derine Verna Elliott and they had children, Bobby Harold Daugherty, Ruth Ann Daugherty, Mary Catherine "Catherine" Daugherty (1912-1979) married Alton Parker Hall. They lived in 1 Switch and had three children, Wilma, Glonnie Parker, and Ronald Rue. Naomi Daugherty (1914-1966) married William "Bill" Cheatham, son of William and Lula (nee Smothers) Cheatham. Bill Cheatham gave birth to two children, Gloria Dean and Barbara Ellen. Durret Leonia Daugherty was born in 1917, married Virgil Hays in 1935. Her son, James Lynwood Hays was born on August 4, 1936 and buried at Green Cemetery in Washington County.

Margaret married Joseph Milton in 1943.

After the death of his first wife, Nora, William Marion Dougherty married Mrs. Rosa Whitlock Padgett in 1917. Mrs. Padgett (nee Whitlock) wife of Willie B. Padgett, had three children, Hubert, Edgar, and Margaret. According to one family member, when William and Rosa Whitlock Padgett first married they lived at the old Bagwell place on the Mose Smothers farm on the north side. They then moved to the John H. Cock farm. Rosa became widowed a short time when William Marion Dougherty died on August 4, 1942. Said to be one of Will Dougherty's grandchildren, he was a very special person. He would help anybody and give them work and help them out when they needed it." He is buried in Marion County's Pleasant Baptist Church Cemetery.

#### DRURY-WALSTON

Henry Drury (1815-1855) and wife Milly Walston (1823-1894) were both born in Marion County, Kentucky, according to a marriage bond of their daughter, Mary, February 13, 1865, Muhlenburg, Kentucky. Members of the family believe that the name was a Walston because on December 31, 1856, she was given \$900 by Albin and Anthony Walston, the executors of the estate of William Walston, who was living in the 1850 Census of Marion County, Kentucky #371. Of note, the marriage bond in 1865, was to Mary Jane Drury to William G. Walston who was

born in Marion, Kentucky. His parents, Albin and Jane Walston were both born in and living in Marion, Kentucky.

The parents of Henry Drury have not been identified. However, in the Census of Washington County, 1830, Zachariah, William, and John Drury all had sons who were about 15 years old. Only Zachariah Drury was listed in the census of Marion County, 1840 and the tax rolls of 1831, 1838-39.

William Walston was born in Brickhouse, Virginia and died in High Grove, Marion County, Kentucky. His wife Mary was born in 1799. They had five known children from 1819-1836. They include: Albin "Albany", Anthony, Mary A., Samuel H., Joseph R. Milly Drury might have been a daughter born in 1823 and the only female 5-10 (7 years) in the Census of 1830-40 Washington County for William Walston. William Walston, brother of Joseph Walston Jr. and son Albin Walston have separate family listings in the Census of 1850. Obadiah Walston probably was another brother of William Walston. Their father, Joseph Walston, Sr. is in the tax rolls of 1835-1838 Marion County.

Albin (Albany) Walston b. 1819 and wife Martha Jane b. 1821 had seven children. Thomas J. b. 1840, William G. b. 1842, Redmond b. 1844, Mary J. b. 1846, Elizabeth A. b. 1848, Anna b. 1857, Margaret b. 1859.

Henry Drury "late of the county of Marion," bought land in Muhlenburg County, Kentucky, December 14, 1839 as recorded April 27, 1840. Henry Drury and his wife Milly (Miley) had a son, Eugene Edwin Drury (1856-1918) who married Lille Defrosia Moore (1860-1934). She was born in Louisville, Kentucky, but was baptized August 26, 1866 at St. Augustine's Church, Lebanon, Marion County, Kentucky. Her father Levi Moore (1825-1909) and mother Mary Ann Bowman (1832-1929) were married on September 11, 1849 by Father James Quinn, Holy Name of Mary Church, Calvary, Marion County, Kentucky. They had seven children. Of these John, Sarah, Mary Elizabeth, George, and Defrosia (Lillie Defrosia) were baptized at St. Augustine's Church, Lebanon, Kentucky between June 30, 1850 and August 26, 1866. See Bowman, Royal

Ada Lewis Durrett (Granny) (1898-1984) was the oldest child of Daniel Boone "Dan" Durrett of Greensburg, Green County, Kentucky and Belle Averitt Durrett of Bradfordsville, Marion County. She had two brothers, Mack and Otha Bell Durrett and two sisters, Fannie Durrett Cowherd and Mary Durrett Abell.

As was the way in those days, Granny had a lot of responsibilities in helping to raise the other children. She was a gifted seamstress, cook, and loved raising her "baby chickens." She was a member of the "Mary's" husband Belltown Church but followed Grandfather wherever his ministries took him. A quiet and conservative woman, she could rise to any occasion when circumstances dictated. We weren't allowed to argue, fuss, or fight among ourselves. Her words, and we learned them early, were, "I didn't raise a bunch of dogs, I raised children." We still remember to abide by her teachings as adults.

Granny m. George Washington, "Preacher Bell," of Belltown and was a devoted and loving mother to nine children of that union who grew to maturity. Our home was always a welcome bed and board for visiting preachers.

Mack (deceased) m. Loueva Porter, daughter of Lee and Mallie Porter. To this union were born: William Lee, Annabel Durrett Johnson, Rita Durrett Brown (deceased), and Catherine Durrett White. He relocated to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and worked in the Steel Mills until retirement. He died in Pittsburgh and is buried in Ryder Cemetery in Lebanon.
