# LOOKING UP THE FAMILY TREE

## The Carrico Family

The Carrico name is found in nearly every state in the Union, and all or most of the migration to the Central and Western states was through Kentucky. The name has a number of variations in spelling, the most usual form being C-a-r-r-i-c-o, which is used throughout this article. Other spellings found have been: Carico, Caricoe, Carricoe, Carracho, Calico, Callico and Cerico.

The Carricos were and are adherents of many religious sects—Catholics, Methodists, Baptists, Presbyterians, and Mormons have been encountered.

### ABEL AND PETER CARRICO

The names of Abel and Peter Carrico appear in Maryland records early in the seventeen-hundreds. The earliest date found, as yet, is 1707, when Peter Carrico of Charles County, executed a deed conveying some property to Walter Story. In 1730 Peter deeded to Abel a property in Charles County. In 1764 Peter, Sr., executed a deed to Peter, Jr. It is interesting to note, in further confirmation of the tradition that Abel and Peter were brothers, that Abel named one of his sons Peter, and that Peter named a son Abel. Peter, Sr., lived out his life in Bryantown Hundred, Charles County, Maryland, while Abel later removed from Charles County to Fairfax County, Virginia.

### ABEL AND ELIZABETH (SIMMS) CARRICO

**ABEL CARRICO, SR.** The date of Abel Carrico's birth is not known. He married Elizabeth, daughter of Marmaduke Simms, about the year 1730 in Charles County, Maryland. Family tradition has it that he was a man of small stature and that he was a Huguenot. In 1785 he was residing in Fairfax County, Virginia, the head of a family of nine "white souls." He died about 1790 while visiting his son, William Carrico, at Galax, Grayson County, Virginia, and is buried there.

→ The children of Abel and Elizabeth (Simms) Carrico were:

Rev. William Carrico, born in Maryland; died in Galax, Grayson County, Virginia. He was a prominent Methodist minister for many years. He, after leaving the old home in Fairfax County, Virginia, first went to North Carolina, where he married Jane Taylor. He later removed to Galax where he lived until his death, about 1805.

Abel Carrico, Jr., married Ann Kent, daughter of Benoni and Jean Kent, in Fairfax County, Virginia. Several children were born to them. (Aunt)

Mary Ann Carrico, born July 4, 1757, married William O'Nan (1754-1825) in 1777, son of James O'Nan of Culpeper County, Virginia. She died about 1830, in Henry County, Kentucky. For a time they lived in Greenbrier County, Virginia, where their first son, Dennis, was born, September 25, 1778. In 1793, becoming impressed with the glowing description of Kentucky, William and Mary Ann (Carrico) O'Nan, together with six children, joined the tide of settlers in emigrating to that "Paradise Land" to take up land eagerly sought by thousands for homesites. Here in Kentucky, in that portion of Jefferson County which later became Henry County, they settled permanently and spent the rest of their lives.

These children of Abel were Nancy, Benjamin, Peter, John, & Samuel.



## PETER AND ANN (GATES) CARRICO

PETER CARRICO, SR. ( -1765), place of birth unknown; died at Bryantown Hundred, Charles County, Maryland. He married first in 1720, in Charles County, Ann Gates (7-23-1690: circa 1737), the daughter of Robert and Dorothy Gates of St. Marys County, Maryland.

The will of Robert Gates of St. Marys County, Maryland, signed February 5, 1694, and probated June 6, 1698, shows names of wife, Dorothy, also issue with birth dates; John, 1681; Robert, 1686; Catherine, 1687; Susanna, 1688; Joseph, 1689 and Ann Gates, born July 23, 1690. He willed 80 acres, part of "Maidstone," to Ann. To wife Dorothy, a 20 acre part of "Maidstone" which was purchased from Thomas Hunt. (*Maryland Calendar of Wills*, Baldwin, Vol. II, page 148, Maryland Historical Society, Baltimore, Maryland.)

Born to this marriage of Peter Carrico, Sr., and Ann (Gates) Carrico were:

Peter Carrico, Jr., born about 1722 in Charles County, Maryland.

## PETER AND MARGARET (GATES) CARRICO

PETER CARRICO, SR., married second, about 1738, in Charles County, Maryland, Margaret Gates, probably a cousin of his first wife, Ann Gates. Margaret was the daughter of James and Jaynet (Boarman?) Gates, of Charles County, Maryland. Peter left a will signed April 14, 1764, which was probated in Charles County, October 18, 1765. In this will are named his wife, Margaret, and five sons, who according to family history were born to this second marriage.

It was customary in colonial wills to name children in the order of their birth. An approximation of the birth dates of these sons has been arrived at, based on this custom and the birth-date of Thomas Ignatius, the second son, given as 1741 in the census of 1776 of Prince Georges County, Maryland, which gave the ages of both him and his wife, Elizabeth, as 35 years.

The sons of Peter and Margaret (Gates) Carrico, as named in his will, were:

John Carrico, born about 1739 in Charles County, Maryland. He subscribed to the Oath of Loyalty and Support, 1778, in Charles County. He inherited one-fourth of the property called "Maidstone" at the death of his mother, under the terms of his father's will. We know that he was married and that he died prior to 1790, because the census of that year of Charles County lists Monica as the widow of John Carrico. It is probable that Monica's maiden name was Bryant, as we find that Theresa (Bryant) Hagan willed some sheep to Monica, and John Carrico was on the bond of Catherine Bryant, widow and executrix of the estate of John Bryant of Charles County, Maryland, March 5, 1758.

James Carrico, third son of Peter and Margaret (Gates) Carrico, was born about 1743 at Bryantown Hundred, Charles County, Maryland. He married about the year 1763 in Charles County, Maryland, and died intestate in Charles County in 1803. No record has been found of his wife's name.

John Martin, second son of James Carrico (above) married Ann Donoho, daughter of John Donoho of Charles County, Md.

Dennis Carrico married first, Miss Jan Clark in Burks Co., Pennsylvania, and second wife was Amy (Jamison) James, the daughter of Joseph and Sally (Hubbard) Jamison. She was the widow of Phenias James who is buried at Cold Water Cemetery in north St. Louis County, Missouri. Dennis Carrico was shown on the Tax Rolls of Nelson County, Kentucky in 1801.

Cornelius Carrico, born 1772, married first time, Susanna Shanks in Nelson County, Ky. on January 27, 1806, and his second wife was Theresa O'Bryan. (Married May 24, 1823).

Walter Carrico married Helen O' Bryan on January 6, 1802, in Washington County, Ky.

Tresy (Thoresa?) Carrico married Francis H. O'Bryan in Washington County, Ky. on November 4, 1823.

Vincent Carrico, the Missouri Pioneer, married Susannah Quick, the daughter of Benjamin Quick. They were the parents of at least twelve children.



Editor's note: The Carricos have several generations of descendants living in Missouri at the present time. Part of the family married into the Patterson family, and some of the daughters married Musicks. Lydia, born 1806, married Reuben Musick, who owned and operated the ferry across the Missouri River at the end of New Hallsferry Road. Her sister, Melanie, married Burr Fugate.

The family burying ground is located on private property at the end of Spanish Pond Road in north St. Louis County, Missouri.

He made deeds to land in Charles County Md. in 1707- 1730-1765. He died in 1765.

His will dated April 14th, 1764 and proved Oct. 18th 1765, mentions his wife Margaret and 5 sons.

He married Margaret Gates, and was brother in law of Joseph Gates of Charles County.

Sons mentioned in Will are - John, James, Thomas Ignatius, and Basil. ~~Two~~ other sons and one daughter not mentioned (Abel, Janc, Bartholomew.) Tradition is they inherited their share previously.

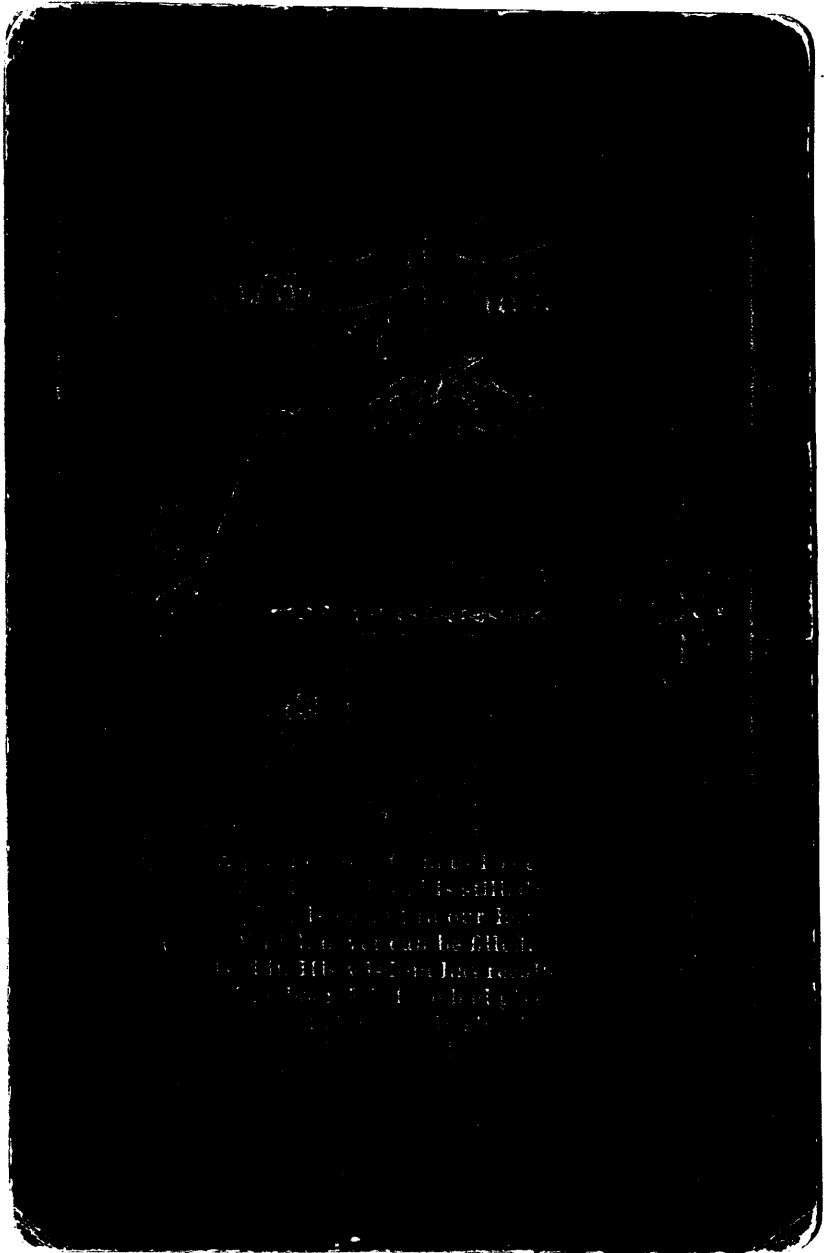

# Lost Records

## COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY VS. JOHN W. CARRICO

*The following letter from research box K concerns the trial of John W. Carrico, who was charged with murder in a trial that took place in Washington County Circuit Court in 1869. Carrico was accused of shooting David Smith with a double barrel shotgun in the early morning of 16 January 1869 in Fredericktown. A plat in the papers sets the scene of the crime, a place called "the doctor shop." Smith was apparently traveling along the turnpike near The Doctor Shop carrying a load of corn in his arms. A flash from a gun came from the doctor shop and Smith was found nearly dead behind the Buggy House. Carrico, boarding at the house of John Marks, had a feud of sorts with David Smith since December 1868. Carrico had warned Smith to get out of town on two occasions. Smith had been drinking the evening prior to the altercation. Carrico was indicted, convicted, and sentenced to six years at hard labor in the Kentucky State Penitentiary for manslaughter. His attorneys asked for a change of venue to the Nelson County Circuit Court, and took their client's case to the Kentucky Court of Appeals. The letter is apparently from a Carrico relative, writing from Birk City, in Daviess County, on 15 June 1871 after the court case had dragged on for several years. No changes have been made to original text.*

Birk City June 15 1871

Dear Cousin John,

I wish you would find some opportunity to send the enclosed letter to Squire Marks. I am afraid to send anything through the mail on account of them treacherous devils at F. I hope you have succeeded in having Borders [James]. I begin to fear he will cause us some problem as I am also apprehending trouble with Gabe Kendrick. I wish there was some way to keep him understand that we would be able to keep him under arrest and that we will be able to have him sober when he comes on the witness stand. Is there any way we could do such a thing? I hope our council are thoroughly posted by this time. It might be well if you were to remind Mr. McKay to find out from his relative Mrs. Overton — formerly Miss Nally — if she will have the backbone to stand up to what she has affirmed about Curtsinger.

It is going to be mighty warm weather to have hard fighting to do but I believe it will be the better for me.

I feel more confidence in the fighting material now than I ever did before. And I know they will put it "thick and fast and more of it" than ever was done before.

But oh what will become of me if after all the hard fight and scientif enjinnering, I should come out in the read. I have more hope than to think such an event progable.
