ELDER JOHN LOGAN

From History of McDonough County, Illinois. Published 1878.

"The subject of this sketch was born in Rockbridge County, Va., February 14, 1793. His father, Samuel Logan, was a native of Ireland, who emigrated to this country when about 20 years of age, and was married about the year 1789 to Ann Wylie. A short time after the birth of John his parents removed to Garrard County, Kentucky, making the journey with two pack horses, on which all their worldly goods were borne. ***

On the 28th day of November, 1816 he was married to Miss Nancy Newell, in Simpson County, Ky., and at once removed to Sumner County, Tenn., where he lived for 5 years. It was here under the preaching of Elder Lee Allen, that he was converted to Christ, and where he and his estimable wife were buried in baptism on the 3rd day of October, 1819, and on the first Sunday in November of the same year they united with the New Hope Baptist Church, in Simpson County, Ky. * * * * *

In October, 1823, he removed to Dubois County, Indiana, where he remained for 4 years. * * * * *

He was regularly ordained by Elders Graham, Charles Harper and David Hornaday, and in the spring of 1828 moved to this county and settled near the present town of Industry, living one season in the old block house, of which mention is made elsewhere in these records. * * * *

Here they lived until fall, when they moved into a more comfortable house, where they remained until the following year, when another move was made to Schuyler County, which place was made their home until the fall of 1835, when they again returned to McDonough County, this time settling near the present town of Blandinsville, and where they lived until the day of Mr. Logan's death. The result of this union with Nancy Newell was the birth of 13 children."

"Elder John Logan, a Baptist minister preached the first gospel sermon ever heard in McDonough County, in the month of November, 1831, Elder Logan and Elder Stephen Strickland constituted a Baptist Church in Bethel township, named Union, composed of 10 members -- four males and six females."

"Elder John Logan, the noted pioneer preacher, a short biography of whom we have given elsewhere, preached the first sermon on Spring Creek in the year 1832."

"The first settlement made in McDonough County was in the year 1826. The first marriage was that of Mr. John Wilson and Martha R. Vance who were married October 30th, 1828 by Elder John Logan, a minister of the Baptist Church." --- "The second birth was Elizabeth Black Logan, now Mrs. Wm. C. Hainline, daughter of John and Nancy Logan."

Dear Ms. Watts:

I would like to visit Marion County Public Library on or about June 21 to investigate some particulars of my father's family history that trace to Marion County. In particular, I'm seeking document evidence for the parents of the ancestor shown below (grave monument photo from find-a-grave.com, and I've visited the Troy, IN, Cemetery myself). I am confident that his parents were Matthew Logan and Sally Fleece (daughter of John Fleece and Mary Withers), but I can't yet prove it with documents to satisfy the application requirements for National Society of Sons of the American Revolution. I'll also be searching for evidence of Sally Fleece's parentage (her father John had quite an impressive record as a soldier in the Revolution). I have a published transcript of John Fleece's will naming her, but that may not stand well alone as proof.

I see both Fleece and Logan among the family history files your library holds. I'm interested in assistance with those as well as other sources that pertain to this quest. I am still very much an amateur with genealogical source material and research, so I will need some guidance when I visit the library.

I assume I should also make contact with the Marion County Historical Society with the same explanation and request.

At your convenience, please reply to let me know whether June 21 is a good day for my visit. I'll be traveling from the Asheville, NC area and certainly want to give your staff advance notice. June 22 or 23 can work for me if the 21st is not best for you.

I appreciate the help available at your library, and the strong website that pointed me to you.

Lincoln County Pioneer Families

FLEECE FAMILY

John Fleece, a soldier of the American Revolution with the Virginia troops, settled in Lincoln County, Kentucky. The Virginia Land Office allowed John Fleece land for his war service, as evidenced by the following record:

"Council Chambers, 27th May, 1831. John Fleece is allowed land bounty for 3 years service, as a Corporal in the Continental Line. John Floyd, Governor. (Department of War Bounty Land Office, Dec. 8, 1836.... Land Warrant No. 1696, for 100 acres of land issued 15th Dec., 1830, to John Fleece, of Lee's Legion, Virginia Line.... authenticated in Lincoln County, Ky., 28 Oct., 1830.)"

John Fleece removed from Lincoln County to Washington County, Kentucky, where he died 1833 or 1834; his will, written July 6, 1833, and probated, Washington County Court, Sept. 22, 1834, reads, in part, as follows:

"Calling to mind that it is appointed unto all men once to die: I do make this my last will and testament. I assign my soul into the hands of Almighty God; I bequeath to Henry Pope; to my children - Nicholas Fleece, Elizabeth Baslie (Bosley); John Fleece, Sally Logan, James Fleece, Pamela Pope, Maria Robertson, Greenbury Fleece, Charles Fleece, and Lucretia Walls. Witnesses, John Walls and John Sandusky."

On August 28, 1835, the Virginia Land office awarded Warrant No 8326 for 200 acres of land to the heirs of John Fleece, for his services as a Corporal in the Revolutionary War.

Name of the wife of John Fleece is not known and as she is not named in his will, must have predeceased him. John Fleece's children were as follows:

I. NICHOLAS FLEECE, married in Washington County, Ky., March 24, 1814, Elizabeth T. Hundley, daughter of Charles and Dorothy Hundley; children: John L., Ann, and Clinton Fleece. (Nicholas Fleece died intestate before August 6, 1835, as shown by a record in Marion County Court, of that date).

II. ELIZABETH (BETSEY) FLEECE, married, in Lincoln County, Ky., August 5, 1806, Gideon

Bosley. (See note on Bosley family which follows).

III. JOHN FLEECE, in Marion County, Ky., 1835; no further record.

IV. SARAH (SALLY) FLEECE, married, in Lincoln County, Ky., Matthew Logan (bond, July 30, 1810). (See note on Logan family which follows).

V. JAMES FLEECE, married in Washington County, Ky., Diannah Penick (marriage bond dated June 29, 1825); residence, Marion County, Ky.

VI. PAMELA FLEECE, married, in Lincoln County, Ky., Henry Pope (marriage bond, March 25, 1816). Children: William, Margaret, Mary, Henry, Lucretia, and John Wesley Pope. (Pamela Pope died prior to 6th August, 1835, as shown by a record in Marion County Court of that date).

VII. MARIA FLEECE, married, in Lincoln County, Ky., Jacob Robinson (marriage bond dated Nov. 3, 1823). Resided in Garrard County, Ky.

VIII. GREENBERRY FLEECE, resided in Marion County, Ky.; no further record.

IX. LUCRETIA FLEECE, married Henry Walls; resided in Washington County, Ky.

X. CHARLES FLEECE, resided in Lincoln County.

BOSLEY FAMILY - This family is of English origin. Walter Gideon Bosley came from England and settled in Maryland, in 1660. James Gideon Bosley, said to be son of the emigrant, married Elizabeth Parrish, Nov. 26, 1730. Gideon Bosley, son of James and Elizabeth, married Sarah Cole, Jan. 9, 1772, and they removed from Baltimore County, Maryland, to Washington County, Kentucky; children: Edith, Ruth, Anna, Thomas Berry (married Elizabeth Sutton); Elijah, Abram, James Gideon (born July 9, 1784; died Nov. 30, 1830; married Elizabeth Fleece); Children of Gideon and Elizabeth (Fleece) Bosley were as follows: Elijah, Charles F., Martha S. (married Elijah Wade Dawson, marriage bond dated Dec. 7, 1856; married on 16th; he was son of Elijah Dawson, Sr., and was born in Kentucky, Aug. 11, 1819, and died in Missouri, June 4, 1890; his wife was born June 24, 1825,

and died Aug. 30, 1892); James W.; Henry P.; Sarah E.; Thomas Greenberry; Gideon J. Bosley (all under 21 at date of their father's will); two children "already 21" - John Bosley, and Harriett (married ---- Funk).

LOGAN FAMILY - Capt. James Logan, served in the American Revolution, "the entire period with General Greene in the South"; after the Revolution removed from Virginia to Kentucky, settling in Lincoln County; he married (1st), Sarah Beatty, daughter of John Beatty, of Washington County, Va., and their children were: Robert (married, 1807, Betsy Tinsley); Beatty (married 1813, Martha Everhart); Sarah, (married, 1805, Elijah Dawson); Matthew (married, 1810, Sally Fleece); John; James. The will of Matthew Logan, probated Washington County, Ky., Jan. 27, 1826, names "my seven children," Polly, James, John B., Robert, Mariah, Jane, Henry, and Dinnah; wife, Sally.
