There was a Col. Anthony New of Caroline County, Virginia, who was living in Kentucky in 1830. He married firstly, Elizabeth Strehly, secondly 1782, Nancy, daughter of Richard and Amy Chiles Wyatt, of "Plain Dealings," Caroline county. This Col. Anthony New was in the Revolution. His wife, Nancy Wyatt, was a descendant of the Rev. Haute Wyatt, brother of Gov. Frances Wyatt of Virginia. The Wyatt history is extensively recorded and traced back for many generations.

Warfield

Benjamin Warfield of Ann

Arundle County, Maryland, married Rachel Ridgeley. They had a son, Elisha, born November 29, 1741. He moved to Kentucky about 1790. Nothing else is known about him or his parents.

Bird

Robert Bird was an early settler in the present county of Whitley. He died in 1821, age 76, and his wife, Catherine, died in 1845, age 88, Whitley County. They came from North Carolina, probably Buncombe County, near Asheville.

Clifton

Burdette Clifton, Ensign in the Virginia Continental Line, Revolutionary War, was born 1736, in King George County, Virginia, and died at

Bardstown, Kentucky. He was married in 1757 to Rebecca Kenner, born 1740. They had a daughter, Sarah Clifton, born 1768 and died in 1815. She was married in 1791 to John Edwards King, born 1758 and died 1829. He was a private in the Stafford County Militia, Revolutionary War.

Arbuckle-Leathers

The following are some of the children of Samuel Arbuckle and wife, Bersheba Arbuckle: Nancy, married Charles Leathers, October 20, 1798; Vicey, married John Bunton, June 10, 1802; Hannah, married John Painter, June 11, 1799; John, married Fanny Ward, March 17, 1804; Polly, married Benjamin Oliver, October 16, 1807; and Winny, married Thomas Phillips, April 1, 1809.
