

Poor little lost Willie

lost Willie. It has a sad ending.

It starts on a cold night in East St. Louis in 1907, James William Ash, better known then as just Willie, was about 9. His father left

him standing in front of an agency run by the Illinois Children's Home and Aid Society.

Willie was frightened, alone and sick. He was later diagnosed as having tuberculosis. Willie's father, a railroad worker from Indiana, never came back.

Eventually, Willie was adopted by Peter and Giaconda Squellati of Coal City, Italian immigrants. They changed his name to Joseph. But everyone still called him Bill or Willie.

Willie grew up wondering about his real family. He couldn't remember much except he had two older sisters, both of whom died as young adults, and a sister, Kathryn, two years older. She stuck in his memory. He didn't even know his family was from Indiana.

In 1923, Willie got married. He and his wife had three children.

This is the story of poor little Several times through the years he went to East St. Louis to search for his roots. He wasn't allowed to see his adoption records.

> Finally, Willie gave up looking, but he never stopped thinking about Kathryn. He worked through the years as a mail carrier.

> He died in December 1979, two months after being hurt in a car accident. One of the last things he talked about to his granddaughter, Debbie Youskevtch, was his lost

> "If only I could have found her," Willie said. "I spent so much time looking for her. If only I could have found her."


In 1969 Debbie started the search for her family tree. She wanted to do this as a present for her son. But she had run into the same roadblocks as her grandfather on that side of the family.

Those roadblocks were removed a few weeks ago, but two years too late for her grandfather. What Debbie found made a sad ending to Willie's search.

Debbie learned that Kathryn also had looked for him. She had repeatedly talked about him over the years, always calling him poor little lost Willie.

In May, Debbie turned her search to East St. Louis, with the help of a judge there. But she came up with nothing. She returned home and called the agency that had handled Willie's adoption.

The agency surprised her. She was told that enough years had passed that they could reveal his adoption file. Debbie learned that her grandfather was born in Loogootee, Ind. She found the marriage license of his natural parents.



She placed an advertisement in the newspaper there and asked to be contacted by anyone in the family.

The letters started coming.

Willie's father had left East St. Louis and told his relatives in Loogootee that Willie had run away. Kathryn had been raised by an aunt.

According to a letter Debbie received from Kathryn's daughter, Kathryn had often talked about her little brother. She had wondered what happened to him, and thought he had probably died in the war.

Kathryn died in May 1980, just five months after Willie. All these years they had wondered about each other, they had been less than a six-hour drive apart.


Their father had died from heart problems in 1946. His newspaper obituary said he had a son who preceded him in death. That was Willie. Willie's father had taken his secret with him to his grave.

"It's so sad to think how much they wanted to know each other," Debbie said. "And they died so close together. It's just so sad.'

Debbie has received photos of her grandfather's sister and they look like brother and sister. She has photos of other family members and finds she resembles that side of the family.

She is planning to visit some of these relatives before Thanksgiving. They are as eager to meet her as she is to meet them. The letters and telephone calls between Coal City and Loogootee are frequent.

"I want to meet all my relatives there," Debbie said. "They have all heard the story of poor little lost Willie."
