Byrnside of Lebanon, Ky., took place Saturday, August 19, in the South Park Baptist Church at 7:00 p.m. The Rev. Benjamin J. Davis performed the ceremony. The church pulpit was banked with palms and yellow and pink gladioli.

"The bride, who was given in marriage by her father, was gowned in white satin made Princess style with tulle veil trimmed with orange blossoms, and carried an arm bouquet of white roses and lilies of the valley.
