On the fourteenth day of November A.D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State of said Margaret Green ~~was~~ aged fifty seven years a resident of Marion County in the State of Kentucky who being duly sworn declares that she is the widow of Charles Green deceased who was a Private in the Company commanded by Captain William Philips in the fifteenth Regiment of Kentucky detached Militia commanded by Colonel Slaughter in the war with Great Britain declared by the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of June 1812 that her said husband was drafted at Washington County Kentucky on or about the fifth day of November A.D. 1814 for the term of six months and continued in actual service in said war for the term of six months and was honorably discharged at Hamdenburg Kentucky on the twentieth day of May A.D. 1815 as will appear by his original certificate of discharge herewith presented.

She further states that she married to the said Charles Green in Washington County Ky on the thirtieth day of November A.D. 1813 by one Charles Herrings a Roman Catholic Priest and that her name before her marriage was Margaret Melohore that her said husband died at his home in Marion County Ky on the twenty first day of August A.D. 1841 and that she is still a widow she makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the County land to which she may be entitled under the act passed September 28<sup>th</sup> 1850.

In the claim of *Margaret Gross*  
for a widow's pension, under act of February 14, 1871, No. 7533  
proof of her marriage to the soldier prior to February 17, 1815, is  
required. You are informed that proof upon this point is of value in the  
following order.

1. A certified copy of a church or other public record.
2. An affidavit of the officiating clergyman or magistrate.
3. The testimony of two or more eye-witnesses of the ceremony.
4. The testimony of two or more witnesses who know the parties to have lived together as husband and wife from the date of their alleged marriage, the witnesses stating the period during which they know them thus to cohabit.

Before any of the lower classes of evidence can be accepted, it must be shown by competent testimony that none higher can be obtained.

In all affidavits relative to marriage, the affiants should state their ages at the time they testify.

Slaughter in the war with Great Britain, declared by the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of June 1812. that her said husband ~~was~~ drafted in Washington County Ky in the month of September 1814 for the term of Six months, and continued in actual service in said war for the term of Six months, and was honorably discharged at Harrodsburg Ky on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of May 1815.

She further states that she was married to the said Charles Green in Washington County Ky on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of August 1813 by one Charles Merine a clergyman of the Catholic Church, and that her name before her said marriage was Margaret Molohow; that her said husband died in Marion County Ky on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of August 1841. And that she is now a widow. She further states that she knows of no public records of her said marriage with Charles Green, nor of any family records of same.

She further declares that she has heretofore made application for Bounty lands under the act approved September 28. 1850. and obtained a land Warrant for 80 acres (no. not recollected) which she has legally disposed of, and it cannot now be returned. She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty lands to which she may be entitled under the act approved March 3. 1855.

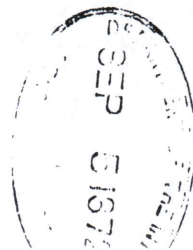

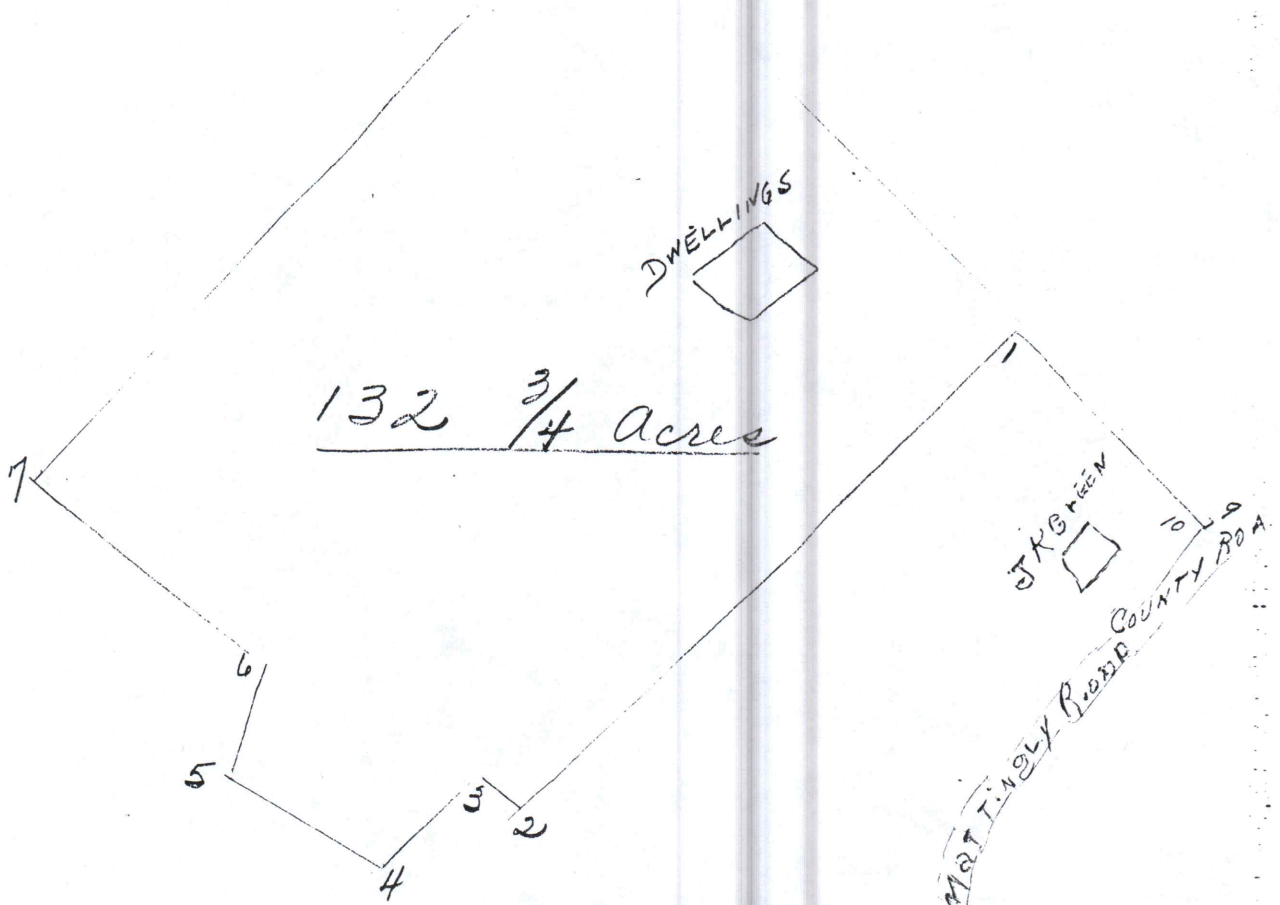

# Colonial Families Of The Southern States of America

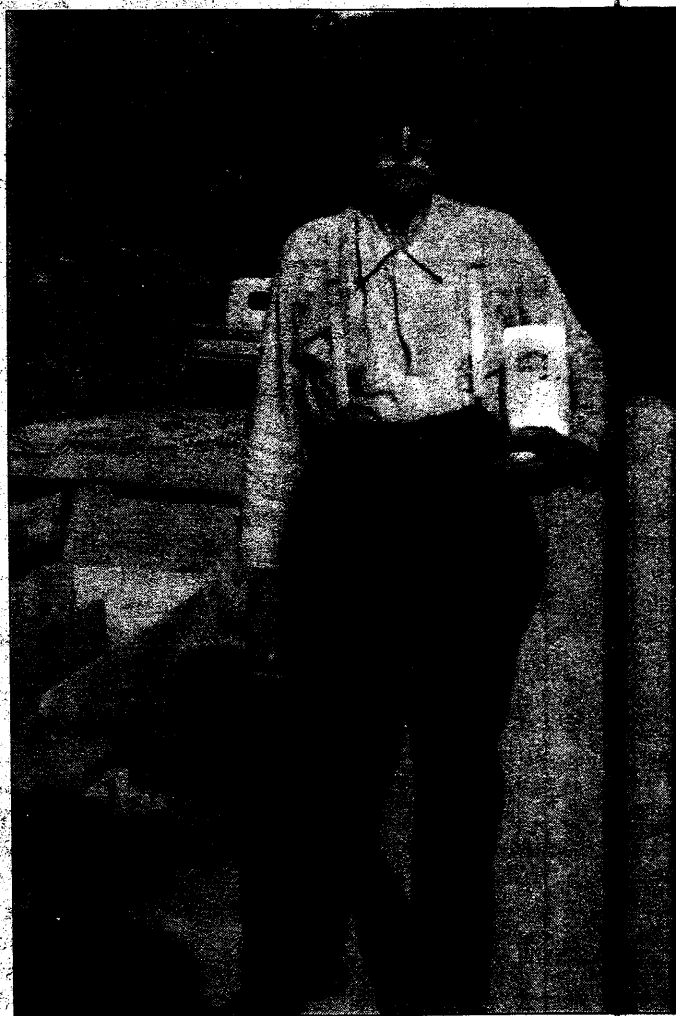
*Editor's Note: We are taking excerpts from the book Colonial Families Of The Southern States Of America by Stella Pickett Hardey. These excerpts consist of history and genealogy pertaining to families who settled in the colonies and later moved to Kentucky.*

## Green

The Greens of Virginia are of an ancient English family, tracing their lineage back to the early 14th century. Sir Henry Green, of "Green's Norton," Northampton County, England, was Lord Chief Justice of England, in the reign of Edward III, and was succeeded by his son, Sir Thomas Green; whose daughter, Matilda, married Sir Thomas Parr, and their daughter, Katherine was the sixth wife of Henry VIII.

William Green of "Green's Norton," Northampton County, England, was an officer in the body guard of William Prince of Orange, he was a cadet in the family of "Green's Norton." He married Eleanor Duff, who was of the noble Scottish clan of Macduff, and had issue:

1. Robert Green, the first of the family in Virginia; died 1795; came to the colony in 1712, located first in King George County, and later in Orange County, that portion of the county which was later created into Culpeper. In 1731 he was a vestryman of St. Mark's Parish, and in 1736 a Burgess from Orange County. He owned large es-

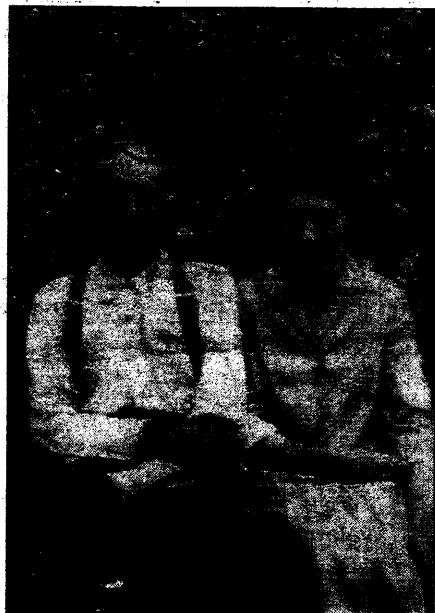

Served as deputy registrar of the Virginia Land Office for Kentucky from 1783 to 1792; and as member of the first Convention held in Kentucky, which formed the first and second Constitutions of Kentucky, 1785 and 1788.
