TWO YOUTHS FOUND DEAD NEAR TRACKS – Bodies of Lebanon Residents Discovered Along Railroad in Lincoln County – ROBBERY HELD MOTIVE – Section Foreman Expresses Belief Pair May Have Been Thrown From Train

Two youths identified as William Raley, 17 years old, and Chester Hamilton, 21, both of Lebanon, Ky., were found dead at 7 o'clock this morning near the Louisville & Nashville Railroad tracks a mile south of Shelby City, Lincoln County.

The bodies were discovered by William Maybrier while he was picking up coal along the tracks. Clothes of the youths, who were found under bushes, their bodies eight feet apart, were turned inside out, and officers, who were called by R.M. Roberts, railroad section foreman, notified of the discovery of Maybrier, said they believed the two had been robbed. The youths were fairly well-dressed.

Identification was made through a card found in a billfold in possession of Hamilton, containing \$1.05 which apparently had been overlooked by the persons who searched the youths' clothing.

With the exception of a slight wound on Hamilton's forehead, the bodies bore no marks of violence. Mr. Roberts said that it was possible that the pair might have been thrown from a train, judging from the positions of the bodies when found. He said one of the youths was found face downward, with his head toward the tracks, which the other was facing the other way.

An inquest was conducted by County Judge John N. Menefee, acting in the place of Coroner W.A. Carson, who is ill. The jury rendered a verdict of death from unknown cause, and placed the bodies in the custody of Mr. Roberts who had them sent to Lebanon.

At Lebanon, George R. Raley, brother of William, said the two youths had been seen together late last night. George said that he and Hamilton had been to a dance, and that at 10:30 o'clock his companion said he

had lost his hat and left to look for it. He said the two boys had not been considering taking a trip, so far as he knew.

It is believed the two boys caught a southbound freight train which passes through Lebanon at 1 o'clock. This train would have passed the spot where the bodies were found at about 3 o'clock.

Inquiries in Lebanon revealed that the Hamilton youth had between \$20 and \$25 with him at the time he left the dance, and that his companion had \$4 or \$5.

Young Raley is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Alex Raley; five brothers, George, Dan, J.A. Jr., Frank and Hugh, and two sisters, Nancy and Rosella. An early morning highway tragedy in Mississippi during spring break claimed the life of 10-year-old Jeffrey Robinson and injured his parents and three brothers, all from Marion County.

The funeral service for Jeffrey, a straight-A student at Calvary Elementary School, was yesterday, April 8, 1997, at noon, in Holy Name of Mary Catholic Church in Calvary.

“Jeffrey was an ideal student,” said Mary Jo Higdon, his fifth-grade teacher at Calvary Elementary. “He was quiet, well-liked by everybody, and an all-around good student. He always had his school work done on time.”

Diane Evans, principal at Calvary Elementary, said that Jeffrey was “pleasant to everyone and was a good student, academically and socially. He was never in any trouble. He touched the lives and hearts of many and will be sadly missed.

“We’re a small community, a small school, and we feel the Robinsons are our family. This is a huge shock to Jeffrey’s family, our school family, and community.

“All of us need the support of each other as we deal with Jeffrey’s death and as we pull together to help the family recover from their injuries and get settled again.”

Two of Jeffrey’s brothers also attend Calvary Elementary: Jay, a third-grader; and David “Buck,” a kindergarten student.

His mother, Janet, is also associated with Calvary Elementary, working as a school bus driver’s assistant to supervise the preschool students.

The Robinsons “are a real close family,” said Evans. “They do things together all the time and are real supportive of each other.”

Just before spring break, Jeffrey’s father, Ernie, served as a chaperone for a Calvary Elementary fifth-grade field trip to the University of Louisville planetarium, said Evans.

On Monday, grief counselors were at Calvary Elementary to help the students and staff deal with the tragedy, said Evans.

The one-vehicle accident happened on Tuesday, April 1, around 6:30 a.m. on Interstate 59, one-and-one-half miles south of Heidelberg, Miss.

The 1992 Chevrolet van, driven by Janet Robinson, was southbound. The vehicle went off the road to the left, came back on the road, went out of control and rolled over several times, according to the Mississippi Highway Patrol.

Ernest, 35, Jeffrey, 10, Jay, 9, David, 6 and John Dylan Robinson, 19 months, were passengers.

Jeffrey was ejected from the van, said the highway patrol.

The Robinsons were transported by emergency medical services personnel to South Central Regional Medical Center in Laurel, Miss.

Jeffrey was pronounced dead at 7:39 a.m. in the medical center. He suffered massive head injuries, according to the coroner’s report.

The parents and John Dylan were admitted to the hospital. The other children were reportedly treated for injuries and released.

The family was traveling to Mississippi to visit relatives on school spring break when the accident occurred.

The Robinsons, of Calvary community, returned to Marion County on Saturday.
