayed on to operate the store for O'Daniel for a time. Then he worked as a pharmacist at the Hagan-O'Daniel Pharmacy. He decided to let his license lapse when he turned 80, after 60 years as a registered pharmacist.

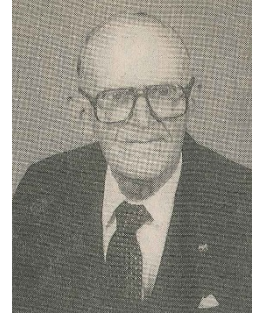
His first business venture in Springfield ended after two years when he moved to Springfield, Tenn., where he stayed a year. Walker had only recently made a trip to visit his granddaughter in Alabama, according to his daughter, Ann Taylor Waters. On the way home, he stopped off to visit the downtown area in Springfield, Tenn. where he had worked more than 60 years ago.

In 1932 he returned to his home town, where he and J.R. Montgomery began the Walker-Montgomery real estate and insurance agency, from which he withdrew after a year.

The next year he made the first of his three moves to Lebanon, where he settled permanently in 1941.

Despite his move to Lebanon, Walker was proud of his Washington County heritage, including his links to the family of Abraham Lincoln. Among his ancestors was Rachel Shipley, aunt of Nancy Hanks, mother of the president.

A devoted Presbyterian, he joined the church immediately after each of his moves, his daughter said. He served as deacon in the Lebanon Presbyterian Church and a ruling elder in the church. For eight years he served as superintendent of the church school.

He was a member of the Transylvania Presbytery, the ruling body of the church in the eastern part of Kentucky. The presbytery chose him as one of its delegates to the Detroit General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

At Walker's funeral service, the Rev. Gavin Meek, pastor of the Lebanon Presbyterian Church, said, "He was always in Sunday School and church unless he was visiting family, and even then, he was in church. In a day when many church-goers are hot then cold, committed then uncommitted, dedicated then apathetic, Theo was a disciplined disciple. Even at the wise age of 86, he was regular in his worship attendance."

His daughter reflected on Walker's priorities: "He loved his work and his family, and his church."

Meek said that Walker's life exemplified the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount. "He is among those whom Jesus called the light of the world, for he never hid his faith but let it shine."

During the turbulence of the 60s, said Meek, Walker was the first Lebanon business person to integrate the counter at his drug store. He may have lost some business, Meek suggested, but "he said he never thought he was much of a businessman."

Others did not share his self-deprecating opinion. Walker, who was a charter member of the Lebanon Chamber of Commerce, was honored by the community as the first recipient of the Outstanding Businessman award. When the Chamber of Commerce established the Outstanding Citizen award in 1965, he was the first to receive that honor.

In 1944 Walker joined other local community leaders in founding the Lebanon Kiwanis Club. In addition to serving as local Kiwanis president, he also held the post of Kiwanis lieutenant-governor in 1950. In 1988, the local club presented him a special tribute marking 44 years of perfect attendance. At the time of his death, Walker was still regularly attending club meetings.

He was also a founding member of the Lebanon Country Club, where he held the distinction of shooting two holes-in-one.

Following his retirement, Walker continued his active participation in the community. The day before his death, his daughter said, "he must have seen half of Lebanon." On the day of his death, Walker had planned to take a young friend on a tour of Washington County.

Funeral services were held at 10 a.m., Friday, Aug. 4 at the Lebanon United Presbyterian Church. The services were conducted by Rev. Gavin Meek, church pastor, assisted by Rev. J.M. Helm, a close friend of Walker. Interment was in the Pleasant Grove Presbyterian Church cemetery, Springfield.

enduring smile.



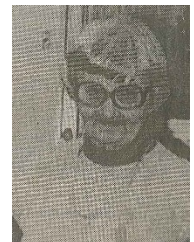

### **DEATH CLAIMS REV. J.P. WELSH – Calvary Priest Dies Suddenly Of Heart Attack Suffered Tuesday Morning – BODY TO GO TO MAINE**

Death came suddenly to the Rev. Father J.P. Welsh, pastor of Holy Mary's Catholic Church at Calvary, Tuesday morning about 6:15 o'clock at the parochial residence as the result of a heart attack suffered a short time before. He had returned to Calvary Monday afternoon after spending several days with the Rev. J.A. Hogarty and the Rev. Joseph W. Saffer at the parochial residence here. While he had not been feeling quite well for a week or more, he had gone about his duties as usual. His passing came as a shock not only to the community in which he served, but to the entire county.

Rev. Welsh was a native of Maine and was about 65 years old. A brother and a sister now living in Maine survive. They are his only surviving relatives.

He attended college in Montreal, Canada. He had been a member of the priesthood for thirty-six years, having been ordained in 1900. When he came to Kentucky soon after his ordination, he was assistant for a time to Father Bachs at St. Brigid's Church in Louisville. He then served for more than twenty years as pastor of the Catholic Church at Hopkinsville, and from there came to Calvary as pastor to succeed the Rev. B.J. Wight, now of Louisville. Father Welsh served at Calvary about four years and was granted a leave of absence because of ill health. During his leave he spent about seventeen months in a hospital in Portland, Maine, where he was under treatment for sinus trouble, high blood pressure, and other complications. His condition became so much improved that he was able to resume his charge of Holy Mary's Church about a year and a half ago. His return was welcomed, for he was greatly beloved by his parishioners. His wisdom and ability, his charity and kindness, his deep understanding of human kind, its capabilities and its frailties, gave him a particular place in the hearts of his people, who knew that they could count upon his interest and advice in matters great and small. He will be sadly missed.

The body on Wednesday afternoon was taken from the priest's home to the church, where it since has lain in state. The Most Rev. John A. Floersch, Bishop of Louisville, will conduct the funeral services there this morning at 10 o'clock, with Pontifical Requiem Mass. The remains will be shipped to Father Welsh's old home, Portland, Maine, for burial.

For the present, Rev. Robert Canty, assistant pastor at Holy Name Church, Louisville, is in charge of the Calvary parish, having come on Tuesday afternoon on temporary assignment. Father Canty is well known in Lebanon, where he served for a time as assistant at St. Augustine's Church.

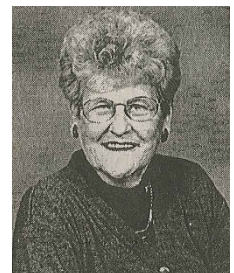

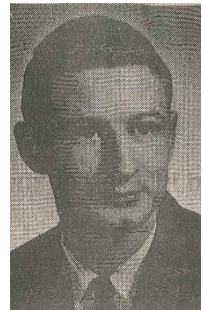

Personnel from Marion County Emergency Medical Services and the Marion County Rescue Squad responded to the emergency call at 7:59 a.m.

The Jeep with a New York license plate belonged to Williams' girlfriend, Anastacia "Stacey" Cummings.

Williams was the son of Richard Williams of Ames, N.Y., and Linda Moore of Palatine Bridge, N.Y.
