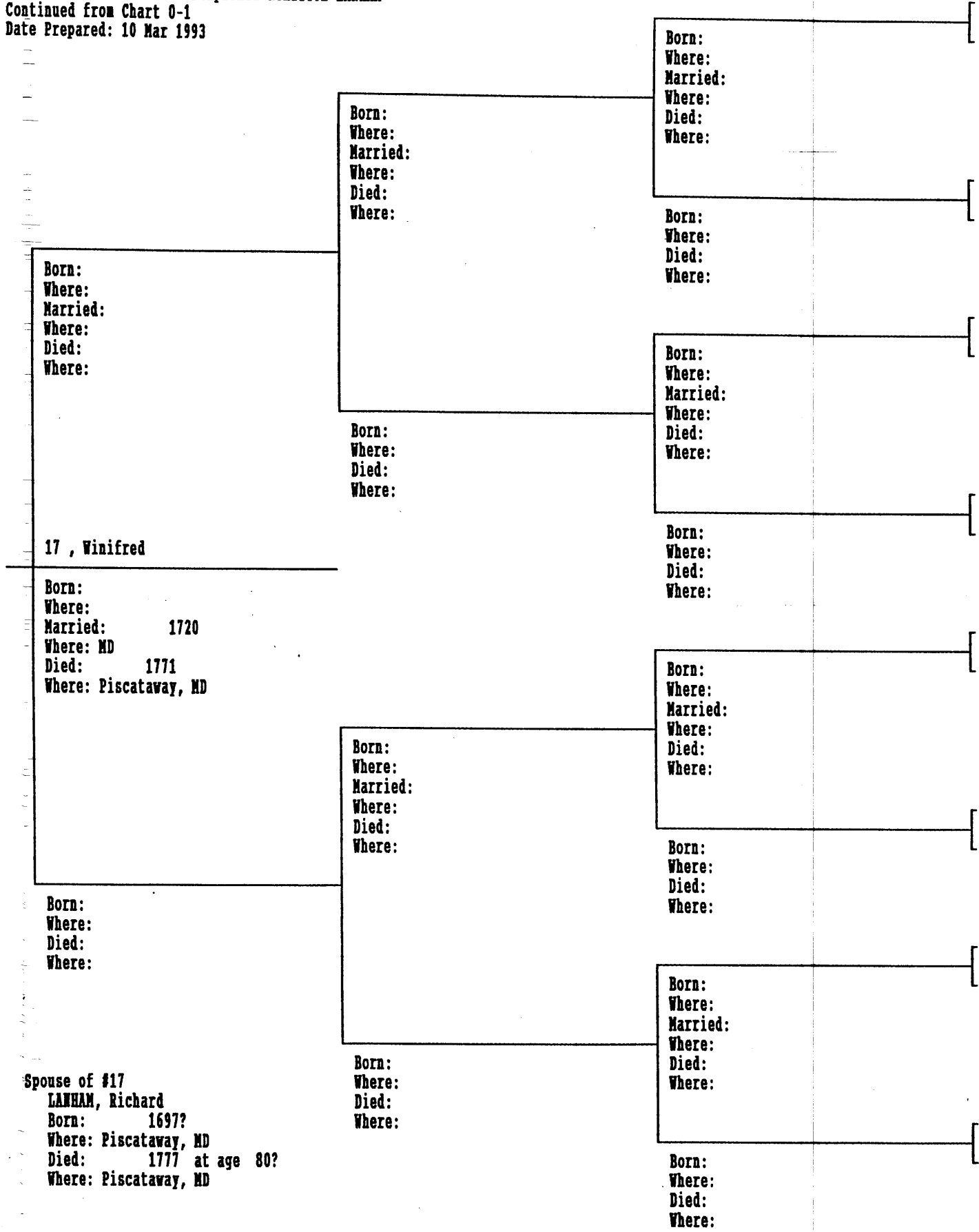

Peter B. Lanham is a prominent representative of industrial interests in Louisville as president of the Lanham Hardwood Flooring Company, which he organized in 1907 and of which he has remained at the head through the intervening period of two decades, gradually developing the business until it is now one of the most extensive of its kind in Kentucky. His birth occurred at Lebanon, Marion county, this state, on the 27th of January, 1874, his parents being Francis Hillery and Apalonia (O'Neil) Lanham, both natives of Kentucky. The father, who was actively identified with lumber manufacturing interests during his business career, is now deceased, but the mother still survives.

Peter B. Lanham acquired his early education as a public school pupil in his native city and subsequently pursued a course of study in St. Mary's College at St. Mary, Kentucky. The concern manufactures oak flooring and parquetry for all manner of high-grade dwellings and public buildings.

On the 27th of January, 1897, in Louisville, Mr. Lanham was married to Miss Katherine Huber Turner, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles E. Turner and a representative of a prominent Louisville family. They are the parents of two sons. Charles T. Lanham, the elder, was born in Louisville, December 10, 1898, acquired his educa-

tion in grade and high schools and is now vice president of the Lanham Hardwood Flooring Company. When this country became involved in the World war he enlisted in the United States navy and for eight months served overseas as a marine. He married Miss Gladys Alvis, of Louisville, and has one daughter, Elizabeth Moore Lanham. Peter Benedict Lanham, whose birth occurred at Lebanon, Kentucky, April 26, 1906, is a student in the University of Virginia.

Fraternally Mr. Lanham is affiliated with the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, while by reason of his business interests he has become a member of the Parquet Floor Manufacturers Association. He also belongs to the Louisville Board of Trade, the Audubon Country Club and the Louisville Automobile Club. Mr. Lanham is widely recognized as one of the representative business men and progressive and influential citizens of Louisville, and enjoys an enviable place in the esteem and good will of his fellow citizens.

C. T. Lanham, the subject of this sketch, attended pub. schs. in Lebanon, Ky., and duPont Manual Training High Sch., in Louisville, Ky. On Jan. 29, 1918, Mr. Lanham enlisted in the U. S. Marine Corps for service in the World War. He went to Paris Island, S. C., where he was in training 3 months, after which he went to France as a mem. of the 82nd Co., 6th Regt. of the U. S. Marine Corps. He participated in the Soissons Drive, and in the Battles of Belleau Wood and Vierzy, and served in the Saint-Mihiel Sector. On Oct. 15, 1921, C. T. Lanham married Gladys Alvis, dau. of Nicholas and Lena (Moore) Alvis, the former of whom engaged in the insurance bus. in Louisville, Ky. He is decd. His widow, Lena (Moore) Alvis, resides in Louisville. Mrs. Lanham was b. at Custer City, Okla., Nov. 30, 1902. She is a mem. of the following: Louisville Woman's City Club; Cabbage Patch Settlement Assn.; Hollins Alumni; and Parent-Teacher Assn. Her favorite recreations are boating, golf, and hunting. Children: (1) Elizabeth Moore (called Betty), who was b. in Lebanon, Ky., Aug. 17, 1922. She is a student in the Ky. Home Sch. for Girls. (2) Charles Turner, Jr., who was b. June 7, 1927. He is a student in the Highland Jr. High School.

years but after Bessie's death several years ago, Fred moved away. I have lost contact with Fred's family but know that after his wife Bessie died he married Frances Farmer Webb. It is reported that Fred boasted of being married three times and that all his wives were Webbs. One of Fred's boys was Shelby, who married Mary Lucy Wilkerson. They have a large family and live in the Pottsville area.

Another son of the Tates is Fred C. Tate, Jr. who is married to the former Elsie Simpson who is a distant relative of his. They live on the Saint Rose Pike with their family and are very active in civic circles. He is one of the outstanding young farmers of Marion County. The Fred Tate, Jr.'s have three children: Judy Ann, Beverly, and Melaine Lynn. Judy Ann Tate is married to Keith A. Blockwell (July 1, 1971) and they have a son, Bradley Keith born February 7, 1972. This just about covers the Nannie Lanham Webb family except the son, Clarence. He left here when he was a young man and I never knew anything more about him.

We will now take up the second daughter of the elder Lanhams and give a few highlights on her family. Barthenia, sometimes referred to as Parthenia, married James F. Simpson. They, like many others of the Lanham Tribe, had eleven children, seven sons and four daughters. The Simpsons, having such a large family, lived pretty hard lives as most of us did in those days. As far as I know, they were tenant farmers the greater part of their active lives. In later years they moved to Lebanon where Jim did odd jobs around town as long as he was able to work. Jim and Barthenia both lived to a ripe old age and were buried at Haysville. He died in October, 1960, and she died in December, 1962.

Let us now take up the seven sons of the Simpsons, who were Oscar, Bill, Jim Harve, Grand C., John W., Bob, and Cecil P. I do not have any information on Oscar as he never lived in this area. Bill is married to the former Malissie Odoniel, and they are at present living on their farm on Landers Creek. They have the following children: Grover, who lives with his family on the Sam Graham farm on Highway #68. Grover married Susie Riley and they have at least two children, Richard, a son of Grover's and a younger child whose name I do not recall. Bill and Malissie Simpson had at least three daughters. Elizabeth is married to Ray Gulley and lives in Lebanon. The Gulley's have a daughter and probably more children but I am not sure about this. One daughter, Dorothy, of the Bill Simpson's, is married to Millard Harmon and Helen is married to Randall Rigdon. One daughter, Louise, who is at home, is handicapped and never married. (See condensed report for more data on the Simpson family.)

The next son of Jim and Barthenia Simpson is Jim Harve. I have no information on him except that he has lived in Lebanon all his life. Grand C. Simpson lives on a part of the old Clelon Purdom farm on U.S. Highway #68. He married Grace Wilkerson and they have several children: Tommie, married to Bonnie Chelf; Wesley, and Tommie are both active in sports since they are basketball coaches. Their daughter Elsie is married to Fred C. Tate, Jr. as earlier stated. Gladys Simpson is married to a man by the name of Goatley. Frances married Herbert Wright and Grand's youngest daughter married a Mr. Hickey. We will now take up another son of the Jim F. Simpsons.

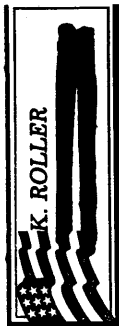

WK Grad Chosen To Play Jesus

A tall, strapping redhead who stands out in any room will command full stage presence this summer in his portrayal of Jesus in the Smoky Mountain Passion Play.

Kevin Lanham was chosen for the lead role from more than 600 actors auditioning before the Southeastern Theater Conference in March.

The six-foot, six-inch graduate of Western Kentucky University said he's had to make a few changes in preparation for his summer role as Jesus. He had to grow a beard, and his thick hair will have to be dyed with a temporary rinse.

"I mean, whoever heard of a redhead-ed Jesus?" he pondered.

A few changes also had to be made on the outdoor theater's stage — the crucifixion cross had to be altered to accom-

modate all of Lanham's 72 inches, and the stage crew is still hoping he can squeeze into a tomb built three seasons ago for a shorter actor.

But Lanham is quick to point out that being tall can have its good points.

"Height is an asset in outdoor drama," he said. "The bigger you are, the better, because you stand out more on the large set."

Lanham said the Passion Play will be his first acting experience in an outdoor theater.

"It will alter my acting somewhat," he said. "You have to be more conscious of projection to the audience, and your performance has to be broadened."

Lanham is a native of Gravel Switch, Ky., a town that "doesn't even have a traffic light." He's spending the summer in Maryville, where a majority of the 50-

member cast lives during the show's ten-week run.

The cast members are representative of a wide area in the United States — ranging in origin from New York to Texas. All the members were assembled in early June to begin final rehearsals for the fourth season of the religious drama.

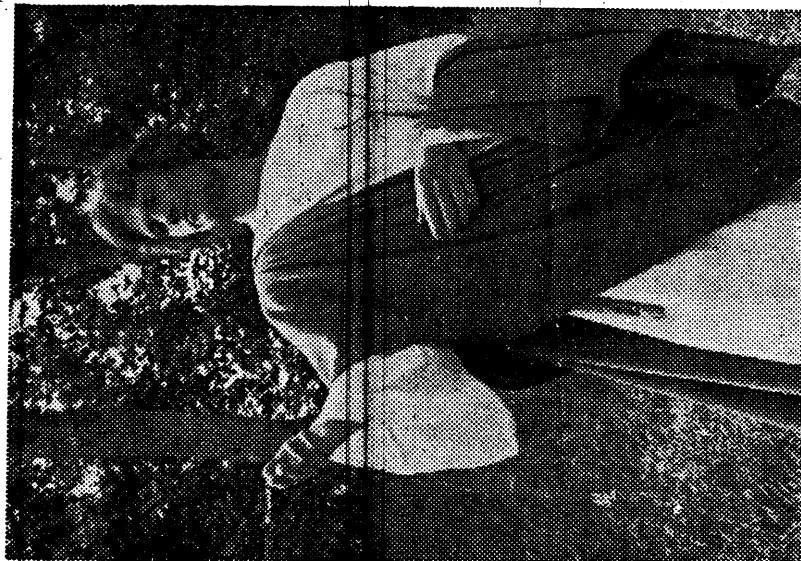
Rehearsals are directed under the critical eye of J. Barry Lewis. Lewis was aided during the final weeks of rehearsal after he suffered a broken collar bone by Laura McCammon, the director of the Young Actors Guild.

Miss McCammon said some changes have been made in the 1976 production. The temple was rebuilt, some costume changes were made and the script was revised to include the role of Pilot's wife "to add another female role to the play."

Opening night of the Passion Play's fourth season will be at 8:45 p.m. Friday.

Passion Play Begins Fourth Season Friday

TOWNSEND — When the Smoky Mountain Passion Play opens its fourth consecutive season Friday, the outdoor drama of the life of Jesus will include several roles which are either new to the play or have been greatly expanded from previous seasons.

In addition, improvements have been made in most stage sets, particularly the Jerusalem temple which has been rebuilt by Victor McPoland, stage manager and technical director. McPoland is a student at Carnegie-Mellon University in Pittsburgh.

Pontius Pilate is played by Joseph Krygi-er of West Seneca, N. Y. In earlier seasons, the role of Pilate was limited to the trial of Jesus, but the role has been rewritten for this year's production to include four scenes in which the personality of the governor of Judea is developed. This also allows a stronger and more thorough development of the events which led to the arrest and crucifixion of Jesus.

Pilate's wife is a new role and is played by Julie Johnston from Charlotte, N. C.

ANOTHER EXPANDED ROLE is Joseph of Arimathea, the nobleman who obtained Pilate's permission to bury the body of Jesus. Joseph is played by Homer Tracy who lives in Scottsville, Ky. and is a drama major at Western Kentucky University in Bowling Green.

David Reeves, of Houston, Tex., plays Herod Antipas, also a new role. Herod Antipas was the ruler in Galilee during Jesus' ministry and was intimately involved in the chain of events that brought Jesus to the cross.

The lead role of Jesus is played by Harlie Kevin Lanham, also from Western Kentucky University and a graduate of that school's theater department.

"With the strong growth of the Passion Play last summer, we knew we could have produced the play again this summer without change, but we saw ways of improving it and have done so," said Robert E. Temple, producer-general manager, who is also the author of the playscript.

"There were so many events in the last week of Jesus' ministry that each season gives opportunity for stronger development of a particular role or to include an event not previously portrayed," he said.

TEMPLE EXPRESSED excitement about the 1976 production and said he is looking forward to the continuing growth of the drama. Reservations and inquiries began coming to the association office in January, four months earlier than last year. "We are very grateful for the wonderful

support the people of East Tennessee have given to the play in its first three seasons," Temple said.

The play is directed by J. Barry Lewis

who is the chairman of the theater department at Palm Beach College of the Atlantic in West Palm Beach, Fla. The cast includes 25 principal actors and actresses from college, university and professional theater organizations and 22 area young people who appear in the crowd scenes. Some of the older young people also have supporting roles.

The Passion Play will be presented nightly except Sundays at 8:45 from June 18 through Aug. 28. There will be one Sunday performance on Aug. 29. Reserved seats are \$4 and general admission \$3. Children under 12 and adults over 65 will be admitted for half price for any seat. A 10 per cent discount will be given to groups of 15 to 25 people and a 15 per cent discount to groups of 26 or more.

TICKETS MAY BE purchased at the performance or reserved in advance. Reservations may be made at the Passion Play Amphitheater box office, phone 448-2244. In Knoxville, they may be made at the West-town World Travel Service in West Town Mall, 693-8511. Reservations are also available in Gatlinburg at Christus Gardens and the Edgewater Motel.

The Smoky Mountain Passion Play Association will hold its second annual Youth Night on Thursday, June 24. For this performance, all seats are on a first come, first served basis. All people 18 or younger will be admitted for \$2, and adults for \$3. Space may be guaranteed by calling in advance.

Temple emphasized that even though the play is presented out of doors, rain is a minimal problem. "Of 167 performances scheduled since 1973, the drama has been presented in its entirety 157 times," he said.

The Smoky Mountain Passion Play is a non-profit corporation with its main office in Maryville. The amphitheater is in Townsend just off Tennessee Route 73. The drama had an average attendance increase last summer of 54 per cent and was attended by more than 25,000 persons.

'Jesus' most difficult role for young actor

Kevin Lanham drops onto the couch, making himself comfortable. At 6-foot-6, there is a chocolate-drop brown eyes glint with

self-contained humor as he stretches his blue-jeaned legs.

This is his second straight year portraying Jesus in the Smoky Mountain Passion Play. When he steps out June 17 for the first of 15 scenes in the two-act play, it will be his 64th appearance in that role.

The role, he explained in an interview, is his most difficult to date.

"It's hard to portray Someone who is so divine and human at the same time," he said. "In a melodrama you have the good guys and the bad guys, but in this play, the good and bad is often a gray area."

"And He had so many pressures on Him, from the people and the government."

Lanham turned to theater when he could not get a speech course in his undergraduate years at Western Kentucky University. He never turned back, but, interestingly enough, the young actor from Gravel Switch, Ky., a community of about 800 near Danville, has no aspiration to pursue a "permanent, professional acting career."

Instead, he wants to teach at a small college where the theatrical program is just getting started. He is working on a master's degree in theater at WKU and

plans his doctoral work when that is finished. He is newly-married, and wife Jan teaches elementary school and is also working toward a master's degree in theater.

At WKU he has appeared as Eugene Gant in Thomas Wolfe's "Look Homeward Angel," in "Godspell," he played the dual role of Judas and John the Baptist; he was Friar Lawrence in "Romeo & Juliet," in "Dames At Sea," he was Dick; and in "Arrivals," he portrayed Sir Lucius O'Trigger.

His favorite role?
"The most rewarding part I've had was in Godspell," he replied, punctuating his remarks with hand gestures and quick smiles.

"The most important part of a play is trying for an ensemble. In Godspell, we had a cast that talked to each other and felt each other out and knew what to expect."

"And my belief is you have to have music in a play. It goes farther. It plays on emotions."

He explained that portraying Jesus was also a rewarding role.

"This has been my most challenging role," he emphasized. "I think that as an actor I grow by playing such a multi-faceted character."

"It's easier the second time around, but still some moments are difficult."

"Each night is different, obviously, each night cannot be just alike. But this time I'm trying to do things a little different, make it more..."

"I guess you might say 'I'm searching for truth.'"

Pressed for a definition of truth, he mused: "Truth in theater is the few moments when the audience and the cast are like one. It's a feeling of the audience losing themselves with the actor in a scene. That's what I strive for."

Even though Lanham seeks oneness with the audience, he does not project himself into his roles.

"I don't get into a role," he said. "I don't become the person I'm portraying. I don't believe in that!"

"There is so much in theater that you can see, the physical aspects — it's not necessary to immerse yourself into a role."

"In the role of Jesus especially, there's no way that a human can experience the grief, the turmoil and suffering he went through. I try to relate it

to something that has happened to me. "It's interesting to note, though, that so many people who watch the play are such fundamentalists about the scriptures. They often approach me after the play and make some comment about lines in the script."

"Like any play, you are putting certain things into it which will make an explosive package, and yet be in a continuous flow."

Smoky Mountain Passion Play Producer/General Manager Robert E. Temple explained that when he authored the play he had to "consider the flow, especially in writing. I had to be careful not to get off on a different tangent."

"In our play we usually refer to Him as Jesus, not Christ, since we're not moving full play style. We try to show Him as Jesus the Man — but we refer to it as the drama of Jesus."

"Of course, our play does not deny his divinity! But neither does He go through the scenes with a halo over his head. He's portrayed as flesh and blood."

"We screened over 1,600 actors and actresses the past two seasons, before deciding on the cast. Kevin was our choice both years for the role of Jesus, even before we began screening, but it's always been our policy to start from scratch."

'Passion Play' in 5th season

The Smoky Mountain Passion Play, now in its fifth season, has completed all but 11 of 231 performances in the previous four years of production despite intermittent rain showers.

Under 12 admission on youth nights is \$1, while 12 to 18 admission is \$2, and adults is \$4.

Usual admission procedures are scheduled for the general public for the senior citizen nights, except that people 65 and older will be admitted for one-half price. The senior citizen reserved seats are \$2.50 and general admission is \$2.

Lanham named Rhodes scholar

A Gravel Switch teenager may be the youngest Rhodes Scholar ever.

Michael Lanham was selected Saturday as one of 32 Americans to receive Rhodes Scholarships this year.

Those who administer the Rhodes program are still researching whether Lanham is the youngest person to have ever received one of the scholarships.

"They asked if they could give USA Today my number, if I am," he said on Monday.

Lanham, a Centre College senior, has already been interviewed by several television stations and newspapers.

He began thinking about the Rhodes Scholars program when he was a sophomore at Centre College.

He was 16 years old then.

"A couple of the professors were eager for me to apply."

He was thinking about the program when he began looking for a summer opportunity in mathematical biology.

The "Mathematical and Theoretical Biology Institute" at Cornell University seemed like what he was looking for when he found it on the Internet.

He applied for one of the highly competitive advanced research projects, knowing that if he were accepted he would be a better candidate for a Rhodes Scholarship.

Twenty-nine students were chosen to participate in the eight-week program this past summer. Lanham was one of them.

The project he worked on at Cornell was suggested to him by a mentor in the program there.

The professor said it was a project he had thought about, but never gotten around to doing.

It was a mathematical model for communicable diseases.

"The program made me passionate about mathematical biology," Lanham said.

He will use the project he began at Cornell to focus on AIDS research when he uses his Rhodes Scholarship at England's Oxford University this fall.

He will be pursuing a three-year doctoral program in mathematics.

Coming home for two weeks after the Cornell program ended, Lanham then left for England.

He has been studying at Regent College there for the past three months as part of a Centre College exchange student program.

Finals at Regent College are this week, but Lanham left a week-and-a-half early to participate in Rhodes Scholars interviews.

His finals are being faxed to him and he is taking them Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

That was the bad part of spending all day Monday being interviewed and photographed, he said.

For the Rhodes Scholar application, Lanham had to submit eight letters of recommendation, a 1,000-word essay, a two-page list of activities, his transcript and his college's endorsement.

Eight Kentucky students were selected to be interviewed as state finalists on Dec. 1 in Louisville.

Lanham flew from London to Louisville.

The night before the interviews, there was a reception for the students and those who would be interviewing them.

Meeting the five interviewers first made things much more comfortable during the 20-minute interview the next day, Lanham said.

While the students went to lunch, the interviewers deliberated on who to send to regional interviews, which were in Chicago on Saturday.

Lanham was selected and flew from Louisville to Chicago.

Passion Play Begins Fourth Season Friday

TOWNSEND — When the Smoky Mountain Passion Play opens its fourth consecutive season Friday, the outdoor drama of the life of Jesus will include several roles which are either new to the play or have been greatly expanded from previous seasons.

In addition, improvements have been made in most stage sets, particularly the Jerusalem temple which has been rebuilt by Victor McPoland, stage manager and technical director. McPoland is a student at Carnegie-Mellon University in Pittsburgh.

Pontius Pilate is played by Joseph Krygiel of West Seneca, N. Y. In earlier seasons, the role of Pilate was limited to the trial of Jesus, but the role has been rewritten for this year's production to include four scenes in which the personality of the governor of Judea is developed. This also allows a stronger and more thorough development of the events which led to the arrest and crucifixion of Jesus.

Pilate's wife is a new role and is played by Julie Johnston from Charlotte, N. C.

ANOTHER EXPANDED ROLE is Joseph of Arimathea, the nobleman who obtained Pilate's permission to bury the body of Jesus. Joseph is played by Homer Tracy who lives in Scottsville, Ky. and is a drama major at Western Kentucky University in Bowling Green.

David Reeves, of Houston, Tex., plays Herod Antipas, also a new role. Herod Antipas was the ruler in Galilee during Jesus' ministry and was intimately involved in the chain of events that brought Jesus to the cross.

The lead role of Jesus is played by Harlie Kevin Lanham, also from Western Kentucky University and a graduate of that school's theater department.

"With the strong growth of the Passion Play last summer, we knew we could have produced the play again this summer without change, but we saw ways of improving it and have done so," said Robert E. Temple, producer-general manager, who is also the author of the playscript.

"There were so many events in the last week of Jesus' ministry that each season gives opportunity for stronger development of a particular role or to include an event not previously portrayed," he said.

TEMPLE EXPRESSED excitement about the 1976 production and said he is looking forward to the continuing growth of the drama. Reservations and inquiries began coming to the association office in January, four months earlier than last year. "We are very grateful for the wonderful

The play is directed by J. Barry Lewis

who is the chairman of the theater department at Palm Beach College of the Atlantic in West Palm Beach, Fla. The cast includes 25 principal actors and actresses from college, university and professional theater organizations and 22 area young people who appear in the crowd scenes. Some of the older young people also have supporting roles.

The Passion Play will be presented nightly except Sundays at 8:45 from June 18 through Aug. 18. There will be one Sunday performance on Aug. 29. Reserved seats are \$4 and general admission \$3. Children under 12 and adults over 65 will be admitted for half price for any seat. A 10 per cent discount will be given to groups of 15 to 25 people and a 15 per cent discount to groups of 26 or more.

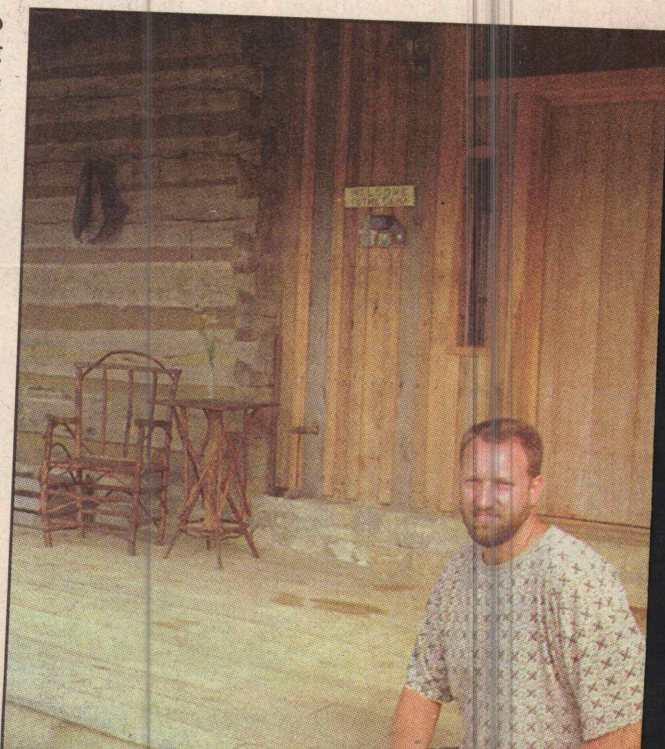

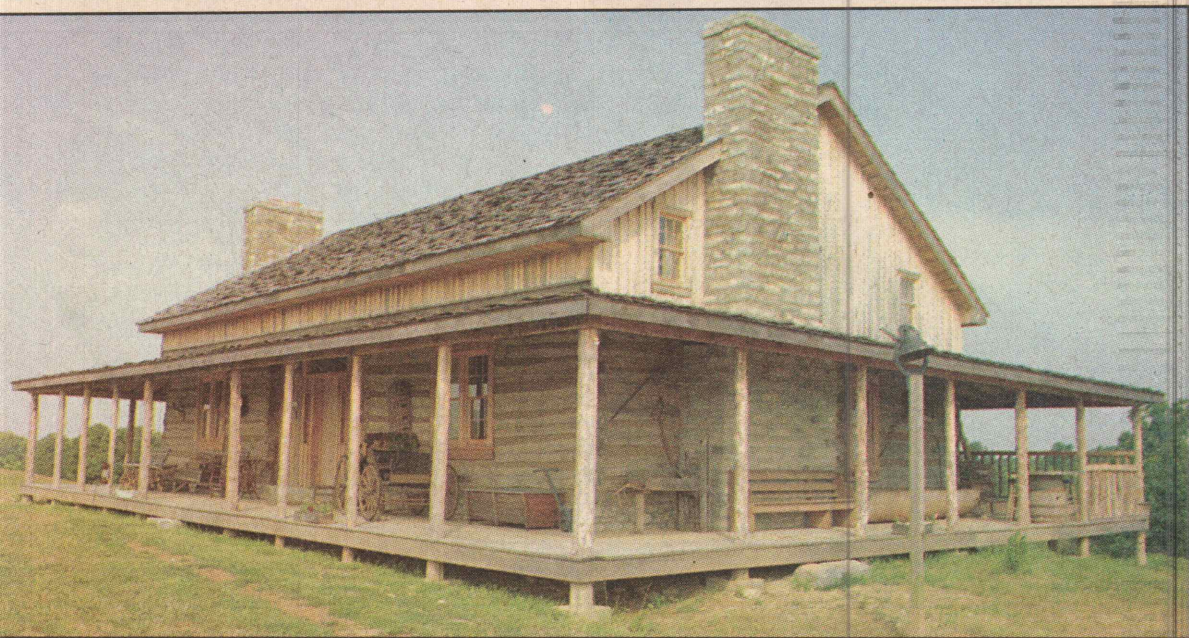
To the right of the entry hall is a turn-of-the-century type kitchen complete with a pitcher and pump sink and a wood-burning cookstove. "Two modern kitchens are downstairs but you could use the wood cookstove," notes the lodge's proprietor, Ed Lanham.

Even though the smell of a country ham breakfast will drift up from the basement, the many types of fake food filling antique kitchenware give the kitchen the appearance of

use. Other interesting furnishings in the room include a trestle table with wooden pegs and a butcher block table.

The trestle table was made by a cousin, Mitzi Elliott Smith, who lives nearby. "She asked me, 'How rough do you want it left?' I said, 'Totally rough,'" notes Lanham. She used two boards that were each over 20-inches wide from the original cabins as its top.

A butcher block table in the center of the kitchen is the design of Bernard Bryan. This elderly man from Lebanon who died over the winter made several pieces of furniture in the house.

To the left of the entry hall is a lounging room with rafters open to the second story. A checker table that serves as the centerpiece is located under a metal and antler chandelier that Gerald Mattingly of Raywick made. Lanham borrowed the idea from those he had seen in magazines but he saved money by having a nearby craftsman make it. "A chandelier you order in magazines is thousands of dollars."

Lanham intends to learn to use a loom from the 1800s that occupies one corner of the room. "It's functional and we're going to try to make some rugs on it," says Lanham, who has the distinction of raising the largest herd of Jacob's sheep in the nation. This type of four-horned, black and white-spotted sheep was endangered a few years ago. There still are only 10,000 in the country and his herd, which can easily be viewed by walking out to the front porch, numbers 350.

As an acceptance of modern times, this lounging room contains a TV and VCR in another corner. But a crazy quilt hanging in the room that dates back to 1845 offers plenty of viewing pleasure as well. "There are over 100 of these embroidered pictures on the quilt. You can see something new every time you look," says Lanham. He calls attention to the painstaking details the quilter put on the flag, such as the exact number of stars on the American flag at that time.

A crosscut saw blade painted by his great-aunt, Marjorie Ellis, is in keeping with the theme of preserving history. "It shows actual

scenes over at Forkland with homes and churches, and Penn's Store is on there."

He has several old photos of Gravel Switch scenes that he plans to display around the home. "We're going to put those around and make it a learning experience as much as anything."

One of them is already on display on the sign-in table in the entry hall. The man pictured in the black and white photo making sorghum is Lanham's grandfather, Isaac Ellis. The family, including his parents, Edward and Wanda Lanham Sr., carry on this tradition every fall, starting a couple of weeks before the October festival at Forkland to make the sorghum to sell there.

An old sewing school desk from Forkland School functions as the sign-in table. Pencils fashioned out of tree limbs by a Casey County man await the signatures of guests. Above the table hangs the favorite of several sheep pictures owned by Lanham, the agriculture agent for the Marion County Extension Office since 1994.

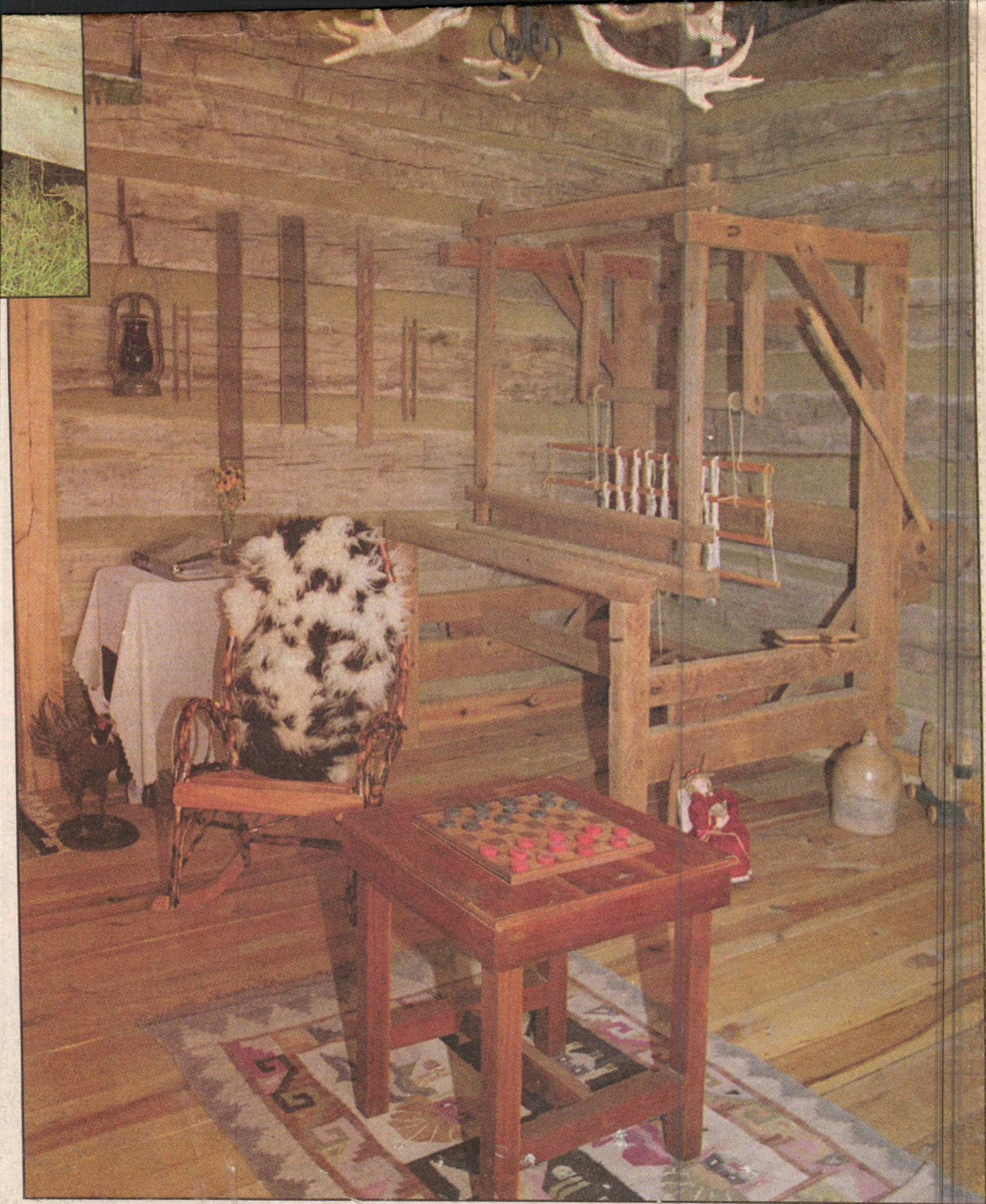
Obtaining the Marion County job prompted Lanham to build his home. Agents are required to live in the county and Lanham bought his farm of about 97 acres and started the demanding business of reassembling the local cabins that came from Loretto and Mackville. "I'll never have another year like this one; 16-hour days," he says. Such tasks as putting up the fireplaces required hauling over wagonloads of rock.

When he saw how large the house would be — 4,000 square feet — he decided the cabin should function as more than just his home. "It has so much history that I want to share it with somebody."

Lanham reserves the basement as his living quarters. Completed the downstairs living quarters and a dining area; the old-fashioned bathroom, complete with copylined tub from Drake's Hotel Lexington; and a guest bedroom featuring an oak bed with his headboard that had belonged to

great-grandmother. In keeping with the home's style, the climb to the second floor is up a steep, almost ladder-like flight of stairs. He has a more modern bathroom there — it includes a clawfoot tub — and more guest rooms.

Many people already have flocked to his door. The first guests arrived for the fall's Great Outhouse Blowout at Penn's Store when Lanham didn't even have running water. Since
