

The same evidence that fixes the homesite of "Virginia John" also fixes the location of the lands he sold in 1773 to his sons Abraham and Isaac. So far as I know, Isaac never built a house on his land. Abraham's house no longer remains, but within the memory of persons now living one or two of the outbuilding were still standing. They occupied a site on the northwest side of the creek, almost opposite the homesite of "Virginia John," at a distance of less than a quarter of a mile. One or two springs were formerly on the northwest side of the creek. This locality was included in the land that Captain Abraham and his wife Bathsheba sold in 1780, before going to Kentucky.

## CHAPTER III

## CAPTAIN ABRAHAM IN VIRGINIA AND KENTUCKY

Unfortunately in Augusta County, as in most other counties of Virginia, no complete marriage records were kept until after the Revolution. However, in the old records there are occasional references to the issuing of marriage licenses or marriage bonds. Among the few thus preserved in Augusta County are the following:

- 1761, August, Leonard Herron
- 1763, April 6, William Fleming
- 1769, July 5, John Wilson
- 1770, June 9, Abraham Lincoln

In these records the names of the brides are not given. Dr. J. A. Waddell, in his "Annals of Augusta County," 1902 edition, page 208, says that the wife of Abraham Lincoln, grandfather of the President, was Elizabeth Winter, daughter of William and Ann Boone Winter (Ann an aunt of Daniel Boone); and that Hannah Winter, sister of Elizabeth, married Henry Miller, founder of the iron works on Mossy Creek.

On what authority Dr. Waddell makes these statements, I do not know. Basing a conclusion on numerous other items of evidence, from sources that seem to be reliable, I am of the opinion that Captain Lincoln's wife, married in June, 1770, was Bathsheba Herring, and that she was his only wife.

Waldo Lincoln ("History of the Lincoln Family," 1928, page 202) was "practically certain that Abraham had but one wife, whose Christian name was Bathsheba,

who was the mother of all his children and survived him at least until 1792. That her surname was Herring is probable."

In or about 1922 Dr. William E. Barton made the following declaration. "All the biographies of Abraham Lincoln are incorrect as to his paternal grandmother. She was not Mary Shipley, as Nicolay and Hay on the authority of J. R. Nall have told us, nor was she of the Boone family, as Gideon Welles, Lincoln's Secretary of War, maintained.

"Last summer in a pile of old tax lists in the basement of the old Capitol at Frankfort the Secretary of the Kentucky Historical Society discovered a list of Washington County for 1792, which shows Bathsheba Lincoln survived her husband. Abraham Lincoln, grandfather of the President, was murdered by Indians and his widow long survived him. Here, then, is the paternal grandmother of President Lincoln, Bathsheba, whom the pioneer Abraham Lincoln married in Rockingham County, Va., in 1770, the mother of all his children, his one and only wife."

At Mapleton, Iowa, in 1930, was published "Memoirs of Lincoln," by Herring Chrisman. The Chrismans were early settlers in the vicinity of Linville Creek. Herring Chrisman was born in Rockingham County, September 16, 1823. On his authority, his great-grandfather, William Herring, and the President's grandmother, Bathsheba Herring, were brother and sister. (See "Memoirs of Lincoln," by Herring Chrisman, 1930, Foreword.) He names William Herring and Leonard Herring as brothers of Bathsheba; these as children of Alexander (perhaps John Alexander) Herring, who was a son of Lord Benjamin Herring. (See chart following page 10.)

Mr. J. Houston Harrison, who made extended investigations of family records over many years, accepts the

foregoing statements by Mr. Chrisman. (See "Settlers by the Long Grey Trail," by J. Houston Harrison, 1935, page 283.)

Rockingham court records show that in February, 1780, when Captain Abraham Lincoln sold his land, shortly before going to Kentucky, his wife was Batsab (Bathsheba). With him she signed the deed. On June 26, 1780, the deed was proved in court and a dedimus was issued for the private examination of Bersheba. It was customary in land sales for the wife to be examined apart from her husband to give her an opportunity for free expression. On September 24, 1781, the report of the commission previously appointed to examine Bersheba concerning the land sold to Michael Shanks was returned to court and ordered to be recorded. Under the same date the record shows that Abraham Lincoln was "about to remove." The various spellings of Bathsheba in the preceding items follow the old records.

Let us now return to 1773, when Captain Abraham Lincoln purchased the major part of the land sold in 1780. In Deed Book 19, county clerk's office of Augusta County, Va., are recorded the indentures, lease of August 7 and release of August 12, 1773, by which John Lincoln and his wife Rebecca transferred 210 (about 200) acres of the tract sold in February, 1780, to Michael Shanks, to their son Abraham Lincoln. The consideration of the lease was, as usual, five shillings, etc. Following is a copy of the release:

This indenture made the Twelfth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Seventy three Between John Lincoln and Rebeca his wife of the County of Augusta and Colony of Virginia of the one part & Abraham Lincoln of the County and Colony aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the sum of Twenty Pounds Current money of Virginia to the said John Lincoln in hand paid by the said

Abraham Lincoln at or before the sealing and Delivery of these Presents the receipt whereof he doth hereby Acknowledge and thereof doth release Acquit and discharge the said Abraham Lincoln Executors and Administrators by these Presents that the Said John Lincoln hath Granted Bargained sold Aliened released & Confirmed and by these Presents Doth Grant Bargain sell Alien release & Confirm unto the said Abraham Lincoln (in his Actual Possession now being by Virtue of a Bargain and Sale to him thereof made by the said John Lincoln for one whole year by Indenture Bearing date the day next before the day of the date of these Presents and by force of the Statute for Transferring uses into Possession) and to his heirs one Certain Tract or Parcel of Land Containing 210 acres Lying and being in the County of Augusta on Linvels Creek being part of 1200 hundred acres Granted to Mckey Duff Green and Hite by Patent Bearing date the 26th day of March 1739 and was by them Conveyed to Robert Mckay by deeds of Lease and Release Bearing date the 19th and 20th day of June 1746 and recorded in the County Court of Augusta and by the said Robert Mckay Devised to Zachariah Mckay Moses Mckay Robert Mckay and James Mckay by his Last will and Testament dated the 7th day of October 1746 and recorded in County Court of Augusta and 600 acres part of the 1200 acres was Conveyed by Zachariah Mckay and Lucia his wife Moses Mckay and Mary his wife Robert Mckay and James Mckay to the said John Lincoln by deeds of Lease & Release bearing date the 21st and 22d day of June 1768 and recorded in the County Court of Augusta and Bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a white oak in a Line of the Original Grant on the west side of Linvels Creek and a line of the same south 31 [37] degrees west 81 [87] poles to Two black oaks South 65½ [55½] east 384 Poles to the Creek near a Sycamore & thorn by said Creek thence down with the same North 10 east 17 Poles & north 60 east 30 poles to a walnut north 18 east 20 poles to a Walnut Corner To Isaac Lincolns North 54 west 240 Poles to two small Black oaks thence North 31 east 16 Poles to a white oak and Black oak Saplin on the old Line and with the same North 65½ [60] west 130 poles to the Beginning Corner and all houses Buildings Orchards ways waters water Courses Profits Commodities Hereditaments & Appurtenances whatsoever to the said Premises hereby Granted or any Part thereof Belonging or in any wise Appertaining and the reversion & reversions remainder and remainders rents issues and Profits thereof and also all the estate right Title Interest use trust Property Clame & Demand whatsoever of them the said John Lincoln and Rebecca his wife of in and to the said Premises and all deeds Evidences and writings touching or in any wise Concerning the same To have and to hold the Lands hereby Conveyed and all and Singular other the Premises hereby Granted & Released and every Part and Parcel thereof with their and every of their Appurtenances unto the said

Abraham Lincoln his heirs & assigns forever to the only Proper Use and Behoef of him the said Abraham Lincoln and of his heirs and Assigns forever and the said John Lincoln and Rebecca his wife for themselves their heirs Executors & Admrs. doth Covenant Promise and Grant to and with the said Abraham Lincoln his heirs and Assigns by these Presents that the said John Lincoln and Rebecca his wife now at the time of Sealing & Delivery of these Presents is Seized of a Good Sure Perfect and Indefeasible estate of Inheritance in fee Simple of and in the Premises hereby Granted and Released and that he hath Good Power and Lawfull & Absolute Authority to Grant and Convey the same to the said Abraham Lincoln in Manner and form Aforesaid and that the said Premises now are and so for ever hereafter shall remain, and be free & Clear of and From all Former and other Gifts Grants Bragains sales Dower rights and Title of Dower Judgments Executions Titles Troubles Charges and Encumbrances whatsoever made done Committed or Suffered by the said John Lincoln & Rebecca his wife or any other Person or Persons whatsoever the Quit rents hereafter to Grow due and Payable to our Sovereign Lord the king his heirs and Successors for and in respect of the Premises only Excepted and foreprized and Lastly that the said John Lincoln and his wife Rebecca and their heirs all and Singular the Premises hereby Granted and released with the Appurtenances unto the said Abraham Lincoln his heirs and all and every other Person and Persons whatsoever Shall Warrant and forever defend by these Presents In witness whereof the said John Lincoln and Rebeca his wife hereunto set their hands and Seals the day and year first above Written

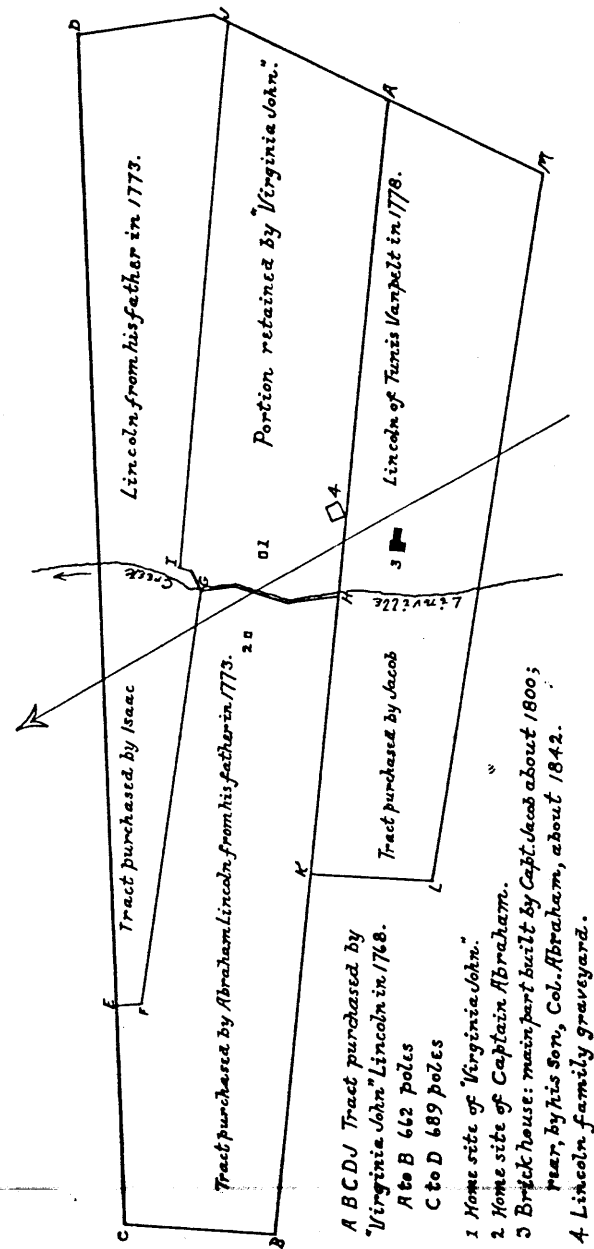

Certain of the bearings and distances in the foregoing writing as recorded are somewhat in error, but it is possible to make proper corrections by comparisons with the McKay survey of 1746, the McKay deed to John Lincoln in 1768, Abraham Lincoln's deed of 1780, and John Vance's deed of trust to George Chrisman in 1804. It seems very



probable that Abraham's purchase of 1773, as above, contained 200 acres or less rather than 210.

Old fences, remnants of fences, and other landmarks still remain on the lines designated in the deed of 1773 to Abraham Lincoln and in later deeds. One unmistakable landmark is the creek, down which (on the northwest side) his line ran with the bearings and distances: "North 10 east 17 Poles & north 60 east 30 poles to a walnut north 18 east 20 poles to a Walnut Corner To Isaac Lincolns." On December 5, 1933, Professor John C. Myers and I, with compass and chain, ran these courses and measured these distances along the west bank of the creek and found them to agree exactly with the notations in the deed of August, 1773.

Another striking verification is to be found at the end of "North 54 west 240 Poles . . . thence North 31 East 16 Poles . . . on the old Line." Here was an offset of 16 poles in Abraham's line, across the extreme northwest end of Isaac's land. Along Abraham's line here today is a lane, known as "Feather-Bed Lane," which has an offset of 16 poles on the exact bearing of N. 31 E. The "old Line" referred to at this point in Abraham's deed is the line of 1768 between John Bowman and "Virginia John" Lincoln. And one standing at the point C (see the maps) can follow with his eye the old line two miles across the valley to D by means of the old fences still in place.

To his purchase of 200 acres in 1773, Captain Abraham Lincoln, on September 6, 1779, added 52 acres by purchase from Holton Muncey, the price 500 pounds. This additional tract lay alongside part of his 1773 purchase, and extended southwest across Tunis Vanpelt's purchase of 1768 and into land formerly Bryan's. (Map page 52.) The price Abraham Lincoln paid, 500 pounds, for the 52 acres purchased in 1779, indicates either that he paid in

The consideration in this transaction, "five Thousand pounds current money of Virginia," was almost certainly in the depreciated paper money of the period.

On Monday, September 24, 1781, when the private examination of Bathsheba Lincoln concerning the land sale to Michael Shanks was returned to the court, on the motion of Robert Rutherford and wife and Thomas Hewit a dedimus was issued to take the deposition of Abraham Lincoln "abt to remove." Evidently Captain Lincoln was about to remove to Kentucky. On May 29, 1780, he had entered 400 acres of land in Jefferson County, Ky.

Besides his home place of 250 or 252 acres on Linville Creek, Captain Lincoln held title to other pieces of real estate in Rockingham County. On May 1, 1781, he purchased a lot in the new town of Keezletown, laid off by George Keesle on 100 acres of his plantation ("Virginia Valley Records," pages 96, 97): and on January 2, 1782, he assigned to his brother, Jacob Lincoln, 200 acres of land which he (Abraham) had entered on July 14, 1770. This tract was surveyed for Jacob Lincoln by Gawin Hamilton, assistant to the county surveyor, Thomas Lewis. It lay on the east side of Linville Creek, adjoining the lands of Robert Belsha and others. It probably was located on the ridge a mile or two east of the creek, where the Lincolns had timber lands.

At the time they moved to Kentucky, almost certainly in the autumn of 1781, Captain Abraham Lincoln and his wife had five children, all born in Rockingham County, Va. Following Waldo Lincoln, I subjoin herewith their names and birth-dates:

1. Mordecai, born about 1771.
2. Josiah, born about 1773.
3. Mary, dates of her birth and death unknown. It

is said that she married Ralph Crume of Nelson County, Ky.

4. Thomas, born January 5, 1778.

5. Nancy, born March 25, 1780. In 1801 she married William Brumfield of Washington County, Ky. She had several children and died in 1843 or 1845.

Besides his 400 acres in Jefferson County, Captain Lincoln took up several other tracts in other localities, his total holdings aggregating 1700 acres. It seems generally accepted that he made his home on the Jefferson County tract, not far from the site of the present city of Louisville. At some time prior to October, 1788, he was shot and instantly killed by an Indian in ambush. The date of his death has not been exactly determined, some placing it as early as 1784, but it was probably not very long before October 14, 1788, when an administrator of his estate was appointed.

At the time of his death Captain Lincoln was working near his house, his three sons, Mordecai, Josiah, and Thomas, being with him. Mordecai, who was then 16 or 17 years of age, hurried to the house for a rifle. Josiah ran for help. Thomas, then nine or ten years old, remained with his father. He was on the point of being seized or tomahawked by the Indian who came to scalp his father, when Mordecai from the cabin shot the Indian and killed him. The latter was probably a lone sniper. If he had been one of a band I am of the opinion that other members of Captain Lincoln's family would have been killed before the help summoned by Josiah arrived.

Not long after the death of Captain Lincoln his widow and her children moved to Washington County, Ky., where old tax lists show that she was living as late as 1792. Mordecai, it appears, inherited his father's lands under the old law of primogeniture. Among the old papers that

came to me from the Lincolns of Linville Creek were two that are pertinent in this connection. Following are copies.

Know all men by these presents that I Mordecai Lincoln of Washington County and State of Kentucky reposing Special trust and Confidence in my Trusty friend Jacob Lincoln of Rockingham County & State of Virginia do hereby Constitute and Appoint him the said Jacob Lincoln my true & Lawfull Attorney to act in all matters in my name & behali Particularly of and concerning the Suing for, and recovering a certain tract or parcel of land Situate lying and being in the County of Rockingham aforesaid which is now in dispute as to the title, and which I claim as Heir at law to Abraham Lincoln my deceased Father, hereby ratifying and confirming all my Said Attorney Shall do of and concerning the Premises or any part or parcel thereof, as fully and amply &c as tho I myself were personally Present, also of and concerning Any compromise he may think proper to make or cause to be made with either or all of the contending parties in the Premises hereby ratifying and confirming the Same In testimony whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Affixed my Seal this the twenty Eighth day of April 1802

(Signed) Mordecai Lincoln (Seal)

Washington Sit,

Personally came Mordecai Lincoln before us two of the Justices for Said county and acknowledged the above to be his act and Deed for the purpose therein mentioned Given under our hands and Seals this 30th day of April 1802

(Signed) Jesse Head (Seal)  
Jacob Seay (SI)

The above was certified and sealed by John Ried, clerk of the county court of the county aforesaid, April 30, 1802.

Accompanying the above paper is another, to wit:

The Land Claimed by Mordica Lincoln was conveyed by the McCoys to John Lincoln by John Lincoln to Abraham Lincoln the father of Mordica the conveyance called for the original line but when Abraham conveyed he conveyed a certin distance Leaving a Surplus between his conveyance and the old Line this surplus is claimed by Mordica Lincoln as heir at Law of Abraham Lincoln this is the Nature of the claim as far as I am informed the conveyances are to be found in the possession of Jacob Lincoln

The foregoing claim was evidently based on the land that John Lincoln would have gotten, or should have gotten, in 1768 if his tract had really contained 600 acres—especially if his line across the northwest end of his tract had actually measured out 108 poles. Just what came of this claim I do not know, but I do know that there were later surveys made in the effort to adjust boundary lines.

It should be remarked in passing that Jesse Head, the first justice signing the certificate to Mordecai Lincoln's power of attorney in 1802, was in all probability the same Jesse Head who certified in 1806 that he had joined Thomas Lincoln and Nancy Hanks in marriage on June 12 of that year.

## CHAPTER IV

### NANCY AND OTHER HANKS

In this brief chapter I am not undertaking to name the forebears of Nancy Hanks, whom Thomas Lincoln married in Washington County, Ky., on June 12, 1806, and who became the mother of two of his children, Sarah, born February 10, 1807, and Abraham, born February 12, 1809, or to prove the place of her birth. Her various parents and widely separated birthplaces have been set forth by previous writers with satisfaction, no doubt, to themselves. I have not been able to reach any definite conclusions, but shall submit various items that may prove of some interest to investigators.

The Hanks were numerous and widely distributed. "Heads of Families," published from the first United States census (1790), shows Hank and Hanks heads of families in six counties of Virginia, and this report is not complete as to Virginia counties. From this showing George Hanks in Middlesex County was head of a family of five in 1783; George Hanks in Richmond County was head of a family of three in 1783; John Hank in Shenandoah County was head of a family of six in 1785; John Hanks in Richmond County was head of a family of four in 1783; Joseph Hanks in Hampshire County was head of a family of eleven in 1782; Margaret Hank in Rockingham County was head of a family of four in 1784; Moses Hanks in Pittsylvania County was head of a family of eight in 1782 and of seven in 1785; **Turner Hanks in Richmond County** was head of a family of nine in 1783.

I have before me a blue-print map of a section of

Mineral County, W. Va., showing the location of the farm of Joseph Hanks, where, many persons claim, Nancy Hanks, the mother of President Lincoln, was born. Mineral County until 1866 was a part of Hampshire. In June, 1926, before the blue-print map came to me, I went to Romney, the county-seat of Hampshire County, at the instance of Mrs. Myra Hank Rudolph of Warren, Ohio, to search the Hampshire County records concerning Joseph Hank and his family. I found that Joseph Hank on March 9, 1784, had mortgaged 108 acres of land to Peter Hartman. Nothing was said about Hanks's wife; evidently she was dead. Perhaps Hanks was getting ready to go to Kentucky. The records at Romney, so far as I could find, revealed nothing more about him. The clerk, Mr. Haines, thought there was nothing more about him. Mr. Haines stated that the land mortgaged ("on Mikes Run, a Drain of Pattersons Creek") is now in Mineral County. He also said that nearly all the will records and marriage records at Romney had been destroyed during the Civil War. He said furthermore that Dr. William E. Barton had been there, at some time preceding my visit, looking up Hank records.

The old records of Hopewell Friends Meeting, seven miles northeast of Winchester, contain several Hank items. These were abstracted for me in August, 1934, by Mr. Richard E. Griffith Sr. of Winchester. As shown by these records, June 2, 1777, a certificate was produced at Hopewell for Margaret Hank and her four daughters, Susannah, Elinor, Hannah, and Margaret, from Gwined Monthly Meeting in Chester County, Pa. On May 31, 1781, the widow Margaret Hank was disowned by Hopewell Friends for not attending meetings and for countenancing her daughters' outgoings in marriage. On June 4, 1787, Asa Lupton and Hannah Hank secured the consent of the meet-

ing for marriage, Hannah being described as of Rockingham County. As shown above, a Margaret Hank was head of a family of four in Rockingham in 1784. Rockingham County records show that in 1788 Henry Hank was in the militia company of Captain Jacob Trumbo and that William Hank, the same year, was a voucher in the militia company of Captain John Herdman. On August 3, 1810, John Hank purchased 70 acres of land from Robert Warner (Harner?). In 1829, 1830, and 1831 there was a Rev. William Hank who performed marriage ceremonies in Rockingham. The county records contain other Hank items. These Hanks evidently lived in or near Brock's Gap, not far from the Lincolns.

Some of the theories and asseverations concerning the parentage of Nancy Hanks are malicious, others are hardly less than fantastic. Altogether the elucidators have been generous—they have given her four or five mothers and no less than eight or nine fathers, among the latter George Washington and John Marshall. Among the few statements upon which we may rely with confidence is the one by Abraham Lincoln, that both his parents were born in Virginia. An objective and discerning discussion of various possibilities (and impossibilities) in the case, with special reference to the claim that Nancy was born in Hampshire County, Va., the daughter, granddaughter, or daughter-in-law of Joseph Hanks, may be found in *Lincoln Lore*, No. 28 and No. 29, dates of October 21 and 28, 1929.

I have before me a letter written from Springfield, Ky., June 11, 1924, by a gentleman who seemed confident that he could locate the birthplace of Nancy Hanks in Rockingham or in Rockbridge County, Va. Mr. Herring Chrisman, writing in 1900, goes into particulars that are interesting and thought-provoking. He says:

It will be forty years next summer that I called at the house where Bathsheba Lincoln was married in the old Colonial days. The scenes around it had been familiar to me in my childhood inasmuch that I could even recall the face and form of the brother that had loved her so well, all the more, perhaps, for her lonely, sad life in her wild western home. He was a gentle and kindly old man, much loved and cherished by his family, including his slaves. He had educated two of his slaves and one was a professor in Liberia College and the other soon followed him. At the time of this call I made at his place, he had been long dead, but some of his children were still there. The place was much as he had left it, much as it was when I was a child, for the grass was as green in the meadow close by, and the trees as sturdy and strong in the orchard, and the ground under their thick shade as well covered with ripe yellow fruit. The house had grown grayer outside, yellow pine though it was, but within, though it had never smelled paint, it was scoured as spick and span as a new-born pin. The thin, quavering voices of the inmates told of old age, and at the mention of Lincoln their memories flashed back to a still older time, and one and another would recall his father and mother who had first met in that old home. One would recite that their Aunt Lincoln's son Thomas was back from Kentucky when first grown. Another remembered that Nancy Hanks lived just over the hill as she always had and was often at the house, and all agreed what a joyous, jolly good fellow Thomas was, so handy and helpful in door and out, and what a dear, good girl but more sober and sedate, Nancy Hanks was, and how helpful in sickness and sorrow she was, and beyond her age. After their marriage in Kentucky, to which Thomas had returned and Nancy had emigrated some while later, with her family, they had both dropped out of sight, and their son had never been heard of till his name had appeared just then like a handwriting on the wall and made them tremble for their slaves.

In or about 1925 Mrs. Myra Hank Rudolph of Warren, Ohio, told me that the third generation of Hanks in America of whom we have authentic records were the children of John and Margaret Williams Hank (or Hanks) of Pennsylvania and Rockingham County, Va.; among whom were John III, Caleb, Williams, Margaret, and Hannah. They were of Quaker heritage, but John III had an extended record as a Revolutionary soldier. Mar-

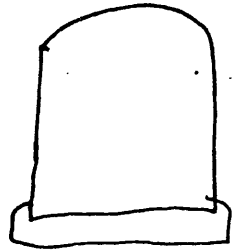

She was the daughter of Abraham Lincoln who was a first cousin to President Lincoln. Mrs. Smith was born and lived all her life in Washington county. From her earliest age she was a devout, and consistent member of the Catholic Church and was buried at St. Rose with all the solemnities of that church.

In his will he made bequests that all of his slaves and their children be freed at the time of his death. He specifically requested "to bury me at the Catholic Church Grave Yard at St. Rose". He names the children of his brother, James, of Washington CO., MD: Martha, Malina, James Martin and Heland. He also leaves bquest to child- ren and grandchildren of his brother John Adams, Sr. A bequest was left to Father Joseph Jarboe, O.P. of St. Rose for the orphans and widows. This will was made on July 25, 1848 and probated December 15, 1856. Other probate records found in Springfield, KY are his Curator's Settlement, J-485; Division of Slaves, J-533; Trustee Settlement, J-594, and the Executor's Settlement, K-354, which tells about Pat Simms & three men taking freed slaves to Keoकेck, Iowa. The Vital Statistics listed him as a single 80 year old VA born male, farmer, who died on August 13, 1852 in Wash. Co., KY and did not give his parents or cause of death. In the 1850 Census of Washington Co., KY, household #1369, Peter is listed as an 87 year old MD born farmer, living alone, with real estate worth \$8,200. This man was a great benefactor of St. Rose Church.
