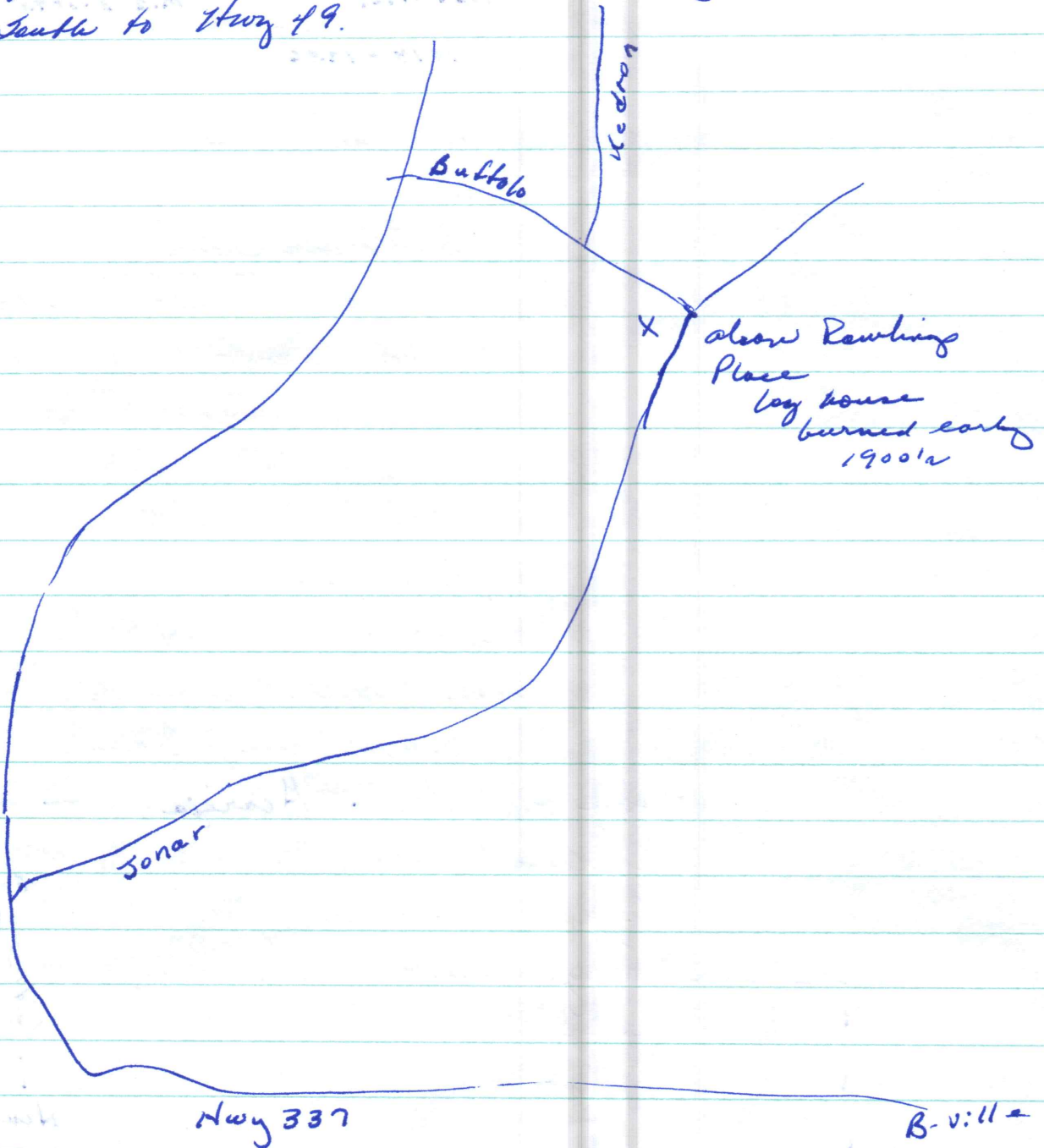

## S. T. MAYES, 89, IS TAKEN BY DEATH

Long Illness Fatal Sunday To  
Retired New Market Farmer.

Stith Thomas Mayes, 89, widely  
known retired farmer of the New  
Market community, died at his home  
there Sunday evening at 7:45 o'clock  
following a lingering illness of heart  
dropsy and other complicated troubles.  
Although he was confined to bed  
only a few days, he had long been in  
failing health and had not been  
actively engaged in farming for near-  
ly six years.

About eighteen months ago, he  
suffered a slight paralytic stroke  
but, in spite of his advanced age re-  
covered promptly. His sturdy con-  
stitution, also, enabled him to with-  
stand several subsequent strokes,  
and until a few weeks ago he seemed  
well. It was not until a few days  
ago that it became evident that his death was  
imminent.

Lived At New Market 23 Years.  
Mr. Mayes was a son of the late  
S. T. and Amy Hilton Mayes and was  
born June 1, 1860 in Washington  
County where he spent his youth. He  
came to this county as a young man  
and until his retirement followed the  
vocation of agriculture. He had liv-  
ed at New Market the past twenty-  
three years.

Twice married, his first wife pre-  
ceded him to the grave many years  
ago. On October 29, 1891, he was  
wed to Miss Carolina Howard  
Barker, who survives him. Also sur-  
viving are two sons and five daugh-

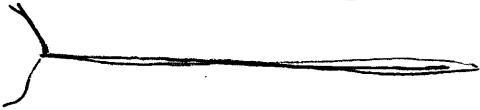
