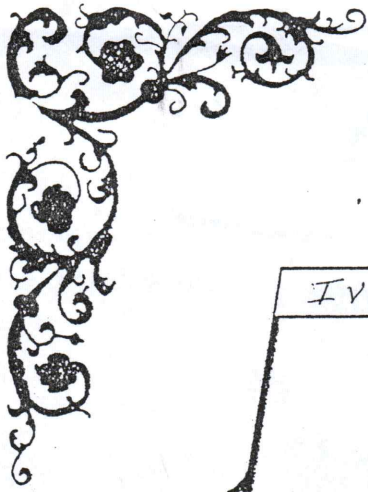

Not in Birth Order

The name of Linton is said to have been derived from the residence of its first bearers at a place of that name in England. It is found on the ancient records in the various forms of Lyntone, Lynton, Lintone, Linton and others, of which the last form mentioned is that most generally accepted today, both in America and England.

Families of this name were to be found at early dates in the English counties of Cambridge, Bevon, Kent, Hereford, York, Derby, Worcester, and London as well as in various parts of Scotland, and were, for the most part, of the landed gentry of Great Britain.

Among the earliest records of the name of England were those of William de Linton of Worcestershire about 1272, those of Richard de Linton of London in 1273, those of Robert de Linton of County Cambridge about the same time, those of Hugh de Linton of Yorkshire about 1292, those of Robert de Lynton of Yorkshire in 1352, those of Laurencius de Lynton of the same place in 1408, those of John Lynton, also of Yorkshire, before 1473, and those of Robert Lynton, who married Katherine Johnson in 1545.

In the latter half of the seventeenth century one Jeffry Linton was living in Yorkshire and was the father of at least one son, the Reverend John Linton, and probably of William and others as well; and one Thomas Linton of London is said to have had a son named William in the year of 1686.

One Sir Roger Linton of Yorkshire in the latter seventeenth century is claimed by some authorities to have been the father of six sons, John, Jacob, Samuel, Benjamin, Roger and James, of whom the first is said to have been the emigrant John Linton, who came to America about 1692.

James F. Linton was born in Washington County, Ky., Jan. 21, 1839, and came to Daviess County in 1859. He was married DEC. 9, 1866, to Helen Able, a native of Marion County, Ky. They have seven children -- James W., Martha E., Joseph, Ronimus, Mary D., Ivo, and Patrick. In August, 1861, Mr. Linton enlisted in the Confederate army and served four years. He was captured at Donelson and taken to Camp Douglas where he remained from Feb. 8 to Sept. 15, 1862, when he was exchanged and returned to his command. He was again captured at Vicksburg the following June, and made his escape, but was recaptured in August and taken to Alton, Ill., and kept a month, when he tunneled out and again escaped. He took a boat and went to St. Louis, and remained three weeks with friends. He then came to Owensboro, and joined another command and served eight months. He was wounded at Fort Donelson in the shoulder and hip; at Champion Hills he received two slight wounds in the thigh; received a flesh wound in the thigh at Baker's Creek; and in Crittenden County received a wound in the lower part of the arm, which extended to the shoulder, and from which he had twenty-six pieces of bone taken. Mr. Linton is a member of the Catholic church and St. Alphonsus Temperance Society.
