This Indenture made this twenty-first day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & seventy eight & in the Second year of the Independence of the American States Between John Williams of the County of Granville and State of North Carolina of the one part and Robert Burton of the County & State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that whereas said John Williams in conjunction with Richard Henderson, Thomas Hart, Nathaniel Hart, William Johnston, James Hogg, John Lutrell, David Hart & Sen. Henly Bullock, did lately purchase of the Cherokee Indians by deed bearing date this seventeenth day of March in the year one thousand one hundred & seventy-five a large territory, tract, or parcel of land lying on the River Ohio & branches thereof to him this Richard Henderson & Co. their heirs & assigns forever in sureity & as tenants in common not as joint tenants, one eighth part of which said tract territory or parcel of land is to this s'd John Williams his heirs & assigns forever now know ye that this s'd John Williams out of the natural affection which he bears to this said Robert Burton as well as for & in consideration of five shillings by this Robert Burton to this said John Williams in hand paid before sealing & delivery at these presents the Rec'd whereof this John Williams doth hereby acknowledge & himself therewith fully satisfied doth hereby give grant bargain & sell alien confirm & by these presents hath given granted bargained sold aliened & confirmed to this s'd Robert Burton one fourth part of this s'd Williams' one eighth part of the whole purchased by him this s'd Williams Henderson & Co. of the Cherokee Indians aforesaid To have and to hold one fourth of an one eighth to him this s's Robert Burton his heirs & assigns forever in as full & ample manner as others this said Williams holds the one eighth part with all the benefits privileges & advantages which may arise out of this one fourth of an eighth of this purchase as afores'd-- free & clear from encumbrances whatever more than a porportional part of such expenses as may hereaf arise, In supporting maintaining and defending this said land.


