Avritt

John Avritt came to Kentucky from Virginia while a young man and unmarried, sometime between 1780-1795. The name was probably origi-

nally Avery, as a deed dated 1814, the first record in which his name appears in Kentucky, is spelled Avery, and so pronounced by the oldest people in the neighborhood. It was also called Averit. John Averitt left brothers and probably sisters in Virginia. About 1635 several Averys sailed from the south part of England to Virginia, among them John, aged 18, left Gravesend on the ship *America* for Virginia.

113-Year-Old Bradfordsville Home Has Remained In Same Family

It has remained in the family through the years. Now occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Bowen E. Grubbs and family, it is owned by an Avritt granddaughter, Mrs. Josephine Avritt Blandford, and her daughter, Mrs. Alice B. Jones, both formerly of Lebanon, now of Louisville.

John Avritt's parents, John Avritt and Mary Vaughn Avritt of Virginia, had taken up land on the Rolling Fork River in 1821 or 1822. The area then was in Washington County. John II, born in Wight County, Va., in 1810, came to Kentucky as a boy 10 or 12 years old. He married Elizabeth Tucker on April 17, 1835.

Owned Land Across River

The Tuckers had come to the Bradfordsville area perhaps 20 years before. At the time this big white house was built, Elizabeth Tucker's parents, James Hall Tucker, and his wife, Betty, owned the tract of land directly across the river from the Avritt place, and made their home there.

James Tucker, born in 1788, was the youngest of six children who migrated from Virginia with their parents to what is now Adair County in 1790. His father, the Rev. John Tucker, in Virginia a noted divine, became a pioneer preacher in Kentucky. He and his family settled on Green River northeast of Columbia, in a fort known as Tucker's Station.

Tragedy struck them there. One day while the older boys were away hunting, the minister

James Finds Way To Kentucky

James found his way to Kentucky. He served in the War of 1812 and, one of the earliest settlers on the Rolling Fork, was both farmer and magistrate in present Marion County while it still was a part of Washington. He married Nancy Tinnett (1791-1856), a native of Maryland, and they were the parents of 12 children—four sons and eight daughters. All probably were reared in the old Tucker house—or at least on the old Tucker land—across the river from the house here pictured.

It was their daughter, Elizabeth (1813-1897), who was wed to John Avritt II in 1835. Five others of the family were still living in 1885—they were John H. Tucker, Rhoda Tucker Yowell, Dr. James H. Tucker, Dr. DeWitt C. Tucker, and Mrs. Virginia Tucker Owsley. Dr. DeWitt Tucker at one time owned more than 800 acres in the Bradfordsville section.

Marion Court Will Be Asked For Airport Aid

The Marion-Washington County Air Board will on Sunday seek \$500 to \$1,000 aid from Marion Fiscal Court to finance preliminary studies proposed airport between Lebanon and Springfield.

Approval from city council in both Lebanon and Springfield has already been given. The Washington Fiscal Court Tuesday voted to contribute from \$500 to \$1,000 in funds to help complete the survey studies on the airport.

The airport, which will serve both communities, will be located astride the Marion-Washington line on the Springfield Highway.

Total cost of the airport has been estimated at \$195,000. The facility will include a 3,000-foot runway with a 50-foot

James Tucker, born in 1788, was the youngest of six children who migrated from Virginia with their parents to what is now Adair County in 1790. His father, the Rev. John Tucker, in Virginia a noted divine, became a pioneer preacher in Kentucky. He and his family settled on Green River northeast of Columbia, in a fort known as Tucker's Station.

Tragedy struck them there. One day while the older boys were away hunting, the minister and his wife stepped outside to stroll around the fort. Both were killed by the ever-lurking Indians—and six children suddenly were orphaned.

Hides Children In Cave

A Negro servant, whom the children loved and knew as Stepney, cared for them and hid them in a cave until the next day. It is said that even little James, not yet three, sensing the danger, never even whimpered in the night.

The story is told—and was verified generations ago—that Stepney was almost caught one day in a wooded area with the two youngest of his charges before they reached the nearest settlement. Fortunately, he saw the redskins before they saw him.

Seizing the two youngsters, he pushed them into a hollow log, and crawled in after them,

all the while warning them not to make a sound.

They didn't. And they were not a moment too soon. A party of about eight, for the Indians were close on their trail. They pattered about suspiciously, and two of the foraging party sat down on the very log that hid the frightened children. If Stepney was a religious darkey, he must have prayed then, for in a little while the Indians moved on.

Once more, two little lives were spared.

All six of the young Tuckers—Matthew, Edmund, Clarinda, Polly, Frances and James—were reared by different parties in the early settlements. Edmund, when grown, went to Mississippi; Matthew and Clarinda, to Missouri.

James Finds Way To Kentucky

James found his way to Kentucky. He served in the War of 1812 and, one of the earliest settlers on the Rolling Fork, was both farmer and magistrate in present Marion County while it still was a part of Washington. He married Nancy Tinnett (1791-1856), a native of Maryland, and they were the parents of 12 children—four sons and eight daughters. All probably were reared in the old Tucker house—or at least on the old Tucker land—across the river from the house here pictured.

It was their daughter, Elizabeth (1813-1897), who was wed to John Avrilt II in 1835. Five others of the family were still living in 1885—they were John H. Tucker, Rhoda Tucker Yowell, Dr. James H. Tucker, Dr. DeWitt C. Tucker, and Mrs. Virginia Tucker Owsley. Dr. DeWitt Tucker at one time owned more than 800 acres in the Bradfordsville section.

Virginia Tucker married, first, Leonard Taylor, and second, Lucien C. Owsley. She was the mother of John Taylor, former Bradfordsville resident, and grandmother of Mrs. Robert L. Isaacs, and Mrs. D. A. Robinson, Lebanon.

Early Home Not Known

The record does not show where John and Elizabeth Tucker Avrilt made their home during their early married years. It is possible that they were with the Tucker family, across the river. Five of the nine Avrilt children were born before 1850: Mary Jane Avrilt (1836), married George McKinney Frye of Casey County, and had seven children; Dr. Beauford E. Avrilt (1839), never married, who was for many years a practicing physician at

died at the age of six, and George Clinton

County. They were the parents of four daugh-
ters and three sons. Of the daughters, Anna
Frye married George K. Thornton of Brad-
fordsville and was the mother of Mrs. Rosa
Thornton Raney, still of Bradfordsville, and the
late Miss Maggie Frye Thornton; Elizabeth
Frye married, first, Will Thompson, and, sec-
ond, Thomas Beard of Bradfordsville. Their
only daughter, Mrs. Hugh Minor, now is a res-

most of his life in this old house, too, and Eliza-
beth Marshall (Betty) Avritt, born in 1858, who
was wed to William Purdy, made her home at
Bradfordsville, and reared a family of four,
all now living.

They are John Purdy, still of Bradfordsville;
Mrs. Henry Wooley, also of Bradfordsville; Mrs.
Lucy Byrd, Foley, Ala., and Mrs. Bess Baudion,
of Florida.

This House 'Has Had It'

They say "It takes a heap o' livin' in a
house to make it a home." This old house—to
use a modern phrase—"has had it." And after
weathering more than a century, still is a big
comfortable country home. Big and roomy.
And there is a broad, shady lawn.

Its facing on a small side road now, instead
of the main highway, seems to matter not at
all. In fact, Jim and Joe Avritt are remem-
bered as two of the enthusiastic backers of the
new road.

The house has six downstairs rooms, be-
sides the center hall—and four rooms, with
similar hall, above. As in many houses of its
era, there are two stairways, one of which
serves only the two front rooms upstairs; the
other leads to the two upper rooms at the
rear. They do not (or originally did not) con-
nect abovestairs.

All the rooms are large, with high ceilings
and big old-fashioned fireplaces, with lovely
mantels. There are tall, built-in cupboards,
too. The floors are sound, and the woodwork,
good. Many interior details have been mod-
ernized for present-day living, but the all-over
plan of the old house seems to serve much as
it did in the past.

It served the Avritts well. All of the chil-
dren grew up there.

There must have been many lovely old
pieces of furniture, in those big rooms. What

became of them all? Nobody really knows. Odd
pieces, no doubt, are scattered among the de-
scendants, or, bought at sale, are in use in
other farm homes of the neighborhood.

Great-Grandson Owns Secretary

An old secretary, greatly prized, today is
owned by A. S. Frye of Somerset, John Av-
ritt's great-grandson. It was given to him by
his great-uncle Jim, who said it was made for
his grandfather Tucker by an itinerant furni-
ture maker, named Levi Tarr, when the Tuck-
ers lived across the North Fork, opposite the
Avritt place.

The aging parents lived to see their chil-
dren and grandchildren visit and revisit the old
place, too. Both lived to be 84. Avritt died in
1894, and his wife in 1897.

A great-grandson today remembers John
Avritt as an old man, small and bent-over,
leaning on a cane. He remembers, too, that
his mother scolded him—at the age of four—
for bending over a stick and limping along,
mimicking his grandsire. She told him he
might someday be old and bent, too, and it
wouldn't be funny. That was more than 60 years
ago—but it was a lesson the boy never forgot.

John and Elizabeth Tucker Avritt had pur-
chased the Tucker land after the elder Tuckers
died, and after the death of John and Elizabeth
Avritt, two Avritt sons, Jim and Joel, bought
the interest of the other heirs in the property
and operated it jointly.

They Courted For 75 Years

Jim never married, though he is said to
have courted the late Miss Ida Thornton for
75 years!

Joe married Miss Lulia Phillips, a sister of
Mrs. Sam Avritt, and they with their only
daughter, Josephine (Mrs. Blandford), made
their home at the old homestead. After the
death of Mrs. Lulia Phillips Avritt, Joe mar-
ried, second, Miss Pat Drye.

The daughter, Josephine, married William
O. Blandford, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas
W. Blandford of Lebanon, who had built the
brick house on West Main that the Sam Avritts
later owned and occupied. The W. O. Bland-
fords, who lived in Lebanon most of their mar-
ried life, with the exception of a few years
spent in Louisville, had two sons, Joe and Wil-
liam O. "Billy" Blandford, Jr., and a daugh-
ter, Alice, who married W. T. Jones, Lebanon,
and now widowed, lives in Louisville.

Known as the "Jim and Joe Avritt place,"
the farms on both sides of the river were op-
erated by the two brothers until Joel's death
in 1930. To settle the estate, Joel's daughter,
Mrs. Blandford, took the original Avritt tract,
and Jim Avritt took the former Tucker land.

He stayed on at the Avritt place for a time
to run the farm for Joel's widow, but they later
let the place to tenants and moved into Brad-
fordsville, where his death occurred a few
years later.

Dr. Duncan Salot of Lebanon, was purchaser
of the Tucker farm when it was offered for
sale.

Those who have lived in the big Avritt house
"with its front to the back," since the family
is no longer there, have included the N. B.
Whitlocks, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Russell, Mr.

She was a daughter of Harrison and Mary (Purdy) Thornton the former of whom was born in Marion Co., KY and died in Elville this state. He followed the trade of a showemaker; voted the Democratic ticket and belonged to the Christian Church. His wife was born, lived and died in Marion Co., KY.

Anthony A. Arvitt was educated in the public schools of Owensboro and then went to work in the planning mill of J. B. Griffen and Company, where he was employed 10 years. After which he was for 6 years in J. B. Grady's Planning mill. In 1904 he engaged in the general repair of bicycles, guns, etc in which he continued to the present time with the exception of the years 1907-09 which he was connected with the Root, Dry Goods Co. at Terre Haute, IN. Mr. Arvitt has been married twice. On April 3 1903 near Whitesville, KY he wedded Miss Annie Berry who was born 1881 and died in 1904. She was the daughter of the late T. M. Berry of that place, to this union was born a daughter Maggie Hale, who is now deceased. First I recommend my soul to God who gave it Second that my body may be buried in a good christian like manner and after my Burial expenses and all my Just Debts are paid I give and Bequeath the ballance of my estate as follows (To wit) Third I give and bequeath to my Sister Elizabeth Philips wife of Benjamin Philips for the use of her two children the lawful heirs of her own body namely Robert and Elizabeth twenty five dollars each fourth I give and bequeath unto my brother Edmund Purdy one dollar. fifth I give and bequeath to my Sister Nancy Alexander decd heirs the lawful heirs of her own body namely John Elizabeth William and Eleanor Alexander Twelve dollars and a half each. Sixth I give and bequeath to my Brother Henry Purdy fifty dollars. Seventh I give and bequeath to my brother John Purdy fifty dollars eighth I give and bequeath to my Brother Aaron Purdy fifty dollars provided he comes personally himself to receive it if not it is to belong to the residue of my estate as I shall hereafter direct. Nineth I give and bequeath unto my brother Stephen Purdy one dollar. Tenth I give and bequeath to Patsey Brecken wife of William G. Brecken one negro girl named Nell about six years old all my Slack household and Kitchen furniture and all the crop of every discripti and five hundred dollars in money that is to say for her special use and not to be used for the Debts of William G. Brecken and not to be considered his in any wise. eleventh I also will the Balance of my estate to be sold on a Twelve month credit and after all my just debts are paid to be equally divided among the lawful heirs of Patsey Brèckens own body. Twelfth it is also my will that at the Death of Patsey Brecken that all the part of my estate which I have

In the name of God, Amen, I, Stephen Purdy, a resident citizen of Marion County, Kentucky having been in a weak and lingering state of bodily health for some months and now being able to walk about my house and being of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking any former will by me made.

Item first: I will my soul to God who gave it to me and my body to the dust from whence it came, to be decently buried.

Item second: My wife is getting old and to some extent helpless, I therefore will and bequeath to her \$1000 in money collected from the proceeds of the sale of my land, this money she should have absolutely to do as she pleases with. I also give to her my buggy horse and my buggy and harness, also the beds, bedsteads and furniture, of her choice. My sideboards, bureau and desk, all my cupboard ware and table furniture. These things she shall have absolutely to do as she pleases with. I also will to her my negro girl, Rachael, to have and use and possess for and during the life of my said wife, Margaret Purdy.

Item third: As to all my other beds, bedsteads and furniture, I do hereby will them all to my wife for her to give and dispose of them to my children and grandchildren or to such of them as she may choose and at such time and in such proportion as she may desire, as she with her work, industry and labor made them all or most of them.

Item fourth: My son, John Purdy is dead, he left a widow and six children who are yet alive. I have made considerable payments heretofore in the lifetime of said John. I hold a mortgage on a house and lot for some of it, that mortgage, I desire to have foreclosed and those debts therein paid. I do hereby will to W.W. Purdy, the oldest child of said John one dollar and to Stephen Purdy, second child of said John I will the sum of \$200, to the four other children of said John, to wit: Samuel Purdy, Elvira Purdy, John Purdy and Jane Purdy, I will the sum of \$200 to each of them. These bequests to my said grand children are to be paid as follows: payment to W.W. Purdy at my death and payments to the other five to be made out of the last payment of the purchase price for which my land shall be sold, payments to be made to the oldest when he arrives at 21 years of age and if he arrives at that age before the land money aforesaid is collected then interest is to be paid on said bequest from the time he comes of age until it is collected and payment to be made to each of the other children in the same way as they severally become of age and if not ready to be paid when they are each of age the bequest to draw interest from the time they severally become of age. In no event shall the mother of said five children last named inherit or have any part of said fund, but in case any one of the children dies before receiving the bequests then those living shall have it in equal parts.

Item fifth: I have hereto fore advanced money to my son, Albin, who is dead and have his notes for \$800 due in 1840. I therefore hereby will to his son, James C. Purdy, the sum of \$1000 to be paid to him when he becomes 21 years old with such interest on it as shall accrue from the time he becomes 21 years old and if he dies before he becomes 21 years old then nothing is to be paid to him.

Item sixth: My daughter, Jane Graham, is dead, she left three children, James, Isaac and John. I will to the said John Graham \$2000 to be paid to him when he becomes 21 years old to bear interest from the time the last payment for the sale of my land is due. I will to said James and Isaac Graham the sum of \$1000 to be divided equally between them, payment to be made when they severally become 21 years old, with interest from the time the last payment in this Item sixth to be made to John M Graham as guardian for said children. In case either James or Isaac should die before they are 21 years old then the survivor shall have the whole \$1000 and if they both die before they are 21 years old, John shall have it and if John dies before he is 21 years old then James and Isaac or the survivor shall have his \$2000.

Item seventh: I will to my son, Benjamin F. Purdy, the sum of \$2000 in money, this is over and above what my son owes me and which he shall not be required to pay. The \$2000 shall be paid to said Benjamin F. Purdy when the last payment for the land is due and as my said son has the

receipt and covenant required. If said Edward C. dies before he receives the \$1000 then his child shall not be allowed to receive it until said child is 21 years old and then he shall have it with interest from the time due and if said Edward C. received said \$1000 and afterwards dies before his child is 21 years old, then Edward's representative shall refund said \$1000 to my executor to hold for said child until he is 21 years old and this shall be embraced in the receipt and covenant to be given by said Edward C.

Item tenth: My negro, Rachael, who is willed to my wife for her life shall be sold at her death to the highest bidder, my children above being allowed to bid and the one only to have her that she is willing to live with, provided said child shall pay \$1000 for her. If none will give that or she is unwilling to go to any of them then she shall be sold to any person who will bid the highest price at public sale.

Item eleventh:

I may sell my land before I die but in case I do not, I will that it shall be sold at my death or as soon afterward as may be, the sale shall be public to the highest bidder provided it shall not be sold unless it brings \$52 per acre. The terms of sale shall be 1/3 cash in hand, 1/3 on a credit of one year and 1/3 on a credit of 2 years both payments with interest from date. If the land will not sell for that price, it shall be rented out from year to year until it brings that price.

reserving however to my wife in case it is rented the use of the houses, yards, stables and as much of the land as she may want to cultivate until it is sold.

Item twelfth: I have two other negroes, George and Patsy, and stock of horses and other kinds with farming tools and with all of which property together with all other property not mentioned. I will to be sold after my death on a credit of twelve months. The purchase money for the negroes shall bear interest from date. I prefer that one of my children shall buy George and any one that will give \$1200 for him shall have him at that if George is willing to go to him. I may sell or give off some of my other property before I die.

Item thirteenth : I have notes and claims due me from others than my children which are to be collected and that fund together with the proceeds of land, slaves and other property shall constitute the fund out of which the special bequests shall be paid and then my debts shall be paid fully and all the balance of my estate shall be equally divided between the persons hereafter named.

Item fourteenth : I purchased the residuary interest in the tract of land on the Rolling Fork which was allotted to Caroline Gartin, widow of N.H. Gartin. I have not yet paid for it- if I have it to pay for as I expect I will then I will said land to my grandson, John Graham, to him and his heirs forever.

Item fifteenth: My executors shall be paid out of my estate the sum of \$50 for selling my home land, collecting and distributing the proceeds and shall have such other reasonable pay for other services as may be proper.

Item sixteenth: The persons who are to receive the balance of my estate as named in Item thirteenth are B.F. Purdy, Xerxes Purdy, Phillip Purdy, Edward C. Purdy, and the three children of Jane Graham, the first four named are each to take a share and the children of Jane Graham one share equally divided. In making this distribution the notes I hold on B.F. Purdy, Xerxes Purdy, and Phillip Purdy shall be counted with the interest on them and shall constitute so much of their several amounts or shares and all the provisions and restrictions made in the former facts of my will in the special bequests to the above named persons in Items sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, and tenth of this will shall be applicable and constitute parts of this Item and the bequests under it.

Item seventeenth: When my wife dies and the negro, Rachael, is sold the proceeds of sale shall be distributed and divided among the same persons as named in Item sixteenth of this will with the same restrictions and provisions and conditions as therein provided and referred to and now lastly, I hereby nominate, constitute, and appoint my sons, B.F. Purdy and Xerxes Purdy, executors of this will.

Will of Richard Vandike

In the Name of God, Amen, I, Richard Vandike being very weak and flow of body but of perfect mind and memory calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all, once to die; do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament principally and first of all I recommend my Soul to Almighty God, who gave it and body to the earth to be buried decently at the discretion of my friends, nothing doubting but I shall receive the same at the general resurrection by the Almighty Power of God and as touching the worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to help me in this life, I give and bequeath in the manner and form as following.

Viz: First I give and bequeath to Polly Vandike, my dearly beloved wife, all my estate both real and personal after the payment of all my just debts, to be for her proper use as long as she remains my widow but if she marries again, she is only to have the household furniture, the sorrel mare, one cow, and four sheep and she can advance the stock but as soon as she marries my land is to be sold at two years credit, the personal estate to be sold at one years credit except Phillip, he is to be hired out to the highest bidder yearly until the youngest child comes of age, then he is to be sold and the money to be equally divided amongst all my children as they come of age. My will and desire is at my wife's decease if she continues my widow that all my children come in for an equal divide of my estate, my desire is that Phillip have the choosing of his master when he is sold. I constitute and ordain my trusty friends, John Scandland and Travis Coppage of them no security is required to execute this my Last Will and Testament specifying and confirming this and no other to be my Last Will and Testament. In testimony I hereto set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen.

Genealogy From The Long Ago

(Old Scrapbook - 1890s)

Editor's Note: We have come across an interesting collection of old clippings dealing with Kentucky family history. Since these clippings are over 100 years old, your editor feels they will be of interest to many of our readers. We will continue this column each month until the supply is gone.

Wade

Robert Wade lived in Halifax County, Virginia, where his son, Hampton Wade, was born on March 22, 1757. He lived there until his son, David Wade, was born on December 5, 1797, and then moved to Kentucky in 1811. Hampton Wade served in the Revolutionary War, 1776-1778 and was at Valley Forge. David Wade was in the War of 1812. It is believed that Stephen Wade was the first Wade born in America at Jamestown, Virginia.

Talbott

Samuel Talbott lived in Fairfax County, Virginia. He married Mary Magdalene DeMovill. Their children were DeMorrill Talbott, born July 25, 1754; Samuel, born March 17, 1756; Presley, born April 9, 1758; Nancy, born December 28, 1760; Jemina, born October 15, 1762; Rodham, born February 15, 1764; Sampson, born November 27, 1767; Hannah N., born January 11, 1770; Katherine, born December 3, 1772; and Ann, born May 27, 1774. His wife, Mary DeMovill Talbott, died July 2, 1791, in Virginia. Several of their children moved to Bourbon County, Kentucky.

Payne

Jasper was born in a blockhouse in Fairfax or Culpeper County, Virginia, about 1746. He married Elizabeth Harris about 1787. He moved with his wife and children to Kentucky in 1806, and they settled in Meade County above Brandenburg. He had three sons: Thomas, Lewis, and Richard. He had two daughters: Sadie and Elizabeth. His father's name was William.

Allen

James Allen was born in Vermont and lived on a farm in or near Louisville, Jefferson County, Kentucky. His oldest child, Samuel, was born there on February 16, 1817. There were two other sons, Thomas and George, and three daughters whose names are not known.

Samuel went to Minnesota in 1850 and never heard from his family again. Thomas went to California in 1849. Samuel Allen believed his grandfather was Samuel, son of Ethan Allen. James Allen was in the War of 1812.

Louisville

In 1780 the Legislature of Virginia passed an act for establishing the town of Louisville, named in honor of the ill-fated French monarch, Louis XVI, whose troops were then assisting the colonies in the war against England. By this act, John Todd, Jr.; Stephen Trigg; George Slaughter; John Floyd; William Pope; George Meriweather; Andrew Hynes; and James Sullivan were appointed to lay off the town on a tract of 1,000 acres of land, which had been granted to John Connolly by the British government. He forfeited it by adhering to the English monarch. Each person was to build on his own lot a dwelling house, 16 feet by 20 feet, at least, with a brick or stone chimney. It was to be finished within two years from the day of the sale.

Averett

William Averett was captured by the Indians (date unknown); carried to Canada; escaped; walked back to Lunenburg County, Virginia; and married Elizabeth Hamlett. He had two brothers, Matthew and George. Matthew went to Georgia, and George went to Tennessee. Averett is spelled Averett, Avery, Avritt, and Averitt.

Willis

William Willis and wife, Elizabeth Garnett, were the parents of John Willis, born December 11, 1787, died November 14, 1868, who had Elizabeth/Betsey Willis, born January 10, 1795, and died May 24, 1877. She married George Cornelius, August 11, 1814. They were the parents of 12 children: Edward G., Indianapolis, Indiana, born 1833; Matilda, born 1818, who married Henry T. Gaines of Boone County, Kentucky, now of Shelby County, Indiana; P. S. Cornelius, Indianapolis, born 1826; and others. John moved in 1834 to Indiana. The Willises were of Welsh descent.

William Averett was captured by Indians and carried to Canada, escaped, and walked back to Lunenburg County, Virginia. He married Elizabeth Hamlett. He had two brothers, Matthew and George. Matthew went to Georgia and George to Tennessee. The name may have previously been spelled Avery, Avritt, Averitt, or Averett.

Dandridge

Nathaniel West, third son of Col. John West, was living October 30, 1723, died soon after. Married in 1699, a lady in her 16th year. His widow married first a Macon, then a Bigger. Nathaniel West's only child, Winty, married prior to March 17, 1719. William Dandridge (an uncle to Mrs. General Washington) and had first, Nathaniel West Dandridge, William Dandridge, Martha Dandridge, Elizabeth Dandridge, Ann and Mary Dandridge.

Raine

Elisabeth or Betsy Talbot, wife of John Raine, Sr., was the daughter of Isham Talbot, a soldier of the Revolution, who was born in Bedford County, Virginia, in 1760, and is buried in the old "Western Cemetery" of Louisville, Kentucky, where he died in 1839. Isham married Jane, his cousin, sister of the Hon. Isham Talbot, of Frankfort, Kentucky. The family have produced men of prominence in Virginia and Maryland prior to the Revolution and during that period. John Raine, Jr., died at the Galt House. A sister of John Raine, Sr., married a Major,

Edmonson

Capt. John Edmonson, of Fayette County, was killed at River Raisin, January 23, 1813, had a grandfather who came to America from the North of Ireland and settled in Maryland. His father, Col. William Edmonson, was born in Cecil County, Maryland, in 1734, and died in Washington County, Virginia, in

1822. His mother was Nancy Montgomery. Capt. John was born in Washington County, Virginia, ca. 1860, and served under his father at the Battle of King's Mountain. He married his cousin, Margaret Montgomery, and they settled on Boone Creek, Kentucky, in 1790. Their only son was Alexander, who died unmarried in Lancaster Kentucky, in 1812. Their daughter, Mary, married (1) James Richardson and (2) James Carter. Another daughter, whose name was either Margaret or Rebecca, married William Prewitt. He has many descendants.

Shipp

Latan Shipp was an early pioneer who is believed to have settled in Scott County, Kentucky, and later settled in Southern Kentucky. Latan married Sarah Johnson (aunt of Richard M.).

McMonigle

Barnett McMonigle came from Dengal, Ireland, and located in Hampshire County, Virginia (now West Virginia), where he married Sarah Pyle, daughter of Richard Pyle. Barnett McMonigle removed with his family to Kentucky. In 1814 he purchased a large acreage of land in what is now Lee County (then in Estill), fronting on the Kentucky River, from the south of Miller's Creek to a place later known as "Old Landing." Here, he built his home and lived and died. He, his wife, and many of their early descendants lie buried in the family graveyard, which was located in his orchard, about 50 yards from the house. Although the name McMonigle

has all but disappeared from Kentucky, many people now living can trace their ancestry to Barnett (Barney) McMonigle. Children: (1) Aaron McMonigle, married Polly Noland, daughter of Jesse, on May 23, 1816; (2) Amos McMonigle, married Susan.

Graham-Slemons

Elizabeth Graham married William Selmons, and they have descendants living in Clinton, Missouri, some named Slemons. Mary married William McCamant, and they lived in Pennsylvania for many years, and finally came to St. Louis, Missouri, and died there. Rachel married David G. Bright. They were the parents of Michael Graham Bright, Senator Jesse D. Bright, of Indiana; George M. Bright, and four daughters; Margaret Graham married Thomas Slemons, brother of William Slemons. Four of their eight children died before their mother. Those who survived her were Margaret, afterward Mrs. John Carver, of Shelbyville, Kentucky; Sarah, afterward Mrs. James McCamant, of St. Louis, Missouri; Adaline, afterward Mrs. William Bard, of Bardstown, Kentucky; and Thomas W. Slemons, of New Orleans, Louisiana; all of whom are now dead. There are now living eight grandchildren of Mrs. Slemons.

Garrett

John Garrett, of Scott County, and Robert Garrett, of Montgomery County, Kentucky, were Revolutionary pensioners. John died in 1818, aged 78. Robert, private, died December 25, 1838, aged
