Man Ends Life Near Raywick – James Lamkin, 24, Hangs Self in Barn on Father's Farm Wednesday – Ill Health is Blamed

James Lamkin, 24, took his own life Wednesday afternoon by hanging himself in a barn on the farm of his father, T.C. Lamkin, about a mile from Raywick. He had not been well for several days but if he had ever contemplated self destruction, he had not made it known to members of his family.

The elder Mr. Lamkin came upon the lifeless body when he entered the barn about 5:00 o'clock. The young man had attached a rope to a rafter and had stepped from the bed of a wagon in the driveway after placing the noose around his neck. He had been dead several hours when the discovery was made.

Both father and son had been in Lebanon Wednesday morning and returned home around noon. Shortly after lunch, the older man left the residence to go into a nearby forest to chop wood, leaving Lamkin asleep on a couch at the house. Later the son left, presumably to aid in the wood chopping. His actions gave no indications of his intentions, and neither of his parents were aware that he was missing during the afternoon.

Mr. Lamkin was a son of T.C. and Lillie Crowdus Lamkin, and was born and reared in the Raywick community. Completing the Raywick graded school, he declined to further his education, preferring to assist his father in the management of his farm. He had since been engaged in agriculture.

Surviving are his parents, two brothers, Leo and Newman Lamkin of Raywick, five sisters, Mrs. Gregory Cecil of Howardstown, Mrs. Beckham Abell of Raywick and Misses Estelle, Celestine and Leona Lamkin, all of whom live at home, and one half-sister, Sister Mary Andrew of the Ursuline Order, located at Wilhelmena, Mo.

Possibility of Foul Play in Death of Laff Lane

The body of Laff Lane age about 83, formerly of Gravel Switch, and well-known in this county, was found in the Little Miami River near Cincinnati, Ohio, Monday, according to information received Tuesday by the Falcon. In talking with relatives, a Falcon reporter learned that there is reason to believe that foul play could have been involved in the disappearance and death of Mr. Lane.

Mr. Lane lived with his daughter and son-in-law in Lawrenceburg, Indiana, and the last time they saw him was when they left their home for Sunday School and Church the Sunday before Thanksgiving. He was wearing a sweater and house slippers when they left the house that Sunday, and, although he was getting rather feeble at his age, he had mentioned nothing of leaving.

Mr. Lane was clothed in the same sweater and house slippers when his body was found in the swampland where it had been carried by the current of the river. A billfold, which he had always carried with him was missing.

Shortly after his disappearance, bloodhounds were used in an effort to locate Mr. Lane but the only trail they could follow was one that led from the home to the highway. It is presumed someone picked him up in a car and took him to the vicinity of where his body was found. What happened after that is still a mystery.

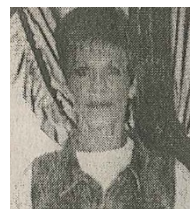

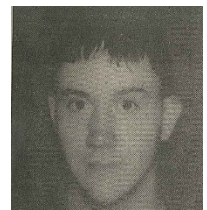

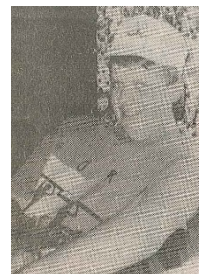

Death Claims John W. Lewis; Body Brought Here For Burial

John Hill Lewis, aged 73 years, the well known Springfield attorney, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Fred Manget, at Fort Worth, Texas, Saturday, of Bright's disease. The remains were brought here Tuesday morning and the funeral services were held at the Second Presbyterian church, conducted by Rev. R.E.C. Lawson, of Springfield, assisted by Rev. V.P. Merrell, of this city. The interment was in Ryder Cemetery by the side of his wife who preceded him to the grave several months ago. He is survived by his daughter, Mrs. Manget of Fort Worth, Texas.

The following telegram from Springfield concerning Mr. Lewis' death appeared in Sunday's Courier-Journal:

"Word was received here today that the Hon. John W. Lewis died this morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Fred Manget, in Fort Worth, Texas, where he had made his home since the death of his wife about five months ago. Mr. Lewis was a native of Green County. Several years after graduating at Center College he came to Springfield in 1869 and formed a partnership with the late Judge Richard J. Brown to practice law. His rise in the profession was rapid, and within a few years Mr. Lewis was recognized as one of the leaders of the bar of Central Kentucky. He was especially strong as an advocate, and was retained in some of the most important cases litigated in this part of the State. He was equally well or better known in political circles, although by no means a politician in the commonly accepted sense of the word, and for the last forty years no Kentucky Republican was better known than he.

"In 1876 he made an unsuccessful race for Congress. From 1878 to 1891 he was a member of the Republican State Central Committee and chairman in 1887. In 1880 he was chairman of the Republican State Convention, and the same year was a delegate to the Republican National Convention, and was one of the famous 306 who voted for Gen. Grant from first to last, while in both 1884 and 1888 he was a delegate-at-large to the National Convention of his party. In 1894 Mr. Lewis defeated A. B. Montgomery for Congress, he being the only Republican who represented the Fourth district. While he was in Congress only one term, he took high rank and was a member of the Judiciary Committee. Four years ago Mr. Lewis was defeated by Judge I.H. Thurman for Circuit Judge of this district. In 1877 he was married to Miss Elizabeth Phillips of Lebanon, and to this union one child was born, Mrs. Fred Manget.

No man during the past half century has wielded a greater power or had a larger or more devoted following in this district than Mr. Lewis and the news of his death was received with distinct sorrow.

ONE KILLED, ANOTHER SERIOUSLY HURT WHEN TRAIN HITS AUTO NEAR CALVARY – CRASH VICTIMS BROUGHT HERE – Miss Leona Lockett Loses Life When Car Driven By Her Father Is Hit – WERE ON WAY TO CHURCH

One person was killed, another dangerously injured and two others were painfully hurt when an automobile in which they were riding was struck by a passenger train on the Greensburg Branch of the L. and N. about a mile south of Calvary Sunday morning shortly after 7 o'clock.

Miss Leona Lockett, sixteen years old, was instantly killed. Her neck was broken and her shoulder crushed.

Miss. Hulda Lockett, ten years old, a sister, suffered a concussion of the brain, broken leg, broken arm and was otherwise injured. She is at a local hospital. For a while following the accident it was thought her injuries were fatal, but it is now believed she will recover.

Mr. and Mrs. Henry Lockett, parents of the two girls, were painfully but not seriously hurt. They received numerous bruises about the body and suffered greatly from shock.

Mr. and Mrs. Lockett and the two girls were on their way to church at Calvary and were riding in an automobile with the curtains drawn to protect them from the cold. Mr. Lockett was driving. His wife was sitting on the seat with him while the two girls were on the rear seat. Mr. Lockett failed to see the train, which on Sundays runs about an hour later than through the week, and drove onto the track in front of the locomotive. The rear of the automobile was struck and crushed. The occupants were hurled several feet, some of them landing in a corn field on the roadside. The train was stopped as quickly as possible and Mr. Lockett and the two girls were brought to Lebanon. The body of Miss Leona Lockett was taken to an undertaking establishment, while the injured girl was removed to Elizabeth's Hospital. Mr. Lockett returned home a few hours after he was brought here. Mrs. Lockett was taken to her home from the scene of the accident. Her clothing was badly torn, but her injuries were perhaps the least serious of the party.

The accident occurred at the first grade crossing south of the railroad bridge over the Rolling Fork at Calvary. The pike parallels the track for some distance south of the crossing. It is said that the fireman on the engine stated he saw the machine, which was travelling in the same direction as the train, but supposed the driver of the car would stop at the crossing. The train was in charge of Conductor W.O. Chambers and Engineer W.S. Atwood, both of whom are among the most careful trainmen in the service of the railroad company.

Miss Leona Lockett, who lost her life in the deplorable accident, was a senior in the High School at Calvary and a favorite with all who knew her. She was a member of the Calvary Catholic church and funeral services for her, conducted by the Rev. J.P. Welsh, the pastor, were held there Tuesday morning. Burial was in the church cemetery.

Other than her parents she is survived by two sisters, Cordie and Hulda Lockett, and three brothers, Garland, Clifton and Cyril Lockett. Mr. Lockett is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Ben T. Lockett.
