After gaining *terra firma*, the remainder of the detachment were collected together under Colonel Chapman, and during his efforts to procure arms for those who had been unfortunate in the Naval Expedition, word came that a detachment of Infantry, Artillery, and unbleached Yankee Cavalry, had been dispatched from Washington, with orders to show no quarter, but drive us into the Bay. Colonel Chapman resolved to fight it out, and as the shades of night approached made a charge upon them. In the melee Captain Samuel Chapman was severely wounded. The roads being in excellent travelling condition, the Yankees returned to Washington early next morning, and reported many daring adventures. Colonel Chapman's men then returned to Fauquier, not to engage in the approaching campaign, but to surrender, and lay down their arms.

On the 13th, a national salute was heard at Winchester, in honor of the Yankee successes and the downfall of our cause. As the sound of each discharge echoed and reverberated through the hills, it fell like the knell of departed glory upon the hearts of our people. On the 14th, General Hancock dispatched a

To Whom It May Concern;

I am trying to trace my family history and need to verify the following information from birth, death, marriage, probate and military service records on the following individuals:

- * Thomas Glascock (e), born in England, settled in Warwick River County, Virginia ca. 1643; married to Jane; appointed Justice of the Peace for the Peankatanke area in 1652; patented land on the Morattico Creek in Lancaster County; died in 1677 probably in Lancaster County.
- * Gregory Glascock, also born in England, first son of Thomas; was married to Mary in 1667 when he deeded land that had been his father's; in 1677, listed himself as a "Rappahannock Planter" and gave power of attorney to his brother, Thomas; died in 1688 or 1689, probably in Lancaster or Richmond County.
- * Thomas Glascock, first son of Gregory, born ca. 1671; arrived at "full age" in 1692 in Richmond County, Virginia; resided on Farnham Creek, north of "Indian Banks" in Richmond County; married Sarah Stone, daughter of William Stone ca. 1698; apparently killed a William Forrester in Richmond County, Virginia and thereafter fled south; died ca. 1730 in unknown county.
- * Peter Glascock, sixth son of Thomas, born on March 13, 1714; married Jane and by 1735 and moved into Prince William County (later Fauquier County) in Virginia by 1741; listed on poll lists in 1741 and 1761 in Prince William County; settled on Carter Land in the Goose Creek area of Fauquier County in the 1760's, near "Ashby's Gap"; was appointed surveyor of the road from Pantherskin to the Blue Ridge Mountains during the Revolutionary War; listed on tax lists of Fauquier County in 1782; later moved to Rowan County, North Carolina on Dutchman's Creek; died in 1784, probably in Rowan County, N.C.

in) Peachey. Colonel Peachey resided at Milden Hall and died there on 7 June 1802; his obituary appeared in the Fredericksburg Virginia Herald on 14 June 1802. His will is very long, complex and involved. He gave directions as to the family vault and made other demands and remarks not usually found in wills. He identifies himself as the eldest son and heir in tail of his father, but says he had rather given his manor estate to a second son (Samuel Peachey 1732/3-1784 of Essex County) but that the entailment placed on the estate by an honored ancestor prevented this act. Colonel Peachey goes on at great length in regard to the laws of entailment which were set aside when the Commonwealth was founded. He married (1) 31 May 1748, Million Glascock, daughter of William Glascock of Richmond County who died testate in 1784, and had an only child to survive infancy, viz: (a) Winifred Peachey who married Henry Armistead (q.v.) p.4. Colonel William Peachey married (2) in 1761, Elizabeth Griffin Colston, the daughter of Travers and Alice Corbin (Griffin) Colston; they had a large family of children. Milden Hall, so long the seat of the Peachey family, was advertised for sale in considerable detail in the Fredericksburg Virginia Herald of 1 May 1824; the advertisement was signed by John Nicholson as administrator of William Peachey, deceased. PEACOCK, RICHARD [GENTLEMAN] of North Farnham Parish, Richmond County, on 31 November 1695 entered into a marriage contract stating that he has lately intermarried with Mary Glascock, the relict and administratrix of George Glascock, deceased, and he obligates himself to leave his estate to his said wife and her children. 





Subject: BIBLE as a surname

Are there any other researchers out there who have encountered the *surname* BIBLE? My great-great-grandfather, Moses Herndon GLASSCOCK, Sr., married Sophia Margaret BIBLE. I'm not sure where they married, but at the time my great-grandfather, James Knox GLASSCOCK, was born in 1844, they were living near Bridgeport, Jackson Co., Alabama. (In fact, they were living on an island in the Tennessee River that almost bisects the county!) This family moved to Texas in the 1870's (Fannin Co. and Lamar Co.). On a later census, Sophia's birthplace is given as Kentucky. She was born in 1803.

Through the IGI (which, by the way, indexes BIBLE under BABEL) it appears the the BIBLE surname was fairly common in Tennessee, but (I'm relying on memory here!) I don't think I found any in Kentucky. Of course, it is logical to think they could have moved.

For obvious reasons it is somewhat hard to search this name in computer databases (unless you can use subject headings) because you end up with things about family Bibles instead of things about the BIBLE family!

Any help would be MOST appreciated! I'm always willing to share research, however, I don't have much on this name yet as I haven't identified the parents. But if anyone else is researching this name, surely we can help each other out!

Keeping my fingers crossed!

THOMAS GLASCOCK

THE first record that we have of the Glascocks in Virginia was Richard Glascock, who came over in 1635, and who was followed by Thomas and his wife, Jane Glascock, in 1643.

Thomas Glascock, the subject of this sketch, was the son of Aquila, who was the son of George, who was son of John, who was probably the grandson of the Thomas who came over in 1643.

The Glascock family name has an authentic history since the year 1365, the Thirtieth of Edward III. The family was located at High Estre in the County of Essex. The origin of the name is not that commonly supposed by many people. There has been a common idea that the terminal "cock" to family names was derived from the French "coq," meaning a "cook." The English turned this French form into the names of Cook and Cocke. Then they put the prefixes and suffixes and get a great number of names. But there are some exceptions.

Glascock is not one of these derived names, as one might easily suppose, but is derived from Glascote, in the Parish of Tamworth. "Cote" or "cott" in time became evolved into "cock." "Woodcock" is really "Woodcott." Cottswold" as a surname has become "Coxwold," and "Cottswell" has turned into "Coxwell."

This John Glascock, who was living at High Estre in Essex in 1365, was followed from father to son for many generations. Thus he was succeeded by Edward, Edward by Thomas, Thomas by William, William by Richard, Richard by John, John by Richard, Richard by William, William by John (who became a Lieutenant-Colonel in the army), John by John (2), and so on. This brings us down to the period of the civil wars in England, when William Glascock went to Ireland as Captain of a troop of horse in 1649. They were rewarded for their services by grants of land in County Wexford. William purchased from the rest of the troop the debentures of Alderton, then called by the Irish name of Bally-feamoge. They had all kinds of troubles in the time of James II, who naturally felt a bitter hostility to these ex-parliamentary soldiers.

The Irish family fell back upon the original name of Glascott, and called themselves by that name for many generations. The history of the English and Irish families of Glascock, or Glascott, is told in extenso in Burke's "Dictionary of the Landed Gentry of Great Britain and Ireland." The Coat of Arms is thus described: [323]

Ermine on a chevron sable between three cocks azure legged and combed or, a bezant. "

Crest: An antelope's head argent attired or. gorged with a belt sable beaked and rimmed of the second."

The Glascocks prospered in Virginia, and though they did not multiply to the same extent that some other families did, they furnished five soldiers to the Revolutionary armies: B. K., George, Spencer, Thomas and Robert Glascock.

But in the meanwhile, a branch of these Virginia Glascocks had, prior to the Revolutionary War, migrated to the new colony of Georgia. This family consisted of William and his son Thomas. William moved to Georgia with the reputation of an able lawyer, and instantly took a prominent place in that colony. He had been preceded a year or two by his son Thomas, who was born in Virginia about 1750, and to whom he had given an excellent education. Both were patriots to the core.

When the Revolutionary War came on, William Glascock became eminent in the legislative work of the new colony, and his son Thomas made a brilliant soldier. He served as a Captain in the famous legion commanded by the Polish nobleman, Count Pulaski, and by the Fall of 1780, being then only in his thirty-first year, had risen to the rank of Brigadier General.

He held important positions after the war, was a man of great enterprise for that time, and left large estates. He died at his home, "The Maples," in Richmond County, at the age of

fifty-four.

While he was making military reputation, his father was making civil reputation. He served as Speaker of the House of Assembly of the State of Georgia in 1780. He was one of the commissioners appointed to plan for the improvement and enlargement of Augusta; and the work they did is a standing monument to them to this day. He was a trustee for the establishment of the "Richmond County Academy" in Augusta. He was one of the trustees for the foundation of the "University of Georgia." He died in 1793 and was buried on his plantation below Augusta, called "Glascock's Wash."

General Thomas Glascock (2) was born in Augusta, Georgia, in 1790, and died in Decatur, Georgia, in 1841. At the age of twenty-two he entered the army in the War of 1812, and was a Captain of Volunteers. In the Seminole troubles in 1817, he served under General Andrew Jackson with the rank of Brigadier General, and was then a young man of twenty-seven only. When the troubles were settled, he returned to his law practice; in 1835 he was elected to the Twenty-fourth Congress; in 1837 re-elected without opposition; and at the close of that term retired from public life, settling in Decatur, Georgia, intending to lead the peaceful life of a country gentleman; but a few months later was thrown from his horse and killed.

He was a man of fine qualities and very popular.

The names of this branch of the Glascock family have been perpetuated in Georgia by Glascock County, which was formed in 1858. It is proper here to say that the two original Glascocks in Virginia, Richard and Thomas, were brothers.

Thomas Glascock, the subject of this sketch, was born at Lakeland, near Rectortown, Virginia, on April 22, 1814, and died at "Rosehill," near Upperville, on July 23, 1885. His parents were Aquila and Susanna (Lake) Glascock. His mother was born on November 15, 1790, and died in December, 1836. His father, Aquila, who was the son of George and Hannah (Rector) Glascock, was born on the 4th of November, 1786. George was the son of John Glascock.

Aquila Glascock was a farmer, a surveyor and a large landowner. He was a reticent man, dignified, of strong will power, very cogent in his statements, of unusual business capacity, as may be judged by the fact that when he died he left each of his seven children an estate of thirty thousand dollars. Judged by standards of the present day, this would more than equal a fortune of a million dollars; and when one considers that this was done in the quiet country places of Virginia, it would seem to be indeed a remarkable testimonial to his business capacity.

Lawrence A. Glassco, The Glas(s)cock--Glassco Saga (Ann Arbor, MI, 1974), pp. 1-5, 8: "Thomas-1 Glasscock, the first of the Virginia Glasscocks, . . . arrived in America during or before 1643, for on August 30 of that year he received two land patents. Thomas-1 probably came from the English family of Glas(s)cocks from Essex County, of which there were a number of branches in the early 1600s. From the patent we know that his wife's name was Jane. [notes: Thomas-1 Glasscock's Virginia land grants are in Nell Nugent's Cavaliers & Pioneers, Dietz Press, Richmond, 1934, pp. 146, 276, 440, and 494. Thomas-1 is mentioned in other grants on pp. 209, 293, 350, and 521. . . . It may be this Thomas who married a Jane Juet or Just in London on June 17, 1634. Cf. Index Library, vol. 62, London Marriage Licenses, p. 120.] . . .

"One of Thomas-1's 1643 patents was for 130 acres in Warwick River county 'parallel to his own and land of John Leyden and adjacent to land of Thomas Davis' for transporting three persons to Virginia from England. [note: . . . The words 'parallel to his own land' in the patent apparently refer to other land Thomas-1 had in the area--perhaps previously patented earlier and unlisted in surviving records--which may indicate that he arrived in Virginia earlier than 1643.] John Leyden's patents, issued in 1636, are for land on the 'Old' Poquoson River, the 'New' Poquosin River, and the James River. Thus it appears that Thomas-1's 1643 patent was for land on the lower part of the peninsula between the James and the York Rivers and situated near the James River somewhat between Newport News, Hampton, and Yorktown, now mostly a heavily populated city area. . . .

"On August 30, 1643, Thomas-1 also patented 200 acres 'a mile and a half upon the south side of Peankatanke River, adj. Christopher Boyce' for transporting 4 persons to Virginia. (Two of the four were himself and his wife, Jane.) We are sure that he lived on this patent, for in 1652 he was appointed Justice of the Peace for the Peankatanke area by the Burgesses, sitting at Jamestown. [note: Records of Colonial Gloucester Co., Va., compiled by Polly Cary Mason, vol. 1, 1946, p. 121]

"The Peankatanke River is north of his other patent, in York County on the peninsula between the York and Rappahannock Rivers, and it flows into the Chesapeake Bay just a few miles below the mouth of the Rappahannock. The first patent on the Peankatanke was granted in 1642 and only four others were granted before Thomas-1's, so we know that he was one of the first settlers in the area. . . .

"The 'mouth' of the Peankatanke is apparently at the neck of water which separates Gwynn's Island from the mainland, so the location of this patent 'a mile and a half upon the south side' can be spotted quite accurately.

"We assume that the Glasscocks lived on the Warwick River County patent and/or on the banks of the Peankatanke in York County for about nine years or so during the rule of the Royalist Governor, Sir William Berkely. . . .

"On July 28, 1652 (in the same year that the Puritans came into power in England, Bennett became governor of Virginia and Thomas-1 was appointed Justice of the Peace in York County), Thomas-1 was granted a patent for six hundred acres about thirty miles north of his Peankatanke land, on Morattico Creek in Lancaster County of Virginia. Two hundred of these acres were received in exchange for

GLASSCOCK, JAMES ABNER (1816-1876). James Abner Glasscock, printer, soldier, and diarist of the Mier expedition, qv son of Thomas and Elizabeth (Milligan) Glasscock and the younger brother of George Washington Glasscock, qv was born in 1816 in Kentucky. John Henry Brown qv ranked him among the "educated, talented and honorable men" who arrived in Austin at its founding in September and October 1839. With the recurrence of war fever that followed Mexican general Rafael Vásquez's qv raid on San Antonio in March 1842, Glasscock enlisted as a private in Capt. Jack R. Everett's Company B of the Mobile (Alabama) Volunteers and served from April 1842 until discharged on October 2. Glasscock was residing in Victoria when Mexican general Adrián Woll qv reentered San Antonio in September with a force of 1,000 men. In response to Woll's invasion Gen. Alexander Somervell qv raised an army to invade Mexico, and Glasscock enlisted as a private in Capt. Ewen Cameron's qv company of Col. James R. Cooke's qv First Regiment of Somervell's South Western Army on November 12, 1842. He remained with the unsuccessful Somervell expedition qv until its commander ordered his troops to return to Texas. Rather than obey this order, however, Glasscock and the majority of the volunteers followed Col. William S. Fisher qv down the Rio Grande to Mier, where the entire force was captured on December 26.

Glasscock, with the rest of Fisher's men as well as the captives from the Texan Santa Fe expedition, qv was incarcerated at Mexico's notorious Perote Prison. qv While in prison he edited a short-lived newspaper, the first issue of which was called the Perote Meat-Axe and the second and final number the Perote Prisoners. More important, he kept an extensive and detailed diary from December 24, 1842, through February 12, 1844, and from June 8, 1844, through September 13, 1844, recording the daily tribulations and minor triumphs of the Perote prisoners. He was released from Perote on September 16, 1844, and sailed for New Orleans from Veracruz with Colonel Fisher and the remainder of his men on the American schooner Creole on September 22.

Glasscock seems to have taken up residence in San Antonio. At the outbreak of the Mexican War qv

he was elected second lieutenant of Capt. Benjamin F. Hill'sqv Company A of Col. John C. Hays'sqv First Regiment, Texas Mounted Rifles. He served from April 14 through June 16, 1847. (A Thomas Glasscock also served in this company as first lieutenant and a Stephen Glasscock as second corporal.) James Glasscock returned to Austin early in 1848 and received \$740 in back pay for his service on the Mier expedition. In October of that year he returned to San Antonio, where he, Michael Cronican, and Frank Brownqqv began to edit and publish the Western Texian, one of the city's first newspapers, on a Washington hand press in the old Rodriguez Building. When the cholera epidemic of 1849 killed Cronican, Glasscock became the sole proprietor of the newspaper but sold out to a partnership called Lewis and Groesbeck in November. He subsequently returned to Austin and worked for a time on the Texas State Gazette (see AUSTIN STATE GAZETTE) but sometime after October 1850 he followed Maj. Robert S. Neighborsqv to El Paso and by 1859 was living in Siskiyou County, California. He died in 1876.

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THE GLAS(S)COCK FAMILY

Ancestors of Elizabeth Glasscock Williams

FIRST AMERICAN GENERATION

THOMAS GLAS(S)COCK b. and m. in England to (Jane or Jeane Just?). They were in Virginia by 1643 when he first patented land in Warwick River County and on the Peakatanke River. In 1652 he was appointed Justice of the Peace for the Peakatanke area. He then patented land on Morattico Creek in Lancaster County on Virginia's "Northern Neck" and apparently moved there in the early 1660's. He was a tobacco planter. He apparently died before 3 June 1667, for on that date his son Gregory was in possession of the Morattico Creek land which had been granted to him in 1662. (One account indicates that Thomas was a brother of the Richard Glascocke who patented land in 1635 in Virginia.)

The children of Thomas and Jane Glas(s)cock: (All three sons were "of age" by 22 Feb 1665 because the earmarks of their cattle and hogs were recorded on that date.)

1. **GREGORY GLAS(S)COCK b. probably in England; d. 1688/89. m. by 1667 to Mary. (See next generation.)
2. THOMAS GLAS(S)COCK b. probably in England; d. by 1701. m. ca 1672 Anne Nichols (daughter of George Nichols) who died 1713. In 1667 and 1683 he was deeded parts of his father's original Morattico Creek land by his brother Gregory. He apparently amassed a considerable amount of land and wealth. Between 1682 and 1691 he and his wife were willed over 1,000 acres of land on Totaskey Creek by her father. In 1691 he also bought, for 14,000 pounds of tobacco, another 400 acre plantation near Totaskey Mill that had belonged to his father-in-law Nichols.

Thomas and Anne Glas(s)cock had six children:

- A. Jean Glas(s)cock b. 10 July 1673. m. by 1714 to Rowland (or Robert) Lawson. One child: Joanna m. by 1727 to John Steptoe.
- B. George Glas(s)cock b. ca 1675. m. Million Downman b. 21 Oct 1683 (daughter of William and Million Downman). He inherited land from his grandfather Nichols and was apparently a wealthy planter. Presumably he was the one who built "Indian Banks" in 1699 and was its first inhabitant. He died in 1714; Million died 25 Oct 1750. Their children:
 - a. Capt. William Glasscock.
 - b. Major George Glasscock.
 - c. Thomas Glasscock.
 - d. John Glasscock.
 - e. (?) Frances Glasscock m. 13 July 1730 Benjamin Miller in Richmond County.
- C. Frances Glasscock b. 14 July 1681. m. by 1701 to Capt. Charles Barber who d. 1716.

I, John Glasscock, Senr., widower, now living in Adams county in the state of Ohio being eighty years of age but of good mind and memory knowing the mortality of this life do appoint make & ordain this my last will and testament after comitting my soul and spirit to God that gave to me and my body to the earth to be buried in a common decent manner at the discretion of my Executors.

Item) I do give and Dispose of my worldly goods as it has been pleased God to favor me with in this manner and form as follows

Item) I give and bequeath to my son Gregory Glasscock four hundred acres of my land lying and being in Butler County on Muddy Creek in the state of Kentucky which I bought of Mr Levy Duffy being bought by him of Syessmoind Stripland, it being a military right given to him by his Uncle, but the said Gregory Glasscock must take it off any corner he may choose altogether, and to have first choice. Item) I also give to my son, Asa Glasscock, two hundred acres of the same tract of land, to be taken by him at any corner he may choose, altogether. The second choice. Item) I also give to my son, Thomas Glasscock, two hundred acres of the above said tract by him to be taken at the Third corner. Which will be eight hundred acres of the said tract of land and the two hundred that remains of the thousand acres bought of Mr Levy Duffy, to be sold for cash and to equally divided between William, John, Downing, Peter and Uriel, my sons; and Annorah Glasscock, Lydia Moss, and Jane McEudre, and Nancy Moss, my daughters, and if my executors, Gregory Glasscock and Asa Glasscock sell the said tract of land, to equally divide it amongst the legatees according to the aforesaid contents of this will mentioned. And I also give to my son Gregory my white Horse called Dragon, and all the plantation utensils likewise all the Kitchen furniture of

every description and two beds; the new one with a black or blue striped tick, and the old bed I lay on as we came out, and all the bedding furniture but one sheet and blanket, and the diamond coverlid; one coverlid and my bed I lay upon before I come out here - that bed and the blue diamond coverlid, blanket and sheet mentioned before, I give to my son Asa Glascock, and if there is any balance due us on sale of our property in Frederick Co. Virginia Gregory is to settle it, and if any balance due us, to take it as his own, and the little wagon we brought out here, and wagon gears, and so conclude by appointing and ordaining Gregory Glascock and Asa Glascock my whole and sole executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this twenty second day of June in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and seventeen in the presence of Johnathan Rees, Rachel Rees, Martin Rees, James Parker, Senr.

I, John Glascock, Senr, of Adams Co. do acknowledge this sixteenth day of November, to be my last will and testament before John Laney,

Note: This will is on record in Brown Co Ohio. No probate date is found for it (in 1952) by the clerk, but Butler Co Ky records show it was filed 1822 or 1823.

The Levi Duffy mentioned in the will was "of Frederick Co Va" by the deed made to John Glascock in 1816, by Levi Duffy for the 1000 acres bequeathed in above will. The heirs of son Thomas, brought a land suit in 1874 for the 200 Acres bequeathed to Thomas, but never received by said Thomas. The records there, in suit 2451, give much data and the restoration of the land was decreed to the plaintiffs. By these despositions in Butler Co., it was shown the sons Asa & William lived & died in Ky. Should anyone having data on them or their living descendants, I will be pleased to hear from them, or should they wish information I have.

Rev. James H. Glasscock

Mr. Glasscock is the descendant of revolutionary ancestry, his paternal grandfather having been a soldier in the war of independence, and having suffered wounds in that glorious service. The son of this old continental soldier and the father of this sketch, was William Glasscock, born in North Carolina. The mother, also born in the good old North State, was Margaret Garman, who was of German parentage. William Glasscock was a farmer, and also served as a justice of peace for many years. To himself and wife were born six children, as follows: Eli H.; James H.; John J.; Andrew; Henry; Catharine and Mary. All of these children grew to be men and women. Two of the sons, Henry and Andrew, were soldiers in the Union army during the Civil war. William Glasscock died in October, 1858, his wife having preceded him only a few months, passing away on May 18th the same year. They were both members of the Methodist church.

Their son, of whom we write, was born December 2, 1830, in the state of Tennessee. He worked on his father's farm and attended such schools as that time afforded. After attaining manhood, he married, in August, 1850, Elizabeth Davis. To this marriage were born eight children, who lived to maturity. They were: Margaret (McKenney), to whom were born four children; Ada, wife of Walter Hood; Nora, married Walter Smith; Uriah, who married Laura Ruark, and was father to a family of six sons and daughters. After Uriah there were born of Mr. Glasscock's first marriage Sarah, who married William Cochorn, and had one son and two daughters, Rebecca, married to B.A. Hudspeth; Eli, who married Nora Morgan; and Oliver S.

After the death of the first Mrs. Glasscock, Mr. Glasscock married Matilda J. (Taylor) Gulick, and there were born to them one daughter, Eva, who became the wife of H.E. Neese and the mother of three daughters.

The second wife also died, and on December 3, 1909, Mr. Glasscock married as his third wife Mrs. Judith (Spragins) (Hudgins), the widow of James H. Hudgins, and later of William Williams. Mrs. Glasscock is the daughter of William W. Spragins and Sephronia (Ellis) Spragins, his wife. The Spragins were a prominent family in Mississippi, from which state they moved into southwest Missouri after the Civil war. By her first marriage Mrs. Glasscock was the mother of two daughters: Martha E. Hudgins, who married Rufus Wright, and has a family of six children; and Marcia A. Hudgins, who married Robert B. Smith, and is the mother of two children.

James H. Glasscock moved to Missouri in April, 1852. He first settled on a tract of eighty acres, from which he added from time to time until he had a farm of two hundred acres. But he was not content to pass his days toiling wholly for himself and his own family. He felt the call to a higher calling, and when forty-one years of age he began to preach the gospel. He had always been active in Sunday school and church work from the time of his young manhood, and it was an easy step from the Sunday school desk into the pulpit. For twenty-five years he was actively in the work of the ministry. For the past fifteen years he has not held regular pastorates, but still is frequently called upon to preach, and never fails to do so with earnestness and acceptance.

During his active work in the ministry he was the pastor of the Smyrna Baptist church for two years and a half, pastor of the Sycamore Baptist church for six years, and filled the same office at the Oak Grove

church for three years. He was also the pastor of the First Baptist church of Miller.

Mr. Glasscock served during the Civil war in Company C, Tenth Missouri Cavalry. He made a good soldier and promoted to be quartermaster sergeant and later to first lieutenant under Captain Colley. In all he was in the army more than two years and in many engagements and one hard-fought battle. Thus as old age comes upon him this good man can look back over a life spent, not wholly for self or selfish aims, but in the service of his family, his country and his God. What could any man ask greater or better?

Died in Lexington.

Mrs. Rebecca S. May, wife of Mr. Jno. C. May, a prominent lawyer and real estate agent in Lexington, died in that city Thursday, April 20. Mrs. May had been married twice. Her first husband was George B. Caldwell, who, at the time of his death was a member of Caldwell, Bros., of this place. In December, 1887 she married Mr. May and since that time has resided in Lexington. She was a Miss Glasscock, of Nelson, prior to her first marriage and was a sister of Mrs. Cordy Long, Mrs. A.E. Blaydes and Mr. John Glasscock of Shelby county, and Mrs. W.H. Long and Dr. Glasscock, Louisville. She had suffered for a long time with an immense tumor and died from the affect of a surgical operation which she had recently undergone. She had no children. The remains taken to Louisville and interred in Grove Hill cemetery. Mrs. May had many friends here, no one had more. She possessed those characteristics which were elevating. The world is better for her having lived in it. Captain May has the deepest sympathy of his friends here.

Glasscock's Will

In the name of God; Amen, I John Glasscock, of the County of Fauquier and Parish of Leeds, being thro' the abundant mercy and goodness of God, tho' weak in body, yet of a Sound and perfect understanding and memory; do constitute this my last will and testament; and desire it to be received by all as such, I first bequeath my Soul to God, my maker beseeching his most gracious acceptance of it, thro' the all sufficient merits and mediation of my most compassionate Redeemer, Jesus Christ, who gave himself to be an attonement for my Sins, and is able to save, to the uttermost, all that come unto God by him, Seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them, and who, I trust will not reject me, a returning penitent Sinner, when I come to him for mercy; in this hope and confidence, I render up my Soul with comfort, humbly beseeching the noe; blessed and glorious Trinity, one God most holy; most merciful and gracious, to prepare me for the time of my dissolution, and then to make me to himself into that peace and rest, and incomparable felicity, which he has prepared for those that love him, Amen, blessed be God. Imprinta, I give my body to the earth, from whence it was taken, in full assurance of its resurrection from thence at the last day: as for my burial, I desire it may be decent, at the discretion of my dear wife, and son John, whom I leave executors of this my last will and testament.

It is my will and desire that the Legacies shall be in my dear wife's possession during her natural life, or that she shall have a sufficient maintenance. I give my son Thomas One Thousand pounds of Crop Tobacco, also what land and other effects, I gave him before.

To my Son Hezekiah, I give a Negro Harry, and my black horse of that mare, also my best feather bed and furniture, and a ten gallon pot, potrack and pot-hooks. To my Son George, I give my horse Prince. To my Daughter Mary Rictor I give a pewter dish, and what else she has had. To my Daughter Margaret Turly; I give my next bed and furniture with what she has already had. To my Son in law Francis Jackson I desire he shall receive what Mr. William Brent owes me. To my Son John I give the Land whereon I live, containing One hundred and Eighty eight Acres, more or less, being bounded by the Church road of Sizas; also all my personal estate; Instate whatsoever that I shall be possessed with when it is the will of God to take me out of this World. To my son John, and together with my dear wife, I leave executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof, I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal the 9th day of December in the year of our Lord, 1780. John X Glascock (his mark).

Witness James Thomach John Fishback Philip Ofaback

At a Court held for Fauquier County the 28th day of June 1784

This will was proved by the oaths of John Fishback and Phillip Fishback and ordered to be recorded and on motion of John Glasscock one of the Executors therein named who made oath and executed and acknowledged bond as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining; probate thereof in ins form.

Additional Comments:

John Glasscock had a gnat of 633 acres in 1728 "above the thoroughfare of Broad Run, at the foot of Mother Leathercoat Mountain." He built a home later north of Rectortown he called "Rockburn" (ecause he had to build fires on the great rocks to break them up before they could be removed). The house was of four rooms and cellar. It was burned and rebuilt during the Civil War, but remained in the Glasscock Family into the 20th Century. The cellar still remains as a wall in the garde of the present house on the old Rockburn Cemetery remains.

Addendum

Note.- This addendum should be added as cover sheet to the manuscript on same subject by same author and dated October 17, 1958.

A recent search of records in Breckinridge, Hardin and Nelson Counties, Ky., and in the Kentucky Historical Society Library at Frankfort, Ky., has developed certain facts about the family of GEORGE WASHINGTON GLASSCOCK, 1st., not given in the manuscript dated October 17, 1958.

1. The parents of George Washington Glasscock, 1st., were Thomas Glasscock and Jenny (Jane) Milligan who were married in Nelson County, Ky., Sept. 16, 1802.
2. The parents of the above named Thomas Glasscock are not yet proven by this writer but probably were Gregory and Jemima Glasscock of Farquier Co., Va.
3. The father of the above Jenny (Jane) Milligan was Joseph Milligan whose will was signed in Nelson County, Ky., on April 1, 1836, probated in the County Court on May 9, 1836, and recorded in Will Book 2, Page 76, Nelson County, Ky.
4. Jenny (Jane) Milligan was the daughter of Joseph Milligan and probably his first wife, name unknown. Records in Nelson County show that Joseph Milligan married Rachel Jeffers November 17, 1789, and Sarah Hopewell November 9, 1809. Jenny having married in 1802 must have been the daughter of a still earlier marriage. The wife Sarah survived Joseph.
5. Joseph Milligan in his will names heirs in this order: "--my daughter Jane Glasscock--" "--my daughter Sarah Rhodes--", "--my son John Milligan--", "--my daughter Elizabeth Speak--", "--my wife Sarah Milligan--", and "--my six youngest children now living namely Thomas, Harrison, Nancy, Joseph Jackson, Fanna Maria and George Washington." The will states that the first 4 named children had each received his share of the estate, and that the estate in the possession of Joseph at his death was to go to his wife Sarah Milligan, and at her death to be equally divided between the six youngest children.
6. Records in the Library at Frankfort, Ky., show that the above Joseph Milligan was a veteran of the American Revolution. Joseph filed his petition for a pension from Nelson County, Ky., September 12, 1832, at which time he was 77 years old, had come to America from Ireland in 1772, had entered the service of the United States in 1776 in Lancaster County, Penn.; where he then resided, had moved from Bedford County Penn., to Jefferson County, Ky., in 1783, and was then (in 1832) living in Nelson County. Pension certificate was issued in March 1833, and payments began April 4, 1831. According to census records Joseph Milligan was in Nelson County in 1800, 1810, 1820 and 1830.

On County 640, 3.5 m. from State 234 the road forks, County 640 (R) and County 610 (L).

On County 640 (R), 2.1 m., is *BETHEL CHURCH* (L), a simple building standing in a grove of oak trees. The church was built in 1850 on land donated by Burr Glasscock and his wife Emsey, who expressed the wish that here it would be possible "to preach and expound God's word." It is said that the building was erected by the hands of devoted members of the congregation. Here again a church was used as a hospital during the War between the States. At the end of the war it was necessary almost completely to rebuild the structure. Once more the church was raised as a labor of love.

Near the church stands the *GLASSCOCK HOUSE*. Originally built of logs and containing only three rooms, the house has been considerably enlarged, though much of the old woodwork and a few brass locks remain to tell the story of its antiquity. Prior to ownership by the Glasscock family, the house was occupied by Pettits, Milsteads, Tansills, Fosters, and by James and Sophia Robbins. During the War between the States this house served as a Federal headquarters. In the burying ground are the graves of Burr Glasscock (1812-1896), Emsey Glasscock (1816-1885), James Henry Glasscock (1875-1893), Lou L. Glasscock (1855-1914), Susan A. Glasscock (1847-1921), Mary E. Glasscock (1851-1921), Aquilla Asberry Glasscock (1857-1927), M. I. Glasscock (1849-1928), Isabel L. Gulick Glasscock (1849—), Myrtle A. Glasscock (1879-1888), James Henry Glasscock (1873-1893), Ernest L. Glasscock (1877-1891), and John W. Lake (1820-1903).

Near the Glasscocks was one of the several Tansill places in this community. Martha Virginia Gregg (1835-1857) and Isaiah Bland (1876-1893) are buried here, but in the graveyard there is not one Tansill inscription.

From the fork of County 610 and County 640, County 610 leads (L) to *HOADLEY* 2.8 m., where it crosses County 642 and continues northward for about 3 miles to *WOLF RUN SHOALS* on the Occoquan.

Near Hoadley is the *SITE OF BOWLING GREEN*, locally known as the Holland Place. Near the ruins of the house is the burying ground containing tombstones memorializing Henry Holland (1783-1832), Mary F. L. Holland (1809-1897), and Annie E. Lipscomb (1874-1925).

The *SITE OF THE ISAAC MILSTEAD HOME* is also in this neighborhood. Though all trace of the house is gone, the tombstone of Isaac Milstead, who "died January 26th, 1876, aged 98 years," stands lonely guard.

BIOGRAPHY:

Little is known of Gregory or his brothers. All were probably born in England and were of age by 22 February 1665 when earmarks of each of their cattle and hogs were recorded in old Rappahannock records. Gregory and Mary had three children. The twin daughters married but had no issue; therefore, Gregory's line are descended through his son Thomas.

About 10 years after Gregory's death, his brother Thomas or Thomas's son George built a mansion at Indian Banks on Morattico Creek. The home was probably constructed in 1699 since that date is carved under the windows on either side of the entrance. The mansion, still standing and occupied, is believed to be the oldest plantation mansion on the James River. The following description is quoted from Rev. Glassco's book, pages 10 to 12 (see bibliography).

"It is constructed of remarkably well preserved red brick and is L-shaped with broad chimneys rising out of either end of a high gabled roof. The lower part of the exterior walls is 26 inches thick, tapering to 18 inches at the top. Over the front porch is a serpentine brick decoration which a member of the National Geodetic Survey who studied and photographed the house has said he has seen duplicated only once in the United States--and that in New England. The timber, which is hand hewn white oak, is dovetailed at the joints and held together at other places by blacksmith nails. Clay packed in the open spaces in the interior walls gives excellent insulation and air-conditioning. The plank floors are six inches wide. The house contains many-panelled doors, hinges (standing for "Holy Lord" to drive ghosts away from the doors), original locks, a curved chimney in the main living room, built-in window seats like those in nearby famous "Sabine Hall" of the Carter family, 18-paned windows, a five sided dining room and living room, attractive mantels in every room, and black iron chandeliers. Upstairs are two doors only four feet high,

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WILLIAM R. COCANOUGH. - One of the alert and progressive farmers and stock-growers of Washington county and one who shows through individual enterprise and distinctive public spirit that he is appreciative of the attractions and advantages of the favored section that has ever represented his home is William R. Cocanougher, who is the owner of a fine farm of four hundred acres in Washington county. Mr. Cocanougher is a native son of the county that is now his home and the time of his nativity was September 9, 1870. Concerning the family history due record is made in the sketch of the career of his brother, John S. Cocanougher, on other pages of this work, so that a repetition of the data is not demanded in the present connection. Mr. Cocanougher was reared to the sturdy discipline of the home farm and after availing himself of the advantages of the district schools he continued his studies in the graded schools in the village of Texas, this county. Thereafter he continued to be associated in the work and management of the home farm until 1900, when he married and initiated his independent career as an agriculturalist and stock-grower by the purchase of a farm of seventy acres. Since that time he has bought and sold fully twenty-five hundred acres of land in Washington county and each transaction has been marked by discrimination and good judgment, entailing a definite profit. His present homestead, which is improved with substantial buildings and is under effective cultivation, comprises four hundred acres and is devoted to diversified agriculture, including the raising of large crops of tobacco each year and to the growing of live stock, in which latter department his operations have been very successful, his farm being as well stocked as any other in the county. At the time of this writ-

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ing he has on the place four hundred head of sheep, ninety hogs, fifty head of horses and mules and many cattle of high grade. His energy and management is clearly shown in the thrift and prosperity evidenced in all departments of the farm work. In politics Mr. Cocanougher is a staunch adherent of the Democratic party and though he always takes a lively interest in local affairs of a public nature he has never sought or held public office of any description.

On the 1st of October, 1900, at Harrodsburg, Mercer county, this state, Mr. Cocanougher was united in marriage to Miss Winifred Glasscock, daughter of Chafin and Susan (Hourigan) Glasscock, both of whom were born in Marion county, this state. The Glasscock family was founded in America by the great-grandfather of Mrs. Cocanougher and this worthy ancestor emigrated to the new world from Ireland. Mr. and Mrs. Cocanougher became the parents of ten children, and of this number seven are living.

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JOHN S. COCANOUGH. - In both the paternal and maternal lines the subject of this review is a scion of old and honored families of Washington county, where he was born and reared and where he has found ample scope for productive effort in connection with the great basic industries of agriculture and stock-growing. He has supervision of the operation

of the fine old homestead farm which was the place of his birth and is one of the well known and highly esteemed citizens of his native county.

John S. Cocanougher was born on the old homestead that is still his place of abode and the date of his nativity was August 19, 1878. His father, the late John Cocanougher, was born on the same homestead, which is attractively situated on Long Run, and here he devoted his entire active career to agricultural pursuits, in connection with which he gained a full measure of success. He was born on the 3rd of March, 1831, and was sixty-two years of age at the time of his death, which occurred in 1893. He was a man whose life was guided and governed by the highest principles of integrity and honor, and thus he was not denied the just reward of popular approbation, which is ever the meteward of character.

Though not formally identified with any religious body he attended and liberally supported the Baptist church and his faith was in harmony with its teachings. His widow has long been a devoted member of the Methodist church at Pleasant Run. He was a staunch advocate of the principles of the Democratic party and took an intelligent interest in the questions and issues of the hour and in local affairs of a public order, though he never sought or desired political office. At the time of the Civil War his sympathies and aid were given to the cause of the Confederacy, though he did not enter the military service. He was well known in his native county and his many generous attributes of character gained to him the loyal friendship of all who came within the sphere of his personal influence. His widow, whose maiden name was Emily Canary and who still resides on the old homestead, endeared to her by the gracious memories and associations of the past, was born in Washington county, on the 25th of July, 1834, and is a daughter of Abraham and Phoebe (Hodges) Canary, both of whom passed their entire lives in Washington county, where they held secure place in regard of all who knew them. The marriage of Mr. and Mrs. Cocanougher was solemnized on the 12th of March, 1857, and concerning their ten children the following brief data are given: Thomas is a resident of Perryville, Boyle county; Phoebe is the wife of George Glascock, of Marion county; Mollie is the wife of Joseph Begley, of Texas, Washington county; Elizabeth is the wife of M.C. Willhite, of Danville, this state; Margaret is the wife of Lee Cochran, of Marion county; William R., a successful farmer of Washington county, is individually mentioned on other pages of this work; Fannie is the wife of William Arnold, of Boyle county; Lula is the wife of Hanson Robinson, of Washington county; Lena is the widow of James Murphey and resides in Washington county; and John S., is the immediate subject of this review. John S. Cocanougher was reared to maturity on the home farm and is indebted to the public schools of his native county for his early educational discipline. As an independent farmer he has well upheld the prestige of the family name and he has gained prestige as one of the enterprising, progressive and successful agriculturalist and stock-growers of Washington county, where his sincerity and uprightness have retained to him the inviolable esteem of the community that has ever represented his home. Though not imbued with any ambition for public office he gives a staunch allegiance to the cause of the Democratic party and is ever ready to give his influence and co-operation in support of measures and enterprises projected for the good of the community. He has operated the old home farm since 1893 and has kept the same up to the highest standard of productiveness and thrift. On the 9th of December, 1896, Mr. Cocanougher was united in marriage to Miss Josie Harding, who was born in Taylor, Marion county, this state, and who is a daughter of Isaac and Elizabeth (Carter) Harding. Mrs. Cocanougher came to Washington county when a child and was reared to maturity in the home of her sister, Nannie, wife of James Coyel, where she remained until her marriage. She is a member of the Baptist church. Mr. and Mrs. Cocanougher became the parents of seven children, of whom six are living, their names, with respective dates of birth, being here entered: Gilbert, November 4, 1898; Iva, April 19, 1901; Hartford, January 31, 1903; Tommie, April 2, 1905; Truman, February 11, 1907; and Robert, April 5, 1909.

advantages for their children. In that period prices for farm products were low, and Mr. Glasscock recalls that he received for hogs raised on his place at one time only 2 1/2 cents a pound. For the decade between 1875 and 1885, Mr. and Mrs. Glasscock considered they were doing well if they could add \$100 annually to their savings. After applying himself vigorously to work all of the daylight hours Mr. Glasscock would wait till evening to make his trip to the mill for necessary flour and feed. With the passing years increasing prosperity attended his efforts, and upon leaving the farm he removed to Bradfordsville in order to afford his children the advantages of the schools of that place. He remained at Bradfordsville sixteen years, and then sold his residence property in that village, in 1910, and purchased twenty-eight acres adjoining the City of Lebanon on the north. The house on this place was destroyed by fire in 1916, and for the following month he and his wife lived in the barn on the tract, as they did not wish to invade the homes of the neighbors, all of whom offered them generous hospitality and urged them to accept the same. Finally Mr. Glasscock purchased an adjoining five acres from J.F. Barber, and the modern house on this place has since represented the home of himself and his wife. In 1919 he became associated with his son, Joseph, in the purchase of a valuable farm of 107 acres, facing two modern turnpike roads and constituting one of the choicest farm properties in Marion County, both by reason of fertility and on account of its excellent improvements and eligible location for platting as a subdivision of Lebanon. This farm is under the management of Joseph Glasscock and is devoted to diversified agriculture and stock-growing. Mr. Glasscock has achieved success entirely through his own efforts and the effective co-operation of his wife, who has shared in his labors and responsibilities and who with him enjoys unqualified popularity in the county which has been the stage of their productive endeavors. Both are active members of the Baptist Church at Lebanon, and in politics Mr. Glasscock is a staunch democrat.

In this concluding paragraph is given brief record concerning the children of Mr. and Mrs. Glasscock. James R., who was born February 6, 1876, married Miss Nellie Thornton, and they have two children: Imogene, born November 23, 1902, and Hugh, born May 17, 1905. Imogene is the wife of John Beard, of Lebanon and they have two children: Elizabeth and Caroline. John C., who was born December 11, 1877, married Miss Ella Dehoney, and they have two children: Elizabeth and John C., Jr.; Benjamin T., was born May 29, 1880, is a bachelor and resides at Birmingham, Alabama, he being a postal clerk in the railway mail service. Verna, who was born February 6, 1884, first married James E. Willis and is now the wife of Lawrence Walker. She has two children by the first marriage: Madelyn, born March 6, 1902, and Hall G., born January 3, 1906. Samuel H., who was born January 26, 1888, married Miss Nora Isaacs, and their one child, Leland James, was born July 28, 1917. Joseph, the youngest of the children, was born December 3, 1893, and represented the family of his native state in the nation's military service in the late World War. On the 24th of July, 1918, he entered service and at Camp McClelland, Alabama, was assigned to Battery C, Thirty-Fourth Artillery. Of his company of 196 men all except thirty-four were confined to the hospital during the epidemic of influenza in 1918, but he was one of those who escaped this affliction. The epidemic caused the revocation of the order for his command to sail for France, and when a second order was later given this, too, was revoked, owing to the signing of the armistice two days prior to the date set for sailing. Since receiving his honorable discharge, Joseph Glasscock has become associated with his father in the ownership and operation of the farm mentioned in a prior paragraph.





In the Year 1792 Jacob and his wife were confirmed and attended Communion for the first time at the Dutch Meeting House, Rowan County, NC (present day Davie County, NC).

Carmel in 1845, where he has been engaged in the same business most of the time since. In 1838 he married Harriet Quaintance (a daughter of William Quaintance), who died in 1875, the mother of three children, of whom one is living, Claude. He was a son of Benjamin, a native of Virginia, who came to Kentucky about the year 1787. Ellen G. Buckner was born Nov. 2, 1799. The old family Bible, now in the possession of A. H., tells the following tale: Elizabeth H., born Nov. 12, 1819; Benjamin T., March 19, 1821; John C., Nov. 17, 1822; Mary A., Sept. 22, 1824; Henry P., April 10, 1826; Stephen, Jan. 17, 1829; Sarah E., Nov. 5, 1830; Franklin, Aug. 29, 1833; Hillory, Aug. 15, 1835; Alexander Hawes, March 1, 1838. A. H. was brought up a farmer, in which business, he has since been engaged. He has a farm of 285 acres, which is stocked with Cotswold sheep and short-horn cattle. Nov. 29, 1869, he married Ida R., daughter of Samson D. and Sarah (Stemmons) Talbott, both natives of Kentucky. He was born in this county in 1809, son of Demoval Talbott, of Virginia. Sarah D. was a daughter of Martin and Charlotte (Glasscock) Stemmons. Mr. Bedford removed from the homestead to the place he now owns, after his marriage. He has one child, Dousie P. He and wife are members of the Christian Church.

MRS. WILLIAM WILKS DEATH

(Susan Harriet Walker)

She was born in Bardstown, Kentucky, of Charles Wesley and Harriet Walker, on March 16, 1821, who came to Austin, Texas, in the early part of 1839; her father and husband helping to survey and lay out that city and also assisted in building the first log hut in our State Capitol; it was interesting to listen to her tell of those early struggles of frontier life when the shuttle made music while she wove cloth for those she loved; and of perilous encounters with the Indians; and of the many times General Sam Houston, who was a staunch friend of her husband, had been entertained at her home; she was married to William Wilks in 1840, of that union there were five children, four of whom survive her, B. T. and Sam Wilks of Post City, Texas, W. J. Wilks of Snyder, Texas, and a daughter, J. W. Nunn of Colorado, Texas, another daughter, Mrs. L. P. Glascock, died in 1892 at Stanton, Texas. She lived in Independence, Washington County, where Baylor University was founded, several years, where her older children were educated; Dr. Burleson being a warm, personal friend of her and her husband. In September, 1881, she moved to Colorado, Texas, and on October 20, 1882, she lost her husband.

She was converted and united with the Walnut Creek Baptist Church in 1853 and has ever since lived a faithful and consistent Christian life, and the words of the hymn she loved so well to hear

"I love to think of my home above,
In the glorious realms of light;
Of the pearly gates and the golden streets
In the land where there is no night."

were indeed true to her, the last few years of her life; she had said she was waiting patiently for the summons from her Savior; perfect through suffering; repeatedly during her illness we heard her talking with her Savior whom she loved saying, "Thy will be done, give me patience, Blessed Lord, patience." She said that to have all her children with her in the last weeks of her life made her happy and that she was ready to go and as the end drew near she had no fears; her Savior with her she went home where there will be no more sickness.

Her last conversations with friends were inspirations to live higher and noble lives; her passing away was like the ebbing tide when that which drew from out the boundless deep turns again home; how we will all miss "Mammy" as we lovingly called her; and how sad we feel not to see the bright, cheerful face with us no more.

Deeds 1759-1778, p.127) I think he may have been a brother of a Letty Taylor who married a William Hendren. William Hendren, son of John Hendren and Margaret, is mentioned on an indenture in Pr. Wm. Co. It is a BRENT LEASEHOLD. George Brent leases land to John Hendren, his wife Margaret, and their son, William. Peter Glascock is a witness. Peter was a much younger brother of Gregory Glascock. Gregory's daughter, Sarah, (by his 1st wife, Alice Elder,) married William Taylor. I think this William Taylor may be the father of Letty and Charles Taylor.

These people all migrate to Rowan Co., N.C. The 1778 tax list of Rowan Co. (p.12) shows William Hendren, Charles Taylor, and several Adamses. William's sister, Rosanna Hendren married an Adams.

Gregory Glascock's Bible came into the possession of William Hendren, possibly when Charles Taylor left Wilkes Co., N.C., and moved to Madison Co., KY., giving power of attorney to William Hendren. Charles made a deed of gift to his sons, John and Charles. John, Enos, and Elijah Hendren witnessed it. Elijah married as his second wife, a Rebecca (Goss ?) whose guardian was a Sarah Taylor...widow of Charles?

Hendrens, Taylors, and Glascocks all came from Richmond Co. on the Northern Neck of Virginia. I think I remember the name Rawleigh being used there. Let me know if this ties in with your Taylors.

I know of one son, Thomas Woodson Glascock.

vii. James Jackson Alexander "Jim" COBB was born 8 FEB 1815 in Bibb, AL or SC, and died 4 JUN 1865 in Rocky Mount Community, Chilton, AL. He married Elizabeth Malone CAMPBELL 22 OCT 1836 in , Bibb, AL, daughter of Aaron CAMPBELL , Jr. and Martha "Patsy" GLASSCOCK. She was born 13 MAY 1820 in , Bibb, AL, and died 2 AUG 1907 in , Chilton, AL.

Ambrose Cobb "the immigrant" (1603-1655/56) arrived in VA in 1635. He had three sons that lived to adulthood.

#1 Thomas (1637-1702). His LWT was proved in York Co, VA on Feb 24, 1702. He never married and died without issue.

#2 Ambrose (1635-1683). His estate was inventoried and appraised in York County in Feb 1684. His widow married one George Glascock. He had two sons, to wit:

2a. William (1655-1705). Estate inventoried Nov 24, 1705, York County. One child, Samuel, born 1698 married Edith Marot.

3a. Robert (1660-1726). Married twice, with the children from both marriages eventually suing each other for his estate. He had a daughter named Elizabeth, born 1704, who married James Shields.

By now I'm sure you have stumbled on or found the seven children of Aaron Campbell and Martha "Pasty" Glascock. I've been able to piece together some of the siblings of Aaron Campbell. He had a sister named Catherine who married Calvin Glascock, I don't know if they had any children, but they did take in three Campbell orphans. It appears that Aaron and Catherine also had a brother named David, who left his three children Acy, Lacy, and John to his siter Catherine Campbell Glascock. The Campbell orphans arrived in the household of Calving and Catherine Campbell Glascock in November 1826.

The above names and birthdates are found in a very old Bible in the possession of France Hendren of Candor, N. C. The Bible was handed down by descendants of William Hendren, who was born about 1748, and died in Wilkes County in 1838.

William Hendren was married twice, first to Letty Taylor, and secondly to Sarah Mullis. The children listed above are of his second marriage.

It has been said that this William Hendren was the father of twenty-one children.

He and his first wife had nine sons: Josiah, John, Jonathan, Nimerod, Dovin, Enos, Oliver, Russell, and William H. Eight of these sons left Wilkes County

and settled in Tennessee and Kentucky. William Hendren II remained in Wilkes and married Charlotte Ellis, daughter of William and Hannah Ellis.

John Hendren (father of Oliver) and William I are said to be brothers.

Sarah Glascock (Glascock) married William Taylor. It is believed that William I and his brother John both married Taylor girls, sisters of William Taylor.

This is how the Bible is thought to have come into the possession of the Hendren family. If there is a relation other than this to the Glascock family it would probably be through Gregory Glascock's wife.


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"The Pines" Travis & Margaret Glascock Home 1853, Hillsborough, Ohio

'The Pines' at 433 West Walnut Street

The "Pines" at 433 West Walnut Street was built in the mid 1800s by Travis Glascock, a native of Virginia.

By the year 1831, Travis and his wife Margaret, with their family, migrated to Hillsborough. In 1853, Travis purchased in-lot 260 from James Henry and Eliza Thompson. Here, he built the two-story brick house that will be on the house tour on Sunday, May 4 that is sponsored by the Highland County Historical Society.

In 1863, Travis Glascock conveyed the property to Arabella M. Boyd, wife of J. Milton Boyd. Boyd was born in Hillsborough, the son of Dr. John and Sally Boyd. Dr. John purchased the Baldwin grist mill located on Rocky Fork Creek in Paint Township. He also operated a hospital a short distance from the mill.

Following the death of his father, J. Milton Boyd took over the operation of the mill until he sold the property in 1858 to David Barrett. The Boyd family moved into Hillsborough. J. Milton Boyd operated a mill between present day Governor Trimble Place and West Beech Street, which was destroyed by fire in 1887.

After the death of Arabella and J. Milton Boyd, the West Walnut Street property was passed on to their daughter Mary, who married J.A.O. Yeoman in 1875. Mrs. Yeoman was secretary of the Friday Club, which was founded in 1890 by Mrs. John McDowell Matthews. Mrs. Yeoman's poetically descriptive minutes evoke pictures of the time in which they lived.

In an upstairs bedroom, Mary Boyd Yeoman painted flowers and birds on the door panels that still remain today. Be sure to look at the doors during the tour.

In 1944, the property was purchased by Bob and Margery Fling Reno. The present owners are John and Courtney Gallimore.

The old, wide-wood floor boards greet you as you enter the front door. In the kitchen, the Gallimores discovered a brick fireplace that had been covered over for many years, which they restored.

Many of the furnishings in the house are primitives or country pieces.

Excerpt from Bishop and Lake Families by Dr. Samuel Bishop, Bloomington, IL, 1898.

"Daniel Bishop, oldest son of John Bishop II, was married to Miss Nancy Lake, sister of James Lake, Sr. To this union fourteen children were born. Of them, Betsy, born 1787, died 1847, was married to William Jackson, born 1777, died 1848. To this Jackson union were born Margaret, 1807; Daniel, 1809; Amy, 1811; Lydia, 1813; Elizabeth, 1816; William, 1818; James, 1822; Bushrod, 1824; George, 1826; and Susan, 1828."

A marriage bond was issued for William Jackson and Eliza Bishop on 28 Dec. 1805 in Fauquier Co., VA. The bondsman was Daniel Bishop (her father). (Fauquier Co., VA, Marriage Bonds, 1759-1884)

2 males 0-10 (William B. 1818 and ?)

The parents of Elisabeth (Eliza) Bishop are named in land records in Fauquier Co. VA.

Fauquier Co. Deed Book 22, p. 149 – This indenture made 31 Dec 1817 between Moses Glascock and Rebecca his wife and Nancy Bishop, widow of Daniel Bishop deceased, and the children of said Daniel Bishop. For five dollars paid by Nancy Bishop, Glascock conveys a 50 acre tract of land.

In the 1830's, the property was purchased from each of Nancy Bishop's eleven children by Aquilla Glascock.

Fauquier Co. Deed Book 34, p. 446 – This indenture made 13 Sep 1830 between William Jackson and Elisabeth his wife, formerly Elisabeth Bishop child of Daniel Bishop, of the one part and Aquilla Glascock of the other part all of Fauquier Co. VA. In consideration of \$55 paid by Glascock the parties of the first part convey to the party of the second part one equal undivided eleventh part of a certain 50 acre tract of land subject to the life estate of Nancy Bishop widow of Daniel Bishop deceased it being the same land conveyed by Moses Glascock and Rebecca his wife to Nancy Bishop widow of Daniel Bishop deceased and the children of Daniel Bishop by a deed dated 31 Dec 1817. The deed was recorded 26 Jan 1833.

Based on the Bishop and Lake book by Samuel Bishop, we know the names and birth years of their children but little else except for the two oldest children who are mentioned in Ohio and Illinois history books. Eliza Bishop and William Jackson had the following children:

i. Margaret Jackson born 9 Nov. 1807 in Fauquier Co. VA; She married Stephen Penquite 29 Aug 1832 in Fauquier Co. VA, bondsman Jacob Silcott; died 23 Jan. 1887 in OH.

Beers "History of Warren Co, OH", pg 1047. "STEPHEN PENQUITE (deceased); was born in Fauquier Co., VA, Sept 4, 1800; he was a son of William Penquite, who was born Aug 16, 1756. politics, he has taken an active interest in local affairs, and for twelve years was postmaster of his town; He is a prominent church worker, and is now superintendent of the Sunday school, from which he has not for twelve years missed a Sunday; married Minerva Vandervoort on 22 Jun. 1861, the descendant of one of the early Dutch families that settled New Amsterdam, now New York. She died in 1888, in Lebanon OH.

Daniel Jackson was born in Fauquier County, Virginia, January 16, 1808. His parents were not in good circumstances, and his opportunities for obtaining an education were limited. His time was required for work to assist in supporting the family. When he was twenty years of age (1828) he came to Champaign County, Ohio. There he worked for two years, for eight dollars per month. He came to McLean County, Illinois, in October, 1830. He made a claim of one hundred and sixty acres of land in the present township of Empire, in the present county of McLean. During the winter of the deep snow [1830-1831] he lived with John W. Dawson. They pounded their corn as the settlers all did, and sometimes parched it, by way of a change, until the snow was gone and the roads were clear. Mr. Jackson built a cabin on his claim, and soon broke ground. With a little help he attended to fifty acres of corn. His grinding was done at Baker's horse-mill, at Blooming Grove, and at Cunningham's mill, at Cheney's Grove. He volunteered, during the Black Hawk war, but was sent back to his home, as he was not needed. On the 12th of February, 1832, he married Margaret Walden, of Springfield. They worked carefully and well, and succeeded in their labor. Mr. Jackson hauled all his grain to Chicago, returning with groceries and lumber. He dealt a good deal in cattle, always keeping a drove on hand. Chicago was his market for cattle until the railroads were built, bringing the market to his door. He acquired, by his care and

industry, five hundred acres of land. He did not take much interest in political matters, but was, for some years, supervisor of highways. He was a good citizen, and was one of those who worked hard for the development of the county of McLean. He died March 20, 1861.

Rebecca, I also have a James LONDON, b. 2 Jan 1821. He was the son of Henry and Mary ELAM LONDON and married Maria J. BENNETT on 18 Dec 1838 in Rutherford Co., NC. He died 21 May 1803, and his will was probated that same year.

You asked where I got the information with Mary (Polly) Ann as a daughter of Henry and Mary. I have copies of legal documents from 1860 in which the heirs of Henry were petitioning the court to allow the sale (and therefore the division, I'm sure) of Henry's land. Here is the way the heirs' names are listed: Chandler London, John London, James London, Henry London (my gt.gt.grandfather), Andrew London, A. C. Cornwell and wife Susannah, Lucy Glasscock, A. G. Weathers and wife Polly, L. S. Sparks and wife Frances, John H. Peeler, Grandson Blanton and wife Susannah, Wm. Patterson and wife Mary, Frances Peeler, Andrew Peeler, Martin Jones and wife Elizabeth, and Fanny Peeler and David Peeler, "infants of tender years."

I don't know why Mary Ann's name is not on the Bounty Land Warrant list. Something just occurred to me--as we can see, some of the heirs listed above are grandchildren. Could she be a granddaughter? I have her birth as 1820; between Martha, b. 1816 and James, b. 1821. Then there are two more children after that. No, I don't think she was a granddaughter, because it seems that the only grandchildren listed are the offspring of Henry's children who were already deceased. I have a source reference for Mary as a letter from another researcher, and, of course, when I want the letter I can't find it. I don't know exactly which information she gave me--maybe the birthdate.





The Patriarch, Thomas Glascocke m Jane in England. They are found in Virginia 1643 when he had a patent on land in Warwick River Co on the Peankatanke River. He was Justice of the Peace in 1652 for that area. Later he patented land on Morattico Creek in Lancaster Co and apparently moved there in the 1660's. He died sometime before June 3, 1667.

I. Gregory b England d 1688-89 m Mary in 1667 and was of an age Feb 22, 1665 when all of the sons recorded the earmarks of their cattle & hogs. He listed himself as a Rappahannock planter in a power of attorney to his brother, Thomas in 1677.

1. Thomas b 1 Jun 1662 or 1671 d 8 Jan 1730? m c 1689 Sarah Stone dau of William Stone . They lived on Farnham Creek about 3 miles north of "Indian Banks", built 1699 by Col. George. The family and I visited there summer of 82 and was allowed to tour the house. A picture is included. Thomas was appointed 1718 & 1719 as surveyor of the highway from Capt. Tarpley's home on Morratico Hill to the main road. Tragedy struck November 5, 1723, when Thomas either with intention or not, stabbed William Forrester and killed him instantly. Thomas fled his home and was apparently not heard from again. Sarah tried to raise the six children to her best ability, was soon lots the estate to "King" Carter.

A. John Glascock b 14 Jan 1699 d 1784 Farquier Co. Va. m. Margaret O'Rear. He had a grant of 633 acres 10 Apr 1728 He built a house of four rooms and a cellar. The house was called "Rockburn" because he had to build fires on the rocks to break them up to be removed. The house was burned during the Civil War but rebuilt and remained in the family until the 20th century. John is certified for the DAR for Patriotic Service.

 must again assert our rights as free citizens; and pray that
 your honorable body would grant us a separate election in the
 third battalion to be holden at the dwelling house of Andrew
 Mocks: which we do not desire through any faction or party
 work; for we can assure your honorable body that as little of
 that business is carried on in this County, as in any other of
 this State. In granting us this, we your petitioners will ever

known as Wolf's Run. The house faced southwest. The two story part contained 2 large rooms below and 3 above. The one story part contained a large family room and kitchen. A large square veranda with large pillars extended a part of the way in front of the two story structure. A large back gallery extended the full length of the home in the rear. The figures "1794" were cut into 2 bricks in the wall. About 75 feet east of the main house was built as a residence for Rev. Tera Templin who had come to Ky. with the Caldwell family.

My earliest recollection is associated with this large family composed of the white members and negroes of all ages. Aunt Fannie wife of the old preacher, Uncle Samuel; Aunt Jane, nurse of my aunt Lydia; Mary the maid of honor; Aunt Sarah mother of the toughest set of negro boys; Aunt Mattie, the famous cook who supervised the preparation of all the meals for white and Negro members; Uncle Isaac, the wood chopper and rail splitter; Uncle Bill the butcher; Susan the seamstress for everyone; Lucy and Margaret the assistants to Susan; Eamiline, the leader of all outdoor sports and her sister Harriett were in charge of the loom house; farm hands Wash, George, Jim, Tom; Amos the blacksmith; Charles the ox driver; Sam the fiddler; were but a few of the slaves. To feed this family required 100 + hogs were slaughtered in the fall, a sheep was killed every other day in the spring and summer months, and a small beef every other week.

The following letter is a taken from a xerox copy in the possession of Mrs. Linnie Raney. I am assuming the letter was written to Green R. Hays from John F. Purdy.


