## Mable Kirkland

Miss Mable Kirkland arrived in Springfield, October 1, 1947 to begin work as Washington County's first Home Demonstration Agent. She held this position with distinction until 1948, when she resigned following a heart attack and marriage to Mr. Paul Wheeler. Her influence is felt today in the homemaker organization. She was a conscientious worker and gave unselfishly to the best interest of all the people with whom she worked. Mrs. Ruth Colvin, extension secretary, said that Mable was the first to arrive at the office each morning and the last to leave at night. This and the many meetings she felt she had to attend, probably contributed to her heart attack.

Mable, laughingly said that when she started to organize the homemaker clubs in the county, the men named them the "Homebreakers Clubs". As a result, when she visited some of the homes, the women would not invite her into their houses. However, later these reluctant women, became her most cooperative and best leaders.

Miss Kirkland taught Home Economics at Mackville High School prior to becoming a home agent.

Mable Kirkland Wheeler is a native of Boyle County and a graduate of Perryville High School. She received a B.S. degree from Eastern Kentucky Teacher's College and has done graduate work at the University of Kentucky and VPI at Blacksburg, Virginia.

In 1953, Mrs. Wheeler received the Fellowship Award set up by the Extension Service of the University of Kentucky. She had many 4-H Champions in Washington County and two of her 4H girls became Home Demonstration Agents. She is a member of the Harrodsburg Methodist Church where she taught Sunday School Classes and served

as a missionary in Harlan, Ky. during the summer. She was recording secretary for the Westleyan Guild and was recognized as the United Methodist Woman's, Woman of the Year.

After Paul Wheeler's death, she married Mr. Leo H. Bottom in 1970. Since Mr. Bottom's death, Mrs. Bottom has filled her life with travel, church work and has compiled three books, "Jacob Minor and His Descendants", "The Charles Kirkland Family" and "Marcus Purdom and His Descendants".

Mable Bottom is the daughter of James Logan and Ellen Minor Kirkland. She has three brothers, Clarence, Roy and Kelly, also one sister Ruth Edwards.

Paul N. Miller, 76, Louisville, died at 6:50 a.m., May 18, 1999, at the Suburban Hospital, Louisville.

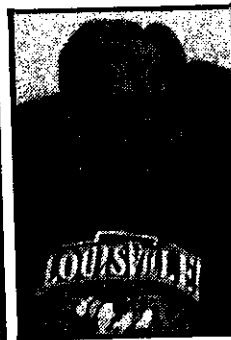
