Dr. Jos. A. Baute, one of Somerset's most prominent citizens, died Sunday afternoon following an illness of about nine months. Funeral services were held Tuesday morning, nine o'clock, at St. Mildred's Catholic church, conducted by Rev. J. D. Fallon. Interment followed in the city cemetery.

Dr. Baute was one of Somerset's leading physicians and citizens. He was prominent, not only at home, but throughout the state, in his profession. He had been a practitioner for 28 years and specialized more or less in children's diseases. He had attained the highest degree of success in his work.

In 1896 Dr. Baute married Miss Barbara Stadler, and seven children blessed the home, all of whom survive, with the widow. They are: Edwin Arthur, Jos. Andrew, Mary Catherine, Helen Marguerite, Bernard James, Elizabeth Cecilia, and Anna Louise.

Last March Dr. Baute suffered from a severe attack of flu. He recovered sufficiently to go about his business, but the effects of that illness caused other complications and he soon had to give up his practice. In the past few weeks it was thought he was improving, but on Sunday he suddenly grew worse and the end came shortly.

Somerset always mourns the loss of one of her citizens, but more especially one who has taken a prominent part in the business and social life of the community.
