Thanks for letting me know that Edith had passed away. I am very sorry to hear that. I know she'll be missed. I met her once in Bardstown in 1988 and always wanted to go back to Kentucky for another visit. She was a very gracious lady and Aunt Allien, Pete Adams and I had a wonderful visit with her.

Attached is a picture taken Sep 16, 1988. L-R: A H "Pete" Adams, Aunt Allien (Adams) Kruse and Edith Scobee. I was the Cameraman.

She had lived in a magnificent 2 or 3 story home just behind the Cameraman, but after her husband died, she said the home fell in to disrepair and she moved in this smaller home (in the picture) and placed it about 100 feet to the west of the old home. They must have had several acres there and as I recall, it was at the north east edge of Bardstown.

Left to right, Robert Harrison Nelson, 2nd child, Bretta Kathleen Nelson Blackledge (the youngest), and her oldest brother, Ed Bixler Nelson, Jr. As of 1999, they are all deceased. Robert (Bob) finally died last in 1999. Ed had one son named Jef, Bob had one daughter named Carol Ann (who goes by "Anna" now, and Bretta had a boy named Steve and a girl named Linda Lee, and she and I were good friends as children, when they lived in Tulsa. Steve and Linda Lee (who goes by Lee now), went to high school in Tulsa, Oklahoma.



This picture includes the spouses. Left to right, Bob, Marie, Bretta, her husband, Glenn in back of her, and Elaine Nelson and Ed are on the end. I know that Marie Nelson is still living because she lives with her daughter, Carol Ann Frazzino, who goes by Anna Frazzino, now. They are in Colorado. Dear David and Mary P:

One of these pics is E.H. and Ida Adams and their 5 boys, William Spaulding, Brengle Harrison, Paul Grundy, Joseph Henderson and Charles Spurgeon (called "Spurg"), and they were called Bill, Brengle, Paul, Joe and Spurg.

The other picture is of 5 Adams girls, all but Allien Frances Adams Kruse, she must be taking the picture. I'll send it separately. The five are: LtoR: Bretta, Bertha, Estelle, Hattie (Eliza's only dau.), and Iva (who is also the tallest and the youngest).

Allien and Iva, the two youngest girls, also married the latest of any of them. Allien didn't marry until she was 40 yrs. old, and Iva, after that, I don't remember the date. Both lived at home with their parents at 1012 Holly St., Perry, Oklahoma. That's where Ida was living when she got sick and finally died in 1937. I'll have to check the details for the rest of the story. I do remember that as long as I knew Allien, she cared for her father, even after she married Fred Kruse. I do know my grandfather didn't die in that house—he finally went to live with his oldest son, Bill (Max Adams' father), and died while living there.

John Grundy Adams

Notes

John Grundy Adams was the 5th child and 2nd son of Elisha Smith Adams and Mary E. Myers Adams. He was born in Washington County, Kentucky, on August 24, 1835. He married Frances Ellen McIntire in the home of her father, Harrison McIntire, near Brandenburg, Meade County, Kentucky, on January 21, 1859. She was the granddaughter of Thomas McIntire and Sarah Summers McIntire of Washington County, Kentucky and the great granddaughter of Joseph McIntire (or McIntyre), (also spelled Josiah), and Lucy Waller of Virginia. Joseph McIntire was born in Northern Ireland in 1774 and came to America some time prior to the Revolutionary War and settled in either Philadelphia or Baltimore. Later, he came to Kentucky and settled in Washington County near present Springfield. Many of his descendants were born in Washington and some still live in the county or in the nearby counties of Kentucky.

John Grundy Adams and Frances Ellen McIntire had 11 children, 7 boys and 4 girls. And, among them were two sets of twins. They were:

Most of the children were born on Hardin's Creek in Washington County, Kentucky. Some remained in Washington County, and others moved to Marion and Nelson Counties. The oldest son, Elisha Harrison Adams, migrated to Perry, Noble County, Oklahoma, in 1908; one year after Oklahoma and Indian Territories were united to form the state of Oklahoma.

John Grundy Adams and his wife, Frances Ellen, lived their last years near Bardstown, Nelson County, Kentucky. He died on February 7, 1921, at Bardstown. His wife died 2 years later, on January 16, 1923, and both are buried in the Bardstown Cemetery at Bardstown, Kentucky.

Frances Ellen McIntire

Notes

Alot of facts about Frances McIntire can be found under her husbands name, John Grundy. But, I will add a few here; but mostly I want to add the stories that were found that were told by France Ellen McIntire.

Harrison McIntire, (Frances Ellen's father), son of Thomas McIntire and Sarah Summers, was born on April 13, 1814, Washington County, Kentucky. She was the daughter of John Simms, and Frances Moore. She was born on May 1, 1818, Washington County, KY. and died on October 18, 1883, Meade Co., Kentucky. Harrison died on October 6, 1903, Meade Co., KY. Both are buried in Cap Anderson Cemetery, Brandenburg, Meade Co., KY. (Tombstones blown away by Arpil 3, 1974 tornado, information from Roy Berry, Brandenburg, KY. 1980--LBG. Roy is the great grandson of Harrison and Sarah McIntire).

Harrison and Sarah had the following children, also records of Roy Berry, St. Rose records, Washington County, KY.

1. Frances Ellen McIntire, bapt. October 15, 1837 (sp. Caroline McIntire)
2. Richard Pius McIntire, bapt. March 16, 1839, (sp. Caroline McIntire)
3. Katie A. McIntire, born November 25, 1841, Meade County, KY.
4. Miriah Jane McIntire, born November 12, 1844, Meade County, KY.
5. George W. McIntire, born January 19, 1846, Meade County, KY.

There is another person to add, because he is in these records too, although he is not a son to Harrison McIntire, he is a nephew.

6. Jacob R. McIntire, born in 1858. He is in the 1860 Census of Hardin Co., KY. He was the son of Patrick Lloyd McIntyre, brother to Harrison. Jacob married Gertrude Enser, November 11, 1879, Washington Co., KY. He died in 1890, Meade County, KY.

Now, records for the Harrison McIntire family of Washington County, KY., list the following marriages:

1. Frances Ellen McIntire married John Grundy Adams, January 12, 1851.
2. Richard Pius McIntire married Frances M. Adams, buried Cap Anderson Cemetery, Brandenburg, Meade County, KY.
3. Katie A. McIntire married John M. Hickerson, November 14, 1860. She died August 28, 1894, Meade County, KY., buried Salem Cemetery, near Ekron, Meade County, KY. After her death, John M. Hickerson married Gertrude Enser McIntire, widow of Jacob R. McIntire. All 4 are buried Salem Baptist Cemetery, Elron, Meade County, Kentucky.
4. Miriah Jane McIntire married William T. Berry, March 27, 1867. She died November 9, 1916, both buried New Highland Cemetery, Meade County, KY.
5. George W. McIntire married Nancy J. Berry. Both buried Salem Cemetery, near Ekron, Meade County, Kentucky.
6. Jacob R. McIntire married Gertrude Enser, November 11, 1879, Washington Conty, Kentucky. He died 1890, Meade Co., KY. 1860 Census Meade Co., KY. does not list Jacob R. as the son of Harrison McIntire, but a nephew. Jacob R. is the son of Patrick Lloyd McIntire, the brother of Harrison McIntire.

More facts about Frances Ellen and John Grundy Adams are: He was born on August 24, 1835, Washington County, Kentucky, and died February 7, 1921, Bardstown, Nelson County, Kentucky. Both buried in the Bardstown City Cemetery, Nelson County, KY. Frances Ellen died on January 16, 1923, Bardstown, Nelson County, Kentucky.

Hi, David: Thanks so much for sending all you did from those reference books in Washington County. I haven't quite read it all yet, but I will today. I'm pretty sure I have all that, but its nice to see it again. That's interesting reading. That last reference you sent that started talking about John Adams, Sr., and how the Adams family started, ended with some information about Robert Fisher Adams and his descendants. The person responsible for that article was Noralee Adams Cornish, a great-granddaughter, I believe of Elisha Barlow Adams, who was a brother to my ancestor, Elisha Smith Adams.

I accidently found Noralee Cornish this year, and can give you her address, if you want it. I had wanted to talk to her ever since I was sent that article. I imagine Lucy Geoghegan sent that, she was one of the first people I found in Bardstown, KY. to help me with Adams information. Actually, I had written to the Kentucky Explorer, which is a marvelous genealogy magazine there, trying to find out more about the trip that Peter B. F. Adams took with Daniel Boone, and a Mrs. Edith Pinkston wrote to me about my letter. Edith Pinkston's husband turned out to be an Adams descendant and Noralee was his cousin, and lived in the same town: Willisburg. I have Edith's address too, if you want it. Anyway, I sent Noralee some Adams information and asked her to fill out some blank pedigree sheets, but I haven't heard anything from her. Edith is in her 80s and Noralee is nearly 90 (and very secretive about her age), and neither one have computers. But, I would really like to get some more information from them, and pictures.

I spent some time yesterday, in between the heavy rains and storm threats, to find these pages from Genealogy.com. I don't have near all there are, as you'll be able to tell from the numbers, but the ones I have are interesting. This was titled The Miguel Bringel (which I had spelled wrong) Family Tree. But, Kevin Wilson's email address is on it somewhere, and you can probably contact him for more information.

I also printed off some pages from my FTM, and will send you information on Frances Ellen McIntyre, what little I have, and her husband, John Grundy Adams. I look up Ralph Hickerson and see what I have on him. Whenever you get back to Smock's Cemetery, I would like to have a picture of Carrie Lee's tombstone.

I have one more "tid-bit" to tell you about: Ralph and Sarah Elizabeth's (I'm told they called her "aunt Sis") had a son called Broadus, whom I never knew, but my cousins in Oklahoma did. Max Adams said that Broadus used to visit them when Max's mother was still alive, and brought his Kentucky Bourbon with him. Max and his family were Southern Baptist, so that probably didn't go over well. Anyway, I think I may have an email from Max about that visit. If I can find it, I'll send it—or you can contact Max yourself in Perry, Oklahoma. I sent you his email address, didn't I?

I'll have to send several emails, there are 5 or 6 pages from Genealogy.com and 4 or 5 from my FTM. It would probably be best to let me know what comes through, I don't always know.

Mary, I am hoping this information will also help someone at the library. You can send this on to Gerald Thompson, and would you ask him to contact me, please.

If there are any questions, just ask. Ida L. Brengle and Elisha Harrison Adams had 11 children, 10 lived to adulthood. Their last baby, Thelma Fern died in infancy, at about 3 months—of what I don't know. The other children were 5 boys and 5 girls. My father's name is Joseph Henderson Adams, and I will be sending his pedigree sheet soon.

As it turns out, Julia Ann was my grandmother Ida's sister, and apparently the oldest. Ida's mother (Ann), and father (Jacob Brengle) had 10 children. I printed off 3 pages about those 2 generations, but there is alot more, because I have seen it. As I said, the entire family tree which was then called the Michel Bringle Family Tree was on Genealogy.com, but I can't find it now. Kevin may have the entire thing, or at least Ida's branch. I do remember that the Tree went clear back to Germany and into the 1600s, and there were photos. There is also a Jim Bringle in California that used to have a web page, if you are interested. Maybe I can find him too. Jim Bringle and Kevin don't know each other, though, I remember that part.

I received your message fine. There was two pictures in the message, which came out fine. I may need to play with them a little in order to print them out but will let you know if I am not successful. I will let you know about the CD, but will probably get it from the Library next time I'm out. As for the last file I sent in my last message, it is a RTF file, You should be able to open it in a word processor. Do you have Word as your word processor? If so I can send it as a Doc. file. It is a list of Eliza's ancestors.

Yes Eliza's stone does say she was the wife of E. H. Adams, but I didn't know what the initials stood for. I have only one other Brengle in my database. Julia Brengle married 8 Jan 1867 to John W. Ensor at Jacob Brengle's house in Washington Co, Ky. Washington County is the county that Marion county came from in 1834, and the county line is only about a mile or two from Smock's chapel. I would think she also is from the same Brengle family as your Ida Brengle since the Ensors have connections to Smock's Chapel. My grandmother's sister (Ada) married James Colie Ensor, who was a son of James B. Ensor, a brother of the John W. Ensor I mentioned.

I don't know how much you know about the Loretto area, but that area (western Marion Co, Nelson, and Eastern Washington Co.) is where the Catholic settler's first came to Ky. It was then predominately Catholic and Smock's chapel was one of the few protestant churches there. Were the Adam's Catholic?

I have only skimmed your message as I write this, so I will now look at it more closely.

I am 51, so we are both in our 50s. Just call me David, no need for Mr. I met Gerald Thompson about 8 months ago, and he and his wife are so nice and helpful. I just received a mailing from him today on another family of mine. I will be able to relate much on Eliza's family. I believe I have a picture of her brother, James Coy Smith. His daughter, Nora Smith is still living in Ohio. I was in contact with her daughter in law a few months ago.

I have found out much more since I did the book last year on Smock's Chapel, so some of my notes on the group sheets may not reflect that.

Thank you for the information. There are McIntyre's (McIntire) buried at Smocks. Not many, but they also married into the Gardner family. I would be interested in the family of Frances Ellen McIntyre parents and' or grandparents. I'll write now later on the Smith's and Gardners. David Minor

I called the library today and talked to Sandy about someone I needed to find in Loretto, KY., and she said I needed to send a written request, so here it is.

I am looking for information on my grandfather's first wife, and here is her information:

Eliza, or Elizabeth Jane Smith (Adams)
born: Nov. 22, 1862, Kentucky
died: May 20, 1890, Near Loretto, Marion Co., KY.

I don't really know exactly where she was born, but I imagine it was somewhere close or in Loretto, KY., but I would think it was in Marion Co., somewhere. I really don't have a lot of information on her. I do know more about her husband, and 2 children. Her husband was my grandfather, Elisha Harrison Adams and they had a boy named Lee Roy Adams who is buried in Smocks Cemetery there in Loretto, and a girl named Hattie Florence Adams who moved with her parents in 1907, to Oklahoma, and married and died there. She is buried in Perry, Oklahoma, I believe.

Eliza J. Smith Adams is buried in Smocks Cemetery also because I have a picture of her tombstone. I also have a picture of a tombstone that has a C. G. Smith on it. That might be her father, I don't know. I need to know who her parents and siblings were, I have no idea.

I am also including a picture of the home that my grandfather and his 2nd wife, Ida L. Brengle Adams lived in, and where my father (b. 1901) was born. I am assuming that he and Eliza lived there also, but I don't know. I have been told it is the Gig Smith place, but I have no idea who "Gig Smith" was, unless it was Eliza's father. This was nearly 100 years ago, so these things may be hard to find out. If you are a historian of the area, or know who is, I would like to find out some of these things. And, just maybe, you'll recognize the house, and the 2 unknown adults and little girl I have labeled "Hattie" is-----I was mistaken in my labeling on both "Hattie" and "Roy". Those were Eliza's children and born in 1884 and 1886 respectfully, so none of the children in the picture could be that old. I think my father is sitting on his father's knee, so I am guessing the picture was taken around 1904 or 05. "Hattie" and "Roy" would be 18 and 20 yrs. old by then.

If you can just find out about Eliza Jane Smith Adams, and who her parents and siblings were, I would appreciate it. I have enclosed a \$5.00 money

order, as Sandy requested, for your copies and your trouble.

EDWARD ADAMS

EDWARD ADAMS [my 4th great grandfather] Born possibly in late 1600s. Edward and William Adams were the only two Adams who signed for an early poll list in 1748 in Brunswick County, Virginia, - no doubt brothers. Edward died between 1748 and 1750. His estate is in Will Book 3, page 59. Date of appraisement July 21, 1750. Edward then "deceased". Estate returned into Court March 31, 1752 by Mary Adams, his wife, and Administratrix for probate.

The will of Mary, his wife, Will Book 5, pages 99-100, was made on January 5, 1774. Probated on June 26, 1780, Brunswick County.

Second Generation

CHILDREN OF EDWARD AND MARY ADAMS

Proof of two children has been found and what appears to be proof of three others has been found. Mary mentions son Isaac in her will and Isaac names "my brother James" as administrator of his estate. Also, Edward Adams, Junior was a witness to Mary's will. Also, my photocopy of will of Thomas Adams shows he names "my brother James and my sister Sarah Williamson" in his will, Will Book 5, page 17. So, this seems to link Thomas and Sarah with other children of Edward and Mary Adams of Brunswick County, Virginia. Their estate lists "4 beds and 2 baskets". The above mentioned Isaac was my third great grandfather.

ISAAC ADAMS

ISAAC ADAMS [my third great grandfather] Birth date unknown but his will is in Will Book 5, page 121. Brunswick County shows he made his will on July 4, 1774. He had died by June 26, 1780. Will probated Jan. 22, 1781. I have a photocopy of above will in which he names "beloved wife Betty" and 10 children. I have most of the records of the 10 children.

EDMUND ADAMS

EDMUND ADAMS [my great-great grandfather], son of Isaac and Betty Adams. Edmund was born before 1774 but exact date unknown. Deeds of purchase and sale of lands indicate Edmund died between 1796 and 1798. Inventory and appraisement of estate is found in Will Book 6, page 429. Also Amount Sales Estate Edmund Adams is in Will Book 6, page 440. His estate was returned into Court for probate by Elizabeth Adams on June 28, 1802. I have certified copy of marriage. On Dec. 17, 1788 Edmund Adams was married to Elizabeth Cooksey in Greensville County, Virginia. John Baptist Cooksey, father, gave consent and Isaac Adams, Jr. and Winfield Adams signed for their brother.

The searcher I had engaged to trace my families in Virginia could hardly believe her eyes when she found a guardianship record in an old Order Book # 18 on page 234 showing that on Dec. 23, 1799, a Court in Brunswick County named William Rideout as guardian over Edmund's three children: Jesse, Wyatt and Polly Adams. I have since learned that the Rideouts were kin of the Cooksey family (see other page). I have a certified copy of above guardianship record and signed by Deputy Clerk and it bears the seal of Brunswick County.

NOTE: Greensville County mentioned above adjoins Brunswick County on the east. In 1781 a portion was cut from Brunswick and from Sussex Counties and this became Greensville County in 1781.

Fourth Generation

JESSE ADAMS OF VIRGINIA AND KENTUCKY

JESSE ADAMS [my great grandfather], oldest of three children of Edmund and Elizabeth (Cooksey) Adams. Jesse Adams, of English ancestry, was born late in the year of 1789 in Brunswick County, Virginia, which is located on the North Carolina line - southern border of Virginia. Jesse Adams left a will (I have photocopy) and estate in McLean County, Illinois (Probate No. 202, Box No. 6). It lists his death as March 11, 1844, his age about 55 years. Jesse Adams could not leave Virginia until he became of age to inherit his share of his father's estate. On January 29, 1811 in Greensville County, Virginia, Jesse Adams was married to Elizabeth Goodrum (certified copy). Thomas Cooksey (his uncle) signed as surety for this marriage. By 1815 Jesse Adams had come to Kentucky where he appeared on Allen County tax list. On March 20, 1817, Book B, page 574, Jesse Adams was issued a Kentucky Land Warrant, 50 acres (Grant No. 1124). The deed was signed by Lieut. Gov. Gabriel Slaughter on March 20, 1818 exactly a year from date of survey. His land was on Trammel Fork of Drakes Creek. On Sept 24, 1825 Jesse sold this tract and bought 93 acres N E of Bowling Green where he lived near John Price and F. R. Cowden. I am certain these two men talked Jesse into going to Illinois - he sold out in 1836 - and all three families formed a wagon train and moved to McLean County, Ill.

with him. He explained to me that this was the only thing that his client would pay with, and that I would be expected to help him to keep them from getting hungry. That was all that it took. I needed me, and I would do anything for Daddy. He stopped and started pulling out the hog weeds and I drug them back to the pig pen and they started to eat. By the time I got the second load of weeds had been eaten. This was going to be an every day job. Daddy had a big hawk that he called a "Hawk Bill." He cut the weeds way faster than I could drag them back for the two eating pigs in the barnyard. It was all fun helping Daddy, and I became used to feeding the pigs. I actually began to like them and had even decided to name them and make them my own. I cared for them all summer and sat by the fence for hours and watched their snouts when they stuck through the fence. They never bit me, and we became friends. I started and the days and nights I tried to be cool. I came in one day from school and everything was really quiet. I heard a sound from my pigs. I ran to the pen and it was empty. I could not understand why my pigs were gone. Daddy told me the sad truth and I went to my room and sobbed and sobbed. Not many days later daddy brought home fresh pork. I took one look at Daddy and another at the pork and went to my room. I decided that I would never be allowed to eat my pets. Mother asked me that all pigs were eaten and I said it was just another part of life. I liz-zer. I could never eat any of the pork and I am not so sure that Mamma had either.

A few days later, Daddy brought me a cage and told me to open it. I could hear noise inside, and was I ever surprised when I opened it. Daddy had brought me two white mice as a peace offering. They were friendly and I talked to them and told them that I would keep them safe. I kept them close to me, and when I went to school, I hid them as far away from the closet as I could get them. I would tell anyone where they were hidden. I was going to make sure that no bad things would befall my two new mice. One day I came home and ran in to find my pet mice. The door was open, and I knew they had escaped. I had pushed the door so far into the closet and the door

had sprung open. After looking in vain, I made Mother promise to never set another mouse trap. It was bad enough to lose them, but I certainly did not want them to suffer the fate of the dreaded mouse trap. Daddy knew that I was unhappy after losing my white mice, so he found another pet for me. He brought me a little "Rat Terrier" dog. I loved that puppy and played with it every day. He had only been home a few minutes when a car drove up with an angry man and woman. They asked for their dog, and I assured them that he was mine. There was only one slight problem. My dog was a boy and this one was a girl. Poor Daddy, he apologized and told them that he thought the puppy was ours. They accepted his apology and left with their little girl, and after that we decided to look no further for my lost dog. We certainly did not want to make another mistake like that. Poor Daddy was so embarrassed. He could not believe that he had not noticed the difference between a girl and a boy. Our puppy was lost forever, but there were many more to take his place. We all loved dogs, and I still am an animal lover, but especially a dog lover.

Memories Of Bill And Myrtle Adams

My mother, Myrtle, was the daughter of Charlie and Nancy Miracle. She and my dad, Bill Adams, got married, on Peck Hollow (Lincoln County, Kentucky) down from where the Moores live now, on August 7, 1933. Mom said they drove across the wooden bridge at the end of the hollow. A wooden plank bridge went up the driveway to the preacher's house. Mom said she was scared of crossing those bridges in the car, but Dad said they were safe.

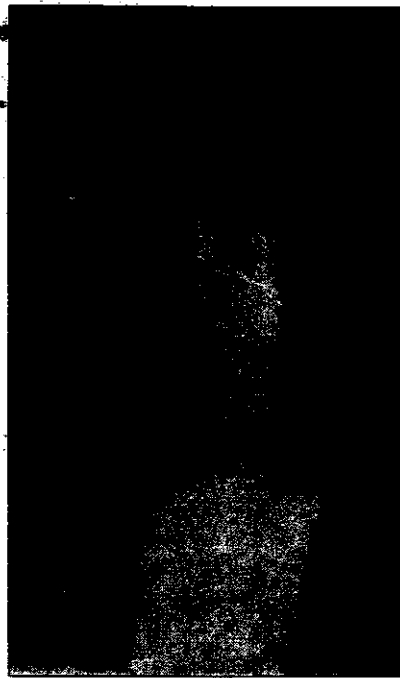
From there they went to my dad's parents' (Jim and Lula Adams) home

where Toady Coffman lived before he built a new house on the hill behind it. I remember Dad's parents living there. It was a big two-story white house with a long front porch.

My first memory is being about three years old and living on a farm above Scutter's outside of McKinney (Lincoln County). I was born in a two-room house across the road from Grandma and Grandpa Adams. They lived where Toady Coffman lived about halfway between McKinney and Geneva. The farm being across the road on the hill from Scutters is what I first remember. I remember that we had guineas and a car that was kept in a barn. When we went from McKinney to Jumbo, where Grandma Miracle lived, we drove on a muddy path that later became a gravel road. I had a red print dress and bloomers that mom made from a feed sack.

Dad didn't stay on the farm but a few years before he got hurt. He was plowing a field with a team of half-broken mules. The lines were always tied and went over a man's back and shoulders when he was plowing. Those half-broken mules ran off with Dad behind them. I remember they brought him home laying on a door in the back of a wagon. They said his back was broken. He was put into bed, then the men left. There was no doctor. Mom took care of him. We lived in a tenant house and the house was needed for a tenant that was able to work on the farm, so we had to move out. I remember it was wintertime when we moved out.

Mom took in laundry. She carried water and washed on a washboard. She had to hang the laundry in the house to dry in the winter. She also took in ironing. We didn't have electric, so she heated an iron on a woodburning cook stove. We used coal oil lamps. Dad painted houses in the summer. I don't remember what he did in the winter. At that time in our lives, we were all in danger of starving. This was during WWII and the Great Depression. With hunger and fear, no work or wages, many kids died. A little cold when they were malnourished turned into pneumonia. There was a lot of pressure to find work, and Mom and Dad lived in town, not on a farm where there was fruit, vegetables, meat, and milk. They did have a garden in front of the house and it was eaten as

soon as it was ripe. There was no fertilizer or manure available to put on it, so it did not produce well.

Some of the people talked Dad into being a janitor at the grade school. Mom helped and was at the school building fires in all the stoves and putting coal in them all day that she carried from the coal shed in big heavy buckets. She pumped buckets of water and carried them to pour in the water coolers. Mom was a petite woman and the coolers were so high, I don't know how she ever got a bucket of water up so high to pour it in. She was always sweeping the classrooms and halls. There was a janitor's room with a big heating stove, and Mom would cook something on it for dinner. When the other kids went home to eat or ate from the lunch boxes, Louise and I would go to the janitor's room and Mom would give us a bowl of soup.

Later, Dad started driving the school bus for McKinney Grade School and High School students and kept that job until he retired. All of the students loved Dad and loved riding on his school bus.

In 1946 or 1947, Dad was painting a house for old man Sam Montgomery.

Old Sam owned the grocery/hardware and feed store. Old Sam owned a four-room house and told Dad he would carry the mortgage, and Dad could make payments on it if he wanted to buy it. They went to Stanford and transferred the deed. Mom and Dad moved while I was at school, and that night Mom walked me home across the railroad tracks to our new house. I don't know how they made the payments.

We did not have electricity and George Coffman took his truck to Stanford on Saturday mornings and loaded it up with ice. He sold ice to most of the families in McKinney. Mom had an old white icebox. The metal-lined top raised up to put the ice in it. The door on the front opened up to put food in.

When I was six years old, we did not have any water on our property and had to carry it from the store where Mom worked. Dad got Mr. Naylor to come with his witching stick to find out where we could have a well dug. Now not everyone can witch a well. Some people have the talent and some do not. One has to have to have a fresh branch with a good fork. The forked stick will point toward the ground. If one takes one step off to

the side, the stick won't move. One has to be right on top of the water. The stick cannot tell the depth of the water; just where the water is.

Anyway, Mr. Naylor could not find water anywhere except for one spot in the front yard. A drilling team came to dig the well where Mr. Naylor had marked it. Dad was gone to work when they came. They started to dig there, but Mom, in her soft-spoken voice pointed to a spot in the backyard and insisted that they dig there instead. They could not believe that when they dug where Mom told them to, they hit water! When Dad came home from work, he wanted to know why she did not have them dig where Mr. Naylor had showed them where water was located. Mom told him that she did not want the well in the front yard!

It seemed like we never had enough food, and the house was always cold. At night, Mom would put her and Dad's overcoats on the beds to keep us warm. There was never much wood to keep a fire going. Mom used to take a bucket and pick up coal along the railroad track. The open coal cars on the train would bounce and coal would fall off

was always someone usually taking up coal along the tracks. When I was a kid, most of Mom's relatives did. They would get on Fridays and ride the train on the pass to McKinney Depot. It would be late and dark. They would knock on our back door. Dad would get up and let them in. We only had two or three kids, so we kids would see them walking down Main Street at McKinney and get on the train at the depot. They would catch the train back to Cincinnati, Ohio or Paducah, Kentucky. Word got around that they could spend the night at our house before going on home the next morning. Dad never turned any of them away. Some of the men we did not know too well. They were some relatives of Mom's who had been told that they could sleep there. I do not know how some of those men could eat gravy and biscuits and look at us hungry kids. Maybe they left a coin for breakfast. I seem to remember Mom's brothers doing that. This was in the early 1940s and nobody had much.

Dad did stop letting men from the railroad stop at the house on Friday nights. Mom's brothers had stopped coming by then. I think they were riding with someone that had a car. We found out one man was drunk after he got in the house. He was talking nasty and Dad told him to stop that talk around his wife and kids. He told him to go to sleep or get out. Mom and Dad stayed awake all that night. The next morning Dad sent him on his way without breakfast. The man said he wasn't going to pay if he couldn't eat. Dad told him to hit the road and never come back. After that, when one of the railroaders knocked on the door, Dad wouldn't open it. He told them to go somewhere else. I know that Mom was worried about money, but Dad said one of the drunks could kill us. They finally stopped coming.

Mom would turn the radio on while we were doing breakfast dishes and starting to get ready for church. She would listen to the Renfro Valley Work Service. The program would start with church bells ringing, and the announcer would tell the names of the singers who would be singing live on the show. Mom always loved to hear the Moon Creek Girls.

came on Saturday nights. Dad used to listen to the Grand Ole Opry on a battery-powered radio. I would go to sleep listening to the music. I loved to hear Ray Acuff sing "The Great Speckled Bird."

Mom used to bring us orange slice candy every Friday night after she was hired at Palm Beach. She had to buy something in order to cash her check, so she walked from Palm Beach uptown on her lunch break to the dime store and bought a bag of candy.

From Mom, I learned to work. She was always working. She worked in a factory and worked at home. She had to cook, clean, wash, and iron for six people, until I was big enough to help her.

Mom worked for over 30 years, then had a small retirement check and Social Security. She never had a savings account at a bank until I started one for her, after I was named power of attorney.

Dad taught me how to cook kraut. I was complaining about its being so sour and he said, "You have to drain the can and wash the kraut, then drain it

again."

I also learned to cook a pot of beans from Dad. We didn't like the beans when Mom cooked them. Dad always put a chunk of jowl bacon in them, and had a small pan of hot water on another burner on the stove. When the beans cooked down and needed water, he used hot water. When the beans were almost done, he used a potato masher, mashed about half of them, then turned the heat down to finish cooking. There would be good thick bean soup in them. He said that is how his mother had cooked them.

Genealogy From The Long Ago

(OLD SCRAPBOOK - 1890)

Editor's Note: We have come across an interesting collection of old clippings dealing with Kentucky family history. Since these clippings are over 100 years old, your editor feels they will be of interest to many of our readers. We will continue this column each month until the supply is gone.

Adams

G. W. Adams, of Livingston County, was a native of Dixon County, Tennessee, and was born February 11, 1824. He was the fifth of eight children born to George and Sallie Boyd Adams, both parents natives of Halifax County, Virginia. George Adams' parents came from Ireland and were among the early settlers of the Old Dominion State, with the grandfather of G. W. Adams dying there shortly after the Revolutionary War. George Adams emigrated from Virginia to Tennessee in 1823, settling in Dixon County, where he resided until 1832, at which time he moved to Livingston County, Kentucky, locating near the town of Old Salem. He was a successful farmer and died in Crittenden County in 1845. Sallie Boyd Adams died of cholera in the year 1833. G. W. was reared on a farm and remained with his parents until their deaths, when he commenced life for himself as a common laborer, finding employment on different farms for the small sum of \$8 a month. Part of the time he worked in a mill and later was employed as an overseer on a plantation, for which services his wages were increased to \$13 per month. He was next engaged with his brother, Richard, with whom he farmed in partnership until 1849. After this, apart from spending three years in California, he farmed in Livingston County. In 1854, after returning from California, he located back in Livingston County, living on a farm before purchasing a different area of land one and a half miles from a 266-acre farm in Carraville, to which he added at different times, increasing the size to 350 acres, the large majority being used for cul-

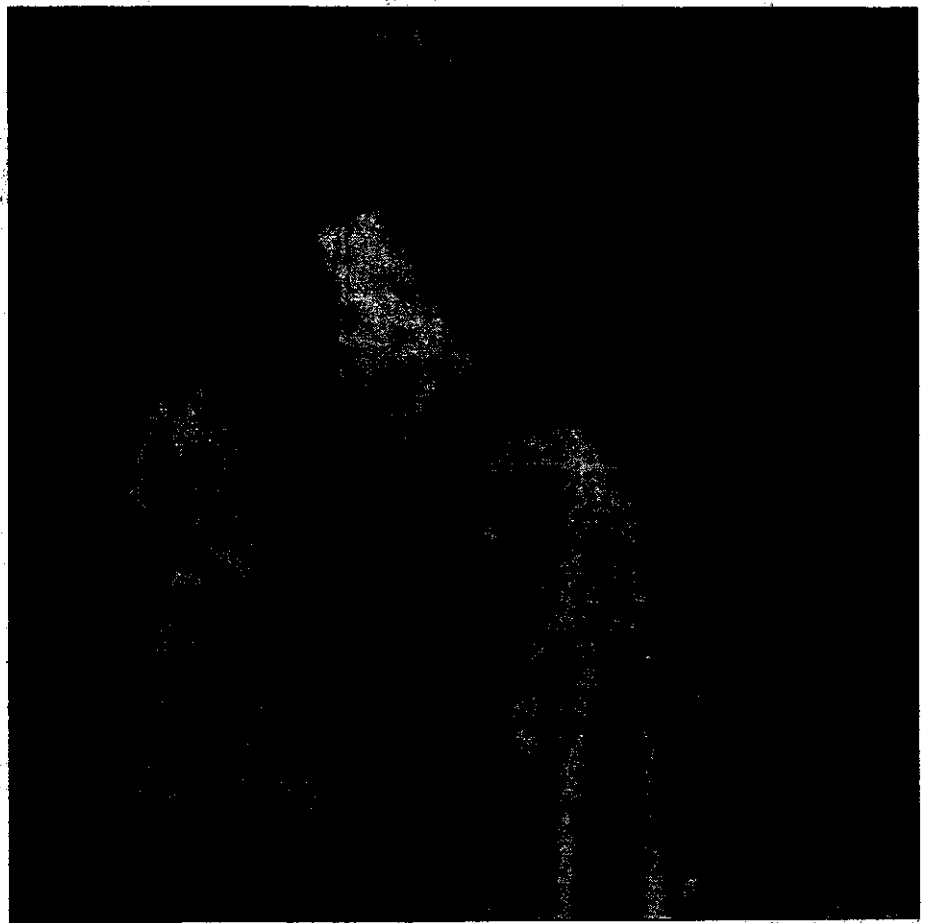
Mr. Adams was a member of the Masonic fraternity and a member of the United Baptist Church. He was married on March 28, 1850, to Sophronia, daughter of Anthony and Sallie Franklin, of

Livingston County. The following children were born of the union: Henry I.; Mary H., wife of W. H. Kidd; Sallie, wife of William Ratter; Kit C.; George E.; Florence; Jefferson D.; Ida A.; and Robert E.

G. W. Adams was killed by a man whom he had employed to work for him, dying in the yard of his farmhouse.

Bristow

Dr. M. Bristow, of Crittenden County, was born in Essex County, Virginia, on May 20, 1806, and was a son of Sanders and Jane Bristow, natives of Virginia and of English descent. His father died in 1810, and in 1811, his mother came to Kentucky with her family and settled in Jessamine County, where she resided until her death, which occurred about 1816. After his mother's death, he
