THESE YOUNGSTERS RECENTLY HELD AN ENJOYABLE REUNION.



Reading from left to right, sitting are James Coppage, aged 69, Joseph Coppage, aged 73, Hardin Coppage, aged 71. The two standing are Moses A. Coppage, aged 66, and Killis Coppage, aged 64. They are sons of Uriah and Margaret (Mann) Coppage, and were reared in a family of six boys and five girls, all of whom are living except Stephen B., who died August 13, 1908. James Coppage was born October 9, 1844, and was married to Amanda F. Batzel, who died several years ago, on January 23, 1857. To the union were born two sons, both of whom are Superintendents of Railroads in the South and West. He has no permanent home, but spends the spring and summer months on his son's farm near Ft. Scott, Kansas, and superintends the garden work for pastime. The remainder of his time he spends traveling around visiting friends and relatives. Joseph Coppage, born April 9, 1841, was married to Nannie Street October 5, 1869. Two children were born to this union, one daughter, now dead, and one son, who is an engineer on the Southern Railroad. He is a resident of Covington, Ky. and, like the son, is connected with the Southern road. Hardin Coppage was born December 26, 1842, and was married to Sallie B. Stanton March 5, 1866. She has been dead several years. Three children were born to this union, two of which are living in Illinois. The son is a prosperous farmer near Modesto. Hardin is a resident of Dallas, Texas. Moses A. Coppage, who was born March 4, 1848, was married to Sallie A. Thornton, November 10, 1870. Four children were born to this union, three sons and one daughter. Two sons are residents of New York City, one of them superintends the steel work of East River tunnel from New York to Brooklyn, the other has a position with a railway. The third son lives in Dallas, Texas, with his father and is a mechanic. Killis Coppage was born May 22, 1850, and was married to Amanda Coppage November 21, 1872. To this union was born one son, who is at present a bookkeeper for the Country Club, in Illinoisville. Killis resides near his old home and is a farmer and milker. The Coppage brothers recently concluded a happy reunion at Bradfordsville.

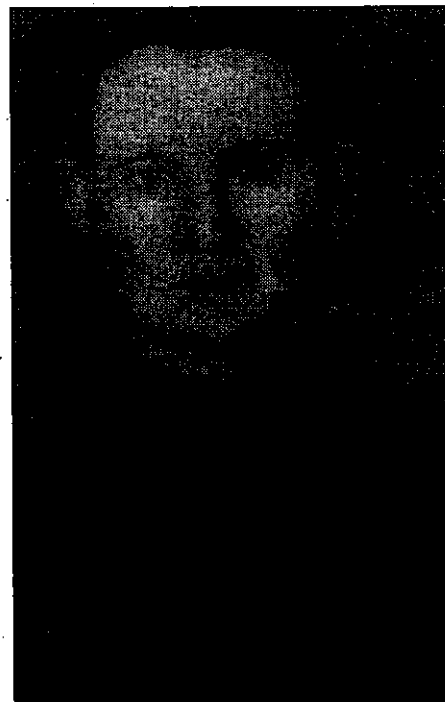

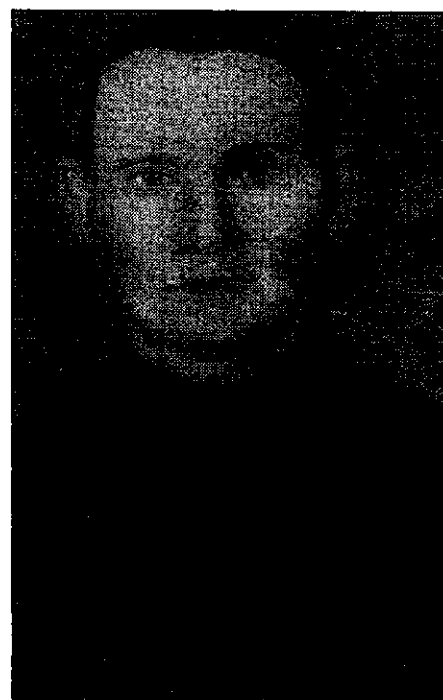
