Tomb Stones at the Blue Spring Burial Ground

Tombstones (head and foot) ready to be placed in the Blue Spring
grave yard, but yet at home:

Richard, son of J. & P. Wilson, born Dec. 18, 1915, died March
22, 1842.

Polly, wife of John Wilson, born June 13, 1789, died March 2
1827. Died in faith of a happy immortality.

James W, son of J. & P. Wilson, born June 2, 1831, died May 20,
1843.

P. W., J. W. W., R. W. foot stones.

Sacred to the memory of Mrs. Jane Glass, who was born April 1st.
1774, and died April the 1st, 1796, aged 22 years. (She was the
first wife of Saml. Glass, J. P. Campbell's wife in Henry Co.
her day.)

Sacred to the memory of Mrs. Elizabeth Glass who was born June
18th 1741 and died June 18th 1824, aged 83 years. (The mother
of Saml. Glass of Shelby)

Margaret M., daughter of Thomas P. and Eliza J. Campbell was born
Sept. 19, 1825, and died July 15, 1826, aged ten months and six
days.

Sacred to the memory of Joseph son of Samuel and Mary Glass who was born Nov. 6, 1802 and died June 21, 1804, aged 1 year, 7 months and 15 days.

Sacred to the memory of Mrs. Mary Glass who was born April 8, 1782 and died April 8, 1816, aged 44 years.

Sacred to the memory of Mr. Samuel Glass who was born Aug. 11, 1760 and died Feb. 11, 1837, aged 76 years and 6 months.

S. Glass died February 11, 1837 aged 76 (Foot stone)

Sacred to the memory of Mrs. Katherine S. Glass Shaw who was born Nov. 26, 1800 and died April 30, 1833 aged 32 years 5 months and 4 days.

All the marks of Thomas Dinwiddie's grave (a former ruling elder here) are gone. Rd. Wilson's grave (Mr. J. W.'s father) was opposite the west square of the meeting house, but when, he says, we enclosed the other graves, the head and foot stones of this were broken down, and we co'd not identify the spot. Two acres were reserved by Mr Marshall in ~~vanceying~~ the land. The graves are mostly, if not all, to the west of the house.
