STATE OF TENNESSEE, DAVIDSON COUNTY CRIMINAL COURT,

August TERM, 1857

BE IT REMEMBERED That this cause came on to be heard before the Honorable W. B. Turner Judge, &c., on this 18<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1857, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the said *Thophalus Brussell* was born in the Kingdom of Belgium on the 22 day of March 1831; that he emigrated to the United States in the year 1848 and that he has resided here more than five years, and that at the term 1855 of the Circuit Court of the County of Davidson said *Thophalus Brussell* made his Declaration of Intention to become a citizen of the United States, agreeably to the Statute in such cases made and provided; that the said *Thophalus Brussell* is a man of good moral character, and is attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same. And it further appearing that he has in all things complied with the laws in regard to Naturalization, and having taken an oath to support the Constitution of the United States. It is therefore ordered, adjudged, and decreed by the Court, that the said *Thophalus Brussell* be admitted to citizenship, and that he be entitled to all the rights, privileges and immunities of naturalized citizens.

### Henry Brussels Killed.

The whole community was shocked at the death of Henry Brussels which occurred at nine o'clock Friday night. Deceased is survived by his wife, father, mother and one brother who have the sympathy of friends.

Kentucky Statutes in part says:

"The teacher is authorized and directed to hold each pupil to a strict accountability for any disorderly conduct on the playground or during any intermission or recess or on the road to and from school."

Our courts have never passed directly upon this question, but have passed upon questions dealing with the suspension or expulsion of disorderly pupils from schools, but quite a number of authorities can be found from the decisions of other State courts upon both sides of this question.

After citing a number of authorities from other States he continues:

"The teacher of a Kentucky common school does have the right to inflict corporal punishment, when it becomes necessary to hold each of his or her pupils to strict accountability for any disorderly conduct on the playground, or during any intermission or recess, or on the road to and from school. But this punishment must be justified in the first place by the disorderly conduct of the pupil, and may never be excessive for it goes beyond, the teacher is not only civilly, but criminally liable."

"I long to see the day in which this custom can be done away with, but I fear that as long as Kentucky produces vivacious, energizing quick-tempered American boys it will be necessary to have hanging on the wall somewhere in sight the proverbial dogwood pointer of our grandfather schoolmasters, for this instrument was one of the greatest appreciable influences in the wonderful development and growth of American life in civilization."—Courier Journal.
