Dear Mr. Borders:

I surely enjoyed receiving your letter and the results of your research on the family. I am happy that you shared this with me, and perhaps from my own memory and conversations with my grandfather and great-uncles, who incidentally are your great-uncles, I can add something for you to the family lore.

We definitely share William Borders as our great-grandfather, and thus together move back in history by emigration from Scotland two generations before the Revolutionary War. This is through oral tradition rather than documentation. The family moved from Virginia, not too far from the Cumberland Gap and the confluence of Maryland, Virginia, and West Virginia, after the Revolutionary War to Bardstown, Kentucky. Again, according to family lore, our great-great-grandfather fought with Light Horse Harry Lee; as a result of that involvement he received a land grant in Kentucky.

My grandfather was Palmer Borders, and he had 10 children, the third youngest of whom was my father, Thomas Martin. I knew our great-uncles Tom and Andrew very well. My grandfather, Palmer, and great-uncle Tom died at our home when I was a boy, and they were my primary sources of information relative to past history. My aunt Zita was a Revolutionary War buff who, I think, sometimes mixed fiction with history, but the Scottish ancestry and the relationship with Light Horse Harry Lee I think are factual. The sword that our great-great-grandfather Borders used was even in our family when I was still a lad.

So it is good to find that our information is parallel--I think the credibility becomes a bit stronger!

In passing, I might remark that while traveling in Alabama between Mobile and Birmingham, about 35 years ago, I encountered another family that was a descendant of one of the original 14 who migrated to Alabama after the Civil War, since he fought for the South. Incidentally, our great-uncle Tom was a soldier for the North during the War between the States.

Again, it is good to encounter a relative, somewhat distant, but nevertheless emanating from the same source.

The following information was obtained from Aunt Maud Adams (Ama Laura (Maud) Borders) who spent many hours with Laura Purcell Borders listening to her stories.

"Laura Purcell's parents died when she was several weeks old in Washington County, Ky. She was raised by a Montgomery family (same kin to her). They were said to have been mean to her. She left the Montgomery family when she was between 3-5 yrs. old.

She went to live with an Aunt & Uncle. She said she remembered sitting & waiting outside of a pool hall waiting for her Aunt & Uncle to pick her up. The Montgomery family took her to town & left her alone to wait for her Aunt & Uncle. She said she was very scared and had on a granny gown & had her clothes wrapped in a bandana handkerchief. She said her Aunt & Uncle took her to a big

house.

Laura said she had two brothers. Lint who lived in Hopkinsville and John who lived in Hickman, Ky.

Laura had two boy slaves. One of them was named Lidge. Aunt Maud recalls Laura running into him one time in Lebanon, Ky.

Laura ran off to marry Ed. They were married in Hopkinsville, Ky. They rode there to get married on the back of a wagon.

Laura said John & Lint ran away from home when they were young. John & Lint each had two slaves of their own. Lint got one of his arms cut off while he was young.

Laura said that her grandfather was an artist.

Laura was short and smoked a clay pipe in her old age.

Laura said that one of her children

had a forked tongue. She said the only thing the child could eat was mashed potatoes. She said the child died while still an infant.

Laura's children were - John, Willie, Steve A., Ivy Nora Ellison, Annie Pearl Cochran, Emma Riddle, Bertha (died as a baby), Lee (died as a baby), Maimie (died as a baby) and Arnold.

Laura believed that her child had a forked tongue because while she was pregnant with the child she was riding a horse across a creek and a snake struck at the horse frightening the horse and her.

Laura was about 16 or 17 when she married Ed.

Laura was baptize a catholic at St. Rose Priory. The St. Rose records list her as follows:

Laura Corilla Borders nee Purcell
Age 21 yrs. baptize April 27, 1873.

In another record at St. Rose they list her name as Mary L. C. Purcell. Probably her baptize name was Mary.

Laura Corella Purcell Borders (8)

St. Rose baptismal records list another child of Edward Borders & Laura Purcell Borders not previously listed. The name was Joseph Lloyd Borders. Born March 17, 1878, baptize Oct. 12, 1878.

Laura Corella Purcell Borders (9)

Washington County - St. Rose Priory records show that Pendleton Purcell married a second time after Martha Moran's death. He married Martha Simpson and had a son James Clarence born Dec. 11, 1855, baptised April 27, 1856.

MRS. A. BORDERS TAKEN BY DEATH

Illness Is Fatal To City Woman
At Hospital Last Friday.

Mrs. Emily Susan Borders, 71, mother of the Borders Brothers, prominent Lebanon business men, and widow of A. Borders, former well known grocer, died at 1 o'clock last Friday afternoon at the Mary Immaculate Infirmary. She had been ill for several months, suffering with complications, and was admitted to the hospital about a week before her passing.

Although she was a native of Casey County, having been born there on December 31, 1875, a daughter of Robert and Annie Mudd McCain, the family moved to this county when she was an infant. She was reared here and, following her marriage, continued to make her home in Lebanon.

Eight Children Survive.

She was a lifelong and loyal member of St. Augustine's Church, consistent in her living, and a devoted wife and mother. She reared to manhood and womanhood a family of eight children, all of whom survive. They are County Judge Roy T. Borders, Robert, Lawrence, Robert, Charles and George Borders, Mrs. J. B. Adams and Mrs. Eddie Carrico, all of Lebanon. She also leaves thirty-three grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

One sister, Mrs. Joe Higdon of the county survives; a brother, Will McCain of Calhoun, and an uncle, Hugh McCain of Jacktown. Another brother, James McCain, is deceased, and a sister, Irene, died at the age of thirteen.

Burial At St. Ivo's.

After being taken to the Don V. Drye Funeral Home for preparation for burial, the body was removed to her late residence on High Street. Solemn Requiem High Mass was intoned at St. Augustine's Church at 9 o'clock Monday morning by the Rev. Joseph D. Gettelfinger and the Rev. John Elder, assisted by the Rev. Patrick Warren of Bardstown and the Rev. Thomas Caldwell of Louisville. Five grandsons were servers.

Burial was by the side of her husband in St. Ivo's Cemetery. Two grandsons, Joe Borders and Lee Adams, and four nephews, R. B., Paul, William and Cecil Higdon, served as pallbearers.
