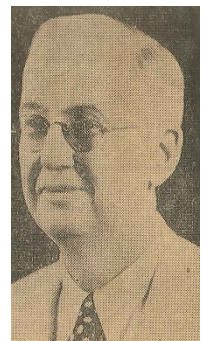

Chapman Young Succumbs at 81 - Former Insurance Officer Dies Sunday in Louisville

George Chapman Young, 81, of Louisville, retired insurance executive, who until his last illness was a frequent visitor here, died Sunday morning at a Louisville nursing home. He had been ill several months of complications.

A son of Thomas Johnston and Marion McElroy Young, one-time well known Lebanon residents now long deceased, Mr. Young was born at Carlisle. His father, an attorney here some years before, studied law in the office of the late J. Proctor Knott, who later was Governor of Kentucky. Capman Young spent much of his early life at Owingsville before going to Louisville.

Studied in Virginia

He was graduated from Louisville Male High School in 1890 and, later, was graduated from the University of Virginia. Afterward, for a number of years he was associated with the law firm of Stone & Sudduth in Louisville, but in 1902 he joined the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company and not long after moved to Los Angeles, Calif., to become general agent for the firm.

After holding this post for about 30 years, he retired in 1932 and returned to Louisville. The owner of a farm on the May's Chapel Road a few miles from Lebanon, he spent much of his time here until disposing of the property in 1939. However, he continued to visit relatives in this city until his health failed.

School Board Member

He had been a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Louisville since 1884 and was a member of the Board of Trustees of the Presbyterian Home for Children at Anchorage. He was also a member of the Male High Alumni Association and was a former member of the Louisville Board of Education.

Surviving are one son, George Chapman Young, Jr., of Denver, Colo.; a sister, Mrs. T. Johnson Clancy of Louisville, and six grandchildren. He was a first cousin of Mrs. Oliver Kelly of this city.
