Buttons Hundreds Of Years Old in Collection Here

Buttons of wood, rubber, stone, and most every other material, buttons several hundred years old, buttons from Switzerland and Panama, buttons worn by Calamity Jane—they're all a part of the collection which Mrs. G. W. Bauder started about 10 years ago.

Mrs. Bauder, a resident of Fort Collins for the last 42 years, told Coloradoan reporter who called at her home at 609 South Mel-drum street recently, "When you're nearly 100 years old, you get lazy" — and then described a variety of interests which would put a woman half her age to shame.

She long ago gave up trying to count her collection, but she has at least 10,000 buttons strung on long cords and that is probably less than half the total. She also has dozens of big cards filled with buttons neatly sewed on and identified. Particulary unusual buttons she keeps in small boxes.

Some Worth \$50

Although she started saving buttons as a hobby only in 1939, she has kept particularly interesting ones throughout her life. She and Mr. Bauder, who died a number of yeasers ago, were married in 1885 and while they were living in Deadwood, S. D., they knew Calamity Jane, so the buttons which she wore have a special significance for Mrs. Bauder. Recalling some of the incidents of days long gone, Mrs. Bauder told of seeing Calamity Jane riding on a big white horse to help victims of a black smallpox epidemic.

Mr. Bauder played at Calamity Jane's funeral and his widow still corresponds occasionally with her daughter, Mrs. Jean Hickok McCormick.

The most valuable button in the collection is a small metal one showing a head of Jesus. It is worth about \$10. There are buttons, however, Mrs. Bauder said, which are worth as much as \$50.

One Three-Incher

A native of Switzerland, she has almost filled one card with Swiss buttons. Several beautifully carved, hand-painted, buttons from the Panana Canal zone were made especially for Mrs. Bauder.

Her collection also includes one of the largest buttons made. About three inches in diameter, it was the single fastener for a coat. She has, of course, a number of interesting campaign buttons, among them a Lincoln button, a Liberty victory loan one and one proclaiming "Governor Wilson Suits Me."

Among her quaintest buttons are the pretty "calico" ones used on sunbonnets and aprons which had sleeves. A delicate hand-painted porcelain one was the gift of Mrs. Harry Hay, whose family had had it for several generations.

Has Old Testament

Buttons are not Mrs. Bauder's only hobby. "I've been gathering things ever since I was a

child," she said. A bookcase in the livingroom of her home contains such varied items as a 17-year locust and a buffalo knife from the Phillppines.

One of her prized articles is a testament which was presented to her parents when they arrived in this country from Switzerland in 1850. Painting was one of her hobbies when her eyesight was better. From the flower garden which is another of her interests she gave us a rosebud.

Her daughter, Miss Katharyn Bauder, who is supervisor of vocal music in the Fort Collins public schools, is also a collector. Her hobby is glasses.
