#### Gaddie, Stiles, Churchill, Holderman

Several of our old pioneer families in the county and their ancestors kept family records through several generations and the Gaddie-Stiles genealogy is an unbroken line back to 1550, over four hundred years.

George Griffin Gaddie whose wife was Eliza Thurman was a son of John Gary and Margaret Ann Willet Gaddie. His maternal grandparents were Griffen Willett and Rhoda Stiles Gaddie, and his maternal grandparents were David and Elizabeth Kitchell Stiles.

And from David Stiles, 1760 to 1839, on back in the Stiles grandfather line were Thomas Stiles 1740 to 1803; Jonathan Stiles 1868-1758; Isaac Stiles 1630(?) John Stiles, 1595-1662, or 3; and Thomas Stiles 1550 to 1614.

The last three named and their families all lived in England, and then some of them began a new life in the new land of America, where Johnathan, Thomas and David all did their part in the War for Independence from England, the Revolutionary War. David being only fourteen years old when he enlisted for service, this information being found in the War Records of New Jersey. And when the war was over many of the Stiles name, as did many others, came to the region of Kentucky, and the name is yet quite prominent and important in the

Also in Pennsylvania records, 6th Series, Vol. 5, is mentioned John LaRue 4th class, and George LaRue 6th class, who were in Capt. Wm. Spiles Co., 7th Battalion, Lancaster County Militia, and John LaRue elected Ensign 2nd Battalion Bucks County Militia April 24th 1786.

And in West Virginia Writers' Program, Page 493, is found the statement that "Isaac and Jacob LaRue, two Frenchmen, settled on land granted them for their services in the Revolutionary War. Their graves are on Middle Island, reached by a ramp leading down from the bridge across the Ohio River".

And so our Historical Society and our County History, seek to trace our lineage and our names, and something of the activities of our forbears, and their courage, for the sake of history for each new generation in our county which is known all over the world.



## JUDGE La FAYETTE STILES PENCE

La Fayette Stiles Pence, LL.B., as a member of our own Kentucky Family. He was known personally by many members of the family now living, his death having occurred only a short time prior to this writing. He was a son of Rebecca Elteugy Stiles, and John W. Pence; she being a daughter of Capt. Lewis Stiles, of Morristown, N. J. and Nelson County, Ky., head of one of the ten branches of the Kentucky Family; he being a son of David Stiles, of Morristown, N. J. and Nelson County, Ky., the Kentucky pioneer who came from New Jersey to Kentucky in the year 1809; he being a son of Thomas Stiles, of Morristown, N. J.; he being a son of "Long" Jonathan Stiles, of Stratford, Conn. and Morristown, N. J. head of the New Jersey Family; he being a son of Isaac Stiles, of Windsor, Conn., Wethersfield, Conn. and Stratford, Conn., reported to be the first male child born in the Colony of Connecticut; he being a son of John Stiles, of Millbrook, England and Windsor, Conn., who came from Millbrook, Bedfordshire, England in 1634 and, with others, founded the town of Windsor in the Colony of Connect-

icut; he being a son of Thomas Stiles, our first ancestor known by name, who resided at Millbrook, England.

Judge Pence was born near Bloomfield, Nelson County, Ky. April 6, 1865 and was the youngest of five children. Upon the death of his mother when he was a very small child, in 1867, he went to LaRue County to make his home with his aunt, and twin sister of his mother, Mrs. Minerva Ford Stiles Beall and her husband, George Washington Beall, near Raywick, Ky. There he spent his boyhood with all the advantages of a son in the home of this respected and cultured couple and their only child Mary Martha Beall.

After completing the courses offered in the county schools he attended East Lynn Academy at Buffalo, Ky., and later entered upon the study of law in the College of Law, University of Louisville, Louisville, Ky. where he obtained his degree in 1889.

The following year he began the practice of law at Lebanon, Ky., making his home with the family of his cousin Mary Martha (Mattie) Beall and her husband Joseph N. Wilson. It was in the home of the parents of this cousin he had spent his early life and their relationship was more like that of brother and sister than of cousins. The practice of his profession at Lebanon extended over a period of thirty years.

In 1902 he was elected Police Judge of Lebanon, Ky. and for eleven years served in that office. He at one time served as County Judge of Marion County during the illness of Judge William M. Spalding.

Besides his law practice Judge Pence did much research work. Being a member of a pioneer family he was deeply interested in genealogy, and was the author of a book, "The History of the Stiles Family in Kentucky and Missouri", published in 1896. Also deeply interested in American history, he was particularly a student of Lincoln lore, and long corresponded with prominent historians in all parts of the country concerning the life of the Great Emancipator.

He was the author of a series of articles which were published through "The Enterprise", a Lebanon newspaper, under the title "Life sketches of the Rev. Jesse Head", the story of the minister who performed the marriage ceremony which joined Nancy Hanks and Thomas Lincoln, parents of the Civil War President.

Judge Pence was widely known and his services were in almost constant demand for research in connection with titles and deeds, and many old and valuable documents were brought to light through his efforts, his work taking him not only into most of Kentucky's counties but into other states as well.

After supplying a quantity of data concerning the parentage and early life of Abraham Lincoln to Senator Albert J. Beveridge to be used in his work "Abraham Lincoln" Judge Pence received in acknowledgment the Senator's personal check and later a copy of the two-volume biography of Lincoln. These two volumes with the uncashed check pasted in one of them are now the prized possession of the writer, a gift of Judge Pence.

It was through his encouragement and that of his cousins Margaret Beall Wilson LaRue and Mina Beall Wilson LaRue that the family was called together in the first Stiles reunion in 1936 and it has continued to be an annual event since that time.

But for his inherent modesty many more interesting incidents of his life might be recorded, for he was requested to furnish first hand information, but friendly as he was to all forms of family lore he silently declined to make himself the subject.

He was a member of the Lebanon Methodist Church and often returned to Lebanon for visits after his retirement. Every one who knew Judge Pence liked him. He was extremely amiable and, although he pursued his duties diligently, was never too busy to fraternize with his friends. Possessed of a good mind, his conversation was always interesting, and invariably sparkled with humor. He was at all times a gentleman, a friend to the friendless, and a wise counselor to those who sought his advice.

During the last few years of his life he spent months at a time at a farm home which he owned near Raywick, Ky. occupied by Mr. and Mrs. T. A. Whitfield, where he maintained a furnished room.

In the fall of 1936, having heard of the writers interest in family history, he made a visit to his home and lent much help and encouragement to the work just then in the beginning. He was at that time in failing health but still the charming guest.

During the early part of 1938 he was seized by a disease of the heart which later resulted in his death at the age of 73,

June 24, 1938. He died at the home of his niece, Mrs. Wright (T.E.) Stoner at Bardstown, Ky., all of his nearer relatives having preceded him in death. He was buried in Bardstown Cemetery.




## Charlie Stiles
