(NOTE: with respect to the first paragraph below, Katharine Hardin Huron and Nannie Hardin were double second cousins; Katharine Huron and Joseph Hardin were second cousins).

Dear cousin (6025)Nannie, Hardin. You cant help but claim kin with me. My Father was (5234)Aaron Harding. (4098)Abram Hardings son. My Grandfather (4098.Abraham) was a brother of Uncle (4100)Thos, your Mothers (5253.Amy) Father, also a brother to Aunt (4095)Mollie, your Fathers (5008.Mordecal) Mother. (5067)Benonie Hardins Mother, Aunt (4020)Nancy Gillehan was a sister to my Grand Mother (4025.Catherine Hardin) Hollett so you see that your husband (6030.Joseph) was a kin to me.

He was my escort on Easter Sunday, 1833 to Roman Chappell Seven or eight couple went from Uncle (4021)Harry Hardens to see sights and we saw more than we expected. Some of the crowd who went with me (5082)Nepolian, (5083)Victor (5080)Maria and (5084)Nancy Ann Hardin, were Uncle (4021)Harrys children Nancy and Herice Head (see #4021) were his step children. I well remember Aunt (4095)Molly Hardin she came to see us, and told a thrilling history of her captivity with the Indians and how she got home and Uncle (4100)Thomas told us how he held Uncle (4001)Jack to keep him from jumping in the river to swim to his wife and children. Uncle (4100)Thom told him they would kill him before he could get into the boat. It would take several pages to tell you all I remember about it.

Yes (6174)Lucinda Bristo and (6175)Susan Rector are your uncle (5254)Noahes daughters. My Father never had a brother, but Noah maid his home with us, cropped with my Father and I remember when he married Lucinda Rogers. She lived only a short time. after her death he came to my Fathers again and he next married Polly Car. a very eccelet lady. She was Lucindys and Susans Mother.

(5254)Noah dyed at my Fathers, he had come on business (he lived over 50 miles away.) he was taken sick they sent for Polly, she got there a very short time before he dyed, tho he knew her and asked

their lives. Later, a larger expedition headed by George Rogers Clark set some Indian villages afire, but the Indians moved further north with their prisoners, into settlements first on the Miami then on the Sandusky River. Here Molly and Mrs. Robertson were reunited, and Molly's daughter was born. It was here also that another unsuccessful rescue attempt resulted in the capture of Shively by the Indians, who ceremoniously burned him at the stake while the prisoners were forced to watch.

With a baby and a small son to care for, in addition to the drudgery of performing menial tasks for the Indians, Molly led a miserable existence. Eventually in November 1781 some Frenchmen in Montreal arranged ransom for the prisoners, who were then taken to Quebec until arrangements could be made to return them to their homes. Molly with her two children arrived in Philadelphia in February 1782, and back home on the Monongahela shortly after that. Jack was still in Kentucky, so it took a few more weeks for him to receive the good news and make his way back to Pennsylvania.

APPENDIX G - EARLY CHURCHES OF TAYLOR COUNTY, KY.

Family tradition has it that the first church in the vicinity of what is now Campbellsville, Taylor County, Ky., the precursor of the present Baptist Church there, was established at the home of John Harding about 1791 by the Harding brothers and their neighbors. Evidently there was an early Pitman Creek Church, dating from about 1792, but its location is uncertain. It probably was to the northwest of present Campbellsville, but this area was very sparsely settled, and still subject to Indian attack. When the Richerson claim began to be settled in the late 1790s, the Hardings and their neighbors started a new church on Robinson Creek. Both these creeks run parallel, about 25 miles long, emptying into the Green River; Robinson Creek is about 15 miles south of Pitman Creek. Campbellsville developed much later, about half way between the two creeks.

The first church on Pitman Creek had a small congregation. When the Hardings started a church on Robinson Creek, some of the Pitman congregation attended. However, the distance to travel from Pitman Creek was a problem; and as more settlers came to the Pitman Creek area they outnumbered those going to the Robinson Creek Church. Eventually an agreement was reached for a new church location on Pitman Creek, more convenient for the Robinson Creek people. Meetings were alternated at the two churches until the new church location was determined, a lot bought, and the log church built. The Pitman Creek people left the Robinson Creek Church early in 1802, but the new Church was not finished for about seven years. In the meantime, the Meadow Creek Church was organized by settlers a further 10 miles to the south.

Stephen and Abraham Harding, and occasionally Thomas, and their families, were pillars of both the Robinson Creek and Pitman Creek Churches. Stephen was equally active in the Meadow Creek Church after he moved his membership there. Abraham and Sarah are presumed to be buried in the graveyard at Robinson Creek, as probably are Stephen and Elizabeth. When Aaron Harding sold the home property in 1833 to go to Indiana, he reserved one acre for the Church and graveyard, which was carried in subsequent deeds until about 1890. The location is known, although no markers have survived. The Pitman

1781 and patented 1 June 1782). Entries could be made by an agent, but other evidence suggests that most or all of them were there at that time. The locations were where they eventually settled, and may have been generally explored by 3016.John and his brother in 1776.

The Nelson County, Ky. tithable list for 1785 shows John Hardin, Sr., John Hardin, Jr., Steven Hardin, John Hardin, Hector Hardin, William Hardin, Charles Wickliff, and Owen Thomas. It appears that 3016.John Hardin was there in 1786, 3015.Mark in 1787, 3004.Benjamin in 1788, and 3003.Mark in 1791. (These tithable lists usually implied residency, as contrasted to "comers and goers").

The "Steven Hardin" in the 1785 list was 4099.Stephen Harding, and one of the John Hardins could possibly have been his brother. Ede, Robert, and Thomas Harding all three appeared first in 1789. In 1790 there was a John Harding and John Harding Jr., and Stephen was listed as Stephen Harding with his son John C. Harding. These five Harding brothers were all on the first tax list of Washington County in 1792. Abraham evidently brought his family later, about 1796-8.

A 1795 tax list of Washington County, Kentucky shows Hardin names: Mark, Moses, Bealy, Benjamin, Casander (Cassandra), Absalom, Big John, John Jr., Ann, Martin, Henry, Jean, John's heirs, and John Sr. Also Hardings: Stephen, John, Robert, Ede, and Thomas.

APPENDIX F - MOLLY HARDIN AND THE INDIANS

Various elements of this story have been passed down through the generations. The following is an amalgamation of several versions.

When Virginia opened the new lands of Kentucky to claims and settlement in 1779, 4001.Jack Hardin planned that he and his family would seek their fortunes there at the first opportunity. He, his wife 4095.Mary "Molly" (Harding), and two young sons were then living in the Cheat/Monongahela River area of southwestern Pennsylvania. Early in 1780 there appeared in the Fort Redstone area a man named Reynolds with his family, from Maryland, intending to go to Kentucky. Reynolds arranged for two flatboats to be built at the Redstone boatyard, a large one for livestock and a smaller one for living quarters for families.

As Reynolds needed several additional hands, Jack signed on as did Mary's brother 4100.Thomas Harding and Jack's uncle 3005."Big Bill" Hardin, both unmarried but experienced woodsmen; and three other families named Malotte, Robertson and Shively. A third boat with the families of John Thickston and John Pringle joined and completed the convoy, on the theory that there was safety in numbers.

In early March, despite inclement weather, the women and children and household effects were loaded into the smaller boat, the livestock into the large one, and the little flotilla started down the Monongahela River. Each boat had oarsmen and a steersman to keep it generally in midstream and clear of obstructions; but due to the labor of handling the large boat and of tending to the livestock, most of the men usually were on it. Everything went well for over two weeks, down the Monongahela, past Fort Pitt, and on down the Ohio to a little east of present Portsmouth, Ohio and the mouth of the Scioto River. There, on the morning of March 20th, disaster struck.

Accounts vary; one relates that gusty wind pushed the small boat dangerously close to the Ohio shore; another tells that two white men (who turned out to be renegades) appeared on the shore appealing for

in Bedford County, Pa. [HW-327]. (Their brother Henry Hardin evidently remained in Virginia, while it is unclear what became of their brother Mark).

I have a copy of an old map of Springhill Township, Fayette Co., Pa. which shows the following properties lying contiguously from about 2 to about 5 miles east and slightly north of the junction of the Cheat and Monongahela Rivers, and south of Georges Creek: (1) 332 acres "Hoseas Choice", surveyed 24 May 1770 for Jas. Campbell, patented 31 Jan. 1785 to Aaron Moore; (2) 339 acres "Sugar Orchard" surv. 1 May 1786 for John Hardin, pat. 26 Oct. 1786 to John Hill; (3) 332 acres surv. 24 Nov. 1769 for James Neal, pat. 27 Sep. 1785 to James Neill; (4) 304 acres "Hardins Park" surv. 24 Nov. 1769 for John Hardin, pat. 25 Sep. 1785 to Jno. Hardin; (5) 300 acres "Fertile" surv. 25 Aug. 1785 for Jno. Hardin, pat. 23 Mar. 1836 to George Hardin; (6) 317 acres "Harbour" surv. 22 May 1770 for Martin Hardin, pat. 8 June 1804 to Joshua Brown; (7) 319 acres "Choice" surv. 22 May 1770 for John Hardin, Sr., pat. 9 May 1788 to Charles Griffin; (8) 303 acres surv. 18 Apr. 1770 for Mark Hardin, pat. part 1836 to Wm. Griffin heirs, part 1869 to Wm. P. Griffin; and (9) 311 acres "Benjamin's Flats" surv. 22 May 1770 for Benjamin Hardin, pat. 7 June 1804 to Joshua Brown.

In the 1770s this area was vigorously claimed by both Virginia and Pennsylvania; the bitter dispute was not settled, and the present boundary established, until the close of the Revolutionary War. At the time the Hardin families settled there it is likely that some of them thought they were still in Virginia. At any rate, the Hardins and the other families mentioned herein were all neighbors, within a radius of a few miles from the junction of the Cheat and Monongahela Rivers. The Wades were in Monongalia County (now West Virginia) on the west side on the Monongahela River and just south of the present Pennsylvania line. The Hardings also were nearby, in Fayette County or one of the adjacent counties of Pennsylvania or Virginia.

APPENDIX D - MIGRATION PENNSYLVANIA TO KENTUCKY

Some of the Hardins, and perhaps Hardings, made exploration trips to Kentucky before 1780. There is evidence that 3016. John Hardin, possibly accompanied by his brother 3015. Mark, did so in 1776, and again in 1780. Possibly 3005. Indian Bill went in 1779. March 1780 marked the first known attempt (by Hardins or Hardings) to move a family to Kentucky; this ended in disaster (see Appendix F below). Nevertheless, the men continued to explore and began to enter land claims for permanent settlement. Evidently some of their families made the journey, and settled in Kentucky by or before 1785.

These were hardy people: the Ohio Indians continued to harass their settlements, raid their livestock, and kill settlers all the way up to 1794. The Hardins and Hardings and men of related families joined in several military expeditions into Ohio against the Indians. It was not until 1794 that the expedition under General "Mad" Anthony Wayne broke the power of the Indians forever.

The first Hardin land claims in Kentucky were filed in May 1780, specifically: on 15 May 1780 3004. William Hardin 1200 acres, 3016. John Hardin 3000 acres, 3017. Martin Hardin 1000 acres, 3015. Mark Hardin 1500 acres, and Charles Wickliffe, husband of 3014. Lydia Hardin, 400 acres; and on 20 May 1780 3004. Ben Hardin 800 acres (at the same time he filed for 200 acres each in the names of his daughters Katey and Lydia; all three of these claims were surveyed in

[IGI-2585; LK-1; her brother 5249. John Harding's will]. (After her
death Hezekiah remarried, and listed a second family of seven in his
1848 will). Children of Rebecca and Hezekiah; per the terms of her
brother 5249. John Harding's will (see p. 36), 5257. Aaron Harding as
executor made payments as indicated - those receiving no payments
were self-sufficient [GH-1]:

[AB2-3:33], probably in Green County, Kentucky. She died sometime

5226. Mary (Harding) Carlisle [KH-2; GH-1]. Children of Sarah and
John, with payments made by 5257. Aaron Harding from 5249. John
Harding's estate [GH-1]:

[AB2-3:33] probably in Washington County, Kentucky. He died of a
sudden illness about July 1846, while visiting the home of 5234. Aaron
Harding at Brownsburg, Indiana, and is buried there [KH-2], although
his residence at that time was in Clinton or Howard County, Indiana.
He died intestate; his son-in-law John Bristow was granted a letter
of administration in Richardville (now Howard) County 14 Aug. 1846.
He married first, LUCINDA ROGERS 8 April 1819 in Green County,
Ky. [IGI-2584], daughter of John Rogers; she died, without issue, not

5243. PRUDENCE HARDING (dau. of 4099. Stephen), birthdate and place not known, married first MATTHEW TAYLOR in Green County, Ky. 1 February 1800 or 2 February 1801 [IGI-2584; SP-50]; he was the son of Samuel and Sally Taylor. They had one daughter. Prudence married second JOHN RUTHERFORD 7 October 1804 in Green County. Child:

6141. Sarah E. Taylor, mentioned in her grandfather Samuel Taylor's will [SP-50]. She m. Beverly Robinson 11 July 1820, consent of stepfather John Rutherford.

5244. ASA HARDING (son of 4099. Stephen) was born 22 November 1785; and died 22 August 1847 in Sangamon County, Ill. [SI-356/7]; (this gives his birthplace as Adair Co., Ky. which appears incorrect). Probably he was born in Green Co., Ky. where his marriage was recorded, then may have lived in Adair Co. later [GH-1].

Asa Harding was also accused, but cleared, in the paternity case 1805-1806 involving his cousin 5234. Aaron Harding (q.v.). This resulted in strong ill feeling between the two families (see Appendix D). Whether as a result of this, or for other unconnected reasons, in later years Asa and his family dropped the "g" from their name and went by the name "Hardin" in Illinois.

Asa married ELIZABETH TAYLOR 29 January 1813 in Green County, Ky. [IGI-2577; 4 Feb. 1813 in Adair Co. per SI-356/7 which place is evidently in error]. She was born 29 February 1790 in Orange County, Va., died in February 1854 in Sangamon Co., Ill. [BB-1; SI-356/7].

All their ten children were born in Kentucky. They removed to Morgan County, Illinois in 1830, then in 1832 to Sangamon County, Ill. Children [BB-1; SI-356/7]:

5237. LAVINA HARDING (dau. of 4098. Abraham) was born 19 September 1785 [IGI-2582] probably in the Cheat/Monongahela River area on the border between Pennsylvania and Virginia. Her death date is not known. She married SAMUEL PRUYEAR (bond) 17 January 1806 in Green County, Kentucky [IGI-2582; SP-61], the marriage was on 19 January [GH-1]. He was the son of Jesse and Elizabeth (Rice) Pruyear [GH-1]. Children [GH-1] (not necessarily in order of birth; possibly others):

5238. SARAH HARDING (dau. of 4098. Abraham) was born 8 February 1787 [KL-1] in the Cheat/Monongahela River area on the border between Virginia and Pennsylvania. She died in 1875 [LK-21], probably at Leitchfield, Ky. at the home of one of her sons.

Sarah Hardin, daughter of Abraham Hardin, married DAVID RICE 26 March 1806 in Green (now Taylor) County, Kentucky, bondsmen Samuel Pruyear and Aaron Hardin [SP-61]. He was the son of Randolph and Ruth (Pruyear) Rice, and brother of John Rice who married her sister 5235. Ruhaham Harding [GH-1]. Children [BB-1; GH-1] (not necessarily in order of birth; possibly there were others):

5233. HANNAH HARDING (dau. of 4098. Abraham) was born 19 April 1778 [KL-1] in the Cheat/Monongahela River area on the border between Virginia and Pennsylvania. She married JAMES DAWSON 30 January 1804 in Green County, Ky., bondsman Aaron Harding [SP-54; 20 Jan. or 2 Feb. IGI-2579]. He was born 12 September 1773, died in 1822 [FH-1].

The minutes of the Pitman Creek Church show that Hannah, James and Jane Dawson were received by letter 6 April 1805 [BB-1]. On 24 March 1810 Abraham Harding and wife Sally sold 122 acres to their son-in-law James Dawson, out of love [Green Co., Ky. Deeds 6:98].

In 1832 Hannah Dawson and her family removed from Kentucky to Marion County, Indiana northwest of Indianapolis, where she died in 1857 [FH-1]. Children [FH-1]:

5234. AARON HARDING (son of 4098. Abraham) was born 7 April 1780 [KL-1] in the Cheat/Monongahela River area on the border between Virginia and Pennsylvania. He had a long life, living to be almost 94 years old. He died 11 January 1876 at Brownsburg, Hendricks County, Indiana [KL-1].

Aaron Harding was the defendant in a paternity suit in Green County, Ky. in 1805-1806, here briefly summarized. Green County Court minutes for 24 March 1806 record that Aaron Harding was judged guilty of fathering an illegitimate female child by one Barbara Taylor, and as penalty had to pay 6 pounds per year for 4 years to the child's guardian, plus court costs; Samuel Taylor (Barbara's father) was appointed guardian. The minutes of the Pitman Creek Baptist Chruch for 1806-1807 reveal that some accusations were made that 5244. Asa Harding was the father, which resulted in strong ill feelings between the families of 4098. Abraham Harding and 4099. Stephen Harding, which were never entirely reconciled. [BB-11 GH-11]. More details of this case are included in Appendix H.

Aaron Harding married 5105. HANNAH HOLLETT (daughter of 4025. Catherine Hardin & 4094. Thomas Hollett) 23 October 1806 in Washington County, Ky. [List of marriages performed by Rev. Jesse

He was married three times. His first wife was ELIZABETH ASKREN, daughter of John and Sarah Askren, whom he married 30 September 1807 in Washington County, Ky. [IGI-2578, WK-76]. She was born 1789, died 2 April 1815 [GH-1] at age 35 (see below). Another source indicates she was born 12 Sep. 1785 [BB-1]. He married second HARRIET STONE, daughter of Benjamin Stone, 6 January 1817 in Shelby County, Ky. [WK-79]. She died 15 June 1835 at age 40, hence was born ca. 1795. His third wife was RACHEL BRAND (BLAND? BEARD?), who was born 1797 and died 19 May 1885 [GH-1; PW-163].

Benoni, his first two wives, and three of his daughters are buried in the same cemetery in Washington County, Ky. Gravestone inscriptions indicate that he died 22 May 1853 age 67; his wife Elizabeth died age 35y 4m; his second wife Harriet died in 1835 age 40; daughter Elizabeth, born 24 April 1820 died 5 Feb. 1855; daughter Harriet who married J.C. Rollins, born 4 Dec. 1824 died 17 May 1855; daughter C. Ann who married Rinehart, born 1828 died 1 May 1854 [PW-163].

The will of Benoni Hardin was written 21 Feb. 1851, proved 20 June 1853 [AB1-261; Washington Co., Ky. W.B. I:457]. It named: wife Rachel; three sons by first marriage Thomas A. (deceased, had children, was in Missouri); John A. (deceased), and Joseph; these three sons had received their mother's distribution in the estate of their grandfather John Askren; daughters Sophia Bentley and Chloe Ann Rinehart; and mentioned "other children". Exec.: Mordecai Hardin.

The will of Elizabeth Hardin (Benoni's daughter) was written 28 Jan. 1855, proved 19 Feb. 1855 [AB1-272; Washington Co., Ky. W.B. J:202]. It named: sisters Harriet Rollins, Fanny McElroy, Chloe Ann Rinehart (deceased), and Sophia Bentley; an infant niece, daughter of Ann Rinehart, and the niece's brother Michael; brothers Joseph, Robert F., and Michael Hardin; and the heirs of Thomas Hardin and John A. Hardin. Exec.: her brother Joseph Hardin. Wit.: Mordecai and Thomas B. Hardin.

Children of Benoni Hardin, all probably born in Washington Co., Ky.: the first three at least by his first wife Elizabeth, the last three by his second wife Harriet, the other four uncertain [wills, above; BB-1; PW-163]:

4105. ELIZABETH MOORE (dau. of 3031. Aaron Moore) was born perhaps in
the period 1755-60, probably in Frederick County (now Washington
Co.), Maryland; and moved with her parents to what is now Fayette
County, Pennsylvania ca. 1769-70. It appears likely that she died in
Monongalia County, (W)Virginia in 1833 [WF-14, 15].

She married ALEXANDER WADE probably ca. 1775 in what is now
Fayette County, Pa.; no marriage record has been found [WF-14]. He
was born about November 1748 possibly in Maryland, son of George
Wade; died 10 May 1803 age 54 yrs. 6 mos. 8 das. [WF-14].

The will of 3031. Aaron Moore (1781) mentioned the adjoining land
of Alexander Wade, and the latter was assessed in Springhill Township
(Fayette Co., Pa.) in 1783, 1785 and 1786 [WF-14]. As of 19 Oct.
1789 land was patented to him in Monongalia County, (W)Va. on a
little stream known as Wade's Run emptying into Scott's Run. This
land then became their home for the rest of their lives.

They had 11 children, all born either in what is now Fayette
Co., Pa. or just across the state line in what is now Monongalia Co.,
W.Va. [WF-15 et seq.]:

Thomas Harding was on a tithable list of Nelson County, Ky. in 1789, and on a Tax List of Washington Co. in 1795 [GH-11]. In Green County, Ky. on 11 Aug. 1801 Thomas Harding purchased 200 acres on Pittman Creek from Joseph Richerson, witnesses Abraham Harding, Andrew White and Ede Harding [Green Co. Deeds 3:1081], which he deeded to Michael Shively in 1817 [GH-11]; on 29 Sep. 1809 he purchased 94 acres on the Middle Fork of Pittman Creek from Alexander St. Clair [Green Co. Deeds 5:459]; on 12 Feb. 1836 Thomas Harding of Hendricks Co., Ind. and Sarah Harding sold to George Marr one tract of 64 acres on the Middle Fork of Pitman Creek (Green Co., Ky.), and two tracts of 111 acres and 22 acres on Pitman Creek, witnesses Larkin Campbell and Aaron Harding [ibid., 16:4141]. He entered some 270 acres in Hendricks Co., Indiana 16 June 1830 [LK-1, Hendricks Co. Deeds].

The abstracts of his pension papers give much family information [AB2-3:31, 32, 33] (see Note with this ref. in Appendix A). He gave affidavit of his service in Green County, Ky. 21 Aug. 1832, as did Michael Shively and 4106. Sarah Harding widow of 4098. Abraham Harding, 4101. Ede Harding gave affidavit 11 Aug. 1832 in Marion Co., Ind. 4095. Mary Hardin, widow of 4001. John Hardin gave affidavit 14 Dec. 1832 in Washington Co., Ky. Thomas Harding was on the Kentucky Roll of Pensions from 9 Aug. 1833 at the rate of \$80 per annum. On 18 June 1835 he appeared in court in Hendricks Co., Ind. to ask that his pension payment be changed to Indiana, to which state he had removed; and 5234. Aaron Harding testified as to Thomas's identity.

His widow Sarah received a pension of \$40 per annum from 16 Dec. 1840. On 1 July 1844 in Putnam Co., Ind. Elizabeth Hardin (wife of 4022. John) testified that she was Sarah's sister, their maiden name was Payne, and that she was present at Sarah's marriage to Thomas. In Hendricks Co., Ind. on 11 July 1844 5254. Noah Harding entered into the record names and birth dates from the family Bible; on 16 July 5234. Aaron Harding testified as to the marriage; and on 17 July Sarah testified and gave their marriage date and Thomas's death date.

Children of Thomas and Sarah [Bible record AB2-3:33, except for Rhuamy], probably all born in Washington and Green Counties, Ky.:

John lived the last ten years of his life with his brother Aaron [LK-11]. He and his family are buried in the Pitman Creek Churchyard. His will was dated 7 Nov. 1854, proved 20 Nov. 1854 [Green Co. W.B. 3:197, I have a copy]. It made specific bequests to his brothers Payne Harding and Aaron Harding; to his deceased wife's sisters Jemima Wright, Elizabeth Wright, and Polly Harding wife of James Harding; and to Henry McDonald. The balance of his estate was left in the care of his brother Aaron (the Executor) for distribution "among the more needy and indigent children of" his deceased brother Samuel, his deceased sister Rebecca Pruyear who married Hezekiah Pruyear, his deceased sister Rhuamy Reed who married Nathaniel Reed, and his deceased sister Sally who married John Carlisle.

Sarah; son Aaron; and daughters Hannah Dawson, Ruhamah Rice, Mary Ball, Levina Preyer (sic), and Sarah Rice. Execr.: wife Sarah Harding. It distributed over 700 acres of land.

4099. STEPHEN HARDING (son of 3026. John) was born probably in the period 1749-1756, birthplace not known. He died in Green County, Kentucky about February or March 1816 [will, below].

His wife's name was ELIZABETH ----- [deed, & will, below]. Nothing further is known about her, nor about their marriage.

Stephen Hardin was admitted to membership in the Forks of the Cheat River Baptist Church 1 Apr. 1781, and was still listed as a member in 1788 [BB-1]. Stephen Hardin was also listed as a member of the Great Bethel Baptist Church, Uniontown, Pa. in 1783.

Stephen Hardin was granted a certificate for land on Indian Creek in Monongalia Co., (W)Va. 4 Mar. 1781; also part of a preemption warrant for 1000 acres on Scott's Mill Run 20 Oct. 1781, adjacent and between Abraham Hardin and Phillip Shively [BB-1]. Steven Hardin was on a transcript of property list of Westmoreland County, Pa. in 1783 (for livestock only; also listed were Abraham, Robert, Eden, Thomas and probably John) [Pa. Arch. Ser. 3, 22:423-4]. Stephen Harding of Washington County, Ky. by his attorney-in-fact Abraham Harding sold 196 acres on Scott's Mill Run in Monongalia Co., (W)Va. 1 May 1796 [BB-1, Deed Book A:252].

A Steven Hardin was on a Tithable List in Nelson Co., Ky. in 1785 [GH-1]. Stephen, John, Thomas, Robert and Ede Harding were on a 1795 Tax List of Washington Co., Ky. [GH-1]. Stephen Hardin purchased 300 acres on Robinson Creek in Green County, Ky. (adjoining Mathias Weant and Jonathan Williams) 16 Oct. 1798 [Green Co., Ky. deeds 2:19]. Stephen Hardin and wife Elizabeth of Green County, deeded 100 acres "one-half of my settlement right granted in 1795, deeded 100 acres "one-half of my settlement right granted in 1795, then Logan Co. but now of Warren" to Samuel Davis of Christian Co. 20 May 1800 [SP-45, Green Co. deeds 2:167]. Stephen and wife Elizabeth sold another 100 acres 16 June 1806 [Green Co. deeds 2:181]. As of 20 June 1807 Stephen Hardin was one of the trustees of the Pitman Creek Baptist Church in Green County [SP-49].

Stephen was an active member of the Pitman Creek Baptist Church, then the Robinson Creek Church, then in 1808 transferred to the Meadow Creek Church; possibly because of the ill feeling between him and his brother Abraham over the paternity suit in which their two sons had been involved (see Appendices G and H).

The will of Stephen Harding was dated 25 Feb. 1815, proved 25 Mar. 1816 [Green Co. W.B. 2:140; I have a copy]. It named: wife Elizabeth; sons Asa, Stephen, and John; daughters Margaret, Prudence, Elizabeth, Mary, and Rebecca; granddaughters Elizabeth Hoves, Nancy Hoves, and Susannah Hoves; and children of son Abraham deceased.

5228.Samuel Harding, married Lucy Whitlock. Marriage bond 20 Aug. 1796 in Green Co., Ky., she age 21, bondsman John Harding. [IGI-2585; SP-56].

5229.Jemimah Harding. Court records and depositions 1802-1806 [GH-1, Green Co. Circuit Court Clerk's file 6253] show that 4097. John Harding was involved in a lawsuit and countersuit, over an alleged note of indebtedness for treatment of his daughter Jemimah by a Dr. Dacon (or Deacon) ca. 1791-92; with inference that she did not recover (see also p. 20). His attorney "Wickliff" was probably 4054. Robert Wickliffe. Other deponents were 5227. John Harding, Jr., 4100. Thomas Harding, and James Carlisle husband of 5226. Mary Harding.

5230.Lydia Harding, married John Wright. Marriage bond 17 June 1800 in Green Co., Ky., "Lyddy" Harding, dau. of John Harding, bondsman Samuel Harding. [SP-65].

5231.Jane Harding, married James McGill. Marriage bond 15 Oct. 1804 in Green Co., Ky., (last name Hardin), she was "of age", bondsman Alex. Carson. [IGI-2582; SP-58].

+5232.Abel Harding, married Elizabeth B. Colvin.

4098.ABRAHAM HARDING (son of 3026. John) was born 17 September 1752 [KL-1; WK-101 or 1754 [LK-2], place of birth not known. He died 25 May 1818 in Green (now Taylor) County, Kentucky [KL-1].

He married 4106.SARAH MOORE [KL-1]; she was the daughter of 3031. Aaron Moore, born 26 August 1759 [KL-1] probably in Frederick County, Md.; and died 2 March 1833 in Green (now Taylor) County, Ky. [KL-1]. Their marriage very probably took place in what is now Fayette County, Pa., about 1776. Quite probably they lived on the land of her father Aaron Moore until he died in 1785 [GH-1]. In an affidavit in 1832 regarding 4100. Thomas Harding's Revolutionary War pension claim, Sarah Harding widow of Abraham stated that during the war she resided about two and one-half miles from the junction of the Cheat and Monongahela Rivers in Pennsylvania, not far from the Virginia line [FH-1].

The Great Bethel Baptist Church was located in Fayette County near Smithfield, until it was reconstituted in Uniontown. Among its members were the following: Abraham Hardin 1781; Sarah Hardin 1782; Sarah, Mary, Elizabeth, and Stephen Hardin 1783; Abraham Hardin and wife 1784. [GH-1 - Great Bethel Church Minutes; BB-1; FP-574]. Abraham removed to the Mt. Moriah Church (near New Geneva) by letter in Sep. 1788 [GH-1].

The names of Abraham Hardin, Thomas Hardin, Eden Hardin, John Hardin, and John Harding are on a "List of Soldiers Who Served as Rangers on the Frontiers 1778-1783", Westmoreland Co., Pa. [Pa. Arch. Ser. 3, 23:229, 285, 317]; also (spelled Harden and Hardin) on two lists of soldiers who received pay, Westmoreland Co. [Pa. Arch. Ser. 5, 4:439, 743]. Abraham died before the Pension Acts were passed, so there is no pension record for him as there are for his brothers Thomas and Eden.

Abraham Hardin (with Steven, Robert, Eden, Thomas and 3 John Hardins) was on a Transcript of Property in Westmoreland County, Pa. in 1783; and on Tax Returns (with Robert and 2 John Hardins) in Fayette County, Springhill Twp., in 1785 and 1786 (3031. Aaron Moore was on the same list in 1785) [Pa. Arch. Ser. 3, 22:423, 565, 629]. Abraham Hardin and Robert Hardin were listed (among others) as distillers in Fayette Co., Springhill Twp. in 1786 [BB-1].

A claim was filed by a Robert Harding on Goose Creek, a branch of Hughes River, in (now) West Virginia; a history of Wood Co., WV gives his name and Philip Shively with others who settled there in 1773-1775 [GH-1]. Two sources imply that he lived in Washington County, Pa. [MI-365; WK-104]; but Robert Harden or Hardin was on a Transcript of Property of Westmoreland Co., Pa. in 1783 (with Abraham, Steven, Eden, Thomas and probably John); and on Tax Returns of Fayette Co., Springhill Twp. in 1785 and 1786 (with Abraham) [Pa. Arch. Ser. 3, 22:423, 565, 6291]. Robert and Abraham were listed as distillers in Springhill Township, Fayette Co., Pa. in 1786 [BE-11].

He probably moved to Kentucky not long after that. Stephen and possibly John Harding were on the first tithable list of Nelson County in 1785, with Ede, Robert and Thomas all first appearing in 1789. Robert was later listed in the militia of Washington County [PW-254]. He was the first Harding brother to actually record a deed there; his land was on the Rolling Fork River in present southern Marion Co. Robert, Stephen, John, Ede and Thomas were all on a tax list of Washington Co., Ky. in 1795 [GH-1].

It appears that Robert did not join his brothers in later moving to Green County, but remained in Washington County for a time. About 1808 he moved to Butler County, Ohio then later to Indiana [MI-365]. But he sold the Marion Co. land in 1800 and perhaps moved to Ohio at that time; the history of Montgomery Co., Ohio listed him and sons Eliakim and Eden as early settlers where Robert entered land where Germantown was laid out. He sold the Ohio land in 1813, moving to Fayette Co., Ind. where he received a patent for land. [GH-1].

His will written 17 Mar. 1819, proved 24 Jan. 1820 mentioned wife Martha, sons John, Eliakim, Samuel, Israel, Laban and "sons and daughters"; he had already deeded half his land to each of his sons Robert Jr. and Ede [GH-1]. Children of Robert and Martha, probably not in order of birth. (NOTE: MI-365 lists Mary not Sarah; WK-104 lists Sarah not Mary; marriage dates cited for Sarah and Jemima are not credible; caution is recommended in using this data):

5215. Martha J. Harding.

5216. Nancy Harding.

5217. Sarah Harding, m. James Grotter 1839 [WK-104].

5218. Mary Harding.

5219. Jemima Harding, m. Abraham Dawson 1841 [WK-104] (perhaps 6091. Abraham Harding Dawson).

5220. Eliakim Harding, m. Catherine Annis [WK-104].

5221. Robert Harding, Jr., b. 16 Nov. 1791 in Washington Co., Ky. [IGI-2585].

+5222. Eden Harding, b. 16 Mar. 1793, m. (1) Mary Robinson, (2) Rebecca (Benn) Gowdy.

5223. Samuel Harding, b. 10 Sep. 1795 in Washington Co., Ky. [IGI-2585], d. 1874 in Wayne Co., Ind., m. (1) -----, (2) Jane Johnson, dau. of Jeremiah, ca. 1824 [WK-104].

Ky. for short periods, d. 8 Sep. 1867. They had 12 children, including Benjamin Hardin Helm, Civil War Confederate General and Abraham Lincoln's brother-in-law, as they married the sisters Emily and Mary Todd.

5144.James Pendleton Hardin, b. 22 Oct. 1810, graduated West Point 1832, in Black Hawk War, d. 26 Oct. 1842; m. 10 Nov. 1835 Jane Tandy Chinn, dau. of Christopher and 4061.Sarah White Stull (Hardin) Chinn, b. 26 Sep. 1817, d. 29 Sep. 1870, m. 2nd Rev. Joseph Cross. Three children.

5145.Rowan B. Hardin, b. May 1812, served in the Mexican War, d. 1851 in Panama (believed murdered); m. 10 Mar. 1836 in Fleming Co., Ky. Eliza Ann Cartmell, b. 4 July 1815, d. 3 July 1891. They had seven children.

5146.Emily Hardin, b. Sep. 1813, d. 1845; m. 13 July 1830 in Nelson Co., Ky. Dr. Robert Caldwell Palmer, son of Henry and Mary Logan (Steel)(Caldwell) Palmer, b. 16 July 1800, d. 1882. They had seven children.

5147.William Wallace Hardin, b. Sep. 1815, d. Jan. 1827, stabbed to death.

5148.Kate Thomas Hardin, b. 27 Dec. 1817; m. (1) 25 July 1835 Nelson Co. Ky. George Howell, no children; m. (2) 25 Mar. 1840 Thomas Wilson Riley, they had one son.

5149.Sarah Hardin, b. 1 Jan. 1822, m. 15 Mar. 1842 in Nelson Co., Ky. George Dixon, no children. George Dixon m. 2nd Jamesetta P. Hardin, dau. of 5144.James P. Hardin and Jane Tandy Chinn, they had three daughters.

4057.CHARLES ANDERSON WICKLIFFE (youngest son of 3014.Lydia Hardin Wickliffe) was born 18 June 1788 near Springfield, Washington County, Kentucky. Like his cousin 4039.Ben Hardin, he was notable among the legal minds and public servants of Kentucky during the first half of the 19th Century. He died 31 October 1869 while on a visit to his daughter in Harford Co., Maryland; he was buried at Bardstown, Ky. [DAB-20:182; GH-1].

He married MARGARET CREPPS 20 February 1813 in Bullitt Co., Ky. She was born 7 September 1788, daughter of Col. Christian and Elizabeth (Brashear) Crepps, and died 10 December 1863. [DAB-20:182; GH-1]. They built their house "Wickland" one-half mile east of Bardstown; this famous three-story brick mansion has been cited by the Smithsonian as the most perfect example of Georgian architecture in the United States. Known as the home of three Governors, it is open to the public.

Charles A. Wickliffe became a high official at both state and national levels. Again like his cousin 4039.Ben Hardin (they were contemporaries and companions) he studied law with their cousin 4070.Martin D. Hardin, and was admitted to the bar in 1809. He and Ben were among a small group of Bardstown lawyers famous both for their talents and for their revelries. Wickliffe established a reputation as a bacchanalian and a gambler for high stakes. [DAB-20:182].

He was a member of the Kentucky House of Representatives 1812-13, then enlisted in the War of 1812 and participated in the Battle of the Thames. He was again in the Kentucky legislature 1820-21, then a U.S. Congressman 1823-33. He ran unsuccessfully for U.S. Senator in 1831. Returning to the Kentucky legislature, he was speaker of the House in 1835; elected Lieutenant Governor in 1836, and on the death of Gov. Clark in 1839 became Governor of Kentucky.

family tradition [LK-2] Hannah was born in Maryland on the north bank of the Potomac River, hence the family apparently lived in western Maryland, adjacent to (then) Hampshire County, Virginia.

They removed to Washington County, Kentucky about 1795, as Thomas Hollett was shown there on Beech Fork in 1796 and 1799 county census records [FH-1]. He bought 100 acres on Beech Fork of Salt River from Clement and 4020. Ann (Hardin) Gillihan in Oct. 1803 [Wash. Co. Deeds C:71]. Thomas and Catherine Hollett sold 100 acres on Beech Fork 10 Jan. 1811 [ibid. C:494]. About 1811 they moved across the Ohio River into Indiana Territory (they may have been in Preble Co., Ohio for a while), then settled in Wayne County, Indiana where he deeded land to his son John 5 Nov. 1824 [Wayne Co. Deeds E:24].

Thomas Hollett's will was dated 9 Nov. 1824 [Wayne Co., Ind. W. B. 1:119; I have photocopy; no date of proving indicated]. It

named: (wife Catherine not named, presumably deceased); sons John (eldest) and Mark; daughters Hannah Harden and Catharine Woodward; his son Mark's four children Thomas, John, Martha, and Mark Hollett; his son-in-law William Askin; Askin's children Richard, Lydia, Caty, Sally, and Martha Ann Askin (evidently all minors); granddaughters Minerva Hollett, Eliza Hollett, and Narcissa Hollett (all minors). Exe.: son John Hollett. Children, perhaps all born in western Maryland:

They lived in Wayne Co., Ind., where several deeds are recorded [FH-1].

5106. Mark Hollett, m. Ann (Nancy) Nusom Moore (bond) 10 Sep. 1808 in Washington Co., Ky. [Wash. Co. Mrq. Bk. 1:801, d. ca. 1818 in Wayne Co., Ind., will 15 Oct. 1818 [FH-1]. They had children 6054. Thomas 1809, 6055. John 1812, 6056. Martha, and 6057. Mark Hollett. His widow remarried, to James Marcus Baxter 5 Sep. 1821 in Wayne Co., and they moved to Hendricks Co., Ind. ca. 1837, where she d. in 1865 [FH-1].

5107. George Hollett, m. Hannah ----- [LK-2], not named in his father's will, evidently d. before 1824. Possibly father of 6058. Minerva, 6059. Eliza and 6060. Narcissa Hollet named in Thomas's will.

5108. Ann (Nancy) Hollett, m. William Askren (or Askin) (bond) 8 July 1808 in Washington Co., Ky. [Wash. Co. Mrq. Bk. 1:801, evidently deceased before 1824. They had children surnamed Askren: 6061. Richard, 6062. Lydia, 6063. Catherine, 6064. Sarah, and 6065. Martha Ann Askren (and perhaps others).

5109. Catharine Hollett, b. 1 Dec. 1792 in Md., d. 11 Jan. 1871, m. Asahel Woodward 1 Oct. 1815 in Wayne Co., Ind. [FH-1]. They were among the first white settlers in Henry County, Ind. in 1819. They had children surnamed Woodward: 6066. Rachel 1816, 6067. Vienna 1818, 6068. Thomas B. 1819, 6069. Pyrrhus 1822, 6070. Franklin 1824, 6071. Mary J. 1826, 6072. Clarinda 1833, and 6073. Martin V. 1834. [See "History of Henry Co., Ind. 1822-1902", by George Hazzard, 383, 388 for further detail].

5110. Lydia Hollett, d.y. [LK-2].

5111. Thomas Hollett, d.y. [LK-2].

5081. Fidelia Hardin, b. 21 Mar. 1806, m. William M. White 8 Apr. 1829 in Washington Co., Ky.

5082. Napoleon B. Hardin, b. 1 June 1810, m. Sophronia Sandusky 7 Nov. 1832 in Washington Co., Ky.

5083. Victor M. Hardin, b. 11 Aug. 1812, m. Nancy Purdy 16 Apr. 1840 in McDonough Co., Ill., dau. of Presley Purdy, had 1 son and 1 daughter.

5084. Nancy Ann Hardin, b. 16 April 1815, m. Edward Briscoe 24 Jan. 1838 (probably in McDonough Co., Ill.).

5085. George Washington Hardin, b. 2 Aug. 1817, d. 3 May 1900 at Appanoose, Iowa; m. (1) Malinda A. Wiatt 23 Feb. 1843 in Pike Co., Ill., b. 1 Feb. 1824, d. 7 Aug. 1886; m. (2) Virginia Ann (Swinford) Earls 18 May 1900 at Savannah, Mo., dau. of John Done and Elizabeth D. Swinford.

5086. Benjamin Hardin, b. 5 Dec. 1821.

4022. JOHN HARDIN (son of 3003. Mark) was born 14 August 1767 [DAR-3; WK-44], probably in Hampshire County, (W)Virginia. He died 3 April 1850 [DAR-3; WK-44] in Putnam County, Indiana [GH-1].
He married ELIZABETH PAYNE (or Paine) 11 August 1794 [DAR-3], marriage bond 4 Aug. 1794 in Washington Co., Ky. [IGI-2581]. She was the daughter of Lt. Jonathan Paine [WK-44]; born 25 July 1778 in Virginia, died 18 March 1852 [DAR-3; WK-44] in Putnam County, Indiana [GH-1]; her sister Sarah married 4100. Thomas Harding. On 1 July 1844 in Putnam Co., Ind. Elizabeth Hardin appeared in court with regard to her sister's pension application, and swore that she was a sister of Sarah Hardin, and that their maiden name had been Payne [AB2-33].
When John Hardin moved from Pennsylvania to Kentucky is not known; he may have gone ca. 1789 with his parents, or earlier with others of the family. He and his own family moved to Henry County, Ky. in 1830, then later to Putnam County, Indiana [GH-1]. Children [WK-44, 45], prob. b. Washington Co., Ky. (and probably others):

5088. Sarah Hardin, b. 1795, m. John Forrest Farley 1815, living in Greencastle, Putnam Co., Ind. in 1850. [GH-1].

5089. Enos Hardin, b. ca. 1808, m. Mary W. Dean.

5090. Mark Hardin, b. ca. 1810/11, m. Martha Ann Shackleford.

5091. Rev. John Harvey Hardin, b. 14, 16 or 17 Aug. 1814, m. (1) Elizabeth Ann Grantham & (2) Sarah Brown Jones, d. Harlan Co., Nebr. 5 Aug. 1899 [DAR-3].

4024. BENJAMIN HARDIN ("Stiller Ben") (son of 3003. Mark) was born 13 April 1776 [GH-1], probably in Hampshire County, (W)Virginia. He evidently died in 1820; he did not return from a boat trip in the spring of that year, carrying produce from Kentucky down the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers [GH-1].

Robert survived. In the fall of 1781 they were ransomed by French Canadians in Montreal, and eventually found their way back to Pennsylvania where the family was happily reunited.

Undaunted, Jack and Mollie set about repairing their fortunes and in the spring of 1785 successfully migrated to Nelson (now Washington) County, Kentucky. About 1790 they purchased a small tract adjoining 3016. Col. John Hardin's claim near the mouth of Pleasant Run, where they lived out the rest of their days.

John Hardin's will was dated 21 Feb. 1818, proved 11 May 1818 (Washington Co., Ky. W.B. C:115; I have a copy; abstract AB1-1021).

It named: wife Mary; sons Mordecai and Robert; daughters Mary Harrison and Nancy Stephenson; and 5 children of daughter Hannah Springer - Lewis H., Mordecai B., Sara Ann, Nancy, and Missouri Springer. Execrs.: Mordecai and Robert Hardin.

Mary Hardin, widow of John Hardin, gave affidavit 14 Dec. 1832 in Washington Co., Ky. in support of the Rev. War Pension application of her brother 4100. Thomas Harding [AB2-321].

5004. Mary Hardin, b. 22 Oct. 1780 in an Indian camp in Ohio; d. after 5 June 1837, m. Cuthbert Harrison 12 Jan. 1804 [IGI-2583]; he d. ca. 1 June 1837. They lived in Meade Co., Ky. [JH-311].

5005. Hannah Hardin, b. 19 Mar. 1783 in Washington Co., Ky., d. 28 Aug. 1815, m. Charles Springer 27 July 1802. They had children surnamed Springer: 6013. Lewis H., 6014. Mordecai B., 6015. Sarah Ann, 6016. Nancy, and 6017. Missouri [will of 4001. Jack Hardin]. They moved to Crawford Co., Ind. about 1814. (Note Missouri Springer mentioned in KH-2, perhaps they returned to Ky.).

5006. Nancy Hardin, b. 4 Dec. 1785 in Washington Co., Ky., d. 3 Sep. 1838, m. John Stephenson 2 Feb. 1807. He was b. 17 Jan. 1777, d. 25 Dec. 1862; they lived in Perry Co., Ind.

5007. Elizabeth Hardin, b. 8 Jan. 1788 in Washington Co., Ky., d. 25 Oct. 1795.

+5008. Mordecai Hardin, b. 5 Mar. 1792 in Washington Co., Ky., d. 1 Dec. 1860, m. 5253. Amy Harding.

4020. ANN or NANCY HARDIN (dau. of 3003. Mark) was born probably about 1763 in Hampshire County, (West) Virginia. She moved with her parents to Nelson County, Kentucky about 1789. She died 2 February 1840 in Washington County, Ky. [GH-1, most data from Iva Hardin's information].

4102. Amy Harding. Strong evidence for a daughter Amy is in the record of a court case in Green Co., Ky. in the period 1802-1806, in which 4097. John Harding was being sued for collection on a note he allegedly gave a Dr. Dacon for treatment of his daughter Jemima, sometime about 1791-1792 (GH-1, Green Co. Circuit Court Clerk's file 6253). Deposing were 4097. John Harding Sr., 4100. Thomas Harding, John Harding Jr., and others. In a deposition in 1805, Thomas Harding was asked if he applied to Dr. Dacon for treatment "for your sister Amy Dawson" at the same time (ca. 1791-1792), to which Thomas replied "I did". This seems positively to establish a daughter of 3026. John Harding, named Amy, who married ----- Dawson, and who was living in Green Co., Ky. about 1792.

4103. Hannah Harding. Some sources list a daughter Hannah; and that she married John Hollett (WK-103), or that she married ----- Stalkup (or Michael Shively?) (LK-2). "Harding Family" (JH-60,80) indicated that a John Hollett's wife was Hannah Harding, but did not relate her to the other Hardings. Note that 4018. Hannah Hardin married a Henry Stalcup. In a 1905 letter (in my possession) Jack Harding of Pleasureville, Ky. (grandson of 4100. Thomas) wrote that he was sure one of John and Sarah Harding's daughters married Michael Shively. "Hardin Family" (JH-46) indicated that the Mrs. Shively who was killed by the Indians on the Ohio River in March 1780 was a Harding, a "cousin" to 4095. Mary and 4100. Thomas. These items are contradictory and inconclusive. There is no documentary record of a Hannah Harding; whether there was a daughter of that name and if so, whom she married, are unresolved questions.

4104. Lydia Harding. Some sources list a daughter Lydia, and that she married Jonathan Wright (WK-103), or that she married ----- Wright (or Michael Shively?) (LK-2). Considering that in the next generation 4097. John Harding's daughter Lydia did marry a John Wright, it appears that ascribing a daughter Lydia to 3026. John Harding was a mistake.

3031. AARON MOORE (son of 2012. George Moore) was born ca. 1730, place of birth not known, possibly Maryland. He died ca. September 1785 in what is now Fayette County, Pennsylvania [will, below].

He married 3036. MARY (Polly) PRATHER (KH-11) (dau. of 2013. Col. Thomas S. Prather) probably at her parents home in Frederick Co., Md., as an estimate about 1755. She was born 6 January 1730 in Queen Anne's Parish, Prince Georges County, Maryland (see her father's entry for more data). She survived her husband, but the date of her death is not known.

They moved ca. 1769-70 to what became Springhill Township, Fayette County, Pa., although in his will (1781) he styled himself "of Monongalia County and State of Virginia". (The location of his property "Hoseas Choice", 332 acres, is shown clearly on the old map of Springhill Township mentioned in Appendix C).

His will was dated 18 October 1781, proved at Uniontown, Pa. in Oct. 1785. It named: wife Mary; "my three sons" Hosea ("eldest"), Aaron ("second"), and Henry ("youngest"); and daughters Elizabeth, Sarah, Abigail, Ruhama, Eloner (sic), Martha, and Nancy ("youngest"). Among neighbors named in the will as owning adjacent properties were: John Swearingen, Alexander Wade, William Hardin, and John Hardin, Jr.

3026.JOHN HARDING was undoubtedly the progenitor of our line of Hardings [KH-1; WK-10.46.102.xxviii], but nothing is known about him beyond his name. Judging solely by the supposed birth dates of his children, he was born perhaps ca. 1720-25.

His wife was named MARY (or SARAH) MOSS according to family tradition [KH-1; LK-2; WK-10.46.102.xxviii]. Evidently my great-grandmother recalled her name as "Mary" [KH-1], but other sources have it as "Sarah". As with John, nothing definite is known about her, not even her exact name. Probably she also was born ca. 1720-1725. As an estimate, they were married perhaps about 1740-1745.

John and Mary (or Sarah) Harding's origins have been impossible to determine. So many speculations and assumptions have been made, circulated, and recorded that the matter is difficult to examine reasonably; especially in the complete absence of any provable facts. As far as is known there is not a single primary source of information (official town or church birth, marriage or death record; Bible record; will, probate, deed or other court record; gravestone inscription; etc.) which can be identified to either of them. One theory is that they came to (what is now) Pennsylvania from Virginia; indeed, some have claimed that the Hardings were French Huguenots and simply another branch of the Hardin family herein, who spelled the name differently. Others have claimed that the Hardings were of English extraction, pointing out the dissimilarity of given names of Hardings vs. Hardins. Some believe they came from New England, or New Jersey. Certainly there were Hardings in New England, and Virginia, but also in most of the Colonies. The Revolutionary War record of 4101. Eden indicates that he was born in New Jersey near Elizabethtown; while the record of his brother 4100. Thomas notes that Thomas was born in Virginia [RI-176.177]. Whether either one of these accounts is correct, or whether both are in error, is unknown.

One source of controversy is "A Genealogical Register of the Descendants of Several Ancient Puritans" by Rev. Abner Morse, which was published in Boston in 1864. Vol. 4 p. 64 concerns a Capt. Stephen Harding (1681-1750) of Providence and Warwick, Rhode Island and later New London County, Connecticut who had sons John, Abraham, Stephen, Thomas and Israel (a striking coincidence of given names with those of our John's sons). The son Stephen moved in 1774 to the Wyoming Valley in Pa. and was Capt. in command at Fort Jenkins at the time of the Wyoming massacre in 1778. For the son John, evidently the eldest born ca. 1717-1718 at Warwick, R.I., the entry is "John, who removed to Red Stone, Pa., and last to Kentucky". (Old Redstone Fort was in the area of Pa. where the Hardins and Hardings settled). No source for this information was indicated; in recent years George L. Harding, a descendant of 4096. Robert Harding, spent a week in Rhode Island going through Abner Morse's papers and could not find any basis for this statement [GH-1]. Later authors, nevertheless, have repeated this same data, in some cases adding that John later dropped the "g" from the name and became the ancestor of many famous Hardins in Kentucky (which is patently erroneous).

The family were early settlers in or near what is now Fayette County, Pennsylvania (at that time this area was claimed by both Pa. and Va., and the boundary was not settled until about 1784). In a letter dated 30 May 1904 (copy in my possession) Jack Harding of Pleasureville, Ky., grandson of 4100. Thomas Harding, stated that the family moved to the Cheat River area when his grandfather was 9 years old, which would have been about 1767. Considering other history of

Despite his relatively young age (mid 30's) he was the recognized head of the "clan" (Hardins, Hardings, Paines, Davises, Shivelys, Carlyles) in that area, a wise and strong leader both in community problems and in Indian warfare, and looked to constantly for advice and counsel. It was with personal reluctance, and against the pleas of his relatives and friends, that he accepted the appointment to the peace mission which resulted in his death. [JH-94.98-100,106-108]. His murder cast a pall over the whole Hardin family, which was not lifted until Gen. Wayne's expedition and massive victory in 1794 gave them vengeance. [JH-106-112].

His will was dated 22 July 1788, proved 4 April 1795 [Washington Co., Ky. W.B. A:4; abstract AB1-1]. It named: wife Jane; sons Martin, Mark, and Davis; daughters Sarah and Mary. Execrs.: brothers Mark and Martin, and wife. Wits.: Samuel Robertson, John Hardin, Mary Robertson. In a court case concerning his estate filed in 1801 and continuing to 1807, heirs named were Sarah, wife of Barnabas McHenry; Mark, Martin D., and Davis Hardin; Jane, wife of Christopher Irvin; and Polly and Rosanna Hardin. [JA-2:139; WK-76]. This case probably was because daughter Rosanna was not yet born when the will was written, and because the widow Jane had remarried.

Children, the first four born probably in Pa., the last two in Ky., Mary uncertain [will & court case; WK-40,96]:

4069. Sarah Hardin, b. 1774, m. Rev. Barnabas McHenry, son of John and Susannah (Viney) McHenry. They had children surnamed McHenry: 5198.Martin D., 5199.John H., 5200.Mariah Estill, 5201.Jane, 5202.Lydia Anne, 5203.Emily, 5204.Sarah, and 5205.Patience. Sarah and Barnabas, and their daughters Emily and Sarah, all died in Ky. of cholera within a few days in Oct. 1833. [WK-31.xxvi].

4070. Martin D. Hardin, b. June 1780, d. 8 Oct. 1823, m. Elizabeth Logan, dau. of Gen. Logan and Anne Montgomery. He was a Major in the War of 1812, Secretary of State of Ky., and a U.S. Senator. They had children including sons 5206.John J. and 5207.Charles, a dau. who m. A.R. McKee, and a dau. who m. Dr. Mark Chinn. [WK-34,35,78].

4071. Mark Hardin, b. 14 Mar. 1782, d 10 Mar. 1875, m. (1) 14 Oct. 1806 Mary Moore Adair, m. (2) 14 Feb. 1815 Elizabeth Logan Hall. He was a lawyer in Ky.

4072. Davis Hardin, b. 5 Apr. 1784, d. 14 Oct. 1846, m. Elizabeth Williams Simpson [GH-1].

4073. Mary Hardin, b. 7 July 1786, believe d. bef. 1823, m. Wallace Estill, had 3 sons [GH-1].

4074. Lydia Ann Hardin, b. 28 Dec. 1788, d. 11 Feb. 1790 [GH-1].

4075. Rosanna Hardin, b. 8 June 1791, d. 1863/65, m. 1811 Curtis Field, had 9 children [GH-1].

3017. MARTIN HARDIN (son of 2002.Martin) was born 1 February 1757 in Prince William County, Virginia. He died in 1848 in Washington County, Kentucky [HW-330; WK-95; will below].

He married first LETITIA STULL, daughter of Col. John Stull and sister of Susannah Stull who married his brother 3015.Mark. They were married probably about 1778 in Pa. [HW-330; WK-81]. She died before 1810. He married second, in Hardin County, Ky. in 1810, ELIZABETH TRUMAN, widow; she may have been the widow of Edward Truman who accompanied Col. John Hardin and was killed in Ohio [GH-1].

4046. Jehu Hardin, d. unmarried in 1850 [GH-1].
4047. John E. Hardin, never married [GH-1].
4048. Celia Hardin, b. 1794, m. 1810 William Davison, had children (surnamed Davison) 5179. Hardin A., 5180. William Hardin, 5181. Jehu Hardin, 5182. Caroline Jane b. 1812, 5183. Laura Enfield, 5184. Nestor C., and 5185. Jane [GH-1].
4049. Amelia Hardin, m. Horace Merry 1808 in Breckenridge Co., Ky. [WK-8].
4050. Lucinda Hardin (by 2nd wife), m. John Holder, had one known dau. 5186. Mary Enfield Holder [GH-1].
4051. Hannah Ann Hardin (by 2nd wife), m. Rhodes S. Wilson [GH-1].

3014. LYDIA HARDIN (dau. of 2002. Martin) was born 10 April 1748 in Prince William (later Fauquier) County, Virginia [HW-328; WK-26, 95].

She married CHARLES WICKLIFFE there in 1765; he was the son of Robert Wickliffe of Prince William Co., and brother of Robert Wickliffe who married her sister 3011. Mary Hardin [HW-328; WK-26, 95]. Probably about 1770 they removed to the Georges Creek area of Pennsylvania. Then in 1784 they moved to Kentucky, and settled on Sulphur Run in Nelson (later Marion) County, where he was on the first Tithable List in 1785 [GH-1].

They had nine children [DAB-20:182]; a son Mark who d.y., several daughters, and four other sons [GH-1; HW-328; WK-14, 35]:

4054. Robert Wickliffe, b. 16 Jan. 1775 in Pa. [WK-142], was left land in Ky. by his grandfather 2002. Martin Hardin [HW-328].
4055. Nathaniel Wickliffe, m. Ann Logan, dau. of Gen. Ben and Anne (Montgomery) Logan [WK-35].
4056. Martin Hardin Wickliffe, was left land in Ky. by his grandfather 2002. Martin Hardin [HW-328].
++4057. Charles Anderson Wickliffe, b. 8 or 18 June 1788 in Washington Co., Ky., m. Margaret Crepps [GH-1].

3015. CAPT. MARK HARDIN ("Horse-Racer Mark") (son of 2002. Martin) was born 1 December 1750 in Prince William County, Virginia. He died 3 September 1835 in Marion County, Kentucky. [HW-328; WK-49].

He married SUSANNAH STULL 25 December 1780 in what is now Fayette County, Pa. She was the daughter of Col. John Stull of Hagerstown, Md., and a sister of Letitia Stull who married Mark's brother 3017. Martin [HW-328; WK-8, 49]. She was born ca. 1761, and was still living in 1839 [WK-50].

He inherited land in Fauquier and Culpeper Counties, Va. from his father. In 1786, with residence given as Fayette Co., Pa. he and his wife deeded away land in Fauquier County; and residing in Washington County, Ky. they deeded away land in Culpeper Co. in 1799, and in Fauquier Co. in 1802 and 1812 [HW-328, 329; WK-58].

Mark Hardin served in the Revolution from Virginia and Pennsylvania, and was a Captain of militia in Pennsylvania. He was granted a U.S. pension in 1833. [HW-328, 329; WK-49, 51, 95. WK-49 has abstracts from his pension papers, including several depositions]. After his death his widow Susannah received a pension [GH-1].

According to "History of the Hardin Family" Mark, with his brothers John and Martin joined the Hardin group at the Falls of the Ohio in the spring of 1781, and took part in their activities. In the summer of 1782 when a group led by his brother 3016. Col. John

Feb. 1786, had children (surnamed Tobin) 5120.Benjamin, 5121.Joseph Hardin, 5122.Rosanna, 5123.George, 5124.John, 5125.James, 5126.Warren W., 5127.Cassandra Hardin, 5128.Hettie, 5129.Sallie, 5130.Mary and 5131.Robert.

4034.Rosannah Hardin, b. 5 Mar. 1773, m. James McElroy 6 Nov. 1794 in Washington Co., Ky [IGI-2585]. They had no children.

4035.Mary (Polly) Hardin, b. 15 Aug. 1775, m. Andrew Barnett 21 Feb. 1801 in Washington Co., Ky [IGI-2584]. They had no children.

4036.Cassandra Hardin, b. 5 Sep. 1778, d. ca. 1799, m. 8 Feb. 1798 her cousin 4044.William Hardin (q.v.) [IGI-2578]. They had one daughter 5173.Molly Cassandra Hardin, who was legally adopted by her grandfather Benjamin Hardin after her mother died [GH-1]; she m. William Caldwell 17 Feb. 1816 in Washington Co., Ky. [IGI-2584].

4037.Martin L. Hardin, b. 25 May 1780, d. ca. 1848 in Texas, m. Juliet Calhoun, dau. of John Calhoun, b. 23 Sep. 1781, d. 21 Sep. 1837. They had children 5132.Parker C., 5133.Margaret C., 5134.Jane D., 5135.Ben, 5136.Hettie C., 5137.Mary B., 5138.Lydia W., 5139.John C., 5140.Sarah E., 5141.Martin L. Jr., and 5142.Juliet A. [GH-1].

4038.Jane Hardin, b. 10 Aug. 1782, d. 1782.

++4039.Benjamin Hardin, b. 29 Feb. 1784, m. Elizabeth Barbour.

4040.Warren Hardin, b. 30 Nov. 1786, d. 12 Mar. 1866 in Meade Co., Ky., m. 18 Apr. 1815 in Washington Co., Ky. [IGI-2586] Eliza Calhoun, dau. of Dr. Parker Calhoun. They had children 5150.H. Parker, 5151.Benjamin, 5152.Zarilda, 5153.Malinda, 5154.Hetty, 5155.Sarah Jane, 5156.Warren Jr., 5157.John R., and 5158.Columbus [GH-1].

3005.CAPT. WILLIAM HARDIN ("Indian Bill" or "Big Bill") (son of 2001.John) was born ca. 1744-45 in Virginia, probably in Frederick County; he died 22 July 1821 at Hardinsburg, Kentucky [HW-325,326; WK-79]. His obituary stated that he died in his 77th year [GH-1].

He married first WINIFRED HOLTZCLAW ca. 1774 probably in what is now Fayette County, Pa. She was born ca. 1752, daughter of Henry Holtzclaw; probably she was William's first cousin, as her mother Ann or Nancy was probably 2005.Ann Hardin. She died in Breckenridge County, Ky. ca. 1802. William married second 9 July 1808 SUSANNA McGEE. [HW-272,273,325]. There were two children of this second marriage (see below).

William probably moved with his father's family to Hampshire County, (W)Va. ca. 1763, then ca. 1770 to Georges Creek in Pa. where he was deeded land by his father in 1772, which he sold in 1779 [HW-325,326]. He may have explored in Kentucky in 1779 [HW-325]. His initial claim for 1200 acres of land was filed at the land office in Ky. 15 May 1780 [GH-1]. In 1785 he received grants from the State of Virginia for 3800 acres in the neighborhood of Hardinsburg, but probably was in actual possession of the land much earlier [HW-326].

According to the narrative of his great-nephew Jack Hardin, early in 1781 William arrived at the Falls of the Ohio (where Louisville now is) to join the Hardin party there in their hostilities with the Indians, in which he took a large part. In the fall of 1781 he took a party of men to the site of present Hardinsburg, surveyed the land, planned the town, and built a fort and cabins. He probably returned to Pa. in the fall of 1782, and

John Reed, 5062. Sarah m. John Reynolds, and 5063. Alicia m. John Stewart. George Hardin m. (2) Mary Lambert, and (3) Sarah Groves [WK-30].

4012. Cato Hardin, m. Susan Cunningham, had children 5064. John, 5065. Bonaparte, and 5066. Isabella. He had a disability pension from the War of 1812. [GH-1].

3003. MARK HARDIN (son of 2001. John) was born probably about 1735-40 in Prince William County, Virginia. He died in Nelson County, Kentucky (now Washington County) in 1792 [will, below].

He married 3022. ANN (NANCY) HARTLEY, daughter of 2011. John Hartley, probably about 1759-60 [DAR-3; KH-1; HW-323; WK-44]. Further evidence of this marriage is that Mark Hardin (wife Ann) and his father-in-law John Hartley both lived on Patterson Creek in Hampshire County, Va. (W.Va.); and that John Hartley named his daughter Ann Hardin in his will in 1783 [SJ-118]. She survived her husband; she signed the marriage consents for her daughters Ann and Mary in 1799 and 1801; may have been the female over age 45 in the 1810 Census in her son Benjamin's household, and is believed to have died about 1813 [GH-1].

Although some sources imply that they lived for a time on Georges Creek in Pa. [HW-323; WK-44] there is no evidence to that effect. In March 1773 he was deeded land in Hampshire County, Va. (W.Va.) by his father. (HW-323 erroneously states this land was deeded by his brother John, but it was 126 acres, part of 306 acres granted in 1766 by Fairfax to Benjamin Rutherford, and sold by him to John Hardin Sr. in 1768 [GH-1]). Mark Hardin may have visited Kentucky briefly, as his 400 acre claim there was entered in his name [GH-1]; but probably did not move there until he and his wife Ann deeded away the Virginia land in 1789 [SJ-23] at which time they followed their children to what is now Washington County, Ky.

Mark Hardin is credited with service as a soldier in the Revolution [DAR-3]. Although it is very likely that Mark did perform military service in the Revolution, as did his brothers; the specific "proof" of service offered in this DAR paper is tenuous, and probably would not be accepted today.

The will of Mark Hardin "of Nelson County and District of Kentucky" was dated 31 March 1790 and proved 8 May 1792 [Nelson Co., Ky. W.B. A:86,88; I have a copy; abstract JA-1:84]. It named: wife Ann; sons Henry, John, Mark, and Benjamin; daughters Catherine Hollett, Hannah Stalcup, and Ann; and "three youngest daughters" Mary, Lydia, and Sarah. Execrs.: wife Ann, and sons Henry and John. Wit.: Benjamin Hardin, John Hardin, and Fleaman Robertson. Children [will; DAR-3; WK-44]; places of birth and most birth dates uncertain, probably not listed in order of birth:

3001. CAPT. JOHN HARDIN ("Miller John") (son of 2001. John) was born 2 June 1733 (or Oct. 1733) in Prince William County, Virginia. He died in Fayette County, Pa. in 1803 [HW-321; WK-30,43; will below].

He married ISABELLA STRAWBRIDGE (Shubrach??); she died 17 May 1814 in Fayette County, age 81, hence born ca. 1733 [FP-698; HW-321; WK-30,43]. As an estimate, they were married perhaps ca. 1758-60.

He was granted land in Dunmore (Shenandoah) County, Va. in 1773, and in Hampshire County (now W.Va.) in 1778; and patented 400 acres on Hardin's Cove in Randolph County (now W.Va.) where, according to a later statement of his son Nestor, he "settled" in 1771 [HW-321,322] (not necessarily signifying that he actually lived there). If he did reside in Randolph County it probably was for only a very short time, before he relocated to Georges Creek in Pa. In his will he disposed of lands in Fayette Co., Pa., in Randolph Co., Harrison Co., at Hardin's Cove (Randolph Co.), and Monongalia Co., Va.; and "my mills and convenience of waterworks" on the land where he lived in Fayette Co., Pa. These grist mills gave rise to his nickname "Miller John". There is no indication that he accompanied other Hardin family members to Kentucky.

He was a Captain of militia in the border wars of the Revolution [HW-321,322], and was in command of a company in the ill-fated Sandusky expedition in which Col. Crawford was burned at the stake by the Indians in 1782 [GH-1].

The will of John Hardin of Springhill Township, Fayette County, Pa. was dated 13 May 1803 and proved (3 June?) 1803 [I have a copy; abstract HW-322,323 erroneously lists Elizabeth and Isabel as daughters]. It named: wife Isabella; sons John, Absalom, and Henry; illegitimate son John; daughters Marium, Mary Ann, Mohelia, and Alice; Mary Ann's two daughters Isabella and Elizabeth; sons Nestor, George, and Cato; grandchildren Henry, Malinda, and Mary Ann - son and daughters of Hector Hardin. Children, dates and places of birth uncertain, probably not listed in order of birth [will; FP-698; HW-322,323; WK-30].

++4001. John "Jack" Hardin (illeg.), b. 8 Mar. 1752 [Bible record per GH-1], m. 4095. Mary "Mollie" Harding.

Mark was involved in 1792). [GH-1, see also HW-327]. It did not mention his wife Lydia, but named: sons Mark, John and Martin; daughters Mary wife of Robert Wickliffe, Sarah wife of Benjamin Hardin, Lydia wife of Charles Wickliffe, Rosanna wife of John McMahon; grandsons Robert and Martin Hardin Wickliffe sons of Charles Wickliffe; with the three sons as executors.

The children of Martin and Lydia were probably all born in what is now Fauquier County, Va. (formed from Prince William Co. in 1758). Their birth dates are reported to have come from a family Bible [HW-328; WK-2,12,14,26,40,94]:

3011. Mary Hardin, b. 4 Oct. 1741, m. (1) 27 Aug. 1759 (mrg. bond 18 June) Robert Wickliffe, brother of Charles Wickliffe. He died, and she m. (2) 1785 in Lincoln Co., Ky. [GH-11 William Robertson, brother of the Robertson whose wife was captured by the Indians in March 1780 (see Appendix F). They settled in Ky.; when Washington County was created in 1792 William Robertson's land fell in Nelson County, where he died in 1796 and his will was probated; Mary later moved to Washington County, left a will there [GH-11]. She had no children.

2011. JOHN HARTLEY died in Hampshire County, Virginia (now W. Va.) about February 1784. There is no information as to where or when he was born, nor any data concerning his wife. He was a witness to a deed of 2001. John Hardin (of Bedford Co., Pa.) to 3003. Mark Hardin in 1773, and executed a deed in 1777, both conveying land on Patterson Creek in Hampshire Co., (W)Va. where he probably lived [SJ-23].

The will of John Hartley of Hampshire County, State of Virginia was dated 6 June 1783 and proved 9 March 1784 [I have a photocopy; abstract SJ-118]. His wife was not named (inference she was deceased); it named: five daughters Mary Wilson, Margaret Hartley, Elizabeth, Ann Harden, and Hannah Pearsall; four grandchildren, children of Mary Wilson - Daniel, William, James, and Ruth Wilson; distributed the estate of Daniel Wilson, deceased, which was in his hands as Administrator; and named eight children of daughter Eleanor Houghland - Mary, Henry, Hannah, Cornelius, Macey (Nancy?), Margaret, Eleanor, and Ann Houghland. Execrs.: Cornelius Houghland, Daniel Wilson, & dau. Mary Wilson. Children, as named in the will:

SECOND GENERATION

2001. MAJ. JOHN HARDIN (eldest son of 1001. Mark Hardin) was born ca. 1707 in Virginia, probably in Northumberland County [HW-318; WK-12, 29, 43; GH-1]. Some sources [HW-319; WK-43] assert that he was killed by Indians in 1789 about a mile from Hardinsburg, Kentucky. However, tithable lists show that while in 1785 he was in the area of Hardinsburg, by 1787 he was in the same area as his daughter 3002. Mary Thomas, in what is now Marion County, Ky. [GH-1]. Since the Thomases were witnesses to his will, it seems likely that at the time of his death he was living there with his daughter.

He married probably ca. 1730 CATHERINE MARR, born ca. 1711, daughter of John and Elizabeth (Fishback) Marr [HW-318; WK-12, 14, 29, 43]. She was last of record in a deed dated 9 May 1780, and a Fayette Co., Pa. tax list of 1783, probably died in Pennsylvania before her husband moved to Kentucky [GH-1; HW-319; SJ-23; WK-xx]. She was not mentioned in his will of 1788.

Major John Hardin had a long and notable career. He moved about 1741 to Frederick County, Virginia. Various deeds (many also signed by his wife Catherine) show that he was living in Frederick County as late as 1762, on Patterson Creek in Hampshire County in 1764 and 1769, and in Pennsylvania by 1771 [HW-319; SJ-23, 36, 52; WK-54, xix, xx]. He helped organize Frederick County, built the first stone courthouse there, served as sheriff, and as a presiding Justice. He was Lt. and Capt. in the Frederick County militia, serving in the French and Indian Wars. [HW-319; WK-43, 52, 94, xx].

When George Washington, as commander of the Virginia militia issued a call in 1754, a contingent from Frederick County, led by John Hardin, responded. Bored by inactivity they became a little boisterous and some were confined. Declaring this should not happen to free men they tore the jail down and went home. Evidently matters were reconciled, as they seem to have been in the fighting in Pa. 1754-1758. Thus when the area was opened for claims in 1769, they were able to take quick advantage [GH-1]. John Hardin was a Justice in "Monongahela" County, resided in what is now Springhill Township, Fayette County, Pa. His title of Major evidently was acquired in the border skirmishes of the Revolution [WK-14, 43]. He also built boats and equipped militia expeditions [DAR-1; HW-319]. He moved to Kentucky by 1785, where he was on a Nelson Co. tithable list [GH-1].

The will of John Hardin of Nelson County, Ky. (which at that time included what is now Marion Co.) was dated 4 June 1788, proved 13 October 1789 [Nelson County Courthouse, Bardstown; I have a photo-copy; abstracts HW-320, WK-43]. It named sons John, Mark, William, and Benjamin; daughters Abigal Linch (sic), Mary Thomas, Catharine Burnett, Elizabeth Martin, and Susanna Walker; Polly Hardin "daughter of Margret Heely (Huly?) that was"; grandson Henry Hardin son of John Hardin; and granddaughters Katy Thomas and Cassandra Hardin. Execs. William Hardin and Benjamin Hardin; Wits. Lewis Thomas, Philip Davis, and Mary Thomas.

All children listed below (NOT in order of birth), except Jesse, were named in the will [see also HW-320, 321; WK-30, 40, 43, 44]. (Birthdates given in some of these cited references appear speculative; except for 3001. John no authentic birthdates seem to be known). Probably his first few children were born in Northumberland County, the rest in Frederick County. Children:
