Hans Michael Mauser born 11 June 1707. Lived Oeschingen, Wuerttemberg, Germany (a very small town about 30/40 miles south of Stuttgart and about 40/50 miles north of the Swiss border.) Hans Michael married in Germany Agatha, daughter of Hans Jerg Gomminger of Ofterdingen, Germany. The family received Communion in the church 2 May 1751 because they were going to the "New World". Their children listed are,

She thought maybe Fred 1740's wife was Frances Heap m. 18 Feb 1758. But we have never found a daughter named Frances after the mother, and the church record lists this Heap m. to P. Frederick and there was a Philipp Frederick Meyer who came over on the ship "Edinburgh" which landed in Philly the same day as the ship "Nancy," 16 Sept 1751.

Several of the younger children including #3. Fred 1740 were born at or near Charlottenhof, Germany which I am told is the name of a house or farm.

We think Fred 1740 & wife moved to N.C. before 1772, perhaps in the 1760's. He died 23 April 1799 and has a stone in Old St. Pauls Lutheran cemetery near Newton, N.C. He had at least three farms, some on Clarks Creek nearby. I have a copy of the clerk's record of his estate sale 25 July 1799, five long pages, which names several of the children and the widow who bought at the sale. We have not found the name of his widow.

I believe his son, ④ Fred 1772/1776 moved to KY before his father died, married in Lincoln county KY 25 June 1797 Elizabeth "Betsy" Clinch Donan. Her father was killed during the Revolutionary War. We believe they must have moved to near Riley, Marion co, KY soon after their marriage. One account states that Betsy was born near Bradfordsville, KY.

I am from their son ⑤ John (Jack) Mouser born 26 Nov 1811 died 23 Aug 1895. Buried about a mile west of Riley on the old Edward's farm next to the iron fence around the Bigger lot. Married Nancy L. (Lou) Hargrave (Hardgrove) in 1833. Nancy was born 2 Sept 1812 died 24 June 1888.

We don't have the date of death for Fred 1772/76 but found a deed where his son Gabriel deeded his share of Fred's land to John 1811. This deed is dated 8 Jan 1861. It mentions Fred 1772/6 is deceased, and Gabriel is living in like county Indiana.

Another deed dated 14 Mar 1814 tells that "Fred of Washington" (now Marion county) purchased 12 acres of land from the Slaughters. So we know Fred was living in the county before 1814. There may be an earlier deed for some of his land in the courthouse in Washington county, Springfield.

Michael MAUSER & his family came over on the "NANCY" landing in Philly on Sept 1751. Hans Michael bought 25 acres in Northampton county PA in 1752. I think land was in what is Berks county today. A June 1758 list of horses/wagons lists

Hart County, with her son-in-law, Rev. W. T. Payton. William Moran, grandfather of George Moran, was a native of Virginia, where he was a man of wealth and prominence. He immigrated to Barren County, where he owned large tracts of land and a great many slaves, and was one of the substantial farmers of the county. He married Miss Elizabeth Blaine, and was the father of eight children—four sons and four daughters—of whom Robert P. Moran was the eldest, and three are still living: William, P. P., and Emily (Grooms). George R. Moran received little education, and in youth was trained to hard work on the farm, which has since been his fortune in life. After becoming of age, he hired to the neighboring farmers until December, 1860, when he married Miss Mary P. Carpenter, the eldest of four daughters born to Andrew and Elizabeth (Bridgewaters) Carpenter, native Kentuckians. Andrew Carpenter was a son of Andrew and Elizabeth (Kinslow) Carpenter, of Culpeper County, Va., and Elizabeth Bridgewaters was a daughter of Nathan and Polly (Page) Bridgewaters, also Virginians. This marriage has been blessed by the addition of the following children: John W., Marietta (deceased), Thomas P., James J., Robert P., Elizabeth Ann, and one son, born August 16, 1886, and died August 28, 1886. Mr. Moran's eldest son, J. W. Moran, was married February 15, 1882, to Amanda W. Stotts, of Adair County, and daughter of Elizabeth Stotts. To this union three children have been born. In 1858 Mr. Moran, with his brother, Hezekiah, bought 130 acres of land in Barren County, on which was a grist-mill, and they paid \$2,000 on the place and lost it. After marriage he rented and cultivated land successfully four years, and at the end of that time he was able to purchase a farm of eighty acres, in 1865, where he lived until 1874. This farm, which he had highly improved, he sold in 1873, and purchased his present location, 226 acres in Adair County, which at that time was in a very dilapidated condition. He has enriched, improved and cleared most of the farm, erected a residence, barns and stables, and built a good fence around it, and it is now in a high state of cultivation, and one of the best farms in the section. He turns his attention to no particular line of farming, but raises tobacco and all the cereals common to the county very successfully. All that he has is the result of his own industry and good management, and besides the \$2,000 lost in 1858, he was victimized to the extent of \$1,050 in another

business transaction. Mr. Moran is a Democrat, and a member of the Baptist Church; his wife of the Christian Church.

DR. ROBERT C. MORGAN was born in Cumberland County, June 18, 1835, and is a son of Reece and Caroline (Conover) Morgan, who reared six children, of whom the Doctor (the only son), and one sister, Lydia A. Morgan (who married Robert H. Cofer, of Adair County), are living. The Doctor is the third child in order of birth and is a twin. Reece Morgan was born in Cumberland County in 1802, moved to Adair County in 1850 and died January 12, 1882, a member of the Christian Church. He was a son of Morgan Morgan, of Virginia, who settled on Crocus Creek as early as 1795. Mrs. Caroline Morgan was a daughter of Garrard Conover and was born in Adair County. Dr. Robert C. Morgan began life as a teacher; subsequently he became a salesman, and at the age of twenty-five he began the study of dentistry; he was graduated from the Cincinnati Dental College and for three years practiced in Columbia, Ky.; then moved to Burkesville, then to Lebanon, and in 1882 settled in Lancaster. He has furnished a number of articles on dental surgery to the press, and has filled the offices of vice-president and president of the State Dental Association. He was married October 6, 1868, to Miss Mollie E., daughter of Richard W. and Rosana M. (Hurt) Wallace. Mr. Wallace is a Christian minister and was a soldier in the Mexican war. He is still living and was a son of William Wallace, who came from Virginia and settled in Adair County many years ago. Mrs. Mollie E. Morgan died in 1878, a member of the Christian Church.

JOHN W. MOUSER was born January 12, 1840; his father, John Mouser, in 1811, and now resides on the old homestead near Riley's in Marion County. His life has been spent in the pursuits of the farm, but he retired from active work in 1870. His wife, to whom he was married in 1833, was a Miss Nancy Hardgrove of Boyle County; nine children blessed this union; six of the number are living, namely: Frederick, of Dallas County, Tex.; John W., Mary E. (Sparrow) of Marion County; Edward G. of Lynn County, Mo.; Gabriel T. of Madison County, Tex., and Redford M. of Marion County. Nancy (Hardgrove) Mouser was born in the State of Kentucky, in 1812; she was reared in Boyle County, Ky., and is yet living, aged seventy-four years. Her parents were of English descent and by birth Virginians. Frederick Mouser, the

mea's note - This genealogy information was provided by Robert Hayes, Barbour Mills Road, Lebanon, Kentucky. Thanks to Robert we have quite a bit of Mouser information in the family files. The parents of Georgie E. Bagwell were Henderson O. Bagwell and Sarah Cassandra James. They were married in Whitfield County Georgia, 7-3-1863. I have been told that Sarah James is a descendant of Jesse James. A copy of the James family tree has been provided to the Lebanon Library. When reviewing the chart, you find the names of Hite, Barr, Farmer and Rose among the relatives. All these names are found in Marion County in the mid to late 1800's. Maybe Jesse James had more connection to Marion County than just robbing a Mundefordville stagecoach with Judge Rowntree aboard.

I am still digging the Mouser "roots". I wrote to and received info from Mr. Anthar Mouser of Houston, TX. He is from the George Mouser, oldest brother of John 1811. I had thought since George and his children lived in Green and Hart counties that your John 1827 might have been from this line. But the info we have does not list him.

Frederick 1772/1776 who was the father of George 1797 & John 1811 had other sons David 1799 and Gabriel 1801 and may have had a son Fred too. Fred 1772/1776 also had a brother John who stayed in Catawba county N.C. and bought the home farm. We have found the deed dated 1816 where "Frederick of Kentucky" along with three of his sisters, Sallie Moser, Catherine Smith, Elizabeth Bolick (Bolack) deeded their part to John who stayed on the farm. Four other brothers must have already deeded their portion to John; Michael, Abraham, George, Henry as they did not sign the 1816 deed. Mrs. Ben Mouser in her book has guessed that John was born about 1764. He may be the father of the John Moser I found in TN. I will list what I found on the TN John further on in this letter.

We found a will we think is for John who bought the farm. He mentions Catherine, his wife, five sons: Henry, Elias, Jacob, John & David. He mentions five daughters but not by name and his mother who was still living. The will is dated 26 Sept 1822. *This John died soon after he wrote will.*

I found in a book printed a few years ago called "TN Cousins" some info about a Moser family who lived in Monroe county TN.

If you subtract 23 from 1850 you would get about 1827. I don't know if this John could be your John 1827.

We also have a R'd Mouser who had a family near Fred 1740 in Catawba county NC (which was part of Lincoln county at the time). I don't know who R'd's children were.

We also found another Fred who lived in Orange county NC, left a will naming sons John, Frederick, Jacob, Michael, Abraham Phillip, Nicholas and daughters: Catherine Kimbro, Barbara Huffman, Elizabeth Sharp, Eve Sharp, Magdalane Bulcher. This Fred died in 1799 also and we think he was some kin to my Fred 1740, probably an uncle. I found what I believe is his marriage in PA where he married 22 April 1750 Barbara Luser in the New Hanover Lutheran Church in New Hanover township of Montgomery co PA. In this same church an Eva Moser m. 1763 to Baltzer Traut, and an Anna Maria Moser m. 11 April 1769 Henry Fuchs. My Fred 1740

The 1830 Monroe county TN census listed a Peter Moser age 40/50 which would have made him born between 1780/90

1746 who would have been 23 when this marriage took place in 1769. I think this is the sister. *As you can see we are still guessing. I need the*

Andrew Carpenter was a son of Andrew and Elizabeth (Kinslow) Carpenter, of Culpeper County, Va., and Elizabeth Bridgewater was a daughter of Nathan and Polly (Page) Bridgewater, also Virginians. This marriage has been blessed by the addition of the following children: John W., Marietta (deceased), Thomas P., James J., Robert P., Elizabeth Ann, and one son born August 16, 1886, and died August 28, 1886. JOHN W. MOUSER was born January 12, 1840; his father, John Mouser, in 1811, and now resides on the old homestead near Riley's in Marion County. His life has been spent in the pursuits of the farm, but he retired from active work in 1870. His wife, to whom he was married in 1833, was a Miss Nancy Hardgrove of Boyle County; nine children blessed this union; six of the number are living, namely: Frederick, of Dallas County, Tex.; John W., Mary E. (Sparrow) of Marion County; Edward G. of Lynn County, Mo.; Gabriel T. of Madison County, Tex., and Redford M. of Marion County. Nancy (Hardgrove) Mouser was born in the State of Kentucky, in 1812; she was reared in Boyle County, Ky., and is yet living, aged seventy-four years. Her parents were of English descent and by birth Virginians. Frederick Mouser, the

father of John, was born in North Carolina, and came to Kentucky when a boy and located in Nelson (now Marion) County, he was a farmer and came from German descent, and died prior to 1850; his grandfather, a native of Germany, came to America and settled in the Virginia colony as early as 1750. John W. Mouser was born on a farm in Marion County, and at the age of nineteen visited the State of Texas, where he remained until the beginning of the civil war, when he returned to Kentucky, and soon after joined the Federal Army, enlisting in Company D, of the Tenth Kentucky Volunteer Infantry, in November, 1861; during the three years and two months that he served participated in the engagements at Mill Springs, was wounded at Chickamauga, Mission Ridge, Tunnel Hill, Resaca, Atlanta, Kenesaw, and Jonesboro, and many minor engagements. He was discharged from the service at Louisville, Ky., in November, 1864, and on the 10th of October, 1865, was united in marriage to Miss Sallie A. Brown. To this marriage have been born three sons: Otis U., Zenas A. and Edward B. Sallie (Brown) Mouser was born October 16, 1837. Her father, Alexander Brown, was descended from English ancestors; he was born in Nelson (now Marion) County, Ky.; his wife was a Miss Margaret Mouser, whose parents were of German extraction. Mr. and Mrs. John W. Mouser are members of the Methodist Episcopal Church, with which they united in 1876. Mr. Mouser's political views are Republican. He held the office of United States Internal Revenue storekeeper from May, 1880, to September, 1885; since that time he has been engaged in agricultural pursuits on the farm that he owns, lying near Riley's Station.

W. A. MULLINS, son of B. G. and Elizabeth (Kennedy) Mullins, was born August 19, 1867. B. G. Mullins, now a farmer and shorthorn cattle breeder, served three years in the Confederate cavalry under John Morgan; was captured in Ohio and imprisoned twenty-two months. He is a son of Williamson G. and Mary Ann (Graves) Mullins, who had a family of six: John G., William Jordan (deceased), Benjamin G., Martha (deceased), Emily (deceased), and Mary L. Samuel G. Mullins, a brother of Williamson G., was president of the Madison Female Institute, and also of the Daughters Female College, at Harrodsburg. Mary A. (Graves) Mullins was a sister of William J. Graves, member of Congress, whose duel at Bladensburg, Md., with Jonathan Cilley, member of Congress, from Maine, is a mat-

ter of history. William J. Graves also ran for governor on the Whig ticket, about 1840, and was defeated by only a very small majority for his opponent. Mrs. Elizabeth Mullins is a daughter of David and Eliza (Kennedy) Kennedy, the father of David Kennedy having been a famous Indian fighter. The children born to David and Eliza were seven in number, and were named Andrew, William, Elbert, Jennie, Mary, Sarah and Bettie. W. A. Mullins was reared on a farm in his native county of Garrard, and was graduated from the Lebanon (Ohio) Normal School, in the summer of 1885, after which he taught at Independence, Ky., for a while, and then bought and became editor of the Central (Kentucky) News, now the Journal.

SQUIRE MURPHY was born February 1, 1820. His father, Robert Murphy, also a native of Nelson County, died about 1875. MOUSER FAMILY HISTORY OUTLINE

George Henry Mouser, born May 20, 1862 at Lebanon, Kentucky and died June 25, 1945. His father was Frederick Mouser who worked principally as a R.R. Contractor for the Cincinnati Southern and the L. & N. R. R. until he retired in 1895 when he came to Oklahoma. He died in 1916.

His mother was Emma Catherine Flanagan who died in 1894.

Ferry was a rugged western town with few frame buildings and many tents. Water was drawn from wells and lights consisted of kerosine lamps. That first summer George moved his family to rooms north of the present Frisco Depot, then later to a house. It was also that same summer their baby daughter Bertha died. There was no cemetery yet and graves were placed helter skelter in a field. Kate tried to keep her baby's grave marked but roving animals and careless riders would destroy all markers. +54. Edward Green Mouser was born 21 Feb 1847 perhaps two miles West of Riley Marion KY on the South side of the L&N railroad. We were told by neighbors that a Nancy Mouser had lived there. He died of "Flux" 31 July 1887 at his home located in the center of his farm, directly West of the Locust Creek country school on Emerald Drive Jefferson township Linn county MO. In later years his son Lee built two houses in the Northeast corner (Husk Road & Emerald Drive) of the farm, one for Lee & Christie and a smaller house on Emerald Drive where several of Lee's children started their married lives. This house was moved by Charles Jennings about one half mile East on Husk Road where it sits vacant today.

Edward married 17 Sep 1868 Marion KY to Maggie Jane Tharp dau. of Alanson & Polina N. (Bigger) Tharp. Some records seem to refer to Alanson as "Lancen" Tharp. His son and a Rawlins relative spelled their names "Alson" and that may have been the way our GF's name should be spelled. Maggie was born 22 Dec 1846 near Riley Marion KY and died 17 Mar 1904 near Laclede Linn MO. Ed & Maggie moved to Missouri in 1876.

When the census taker came to take the 1870 census Tom still had no name and was listed as baby male one month old. His father was 24 and his mother was 22. Also in the home was Pauline Tharp age 60 mother-in-law. Tom died 20 Mar 1952 in the house he built 1110 Cole Street in Laclede MO. Tom m. 19 Oct 1898 to Nettie May Anderson at the Brookfield Methodist church by Rev. W. M. Sapp. Nettie's brother Herbert L. & wife Sylvia Anderson were their attendants. Nettie was born 2.5 miles Southeast of Laclede on Fine Drive (Hubert Mason farm in later years) on 15 Sep 1872 and died 25 July 1958 on West John Street Brookfield MO.

Tom & Nettie had one child: Marcedes May Mouser born 4 Sep 1899 in the Burnett house one half mile South on hiway 139 and three fourths mile West on Etna Road. Caleb Burnett had married Delpha Ann Tharp (a niece of Maggie (Tharp) Mouser), Delpha died 12 May 1897 after the birth of a son Orbid William Burnett born March 1896.

OUR DONNAN LINE FROM Scotland? Ireland? Wales?

Sometime before 1772 D. C. Donnan came from Wales to Virginia perhaps bringing a son David Cox Donnan. We have not found much data on when or where D. C. Donnan came from. We do find some Donnans in Schenectady NY who have the legend that one Donnan was a ship captain who brought relatives to America who settled both in Virginia and in upper New York. Andrew Donnan of Schenectady NY enlisted 1779 in the Revolutionary War. Andrew was married at Whiteburn Gallowayshire Scotland.

One David Donnan was in Schenectady by 1796 stating he was the son of James Donnan of the Parish of Kerkinnershire Wigtown Wigtownshire Scotland.

In 1817 another David Donnan came from Wigtownshire to settle in Petersburg VA.

The Bible of David Crews Donan (brother of our Betsy Donan) states the name was Donian (Irish).

Nothing is known of the life and death of D. C. Donnan however the Mousers think he was killed in the Revolution. Some family members thought D. C. Donnan settled in Washington county VA.

On 29 May 1772 David Donnan witnessed a will in Surry VA. 3 June 1775 David Donnan was a resident of Dinwiddie county VA when he requested indemnity for two runaway slaves burned in the Prince Edward VA jail. One slave was named York.

Surry VA will of Henry Davis dated 17 Oct 1771, proved 21 April 1772 listed wife Amith, son William (named after GF William Davis) and other children (not named). Executors were wife Amith Davis, William Crews, John Hartwell Cocke. One of the slaves named in the will was named York.

David Donnan was a resident of Pitt county NC in the 1780s where he owned a lot in Martinborough (now Greenville) and a 300 acre plantation formerly the home of George Evans located on the South side of the Tar River and the North side of Little Contentea Creek & Hardee's Run and a $\frac{1}{4}$ interest in a grist mill on Coneto Creek, perhaps at the junction with Tar River. In 1780 Donnan paid \$4500 for the plantation, a very high price. Family tradition holds that David Cox Donnan married a very rich widow. On 16 Sep 1785 Donnan deeded the above 800 acres to his children naming his children in the deed.

One day later 17 Sep 1785 **Donnan** sold the same 500 acres to Thomas H. Hall for ±300. On 7 Jan 1787 the **Donnan** plantation that had cost \$4500 seven years earlier was sold at sheriff's sale for \$74 to satisfy a court judgement.

David Cox Donan (he dropped an "n" from his name in KY) is said to have been the first to settle Greensburg KY and built the first log cabin there. He built a flatboat in Greensburg KY and floated to New Orleans LA. He is supposed to have been in the bootheel area when the New Madrid earth quake took place in December 1811 and the Mississippi River flowed backwards for several hours. A bill of lading dated 15 Feb 1812 said **D. Donan** was to take a bale of rope up the Red River (Arkansas) and exchange it for cotton. **Donan** is supposed to have been on Fulton's steamboat when it first sailed up the Mississippi River. (The "Virginia" ascended as far as Fort Snelling MN April 21 - May 10, 1823.)

OUR SHUCK LINE

The following is our best compilation of the Shuck family, subject to further research and correction.

Margaret (Shuck) Tharp's father was **Andrew Shuck**. The name is written Such on **Parra Tharp's** marriage bond and Shoc on the Low Dutch petition and Sogh on Sarah Shuck's marriage. Perhaps he was born in Germany ca1733 and married ca1754 to **Margaret** _____. **Margaret** was born ca1735 and died 1 Jan 1820. **Andrew Shuck's** will dated 20 March 1803 proved May 1803 Shelby county KY. OUR SHUCK LINE

We have no record of where in New Jersey **Andrew Shuck** lived. The Bantas who were members of the Low Dutch lived in Hackensack NJ but no Shuck records have been found there. The pension applications of Mathias Shuck and other children of **Andrew Shuck** seem to list NJ about 1759, soon to PA for a short time. Then we believe about 1760/1 the Shucks were near Shepherdstown WVA. Then this was in Berkeley VA, today Shepherdstown is in Jefferson county WVA. The major Low Dutch settlement was just East of Gettysburg PA. Conewego Chapel (marked in red on maps) near Hanover PA was the Low Dutch Church. Records of this church do not list **Andrew Shuck** or the baptism of his children. We think he lived near Shepherdstown.

When the Low Dutch migrated to what was to become Kentucky, some floated down the Ohio River, others went South in VA and crossed the Cumberland Gap. Fifty-Six year old Samuel Duree left Shepherdstown on March 1, 1779 with eight white men and two black men to explore KY. They traveled over the Cumberland Gap and arrived at Boonesborough KY on April 7, 1779. Among the men were Thomas & Benoni Swearingen. Remember that **Parra Tharp** served in 1776 under Capt. Van Swearingen. Perhaps these men were related. We do not know when **Parra** met **Margaret Shuck**, could they have known each other in VA?

Samuel Duree led some Low Dutch from Shepherdstown to KY where they arrived at White Oak Spring Station in now Madison county in March 1780. This land is now part of Lexington-Blue-grass Army Depot. Indians forced them to the larger forts. Thirty-five Low Dutch were killed or wounded by Indians during the early years of the KY settlement.

The Dutch were forced to move to Mercer county where they constructed a Low Dutch Station Southeast of Harrodsburg and North of Danville KY. The Dutch drafted a petition to Congress in which they petitioned for help to settle the land claims. The petition is not dated but was recorded at Congress 27 Sep 1783. It appears to have been signed by KY members, sent East via Conewego PA where other members signed. **Andrew Shuck** and his son Mathias were listed under the name "Shoc" as "Intend Frinds". We believe this may indicate the Shucks had not moved to KY, yet.

The Dutch purchased 8,610 acres in Shelby KY, most of it from Daniel Boone's brother Squire Boone. On March 14, 1786 the Low Dutch met at the Low Dutch Station near Danville KY to sign Article of Agreement. Andrew & William Shock signed. Witnessed by Benlemen X Stout and Darra tharp. The latter was our Parra Tharp. The document was discovered in 1974 in a Shelby Circuit Court case. It measures 13 by 43 inches, made of four pieces of heavy parchment sewn together.

Indians still attacked the Shelby area. Marion Tharp mentioned they had to return to Mercer county for a time. Not until 1788 could the area be considered halfway safe. Some of the prisoners captured by the Indians were released in 1795.

Sources: Mr. Vince Akers, 6683 W. Division Road, Bargersville IN 46106 collected data on the Low Dutch. his notes were published in "The Halve Maen" vol. LV No. 2 Summer 1980. the quarterly of the Holland Society, 122 E. 58th Street, NY NY 10022. Mr Akers planned a book on the Low Dutch, last correspondence with him said the book publication was uncertain.

Marion Tharp told us that the Shucks had to "fort up" even after they purchased the Shelby county land. There was a man fishing on the Rolling Fork River not far from Parra Tharp's farm who was killed by Indians after Parra moved there. We were told a gap in the hills/mountains to the East of Riley is called Indian Gap and the early settlers kept a wary eye in that direction for the Indians would come through that gap when they were up to no good!

One Andrew Kelly appears in Green KY records near the Donans after 1800 so Betsy may have divorced Kelly. The Indiana Mouser cousins have the tradition that Betsy's husband was mean and had a bad temper. Betsy said he would cuss alot. When he cussed she would pray. The louder he cussed the louder she prayed. The cousins thought his name was Donan. We don't know if this applies to Betsy's father David Cox Donan or to one of her husbands. Perhaps Kelly was ill tempered and the reason she left him.

Sparrow (married Ruah _____), Mariah Sparrow (married _____ Hendron), Nancy Sparrow (married Tom Isaacs), Mary Melvina Sparrow (married Jim Johnson), Sally Sparrow (married Ed Nevieus). Henry traded in tan bark and moved his family quite often. They once lived on the Fork at the Lillie Conder farm that is now owned by Mrs. Cecil (Alma) Ellis. Their children went to Sycamore school. Mrs. Sparrow loved to fish and she would sit on the banks of the Rolling Fork and fish all day. Henry Austin Sparrow and Mary are buried at Ryder Cemetery in Lebanon KY. [Note: The first wife Mary Elizabeth Mouser is buried in the Edward's cemetery beside her parents John "Jack" & Nancy Lou (Hargrave) Mouser. Mary's stone reads 17 Mar 1842--3 Aug 1889.]

These same Sparrows are direct descendants of Abraham Lincoln [correction: they are cousins]. The Sparrows were very patriotic. They came from England. Henry's family seldom spoke of his ancestors because of the scandalous stories of the Lincoln connection. These descendants are spoken about in the book "Women In Lincoln's Life". Henry Austin Sparrow married the second time to Ceb Brown only three months after Mary had died. His family scolded him about this and he told them that Mary was as dead as she would ever be. They had little to do with him after that and when Ceb (Brown) Sparrow died he married again to Diecy Bradford. At his death they buried him beside his first wife Mary. There were no children except by his first marriage.

Robert Shipley of VA had five daughters who moved to KY. Lucey Shipley m. James Hanks and Henry Sparrow Sr., Rachel Shipley m. Richard Berry, Naomi Shipley m. Robert Mitchell,

Margaret m. Robert Sloan who was killed Revolutionary War and his widow married(2) Mathew Armstrong.

Lucey (Shipley) Hanks m.(2) 30 ____ 1791 Mercer KY to Henry Sparrow. Lucey left her dau. Nancy Hanks (Abraham Lincoln's mother) with her sister Rachel (Shipley) & Richard Berry.

Henry & Lucey Sparrow had: Mary "Polly" Sparrow who m. Benjamin Whitehouse [a Whitehouse lived in Riley on the hill between Red Mouser's house and the place Edward Green Mouser lived], Thomas Sparrow m. Sally Smith and Mary Smith, Henry Jr. 1802--1881 m. 1822 another Smith sister Elzy Smith, George Sparrow m. Susan Ingram, Margaret "Peggy" m. William Ingram,

Elizabeth Sparrow m. Clayborn Franklin, Loucinda m. James Campbell, James Sparrow m. Nancy Hindman & Parthenia VanDeVenter

Parra signed his marriage bond and other papers "Parra" Tharp and the family wrote it thus in correspondence. Many try to change it to Perry. Parra had received some education and was often called on to serve his neighbors in court matters. Parra witnessed the papers of the Low Dutch Church group of which Margaret's father Andrew Shuck was a member. The Low Dutch moved from near Conewago (Gettysburg) PA to KY where the Indians forced them to move twice until the Low Dutch bought land from Squire Boone near Sheperdsville KY. Parra Tharp served in the Revolution enlisting at Monongahela PA and was in several battles around Philadelphia and New Jersey. Parra also went on Sullivan's Campaign up into Western New York to destroy Indian crops. Parra & Margaret are buried on their farm Southwest of Gravel Switch on the Rolling Fork. [No grave stones] The stone spring house Parra built behind their cabin still

Mr. Wm. P. Donan sent to me copies of your Family Group sheets. Mr. Donan knows I have been trying to combine info from the different lines of descent from Fred & Betsey Mouser. I descend from John (Jack) born 1811.

If you would like to compare data on the Mouser roots I would be glad to share what I find. It would help me and save time if I knew what books you have read on the Mousers. From Mr. Donan's letter I am guessing you have a copy of the David Donan book.

Do you have the 482 page "A Genealogy of the Mouser Ancestry, Including the Best and other families" by Lafrona Foshee Mouser, (Mrs. Ben Mouser, Box 378, Spade, TX 79369)? This 1978 book, \$25. postpaid from author, contains her husbands line back to Casper Mouser in the late 1600's, Wuertemberg, Germany.

Lafrona sent info she had received after the publication of her books, which may tie our Fred Mouser to the grandson of Casper. This grandson, Johann/Jacob Frederick Mouser lived and died on Clark's Creek near (west) Newton, NC. This is now Catawba county but was Lincoln county. This Fred died 23 April 1799 and is buried in the cemetery of the Old St. Paul's Lutheran Church, just north-west of Newton. Here is a book "Tombstone Inscriptions of the Old St. Paul's Church Cemetery" 1702-1967, by Neal D. Wilfong available for \$7.50 pp from the Catawba County Historical Association, Newton, NC

I will comment on where your charts differ from info I have found. I note you had a date of birth for Fred (ca 1772) but it seems to have been erased. I do not know when he was born. Leamon Slinker had info from the David Mouser Bible in which he said Fred was born 2 Sept 1776 died 15 Feb 1862. As you know 2 Sept 1776 is Betsey's birthday. I have a deed from Springfield, KY that seems to indicate that Fred died before 15 Feb 1862. I wonder if both of these dates should be for Betsey and have been listed as Fred's dates by mistake.

Mr. Slinker also has the oldest son George born 28 Jan 1797. I have a letter from Mr. Anthon Mouser, Houston, TX who is descended from this George. He states his Bible has George born 28 DEC 1797. He says his George was the son of a Fred Mouser and knows he had a brother named John aka Jack. He believes his George is the eldest son of Fred & Betsey.

Mr. Slinker also has Margaret & Rebecca listed as twins. I found Margaret's gravestone which lists her birth as 30 Dec 1807. I have received other charts that list Rebecca's birthday as 31 Dec 1809. So I believe we need to place a question mark on the "twins".

On your chart you listed Amy as a Bouth which may mislead someone. They think her maiden name was Davis, dau. of William Davis. I found a story in a book that a rich merchant and ship owner of London financed tobacco farming in VA for fifty years and sent his nephew named DAVIS to VA to oversee his interests.

I will enclose M-3 chart which has some of the additions and what I THINK may be corrections added.

The two Brown sons-in-law were brothers, sons of Archibald Brown II. The Brown farm adjoined the Fred & Betsey Mouser farm just east of Riley, KY. The Brown family state Archibald II and his wife are buried on their farm so it may be that Fred & Betsey are also buried there. However I found John (Jack) 1811, his wife, daughter, son, daughter-in-law, grandson and sister (Margaret Brown) all buried on a hilltop about a mile west of Riley on the old Edward's farm. There was a piece of an old stone near John 1811's grave but there was no way to tell if it could have been his father Fred ca 1772.

Fancy & John S. Welch were brother & sister also. The son John I. (son of John 1811) married his first cousin Sallie Brown, dau. of Margaret and Alexander Brown.

I am beginning to wonder if there may be some more ^{double} cousins in the tree. Elizabeth (Peggy) married George W. Moore and the witness to their marriage bond was David D. South. Didn't Betsey have either sisters or aunts who married Moores and Souths?

I will enclose a copy of an 1877 landowners map of Precinct 1 of Marion county. Bradfordsville is just off the map in the lower left corner. You can see J. Mouser & A. Brown, Est. listed just below where it says "No. 1". I believe this is the location of Fred ca 1772's farm. Just below "STA" may be my E.G. Mouser thought it looks like Mousley on this hard to read map.

Follow the railroad west to the Edward's farm. An "X" marks the cemetery. If you ever visit it take a machete. I spent two hours tromping weeds and briars down so I could take a picture and then I had to use the flash at mid-day.

South across the tracks you see a Welch and another J. Mouser. I was told Janie Mouser was the last to live there. On South below the heavy line is R.C. Milburn. To the west is a McCubbins. I have found a Mrs. Nancy A. Donan, daughter of James & Elizabeth McCubbin. Nancy had two children, Sophronia C. Whitlow & Thomas J. Donan. Nancy m. secondly John H. Montgomery. He was born 1823, son of David & Tabitha (Holland) Montgomery. Tabitha was the daughter of Burchy & Mary McCaslin Holland. Mary was scalped by the Indians but survived. Mary's parents were killed at the time. I do not know who Nancy m. with the Donan name or how he might have fit into the tree.

Near the center of the map is J.H.M. & J.H. Mouser. This Mouser traces to a John born 1827 that I do not know the source of. I guess he could be a grandson of Fred & Betsey.

Dear Mrs. Nezin,

I will try to get this letter off so our letters will not cross in the mail again. Guess you thought you got a quick answer to your letter.

I appreciate any help on the Mouser tree. They are certainly a mystery. I was Lucky on my father's side of the family. Many of his ancestors were Dutch, all belonged to the Dutch Reformed Church. You could bet your birth certificate that (1) they would name the first two male and two female grandchildren after their grandparents and (2) that they baptised the babies before they had time to cry.

We just dug up the DAR records and there they were. The Albany records were lost before 1687 but my grandfather Yates was born that year and one of the first listed so we lucked out there.

My Yates married so many Dutch lines that they consider Yates a Dutch family in NY. My fifth great grandparents Johannes & Rebecca Yates were the third great grandparents of Teddy Roosevelt and fourth great grandparents of Eleanor who m. FDR. Later my Yates m. the daughter of John Fonda so Henry and I have the same grandparents.

As you know Glen Campbell has a Mouser ancestor. This took place in Arkansas but a friend from Waynesville, MO whose husband was from the Mouser girl who married a ~~W/~~ Cook, page 112 Mouser book, tells me that they have Campbells buried with the Mousers in the cemetery on their farm and they believe they trace to Glen also.

I have found many families traveled together when emigrating and I have tried to use that to help trace the Mousers. Mary E. Mouser, daughter of my John 1811, married Henry A. Sparrow. I am sure he was related to Nancy Hanks. Her mother m. (2) Henry Sparrow. The Whitehouses who lived at Riley were also kin to the Sparrow/Hanks. I have watched the Lincoln and Boone migration from PA to VA to NE to KY but I have not found a good clue. The Lincolns lived in Rockingham county VA very near a John Mouser born 1733. Some of his family is listed on pages 40 thru 57 of the Mouser book. I have more info on his family and there are a number of discrepancies between my info and the Mouser book.

I should state right here that we need to double check everything Lafrona Mouser sends. I have found many errors not only in her book but also in her letters. I believe she writes many letters and does not have time to look up what she writes and sometimes memory fails.

She wrote me sometime ago that she had info from the VA Mousers who told her that they had some of their family move to NC but Lafrona did not believe they were any kin.

As I note you wrote in your letter and as I wrote to you, I am not too sure that Fred & Betsey are the Fred of KY that is thought to be a son of Fred 1740-1799. If you do check into this you will note that the gravestone of Fred 1740 in the St. Paul's Cemetery states in Roman numerals that he was born 26 Sept 1743 but when you subtract his age from his 23 April 1799 death you get 26 Sept 1740. It is hard to misread 1740 for 1743 in Roman so I guess the stonecutter made a mistake.

Lafrona has told me she thinks Frances Heap is the wife of Fred 1740 but she is listed as the wife of Phillip Frederick Mouser who lived and fought in PA and I believe died about 1815 according to the DAR. Of course the DAR is not infallible. It would be nice if we were sure we trace to Fred 1740 as his siblings and parents and grandfathers are all down in black and white and I have some nice maps of the locations they came from in Germany about 30 miles south of Stuttgart.

I like to find maps of the area and era as soon as I can as I find it helps trace the correct root. Just like in the Mouser book, pages 11 & 16 it states Michael Mouser had 25 acres in Northampton county VA but when I checked the original it says Berks township of Northampton co. I believe the Maxatawny twship of Berks where the sons were said to be the correct location.

Received your letter dated February 6th. I laughed until my sides hurt at your story about John E. Mouser. As soon as I find certain proof that we are all related, you will be the first to know, or would you rather I destroy the evidence?

You should have heard my cousins howl when I told them we were related to Jane Fonda. My cousin Mildred was married to an FBI attorney who thought Jane should have been charged with treason. Whenever I felt like being mean I would ask him if he didn't see a little of Jane in his wife Mildred.

Another new found cousin (through "roots" searching) is big in the DAR, so much so that she and her husband went to France to attend the 200th anniversary of the signing of the Treaty of Versailles. She wrote that her husband not happy about our Fonda kinship. I told her that all those DAR ancestors she was so proud of were considered traitors at the time.

AKA Col "Stoffle"

I have often wondered how a cousin, Christoffle Yates of Schenectady felt at the start of the Revolution. He was a double cousin, his mother being a sister to my grandfather Douw Fonda. Col. Stoffle as he was known, had a large land grant from the Crown, a commission in the British army and two sons-in-law who were officers in the Br. Army. But he does not seem to have hesitated when he joined the Cause.

He was an attorney and acted as the secretary for the Sons of Liberty. Many of his letters have survived. When my grandfather John Fonda (and Stoffle's cousin) was arrested and jailed at Johnstown when he hit the sheriff's deputy with his hoe when the deputy persisted in trespassing on Fonda's land. Fonda's neighbors "sprung" him and then they went after the sheriff. The shots fired are said to have been the first of the war in the Mohawk Valley. Col. S. wrote a letter to Albany asking for a cannon to help get the sheriff out of Sir Johnson's house but the sheriff left for Canada in the middle of the night.

The Yates family in Schenectady, had a warrant for one thousand dollars sent to Col. Stoffle, signed by Benedict Arnold, and countersigned by Jellis Fonda (brother to John). Col. Stoffle was the father of Joseph Yates who was governor of New York 1821.

Well so much for your history lesson. This is one of the things I find most interesting about "roots". I think roots should be a required first grade subject. I know I would have paid more attention to my history lesson if I had known grandpa was there. We all might be a little more tolerant of each other if we knew how many were our cousins, even John E.

I have read that there were about 3000 white persons living in what is now New York State in 1650. I have found over 80 of my grandparents living there at that time. When you stop to count up all the cousins, siblings & in-laws you realize you must have been kin to half the white people and a few Indians too.

I will make some copies of the family of John H. Mouser who m. Esther Ann Catlin. This is the J.H.M. on the 1877 map I sent you. Are you sure this son of Gabriel is the John who married the Catlin?

My grandfather, Thomas Donan Mouser was named (middle name) for his great grandmother. That is one reason I watch for the Green name, just in case it came from a grandmother.

One other source might have been the Revolutionary War General named Green. I believe he served in the Southern area but I need to brush up on my Rev. War history.

I will scan you February 6th letter and give you my thoughts on some of your questions. I guess you have a copy of the clerk's record of the sale 25 July 1799 (five pages) It lists "widow Mouser", /s/ John, George & Elizabeth Mouser as buyers along with a number of purchases by John Smith. I would guess that he was already a son-in-law since he was a co-administrator ~~But the clerk may have slipped up /s/ John.~~

There is an Abraham Myers listed plainly as a Myers. I believe the Jacob Bolack must have been some kin to the John Adams Bolick who married Elizabeth.

Do you have the two family group sheets from Willie's wife of Hickory, NC and his recopy of deed book 32 page 46 30 Aug 1815? I believe this helps tie the other children, Fred or KY, Sallie, John & Katy Smith & Adam & Elizabeth Bolick to the family when they deed land that belonged to "Frederick Mouser, deceased, of Lincoln co NC"

This leaves Henry and Abraham still loose. I guess Lafrona found info that Abraham was with Michael on the move to Missouri. I should mention that Sallie seems to have been rather old when she married Joabert White in 1829. One lady wrote that she thought the Sallie who m. White might have been a grand daughter of Fred 1740, perhaps a daughter of John & Catherine Mouser.

Note that John made his will 26 Sept 1822, proved 6 Oct 1822 in which he lists five sons: Henry, Elias, Jacob, John & David and five daughters not named, his wife Catherine AND AS A CODICIL ADDS HIS MOTHER so she must have been still living.

I will watch for the marriage of your Watch & Mariah Mouser. I do not find my KY book to check but I believe 1825-27 would be about the time Marion county was formed from Washington county. Since the courthouse at Lebanon was burned during the Civil War you may be out of luck.

I guess the Gabriel grand daughter could have married at age 12. I see Lafrona has several listed in Ben's line who married at 14. When you add info to the Gabriel line be sure to remember that there were a whole bunch of Gabriels. Info may become mixed between cousins. There were so many Gabriels that I wonder if we are from the Gabriel who came to Georgia in 1734; page 34, Caye/Coulter's "List of Early Settlers of Georgia" 2nd ed. by the Athens GA U. Press (1967).

NEZIN) for your review, as Mr. Donan tells me you are attempting to contact members of the DONAN/MOUSER family in order to combine information on the Tree.

I also recently purchased "A Genealogy of the MOUSER Ancestry..." by Mrs. Ben Mouser and along with the book she sent me some updated Family Group Sheets for Johann Frederick MAUSER who is allegedly the father of our Frederick MOUSER, as well as the Group Sheet for Johann's father, Hans Michael MAUSER - do you have these?

Wm. Donan sent me a copy of your 3 December 1983 letter to him, and I'm scanning it as I go along. I note paragraph 6, page 2 regarding the deed in Springfield KY wherein Gabriel MOUSER of Pike Co. IND deeded all of his interest in Frederick Mouser's land to John MOUSER. I'm not exactly sure who the John Mouser who acquired all these lands was, but the Gabriel mentioned herein was the grandson of Fred & Betsy. He was the son of Gabriel & Nancy WELCH MOUSER. When Gabriel Mouser, Sr. died ca 1838, he left 9 minor children, and Gabriel was the youngest of them. He moved up to Indiana to live with a married sister and her husband. I have a fairly complete Group Sheet for Gabriel & Nancy MOUSER if you would like to have it.

Anyway, regarding the above and Paragraph 8 of your 2nd page, the Gabriel from Pike Co. IND was born ca 1840 in Marion Co. KY according to the 1850 Marion Co. KY census (he was 10 yrs. old, living with his mother, Nancy, and 3 other siblings), the 1860 Pike Co. IND census (20 yrs. old, living with sister Margaret MOUSER HARRIS and her husband, James HARRIS), and the 1880 Gibson Co. IND. census (age 40, living w. wife Estela and 2 children).

Just a brief note to ask for some clarification on information you sent regarding Newton (Nute) Mouser.

The first clue I received concerning a Mouser in my heritage came from a distant cousin in Joliet, ILL. Her grandmother (Alice Welch KRUKER) was an aunt of my grandmother (Dollie HAPNER BURK). This cousin said her grandmother often spoke of an "Uncle Newt/Nute Mouser."

This perplexes me because I can't figure out how this Newt would have been involved in Alice's life. Alice was born in 1869 in Bloomington, IND., just before her parents (Rosa & Jonathan WELCH; he was the son of John & Mariah Mouser Welch) moved from Bloomington to ILL. Alice was raised in Shelby Co. ILL, moving to Bond County, ILL after her marriage in 1890. Inasmuch as your records show that Newt/Nute died in 1898, I am wondering when and how and where their paths would have crossed.

How are you descended from Frederick & Betsy? I was under the impression that it was through their son, George, but am not sure. Could you send me a copy of your Pedigree Chart? Do you have any additional information on this Newt/Nute? I am sure he was the one Alice was referring to, however, any further information on him might enable me to locate other descendants of Alice (hopefully).

I am enclosing copies of the "updated" Family Group Sheets that I received from Lafrona Mouser last month (as requested in your 30 Jan 1984 letter).

I will answer your letter of March 18th and see if this will draw another letter from you into my mail box. We seem to do very well crossing our letters in the mail.

I was a little worried that something might have happened to you. My brother sold his Portland home and his land in the mountains near Placerville and moved to the east coast last fall. I think he was worried that the west coast was going to go into the ocean. David's moving to Delaware is probably the reason the weather has been so bad in the east this year.

Here is Lake Forest? I don't find it in the atlas index.

Sounds like Michael must have a farm background, with his "runt in every litter" saying.

When I read back on your chart I wondered if you are related to Nathan Allen. Since David G. Allen was born in VT. A friend has a paperback book about the early history of the VT area. I did not know until I read it that VT was not a state during the Revolution. The area was claimed by NY and there was a lot of give and take and horse-trading, in order to obtain status as a state in their own right. They pretended to consider joining England to pressure NY into giving up their claim to the area.

There were several Allens involved in the war and in the political horse-trading. One Allen and his son were sent by VT to the Constitutional convention to present VT's case but had to return home without accomplishing much.

I guess Ron Mouser means that the three books pertain to OUR MOUSERS. I will list some of the books I have found that are supposed to have articles about SOME Mouser family. I have not seen many of these, I just located the listing or index.

From the Newberry Library of Chicago, Ill. You may know of this private library. They have a genealogy collection second only to the LDS collection. There is a giant three or four volume index, (every name index), to their collection up to sometime around WW I, later books are not included. They sent me a brochure which I don't find at the moment telling how many million books they had. They are building new quarters this summer and suggest calling before going there. "Moise Family of South Carolina; Life & Descendants of Abraham & Sarah Moise of Charleston SC 1791. This 304 page book was printed in 1961. I would like to look at this book because of the Abraham Moser buried near J. Frederick Moser in the cemetery near Newton, NC. I learned sometime ago not to pay much attention to how the name Moser was spelled.

I have wondered where they got the name "Hute" "Newt" and if it could have had a connection with the town of Newton, NC.

I found another Moser book in the St Louis Public Library, I do not find my notes on it but I believe it was a "Moser Moser who came to USA ca 1860". It was printed in north-east Iowa, I think it was Duquesne, Iowa.

There should be mention of Mosers in "The Historical Record of the Schaul/Schall Family" by June Lutz. This could be the Ohio Mosers who came from 1733 John of Schaffhausen county, Pa and is connected with the Fudasill-Schaul Family association.

I note that Goodspeeds has listed, "Meyer & Sturbaum" by E.M. Firestone, 33 pages, (1946). I wonder if this has any connection with "Strobridge General" in the Newberry List.

I have a copy of "Menoir & Genealogy of the Maryland & Pennsylvania Family of Mayer" by Brantz Mayer. It is a 1905 reprint of the 1878 book and covers 1495 thru 1878. The Mayers were from Ulm, Wurtemberg, came over 1752 and 1784. They settled at Annapolis, Maryland. Christian Mayer lived at Baltimore.

Georg Ludwig Mayer settled in Lancaster, Pa where many of his descendants lived. I don't see any connection with our tribe.

When I wrote to you that Betsey's ^{mother} father was William Davis that was wrong. William was her grandfather, Henry was her father. I wonder if we will be able to add Jefferson Davis to our tree of famous relatives?

Note the Crews mixed with the Davis family in ... 17 of the Roman book. From the biographical sketch of ... lines: "This land is part of 'Cloyd Patent', settled in 1781 ... grandfather in company with the Taylors, Mayers, Crews ... of Va and the Thorps (Sharps) of Pa." This was the old ... of Gravel Switch and east of Bradfordville. The map I sent still shows Crews, Thorps & Rawlins/Rawlins living there eighty years later and they still live on some of the original land today.

The Rawlings who painted the eleven oil paintings I purchased when we visited KY is descended from Alson and he told me his grandfather and my grandfather Sharp were the only two Alsons he knew who spelled their given name thus. His cousin is married to a Moser and lives in Louisville.

I have snapshot 1920 era of Etta Moser Moore, ^{Sincerely,} perhaps age sixty, her husband & daughter, I think from Ohio or Louisville.

She is not (repeat, NOT!!) a Mouser like my John Mouser and his evidently-just-as-rotten-younger-brother, who not only didn't answer my two (count 'em, 2) letters, but didn't even return my SASE's!!! I am really surprised - he was so nice on the phone and seemed to be so interested in genealogy; I guess you don't have to be the runt of the litter to be a jerk, after all! However, everything I've heard about their father, Neil, indicates that he was a real prince. 6 January 1985

I received a letter from Mr. William Page Donan with the name of Mrs. William C. Limacher, 1322 Douglas St, Joliet, Illinois 60435. She is from Frederick and Betsey Mouser. I wrote to her last fall but have not heard back. She was going to make a trip to Europe and may not have had time to answer.

I have been watching for info on the Mousers this summer but little new has turned up. I did notice the DAR has a listing for David Cox (Cocke). I wonder if he is from the family line that produced the namesake for David Cox Donnan.

I have spent much time reseaching my mother's maternal line of Anderson and Hunts. We have made two trips to Peoria county Illinois this summer and have learned a lot about the Hunts but nothing new on the Andersons.

I am now digging Hunts & Bradwells in Bourbon county KY and believe they may have come from Stafford county VA (the Bradwells) and the Hunts from Rowan county NC. I found a little 16 page booklet, To Oregon by Ox-team, In 1847, in the Columbia, MO Historical Library. It tells about the trip of some Wayne county Hunts to Oregon. They used the same names as my Hunts, say they came from Rowan co NC in 1800, the year my Levi Hunt settled in Clermont co Ohio, and say one of their kin settled in Ohio at the same time they settled in Wayne county Indiana.

The Wayne co family made their own wagons and buffalo guns, went to Cincinnati where they boarded a boat for St. Louis, changed boats at St. Louis and took one headed for St. Joseph, Mo. The boiler blew up near Lexington so they unloaded their wagons, purchased oxen, drove to Blue Springs & Independence where they bought powder, lead and cornmeal, joined a train and headed west. A son Thomas Hunt traded his gun for a real nice Indian pony. Two nights later the Indian came back and stole the horse back. They settled near Salem, Oregon.

This booklet mentions that George W. Hunt collected a genealogy on the Hunts. I am looking for this booklet which must have been written about 1880 to 1910.

I had wondered what you learned from Ren Mouser after he returned home and sent info from the three Mouser books. I would like to have his address in NJ and the names & dates of the other Mouser books so I can watch for them.

My brother built a log cabin near Rising Sun, Maryland this summer. I would like to get back to see him and spend some time in NJ taking pictures of some new sites where my father's ancestors lived. I have learned of at least two more houses built by my grandfathers Covenhoven and Hendrickson in Monmouth county between 1696 and 1730 that have been preserved.

I located and purchased a copy of Pre-revolutionary Dutch houses in NJ & NY, put out by the Holland Society in 1936. Cost me an arm and a leg but I wanted it as it not only pictures many Dutch houses but gives a pedigree back to the emigrant ancestor. Also found a reprint of Beelman's Early Dutch Settlers of Monmouth co NJ. It has both of my lines listed and some 1900 pictures of some of the homes.

I received a letter last fall from Mrs. Ben Mouser. She says she plans a second book on the Mouser, perhaps a paperback.

I have been trading Mouser data with Arthur M. Mouser, 5314 Piping Rock, Houston TX 77056. Art is 79 years old and descends from the George Mouser who was the eldest child of Fred & Betsey (Donan) Mouser.

Art visited both KY and Owen county Indiana this year and sent some pictures of cemeteries, which I have xeroxed for you. Art wants to have the stone of our mutual ancestor Betsey Mouser repaired. If you wish to be a part of this project you should write directly to Art.

RE: your 1983 Mouser charts: Art says his Bible lists George Mouser's birth as 28 December 1797. Not Jan. as Lafrona Mouser listed in her book.

My wife and I visited Perks county PA in 1990 and dug into their records a little. I guess you know our GF Jacob Frederick Mauser 1740--1799 married Maria/Mary Hauck.

There are at least two copies of the Reading PA Lutheran Church records and there is a little difference in the two. I did not get to check the original book.

This record is from: "Records of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church, Reading, Perks, PA, 1751 - 1812" Xerox copy of church records, CR T832M vol. 1.

Commenced 1754, another hand up to 1813. Copied 27 Jan 1913 by J.W. Farly.

"Marriages performed by me, Daniel Schmacher, the Evangelical Lutheran Pastor here: starts 29 April 1754" (as all are published three times, it will not be noted hereafter, unless there is something special.)

1764: Joined in matrimony by me, the Evangelical Lutheran Pastor, Joh. Andrew Krug: 25 December. Frederic, son of Michael Mauser of Greenwich twp. and Mary, daughter of Peter Hauck and step-daughter of Thomas Winckler of Maiden Creek twp.

This record book seems to only have a partial list of marriages as my notes indicate Pastor Krug married 9 couples in 1754; 5 in 1755; 1 in 1758; 5 in 1764 and 20 in 1765. I believe Rev. Krug traveled to satellite churches outside Reading and that our grandparents were married in Maiden Creek or Greenwich which are both north and north and a little east of Reading. If the records tell which church Krug was at, I did not pick it up.

I feel certain this is our correct marriage as when you look at the land deed in NC for Fred Mauser's land on Clarks Creek you find "a" Henry Winckler was an adjoining land owner. When you get to central KY where George Mouser (born 1797) settled we find Mosers and Donans buried in the Houk cemetery. I suspect the Houk/Houk and Mouser relatives moved together. This also helps tie our KY Fred Mouser to the NC Jacob Fred 1740-1799.

I found records to indicate a John Hauck was baptised 10 Nov 1751 with Peter Hauck either the father or sponsor at New Jerusalem (Dunkel's) Reformed Church of Greenwich twp. Also a Nicholas Hauk was born 16 Nov 1759 with Peter & Maria Hauk as sponsor/parent at the Zion (Moselem) Lutheran Church in Richmond twp.

Also at the New Jew. church (above) was a Hauk (son) baptised 24 Feb 1760 with Peter Hauk listed as parent/sponsor.

I believe the Mormons have the Lutheran marriages filmed 7 June 1971 L G 7018905 - 58 serial sheet. The first long number must be the batch number.

In the Berks tax lists we found:

Michael Moser (married) in Tulpehocken twp. 1754, 1760, 1764, 1765

In 1762 the name is written as Michael Moser but is probably the same person.
I don't think this is our kin.

In Berks tax lists we found:

Michael Maurer in Maxatawny twp in 1763, 1766, 1768

Jacob Maurer in " " (single) 1763, 1764

" " " (married) 1765, 1766, 1768 *Seems to "fit" with the 25 Dec 1764 marriage*

(in the last year 1768 the name seems to be spelled Maurer. I think there is a good chance this is our Jacob Fred Mauser who married in 1764.)

Peter Haucke (married) in the dist. adjoining Maxatawny in 1754 Perhaps our grandfather.

"Berks County PA Births, vol. II 1760 - 1770" #18-45

Michael Mauss born 11 May 1765 baptised 21 July 1765 at Zion (Windsor Castle) Lutheran Church in Perry twp. Parents/sponsor: Friedrich & Maria Mauss.

"Zion Lutheran Church, Windsor Castle 1747 - 1842" page 4: has this same entry except it only named Fridrich Mauss (no Maria) and lists the sponsors as Stephen Harsch and wife.

I think this Michael is the eldest child of our Jacob Fred & Mary/Maria Mauser.

The index to Berks County Tax Records 1754 - 1768 by Hollenbach on page 202: Frederick Mauser (married) on pages 198 - 223, Greenwich twp. 1766.

I don't know if this is Jacob Fred listed twice, since Jacob is also listed in 1766 but it does weaken my idea that Jacob is the same as Fred.

I will enclose: Art Mouser's 14 April 1991 letter; map of Owen county Indiana that shows Hudson Hill cemetery where Betsey Donan Mouser and her dau. Rebecca Givin/Gwin is buried and five pages of xeroxed pictures. Please note many of these pages have both Indiana and KY pictures on the same sheet.

Finding the Houck/Houk cemetery near Three Springs KY with some of our relatives buried in it helps me to believe our Fred Mouser of KY is the son of Old Jacob Frederick Mauser 1740-1799 of Newton Catawba county NC.

Art Mouser also talked to some of the Donans living in KY and I believe he learned a little about the Slinker relative and perhaps knows more about Nute Mouser. I believe Slinker and Nute are descendants of Art's George Mouser 1797.

Since my John/Jack Mouser 1811 is buried in the Edward's Cemetery near Riley in Marion KY; I wonder if the Slinker/Edwards were kin to the Marion county Edwards?

I have had some info from Libby (Mrs. W. D.) Britton, R 1 Box 134, Montezuma Ind 47862 who descends from Rebecca Mouser Gwin/Givin. She has been in touch with Phillie Limacher. I think both of their husbands are doctors. Britton is retired and has been rather ill.

Guess this is all I know. You might let me know if you receive this. I don't have a lot of faith in the U.S. Mail. Sincerely, Ned Brenner

Dear Karen,

Several years ago; Mrs. Ben (Lafrona) Mouser of Spade TX sent me a copy of your letter to her, along with other Mouser papers. I had purchased Lafrona's Mouser book and we traded Mouser data. Mrs. Mouser has moved to her daughter's: Charles/Bargara Nathman, 801 Shady Lane, Keller TX 76248.

I have intended to write to you but never got around to it. Mr. Art M. Mouser, 5314 Pining Rock Lane, Houston TX 77056 has a dau.-in-law who was born in Germany. During a visit to her mother a couple years ago, she drove down to Oschingen and met some of our Mouser cousins.

Art visited there last year and plans to return next month for a longer visit. He has brought back a number of pictures, a small book on the old houses in Oschingen, a recipe for a meatless dumpling they served him during Lent and some addition generations of our family tree.

I will enclose a few charts/lines from Art's printouts.

The first is my line from our first known ancestor Michael (40) and his wife Jene Wittwe Chatarina (41). My mother Mercedes May Mouser (311) was born 04 Sept 1899 and married Henry Edward Brenner.

Second: I combined Art's and Marie (Mauser) Rempfer's lines and have yellow hilited our common ancestors. Some of the father-in-laws are included in the line.

Marie is the fifth Mauser to live in the early 1700's Mauser house on the Western edge of Oschingen. I don't have complete data on Marie's family although Art did send a picture of her family reunion. I understand Marie, her sister and one brother survived to adulthood, the brother died in WW II.

Third: chart of Michael Mauser III (37). I hilited our direct line. Art's computer program assigns random numbers. Too bad it does not use the father's number is twice the son's number system so we could follow the numbers.

Fourth: Chart of Casper Mauser (23). I think somewhere we found something that indicated Casper also came to America. Art said he hoped to get more data on Casper's sibs.

If I have room will enclose chart of my family. When we visited Berks PA Historical Soc. we found the m. record of Mary/Marie Houk to Frederick Mauser of 25 December 17__ listed that she was the step-daughter of Thomas Winckler of Maiden Creek township Berks County PA. The 1767 Tax list has:

Maiden Creek: Jacob Maurer 150 acres 4 horses 6 cows 8 sheep

Thos. Winckler 50 acres 2 horses 2 cows 3 sheep and 3 taxed

Penn twp: Michael Moser 100 acres 2 horses, 2 cows 3 sheep and 5 taxed (adult males???)

Conrad Winckler 0 acres 0 animals

Hans Bucks 150 acres 2 horses 2 cows 1 sheep (the Bucks family married with the Mausers in Oschingen Germany.)

We think the Jacob Maurer listed is our Jacob Frederick Mauser and Tom Winckler is his father-in-law. In NC we find a Winckler had land adjoining Fred Mauser

Both Art Mouser and I descend from Fred Mouser who married Betsey Donan. Art is from the eldest son George who moved to Green county KY. We find some Mousers, perhaps George also, buried in the Houk cemetery. As often happens we believe relatives and in-laws moved, together.

The Berks PA Birth vol. II 1760--1770 lists:
Baptised at Zion Lutheran church, Windsor Castle twp Berks PA (another list says Perry Twp.) Michael Mauss born 11 May 1765 bapt. 21 July 1765;
parents Friedrich and Maria Mauss.

The Zion Church book 1747--1842 gives the above info and lists sponsors of Stephen Harach and wife. I think this Michael Mauss is the eldest son of our Fred & Maria Mauser; the one who moved to South-East MO about 1804.

The index to Berks Co. Tax Records 1754--1768 on page 202 lists:
Frederick Mauser married pages 198--223 Greenwich Twp 1766.

We found Berks records hard to understand. Many were transcribed years ago by people with poor eyesight and sometimes they only recorded part of the information. One needs to check original which takes time.

Art's dau.-I-I obtained a little book of old pictures of houses in Oschingen with a short history. Collected MCMLXXXVIII by Hans Martin Schneider (his family married with Mausers so many of the pictures are of kin.). Some quick notes:

"grave sites found on West side (outskirts) of villiage date from 7th century. Called "Eschingen" 1110 in Cloister "Hirsau" records. 1275 parish documents call "Eschingen". In 1248 Albrecht von Stoffeln calls Oschingen "his village". sold to Count Fritz von Zollern 1381. In 1415 he sold it to Wurttemberg.

In 1477 had 26 households and 6 singles. In 1559 was first village in Wurttemberg to have German School. Plague raged in 1566. Entire village burned in 30 Years War. Castle of von First near Firstberg Mountain mentioned 1092; thought demolished 1756. Napoleon overran. Russians in 1813/14. Bad crops from hail caused 20% of 900 residents to emigrate between 1846--1896. In 1971 joined with Mossingen and now a bedroom community." Art has a airplane view of the valley, shows many new houses not in the 1900 view.

" from under picture #4: The first house at entrance to village on Mossingen side was Mauser house built 1780. Paul Rempfer cabinet maker married into house 1746. Marie (Mauser belonged to fifth generation. The picture shows her (as a young girl) standing next to her grandmother.. Her father Martin Mauser was an hourkeeper. The GM Katharine (Schneider) m. Johannes Mauser in 1886. She did not want to live in house as she feared the French army would plunder it first since it was located on main road. 12 April 1945 it became reality."

We have learned our Fred & Betsey Mouser lived near Riley Station KY in Marion county KY (was Washington co) Gravel Switch is the closest name on the atlas. Family tradition that Betsey split from her husband, not found with him in some census, and we found her grave in rural cemetery near Carp in Owen county Ind. Several of us had her stone repaired. Her daughter is also bu. there.

When we visited Marion county KY we found my GG OF John Mouser, wife Nancy & dau. Mary Sparrow. Mary died about 1889, was married to Henry Sparrow. Henry was either the son (or grandson) of Henry & Lucy (Hanks) Sparrow. Lucy being the mother of Abe Lincoln's mother Nancy Hanks. Lucy m.(2) Henry Sparrow and they had about eight children. All for now! Would be glad to receive your up todate charts on your Mouser line.

Notes on the MAUS family of Philadelphia and Montour county PA.

From "Notes & Queries, History, Biographical & Genealogy Penn." by W. H. Egle (1897)
(In the U. of MO Library, G.H.P. Room, three east)

Page 132:

Philip Frederick Maus was born in Prussia about 1731. He came to Philadelphia with his parents and three brothers Frederick, Charles and Matthew about 1741. His parents lived in Philadelphia. His brother Matthew was later a doctor.

Philip Frederick Mauser married Frances Heap. She was from England. They later obtained land on Mahanoy Creek in what is now Montour county PA. (I believe it was Northumberland County first). His land was near the land of General William Montgomery, his brother Dan Montgomery and four others. April 3, 1769.

My notes are not clear but I believe they had to flee the Indians, came back to Northumberland county where they lived for one year, moved to Lebanon for one year, returned to Northumberland county for three or four years and then returned to their land in Montour county. I believe they moved there in 1782 to Valley twp. I wrote in my notes "1800 stone mill" but I am not sure what it means.

Philip Frederick Mauser died 27 April 1815 age 84 years.

The son Joseph 1777 married 1808 in Philadelphia, Sallie Montgomery, dau. of John. Sallie died 20 May 1872.

Joseph 1777's son was Phillip F. Mauser born 27 September 1810, married May 1838, Sarah Gallagher, near Pine Creek Lycoming county PA. They had six children but five died young. The sixth was Phillip E. born 22 May 1852, married 1878 Mary R. Leinbach Northumberland county PA.

Joseph 1777 had another son, John M. born 1812.

I do not think there is much chance that Frances Heap had married into the Family of Michael Mauser. There are other records about a Frederick Mauser/Moser who lived in Philadelphia, shows on several years of tax and voter lists. I believe he probably belongs to the same family as Philip Frederick. I believe this article indicated that the parents of Philip F. always lived in Philadelphia.

Fred Maus is in vol 24 p. 598 and vol 25 p. 230-237 PA Archives 3rd Series: I believe he lived in North Liberties in the western part of Philadelphia county in 1779. I feel he is from a different family than Michael Mauser.

I have read that the addition of "er" to a German surname means "son" or "the younger person in the family." We found some of

our MAUSERS listed under MAUS.


I will be writing to Mr. Art Mouser and asking to be included in the repair or restoration of the Betsey Donan Mouser stone. Thank you for passing along this information.

I believe I have found some Mouser m. in the New Hanover church which is a township in upper Montgomery county PA just across the line from Berks county.

Lafrona did send me a sheet which seemed to list Michael Mouser as one who furnished a horse for the Rev. War and this list was from Hiedleberg township. Every county in PA seems to have several Hiedleberg townships. So far I have not found a good detailed PA map of the time.

In answer to your letter of Jan 25th. I have the sheet for Fred 1740 the one listed as Johannes Frederick and for his father Hans Michael. However if you have room in a letter sometime you might send me a copy as mine are some two years old and if yours are later Lafrona may have added new info to them.

I guess Mr Wm. Donan sent you a copy of Mrs. Goss's six generation chart, and the letter list where she only has six children listed for Gabriel Mr. This list lacks dates so if you have Gabriels listed I could use a copy.

I will be interested to hear of what you find in the LDS files. I have glanced thru a Mouser Genealogy printed in eastern Iowa but it is for a later emigrant. They came from an area less than forty miles from Charlottenhof and might be related in Germany.

I also have a genealogy of a family who came to Baltimore and some moved up to Lancaster PA but I am sure they are not kin to us. They spelled their name a little differently. I believe it was Moser. My book is put away as we have been rebuilding out house.

I am pretty sure the John who purchased the estate of Fred & Betsey as indicated on the deed from Gabriel of Pike county Ind was John 1811. It would be nice if they had sections and rangelines on some early deeds but I fear the old oak tree with the slash mark may be so close it is very hard to locate a plot. I need to try to trace the Mouser leg on the south side of the railroad near the Welch farm.

Since you are in the legal profession, what do you think of the deed in MO where David Cox Donnan tried to deed the 240 acres to his children? And what about his disbarment in MO?

You mentioned difficulty finding the extra hands to dig roots. I have trouble getting answers from Mousers. I had thought about a new style letter, "send me your tree for you may have inherited a lot of money" but I found that did not work. A second cousin of my fathers died in NE and they paid her setate to six cousins in Illinois and missed a lot of her kin. Her will said to her "heirs at law according to the E law" but did not name anyone. They hired a firm for almost \$4000 to find the heirs but they did a poor job. A professional genealogists noticed a story in the NE paper and he checked and found more heirs including some in Germany. They sent a letter around wanting 45% to tell where and try to obtain out part. This was after the estate had been settled. Very few of the cousins bothered to sign up. The estate was almost two million so I would say I lost out on enough to buy a new typewriter, preferable one that could spell. I guess I am going to have to get a computer to keep track of all the twigs.

I guess Wm. Donan did not send copies of the charts 1-1 & 1-2 to you. I will not send any now until I retype them. I have added too much info by hand. I will enclose Jan 15-A, Jan 20-B & Jan 29-C. Sheet A gives info on George, son of Fred & Betsey. Sheet B gives the same with info added from pages 80/81 Mouser book. I AM GUESSING AT SOME OF IT. Sheet C carries some of the lines on out. A note from Wm. Donan noted that Mouser, father of Rev. Calvin W. Mouser married Vic Atwell Mouser, the widow of his uncle Newton (Nute) Mouser. When I find out I am my own grandpa I am going to quit digging roots. Ha!

He was not home when Art's daughter-in-law visited. She called him later and he may send more info. The following is the translation of the introduction to the 1988 book, "Oschingen in alten Ansichten" by Hans Martin Schneider.

Introduction: The village "Oschingen" with it's name ending of "ingen" is one of the oldest settlements in Germany. This is confirmed by the findings of grave sites on the western outskirts of the village, dating to the 7th century.

The village is mentioned as "Eskingen" for the first time in the year 1110 according to documents from the cloister "Hirsau".

Documents from the parish appear for the first time in 1275 that name the village as "Eschingen".

The first secure Messers (Mr., perhaps i.e. Master) of the grounds are the Stoffeln, Albrecht von Stoffeln in 1348 calls Oschingen, his own village.

Burkard von Stoffeln sold the village in 1381 to Count Fritz, the oldest von Zollern. Von Zollern sold Oschingen to Württemberg in 1415. (1415).

For the first time in 1477 do we find out anything about the size of the village. One counted 24 households and 6 singles dwellings. Oschingen in 1559 was one of the first villages in Württemberg to have a German school. The plague raged in Oschingen in 1566. During the 30 year war the entire village was burned to the ground. Besides the church only 3 other buildings were left standing. The war destroyed 78 buildings. 54 less men were counted after the war. The castle belonging to the Messers (Mr.) von First, which was located near Firstberg (mountain) was mentioned in a document for the first time in 1092. The castle was thought to be demolished by the former Elder Wagner and 11 townsmen in 1756. The silver rafter ?? (after ??) from the coat of arms belonging to the gentlemen von First were taken over by the municipality from Oschingen and Nehren. Mainly during Napoleon times did Oschingen suffer from troop passages and requisition of quarters. Russians had also taken up Quarters in 1813/14. The Martinschurch replaced a small dilapidated cemetery church also in 1814. The cemetery was also moved at the same time to it's present location. A bad harvest in 1816 was followed by a horrible famine and inflation.

The years between 1828 and 1896 brought many hailstorms. The worst occurred in 1882/84/89. On the 18 July 1880 due to lightning, 4 family homes and 9 barns on the Obergasse (Street) were burned to the ground. Due to the heavy hailstorms between 1846 and 1896 about 185 persons migrated, mainly to America. That was about 20% of the 900 residents. Despite the unpleasant circumstance, things became better in the second half of the last Century and improved living condition. To break away from only agriculture, tools and hardware were introduced to the population and crafts were taught to promote trade.

1870 Oschingen became a market spot. The cattle market in "The Tanzgraben" (dancing grove) began to be filled with 300-500 heads of cattle. A new school house was built and finished in 1881. Added was a fire station in 1886 and an Savings and loan building in 1891. The most significant upswing for the village came in the year 1911 when the industrial company named Scholler moved to town. The same year also saw the building of a water supply pipe. More progress came with the connection of electricity in 1921.

An economics crisis came after World War I, which was long lasting. Inflation and high unemployment in 1923 contributed to further emigration. An upward development came about after World War II. The growing number of residents made it necessary to build. The local industrie was able to strongly develop and created new jobs. Which resulted in pushing agriculture in to the background.

The sudden growth made it necessary to build public establishments. 1961 saw the opening of a new kindergarden. In 1967 followed a school with a gymnastic and festival hall. And in 1971 saw the building of a mortuary. On the 1 December '71 the community Oschingen lost it's independence. Against the vote from the majority of the population the village was annexed to the village of Mossingen. It followed a frenzie of building and widening of the village. Strong changes were visible in the village in 1986 with the broadning of the village thoroughfare.

Further radical changes are to be expected for the newly planned town center. Since the village is threatened to lose more of its identity so it is important to capture the old picture material which shows the change over the years of the community. The on hand picture story shall serve the older residents with memories and the younger and newly arrived residents shall have a picture of the old Oschingen from which the older generation speaks. But mostly it is meant for reflection of past history.

Book picture #2: Environment conscious street building was practiced in Oschingen at least 60 years ago. Our picture proves it, less countryside wear, no asphalt, instead many shade giving trees. This picture was taken in 1926 between the Talheimer StraÙe and Mossinger Bruck. At this time the entire streetcorner from Mossingen to the Gonninger border was repaired. Most was manual labor. At that time the only technical helper available was a steamroller and their shovels on which they are leaning. From left we recognize: Friedrich Schneider (Banholtz-Beck), Georg Billig, two out of town roadworker, Karl Bihler (line master since 1927) civil servant Johannes Mauser, Karl Haußler and Gustav Scheurer.

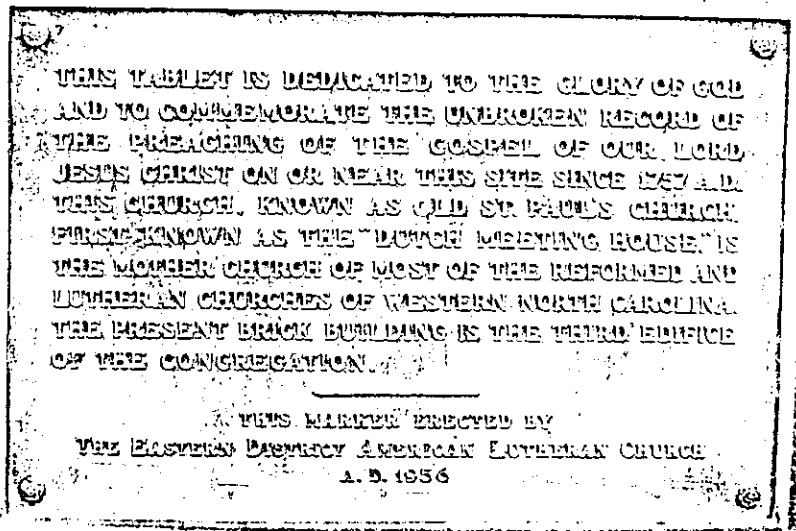
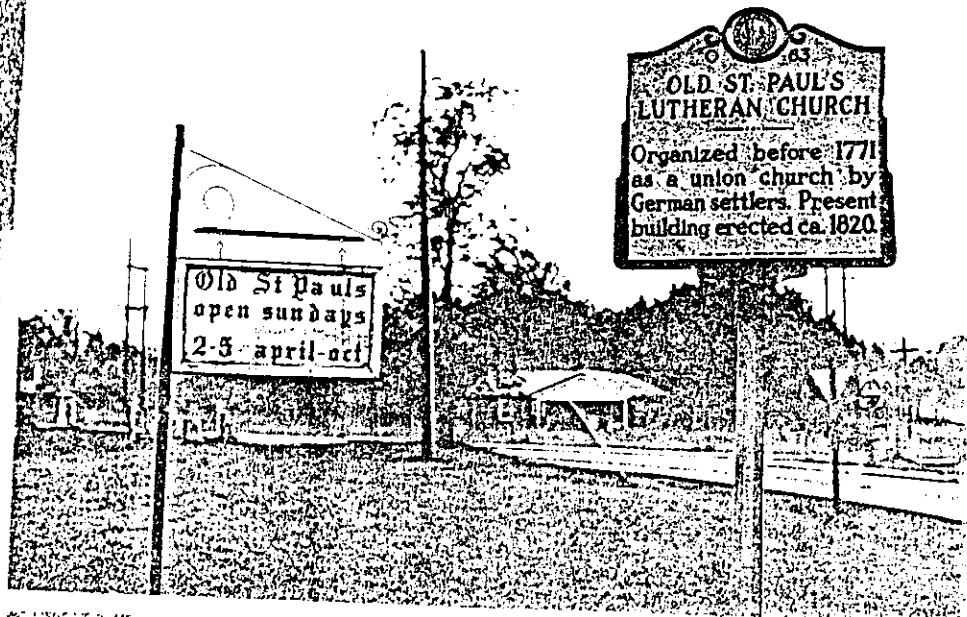
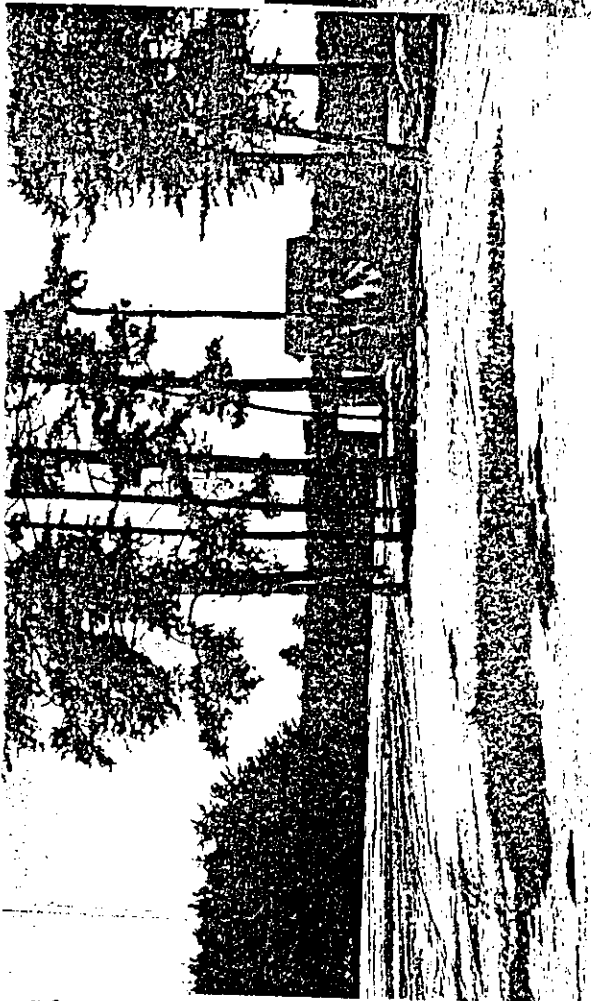
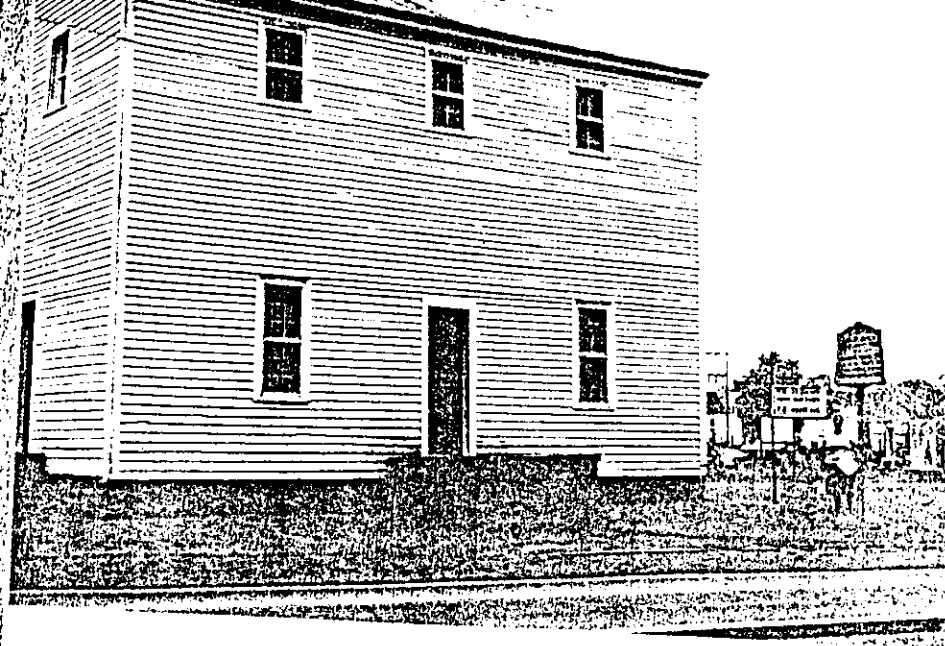
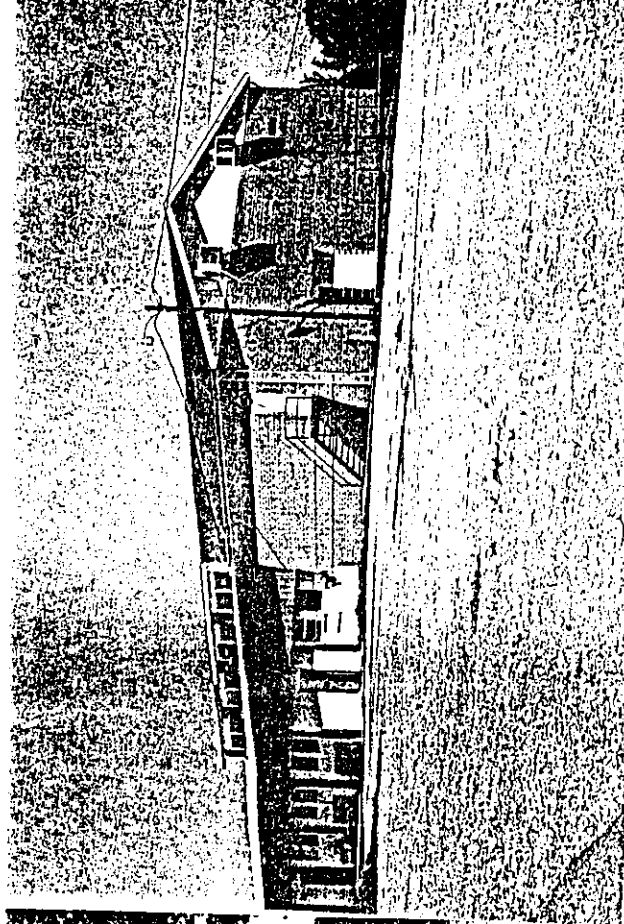
Book picture #4: The first house at the entrance of the village (of Oschingen) on the Mossingen (side) was the Mauser-house build in 1780. Paul Rempfer (cabinet maker) married in to the house in 1946. In 1964 he enlarged the living area. His wife Marie, former Mauser, belonged to the at least fifth generation who resided in this house. Our picture shows her standing left next to her grandmother. Her father Martin Mauser was known as an hourkeeper. The pictured grandmother Katharina born Schneider, was reluctant after her marriage in 1886 to Johannes Mauser, to move in to the house. She feared that the French would come to the village and plunder the house since it was the first at the entrance of town. Her fears became reality on April 20, 1945.

Book picture #36: One of the oldest families in Oschingen was the Buck family. Already in 1522 is the family name evident. Our picture in 1871 shows the 13 member family of Johannes Buck (1824-1894). He probably did not always have it easy to feed his large brood. He at one time had said he never turned his back to look out of the window when sitting at the dinnertable in fear that his ~~back~~ glass would be empty, when he turned back around. Backrow standing from left: Johannes (Lammwirt), Martin (Tanzgraben), Ursula Brabara married Schneider (ancestor of the author), and Wilhelm (Gonningen). Front: Katharina married Mauser, Jakob (Bronnweiler), August (Muller in Gonningen), Gottlieb (Obergasse), Mother Maria Katharina born Eißler, Father Johannes (Buck), Gottlieb (Bronnweiler), Matthias and Christoph.

Book picture #46: "In the Brook" it was called early on, the Reutlinger Street from the Oschenbach Bridge toward the village's exit. Corresponding and appropriate the grounds across the Oschenbach was named as "Bachosch". Our picture shows the street across from the butchers shop Buck. In the foreground we recognize what used to be the "Waag" Haus. Beyond stood a giant poplar tree. The barn used to belong to the restaurant "Fur-Rose". The little property in the background was jokingly called "The Little Castle". It was torn down in 1971. At one time Jacob Mauser and his family lived there. The last one was his daughter Marie, married Hummel. The oldest residents remember Anna-Barbele, a born Kuppler, who from 1891-1913 had a small shop in the Castle.

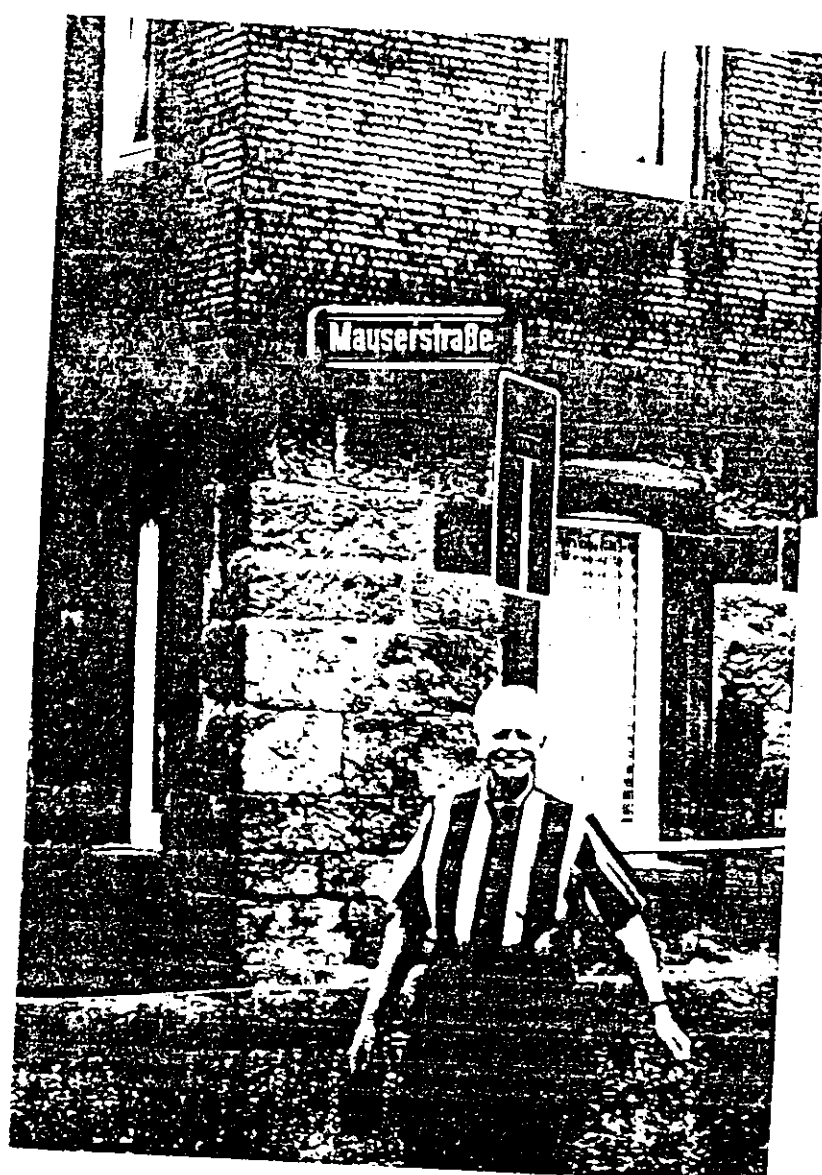
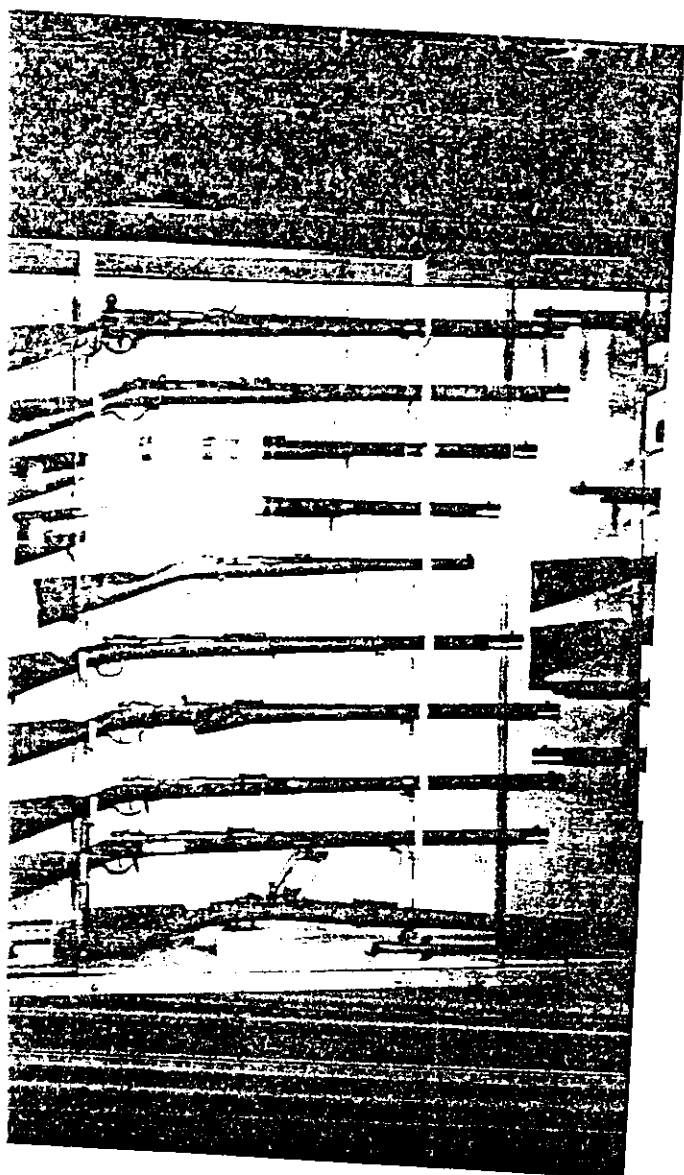
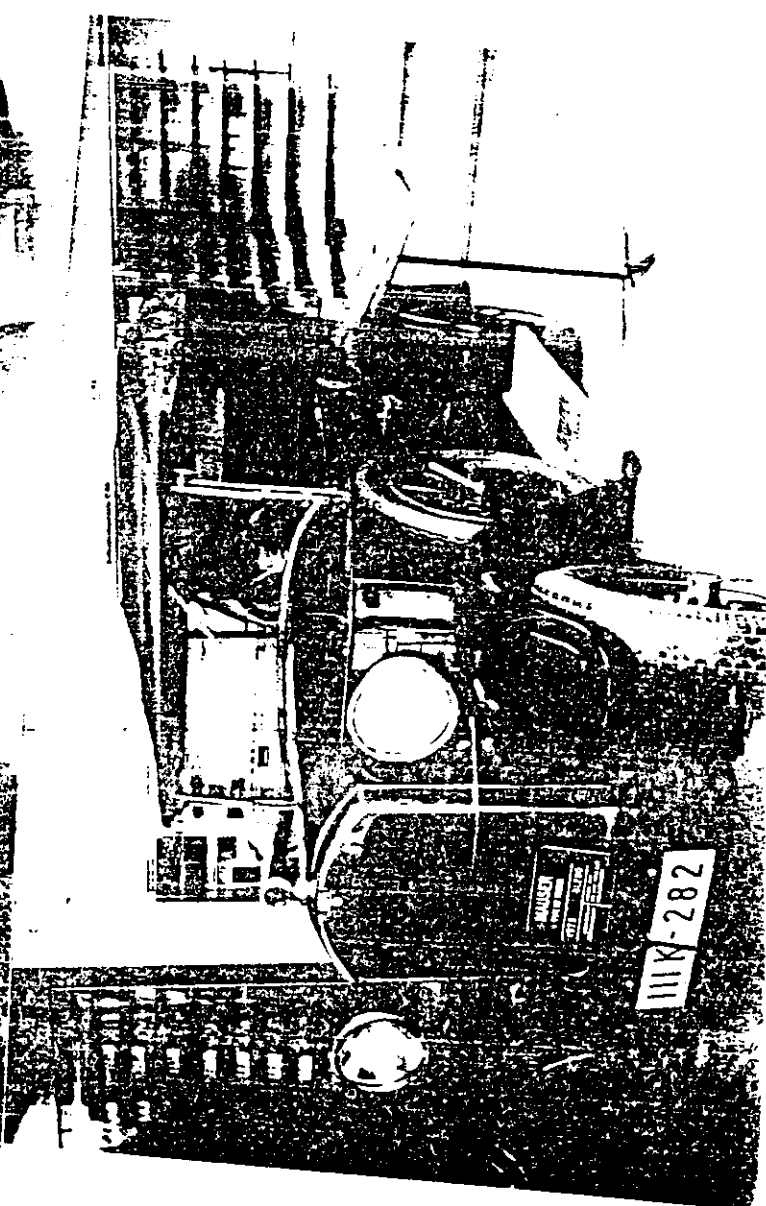
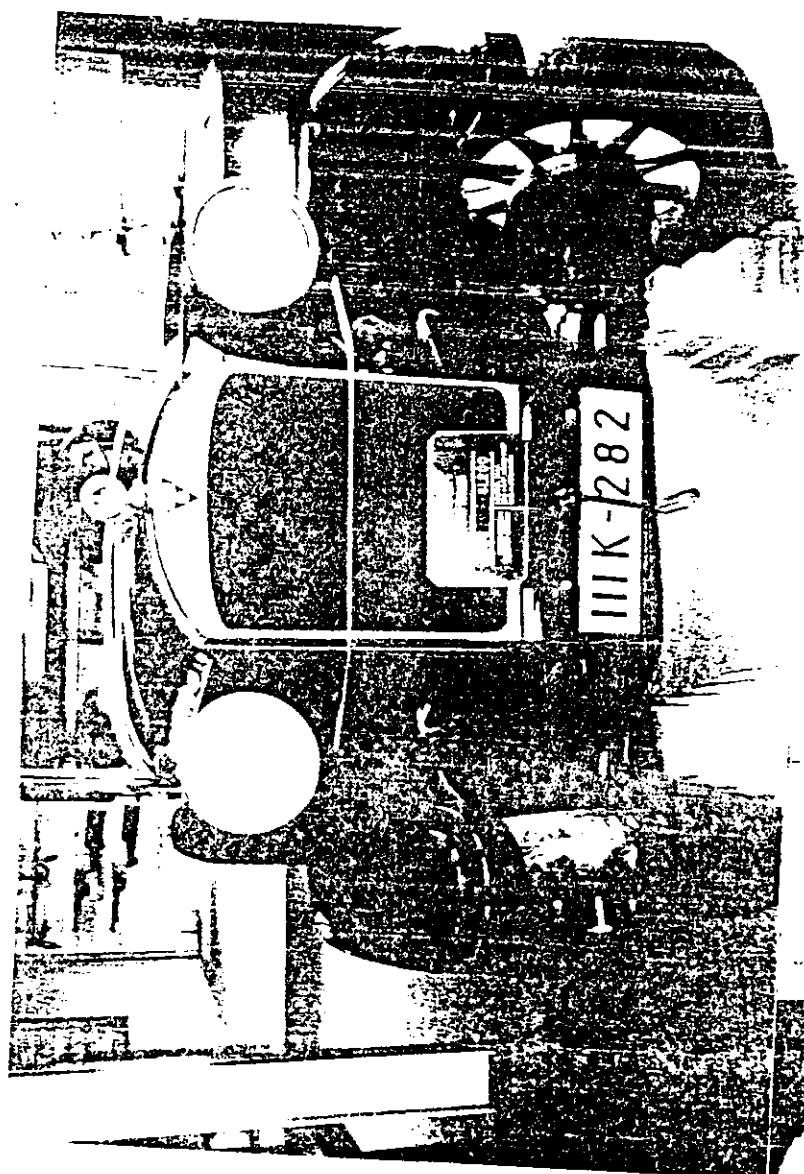

Notes from Art Mauser's daughter-in-law, who lives in CA but was visiting her family in Germany (she was born & raised in Germany) and made a trip down to Oschingen Germany.

"Took off 7:30 for Heidelberg towards Stuttgart -- Tübingen -- Oschingen. A lovely charming village settled in a lush green rolling hills. We entered the little town from the East end -- never knowing how close we were to the source.

→ Our first stop was the cemetery, looking for some Mauser tombstones. I was surprised to find it close to the only church in town (Protestant) surrounded by a 30" high old stone wall. (that was the only thing left from the Past.) All grave sites were relatively new, with impressive beautiful modern tombstones. The graves were planted with lovely flowering plant. * See pictures. Found (5 or 6) gravesites. I met an old woman with a sprinkling can in hand & I stopped to ask her for the old part of the cemetery -- I told her what we were looking for. She took a little time -- sat down under an old willow tree and started talking.

She told us of a couple of Mausers that she personally knew -- but these ladies were married but their maiden name was Mauser.

A younger woman stopped. We also asked her a couple of questions. She offered to drive us to the so called "Mauser House".

I knocked on the door -- told the woman who answered, who I was & what I was looking for. To my surprise I found a delightfully friendly, older woman and her husband who were equally interested in knowing our (your) story as I was in knowing hers. For one hour we shared information, she brought out a 200 year old family Bible and a so-called housebook. (the 1988 book) As you can see the part pages of the Bible are falling apart but the most important thing was still legible & in fact. I asked if we could copy that three _____ pages & they agreed. My brother Peter & sister-in-law Doris went to the only place in town (an attorney's office). My mother later translated!

As they turned the Bible, a picture fell out * which showed the two Mauser women as little girls, with the Mom & Dad, in the field. The attorney saw the picture & said he remembered an interesting article about the Mauser House. As Doris came back she questioned the lady & she presented a little book * which showed all the beautiful old homes in the village & the stories of the people who lived in them.

Needless to say I asked where I could buy one. They gave me the name of the man who created that book -- and we instantly drove to his house -- were able to find his wife who sold us one. (only 8 left).

We took time off to have lunch & returned to the house where the woman made arrangements for us to go with her to meet her sister & husband, in the next village. (Mossengen) He supposed to have a family tree. He did a great deal of talking in the dialect of that area & even though it was German, ~~he~~ was very hard to understand. Spread out on the kitchen table he had the so called Mauser tree. (He was very very surprised at the Mauser history you had) Unfortunately I only had the first page with me.

He copied part of the tree by hand & insisted of doing it himself, since he was the one who had gotten that information some time ago from the church archives, (where the "then ???" Pastor allowed him to spend 4 hours in the cellar searching through some old documents.) He said a young pastor has taken over & does not allow this type of search anymore (since in the past few years there has been such an overwhelming request from tourists, about their ancestors.) One thing was _____ that we had the right Mauser dau. -- that (as is written in the part of the book) knew that famine had come over the little town & many people had to leave - (Not because of religious persecution - but because they had lost everything & could not feed their families.

Hope I got your address correct. My notes of your phone call are in a jumble. I made some copies of some Mouser/Mausers items I thought you might find interesting:

Page 20/21 Annals of Lincoln County NC. This list of signers of the 1775 Tryon County NC Association is supposed to include Freiderich Mauser. They say there is a bronze plaque with these names, I am not certain which courthouse or square has the plaque.

Sheets with the Mouser sale barn, located on the old Fred Mauser land grant on Clark's creek just east of Hickory NC, and pictures of the Old St. Paul's church near Newton NC. The Killian stone is located behind the right side of the building and the Mauser lot is just behind the large Killian stone.

I have color photos of all except the stone of old Jacob Fred. I have sent all pictures of his stone to cousins. Sorry.

I am not certain what the date across the top of the stone means. It seems to read Ano 1752. I have wondered if this was the date he was confirmed in the Lutheran church? He would have been about 12 years old.

You can see the three III that seem to turn 1740 into 1743, are not carved as deeply as other letters. They show even lighter, when you see the stone. I think they are either an error or space fillers. I wonder why he put the = in the middle of September? You will notice a hard to read mark at the bottom of the stone, Art Mouser says this is a stone cutters guild mark, I guess you would say a union mark.

There are two more stones with German inscriptions, plus several field rock markers, that appear to be on the lot. One stone seems to read: Ano 1702, Here rests Abraham Mau:ser. The bottom line seems to have a "double" W and the last mark is a circle with a * inside. I thought I saw somewhere that the last is the symbol for baptized.

The other stone may be for Mary Maria (Hauck) Mauser. I can not make all of it out but part seems to read: A-NNA:MA:MAUSER. The stone cutter made his N and M much alike but if you look closely, you will see an N has a single slash line while an M shows the v in the connecting bar.

While I think of it: the address for Lafrona (Foshee) Mouser who wrote the 1978 Mouseyr book, is in care of her daughter, Mrs. Barbara (Mrs. Charles) Nathman, 801 Shady Lane, Keller TX 76248. Lafrona was born in 1914.

I will enclose a map of the Newton-Hickory area, with Old St. Pauls marked, also Fairgrove Meth. where John Mouser who remained on the home farm. His first wife and a couple young sons were poisoned by a neighbor with a grudge, who put poison into their spring, which was fed by a pipe to the house. They were buried on the farm, and Richard did not know where the grave was. I talked to Richard on the phone about ten years ago, when we were there. I wish now I had contacted his aged aunt to see if she had some stories to tell. I also have received a few phone calls from a Becky Hunter, I believe her phone was out of Newton. She mentioned that she knew a cousin who had a trunk full of old Mouser papers, including deeds. She was going to try to make copies but was not sure the person would loan the papers. Since the CH burned, these deeds would give information we could not find elsewhere.

I don't know whom the Mauser Drive was named for.

A couple pages my friend Hermon Fagley copied from Prodigy. I have a little data on the Brown family who lived next door at Riley and inter-married with the Mousers. They claim they lived in the locale where the Battle of Kings Mountain was fought during the Rev. War, and were told to move. They went South-west, where one of the family died on the bank of a river (perhaps the father, not sure) and they later moved up to the Riley KY area. There is/was a Brown/Braun (German) family who settled south of Salisbury NC where they built a stone house which is still standing, marked on some maps, I think the Brown Family Association may own it. They printed a book, (copy in Salisbury NC Lib rary) and they had some named Alexander or Archibald, both names show up in the Browns who went to Riley. I think they may connect, NO PROOF.

The second computer printout shows some Germans from the same towns who came over on the Nancy, with our Mausers.

Charts enclosed: Gabriel Mouser born 1801, from Richard Rodgers II; Fred & Betsey (Donan) Mouser, John Mouser of NC, old Fred & Mary Maria (Hauck) Mauser of NC, Hans Michael Mauser of Berks PA, and a chart on David Cox Donan. There is a Donan book, you should buy. They did have some in Greenville KY but I believe the old lawyer Donan who lived there, has died. A Genealogy book sales in Boston Mass also had copies a few years ago. Call your library, ask them to look in the Gen. Books in Print catalog to see if "David Crews Donan of KY and his family" (1977) is listed.

Computer printout shows the Mauser line back to Michael 1580. Copy of Fred & Betsey marriage bond, Lincoln county KY 1797. Would be interesting to know what kind of a soap opera was going on back then. No one can find a divorce from Kelly who was still living years later. George Mouser was born about 6 months after the June 1797 wedding. Geo is Art's line. Art's 28 May 1995 letter, picture of Maria (Mauser), and three maps of Germany with locations marked. The Adolph Gerber book of Germans who came in via Philly from Wuerttemberg tells that Hans Michael, wife & older children took confirmation "as they were going to the New World" It lists the kids that were born at Challottenhof. The German Mouser told Art where it was located, no longer there. It was a Duke's estate. All for now!

I found a few more pages to enclose: In Search of My Mouser Ancestors, by Art Mouser; repeats a speech he made at a Mouser Reunion. I have never attended one of the reunions, they have held them in Marion county KY, in the Greene county KY area and there has been one held in Arkansas, each for different branches.

A typed page that lists some of the children of some of the German Mausers. Our line splits off from Casper born 1669, near the top of the page. This goes on to show how Maria Rempfer descends from Casper's brother 2. Hans born 1680.

Marie lives in the old Mauser house located on the old main road into Oschingen, from the west. Five generations of Mausers have lived in the house, which dates from the 1700's. One Mauser wife did not want to live there, as she said the house was located on the road the French Army would take into town. I don't know that the French bothered her but in WW II, the house was one of the first captured, as it is on the Western edge of the village.

Art's daughter-in-law brought a book published in the 1950's, made up of old ca1900 to 1920 photos, most of houses, but a few of events, school groups and tourist sites. It has a photo of the Mauser house as it looked caWW I time, with the basement barn. Since then Rempfer has raised the roof to built a second story, and has closed in the barn part, and changed the entrance steps and added some dormers.

Another page has a photo of your Grandmother Betsey (Donan) Mouser's stone in the Hudson Hill cemetery, near Carp, in Owen county Indiana. Spencer is the county-seat of Owen county.

Xerox copies of Mauser rifles, of Art Mouser under a steet sigh and a Mauser auto, all in a museum about the "rich" Mausers.

Two maps of KY, I found in the old Statehouse Library, in downtown Frankfort KY. One of the early forts and stations, shows the Sandusky Station and the Hunter's Trace, north of the county line, in Washington county KY. When we were driving around Riley, we drove north from 63 near Penick P.O., on a road that went by a country church. We drove north to a T intersection, turned west and back north a short distance, where we found a much shot up historical sign, put up by the state, that told that Sandusky's Station was located there. We were still in Marion county, we turned east at the sign and soon came to a church located high on a hill on the north side of the road. I think some of our distant kin are buried there, but don't remember the names.

Anyway this map seems to place the S. station, too far north, if the sign is correct. I think when I read about the S. family, they had several branches who built more than one station.

My Edward Green Mouser married Maggie Tharp. Her Grandfather Parra (Perry) Tharp married Margaret Shuck (Suck on marriage bond), daughter of Andrew Shuck, who was a member of the Low Dutch church group who moved from NJ to York county PA, where the Conewago Chapel they organized, is marked in red on the atlas. Near Hanover PA.

My Shucks lived in a branch located near Shepherdsville WVA, just East of Martinsburg WVA. The group sent advance members to locate land in KY, some came via the Cumberland Gap and some came via the Ohio River, to KY. Their first settlement at Estill and Banta's Stations were run out by the Indians. They regrouped at the Low Dutch Station south of Harrodsburg and then purchased a block of land near Pleasureville KY from Squire Boone, Daniel's brother.

My Parra Tharp could write and he signed his name as Parra. He witnessed the papers of the Low Dutch, although married to Andrew Shuck's daughter, he must not have been a member. The Dutch had to return at least once to the forts, from Pleasureville, because of Indian attacks.

I don't think my Parra Tharp lived at Pleasureville. He about 1800 settled on the Rolling Fork, below Gravel Switch KY. A descendant Marion Tharp lived on the next farm to the east, when we visited about ten years ago. Marion showed us the stone walls of the spring house that Parra had built and the mound nearby, where he had built his log cabin. Marion said when he was a boy, the wooden roof was still on the spring house. Parra is buried in a grove of trees, across the blacktop from the spring house. No stone, only a few field rocks to mark graves. Marion and I thought from the size and length of the rows, that perhaps 80 graves are in the grove.

My Grandfather Thomas Donan Mouser married Nettie Anderson. Her mother was Agness Hunt. Agness's father Thomas Hunt was born 17 Dec 1787. We believe he was born in the cabin Daniel Boone had built earlier and moved on further north. Thomas Hunt's aunt Mary Hunt was married to Samuel Bryan, who was a nephew of Dan Boone. Levi Hunt and his brother George Hunt were in KY with the Bryans, earlier, and after William Bryan and his son William Jr. were killed by Indians in the Spring of 1780; and two more Bryan sons died of fever, at Bryan's Station, Mary (Boone) Bryan moved what was left of her family back to NC and George and Levi Hunt helped guard the family.

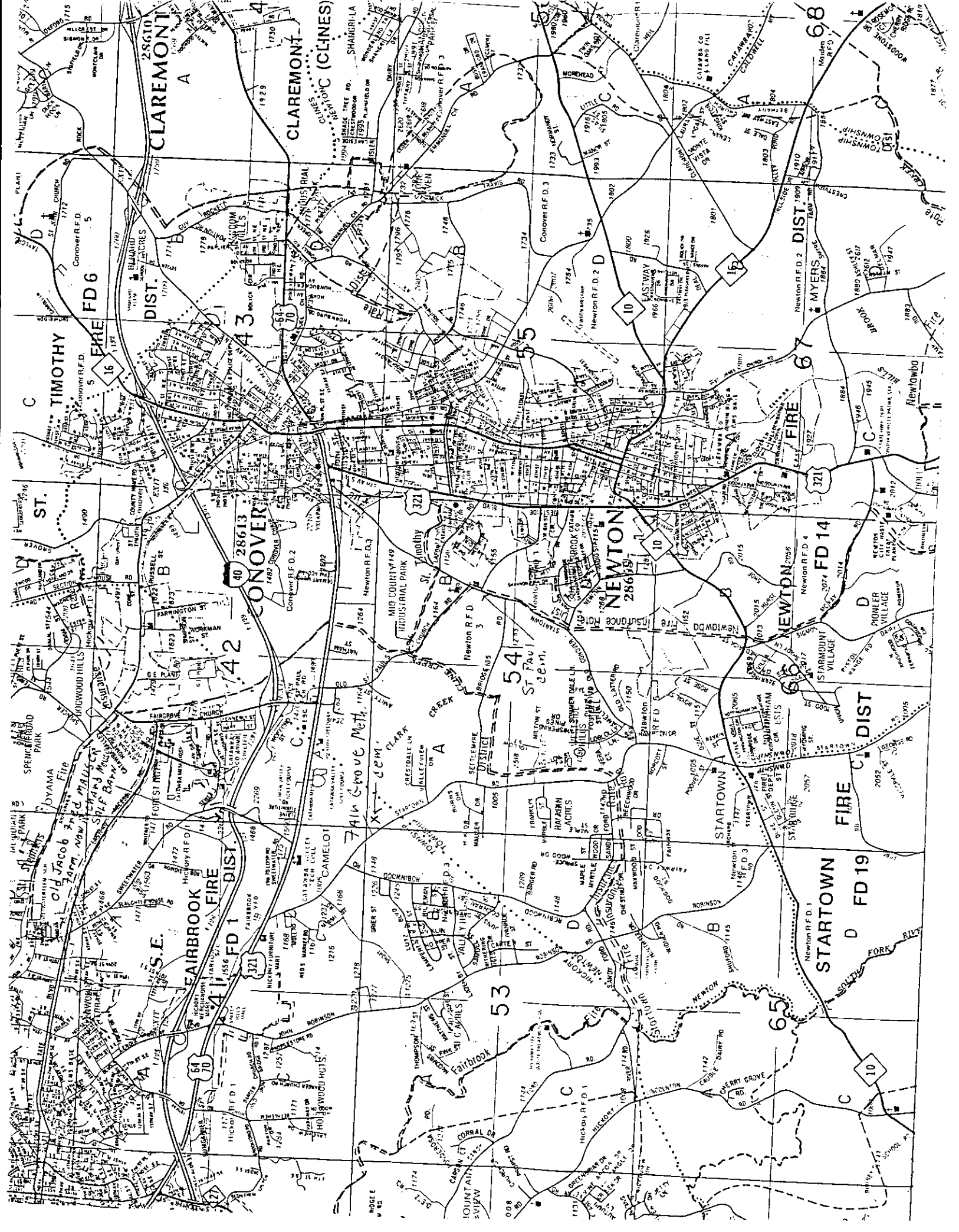
In 1784 Levi Hunt married Rachel Dean/Deene in Surry county NC near the Bryan Settlement. Samuel Bryan posted the marriage bond.

They were back in KY by Spring 1787, where they joined the new Marble Creek Baptist (now East Hickman). In a couple years they moved their membership to the Bryan's Station Baptist. Sam Bryan had land that included the part of the station to the east of the creek, and Levi had land on the east line of Bryan. Bryan lost most of his land but Levi sold his to his brother John Hunt, in 1799, and moved to near Bethel Clermont Ohio. About 1789 in Bourbon county KY, Samuel Bryan was bondsman for Henry Willis to marry Mary Dean. The Willis's moved to Bethel at the same time and lived across the road from Levi & Rachel.

That is the reason I marked Bryan's Station and Boone's 1784 cabin in what is now Jessamine county, on Marble Creek. The preacher at Hickman told me the original Marble Creek church was located down Marble Creek near the Boone's cabin location.

On the old land owners map of Riley, I marked where the Parra Tharps lived, and where J. Mouser and A. Brown estate are marked by No. 1. This is where I was told there had been an old cemetery, now no sign of it exists. This is in the middle of the fields, the easy way to get there is to drive into the lane below the Beech Fork church/cemetery, which curves along the ridge, west and south, to the Baxter farm. (On this map, it is dotted up to the "C" in Precinct). I marked the Edwards cem. The other dozed cem we talked about was on 63 on the Evans-Brown farms. The Mousers (J. H. M.) up further north, have kin in Lebanon and some bu. in the L. mound cem, at the east edge of town and in the Beech Fork cem. One was a policeman in L. who died middle-aged. The Jane/June Lankford ?? of Perryville KY is from these. They also have some kin living in Louisville, related to Mousers and to the R. W. Rawlings who painted the paintings I have of the Riley area. Rawlings was in his seventies when I met him, lived on Hourigan Lane, just below J.H.Mouser. Sincerely, Ned Brenner

CAR WRECKED STROKE FATAL AT CROSSING TO MR. MOUSER

Machine Is Torn To Pieces Passes Away At His Home
But Negro Driver Not Seriously Hurt After An Illness of Seven Weeks.

WAS IN BORROWED COUPE FUNERAL THIS MORNING

Earl Bell, eighteen-year-old negro boy employed at a local hotel, was severely injured early Sunday morning when he drove a Ford coupe into the incoming Greensburg train at the Jackson road crossing in the eastern part of town. That he was not killed is difficult to understand. The machine, which had been left parked near the hotel by Harry B. Thornton and which Bell is said to have borrowed without permission, was literally torn to pieces. A colored girl riding with him jumped when she saw a collision was inevitable and escaped injury.

The machine Bell was driving, an old model, is said to have crashed into the locomotive near the cab. It was dragged several feet and finally thrown against a telephone pole which was snapped off near the ground. It was at first thought that Bell had been killed, but examination at his home where he was taken disclosed that he was not seriously hurt and it is believed that he soon will be able to be out. He lives near the scene of the accident.

ARRESTED FOR MURDER THAT NEVER HAPPENED

Sheriff F. N. Blair the first of the week had what was probably the most unusual experience during all the years he has served Marion county as a peace officer.

Early Sunday morning a young man came to him at his home at Loretto and informed him with tears in his eyes that he had shot and killed his brother. He said he regretted the occurrence more than he could express in words but that it was forced upon him. Sheriff Blair hurriedly dressed and brought the young man to Lebanon and locked him up in jail.

John W. Mouser, 66 years old, died at his home on East Main street Wednesday afternoon at 5:15 o'clock of apoplexy. He was stricken on August 1 and had since that time been in a serious condition. Hope for his recovery was abandoned several days before he passed away.

Mr. Mouser was a son of John H. and Hester Catlin Mouser and was born in this county on February 17, 1862. All of his life he was a resident of the county and until eight years ago was engaged in farming. At that time he moved to town, purchasing the Rowntree property on East Main street where he had since lived. He frequently served as a police officer of the city, and always discharged his duties most satisfactorily. He was a Republican in politics and took an active interest in the affairs of the party. A few years ago he made the race for Sheriff of the county, but was defeated, the county being overwhelmingly Democratic.

Surviving Mr. Mouser are his wife, who was Miss Georgia Bagwell, and eleven children. They are Mrs. R. C. Hays of Marion county, Mrs. Hugh Hall of Washington county, Mrs. Charlie Hatchett of Washington county, Mrs. Charlie Russell of Marion county, Mrs. Eb Glazebrook of Lebanon, Mrs. Mary Yankey of Dubuque, Iowa, and Tom Mouser of Louisville. 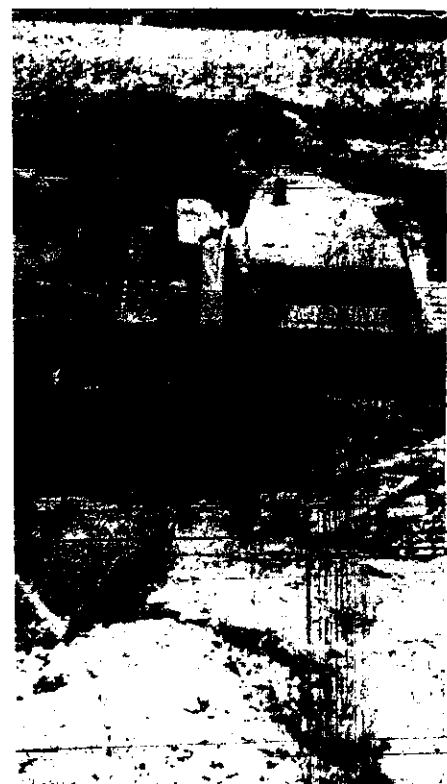

to be the bottom of the crater. When the dynamite charge was set off Saturday morning by Maupin and Cox, the rocks fell all right. They settled all the way down. After the charge went off we looked into hole and couldn't see anything but a black "Maupin said. The rocks, piled on what Maupin and Cox thought was the bottom, had been dislodged by the blast and had dropped into the huge underground cavern. "It's no telling how many deep or how large that hole is," Maupin Cox admitted that he was a little jittery running a 14-ton bulldozer around the edge of the crater. The rocks strewn around the sides of the crater had not been moved in the first explosion. Maupin and Cox set off a full case of dynamite. This blast loosened the rocks around the edge of the crater sufficiently to allow the men to push the remainder into the crater. Following the leveling of the high mound around the crater, and the removal of a few large rocks that could not be pushed into the hole, the area looked normal Saturday. A drilling rig had been removed when a hole of almost 200 feet had failed to produce. The earth was smooth where the high mound and huge crater had been. The only sign of what had happened were a few jagged cracks several inches wide, running zig-zagged through the earth out from the perimeter of the crater.

A concerted effort by officials of Lebanon and five other central Kentucky communities was begun this week to seek construction of a Central Kentucky toll road.

Representatives from Lebanon, Danville, Harrodsburg, Perryville, Springfield and Campbellsville met last Wednesday in Danville to lay plans for the campaign.

The group is seeking the construction through this section of a toll road that would link Lexington and Elizabethtown. Toll roads west of Elizabethtown and east of Lexington already are under construction.

Chief opposition to the proposed road, which representatives of the six communities want to pass through or near their towns, is a plan which will provide for construction of the highway north of this route and near Bardstown.

Engineering Study Is Slated

Bardstown officials and the Chamber of Commerce there have been actively supporting the northern route, which would provide for construction of the toll road in an almost straight line from Lexington to Elizabethtown. This proposal would route the highway near Bloomfield and the Nelson County seat. Governor Bert Combs, in a luncheon address at Bardstown several weeks ago, said an engineering firm has been hired to prepare a study determining the feasibility of constructing the toll road and to determine where it should be built.

Representatives from Lebanon who attended the meeting last Wednesday in Danville include Chamber of Commerce President Eugene Spragens, Jr., Mayor W. C. McDuffee, Walter Leachman, chairman of the Chamber of Commerce industrial committee; Eddie Deep, chairman of the C. of C. highway committee, and City Councilman Maurice Spalding.

The group voted to begin immediately a three-phase program.

Representatives of the highway group will contact the engineering firm that is preparing the road survey and will attempt to find out just how much consideration is being given the proposal to construct the toll road along the southern route.

Petition Being Circulated

A petition is being circulated among residents of the six communities, seeking consideration to have the toll road routed so it will pass between Lebanon and Springfield. The petition reads, "The undersigned residents petition the Governor

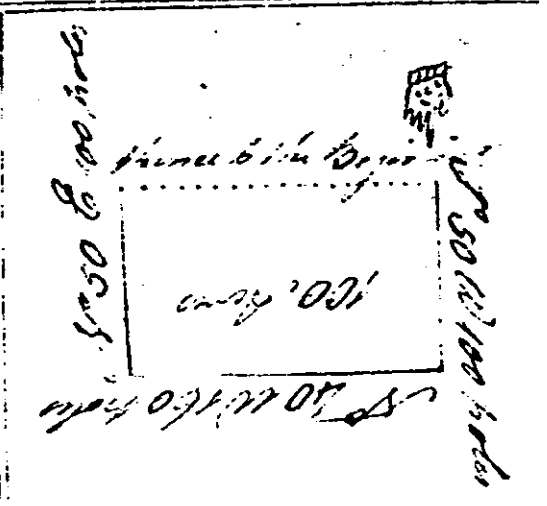

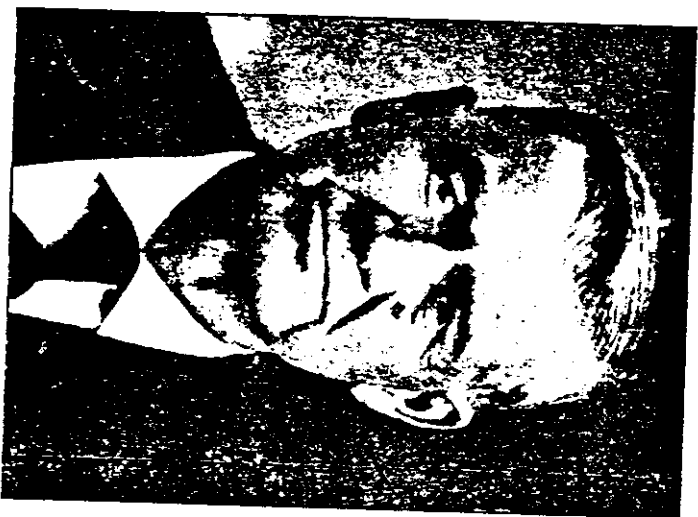

A BRIEF HISTORY OF OLD ST. PAUL'S CHURCH

A great emigration of German colonists mostly from Pennsylvania began settling in the Piedmont area of North Carolina during the first half of the eighteenth century. These people were of the Lutheran and Reformed faiths. As a result of living and working together, members of the two denominations agreed to build common houses of worship. These "union churches" were used by each faith on alternate Sundays, each faith having its own minister when a circuit rider was present in the community.

Old St. Paul's Church in Catawba County just northwest of Newton was organized about 1759, but it is generally accepted that the Rev. Christian Theus of the Reformed Church ministered to both the Lutherans and Reformed in the Carolinas before that date. St. Paul's was the first church established in the State west of the Catawba River.

The deed to the church property is dated May 20, 1771, and is made "Between Paul Anthony and Frony his wife of the county of Rowan in the province of N. C. of the one part and christian churches Lutheran (Lutheran) and Presbeterian (Reformed),.....of the other part."

The church was originally known as "The Dutch Meeting House," but became known as the "The South Fork Church," about the beginning of the nineteenth century. It came to be called by its present name, "Old St. Paul's," sometime afterwards.

The first church building, a small logg'd structure became in need of repair and was dismantled about 1818. The sound logs from this building were removed a short distance away and were used to erect a two-story sanctuary, which was weatherboarded and ceiled. It is said that Henry Cline was the principal carpenter and that he completed the building in five and one-half months. This edifice still stands today stately and solid as the day in which it was constructed. The pews are arranged around three sides of the first floor with the pulpit and altar located on the other wall. Steps at the two narrow ends of the church lead up to the slave gallery. A wooden device called a sounding board hangs from the ceiling in the fashion of an inverted wine glass. Its purpose was to enhance the speaker's voice as he delivered his oratory from the pulpit. *No white men lived there in 1702.*

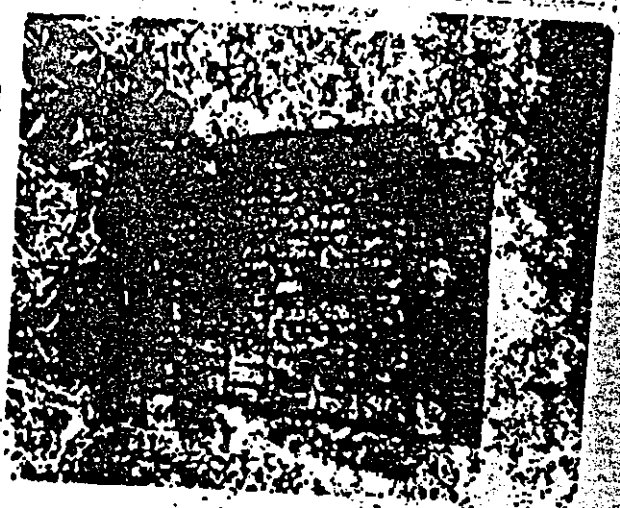
The cemetery has reached extensive proportions. Many graves date back to the 1700's. Most tombstones are still legible, but others obviously older were either never inscribed or since eroded by time and the elements. Among the markers chiseled in German includes one dedicated to the memory of Abraham Mauser who died in 1702.

In 1818 a second deed was made on the property by John Smyre to John Wilfong, Sr. and John Propst, they being appointed to care for the church property.

The Reformed congregation of Old St. Paul's removed to Startown at the turn of the present century and there erected a small frame church in 1903-1904. The Evangelical Lutheran Tennessee Synod followed its brethren to Startown in 1905. The American Lutheran Church (formerly the Evangelical Lutheran Joint Synod of Ohio) which had worshipped in Old St. Paul's Church many years erected a new brick building in 1952 within sight of the historic Mother Church.

St. Paul's Church celebrated its Bicentennial Anniversary, October 4-11, 1959. During the memorable week special worship services were attended by members of both the Lutheran and the Reformed Church (now the United Church of Christ) in the amiable manner shared by the two communions continually since their organization two centuries ago in colonial North Carolina.

Practically all the Reformed and Lutheran churches in Western North Carolina are transplants of ancient St. Paul's Church.

29 May 1772 David Donnan witnessed a will in Surry county VA. 21 Dec 1772 David Cox Donnan witnessed a marriage bond Surry and also obtained his own marriage bond to marry widow Mrs. Amy (David) Bouth. 03 June 1775 David Donnan, resident of Dinwiddie county VA asked indemnity for loss of two runaway slaves (one named York) who burned in the Prince Edward VA jail. 1795/6 Robert Davis was taxed on 400A conveyed to Davis by David Donnan. 25 Aug 1778 David Donnan took the oath of allegiance in Amelia county VA. The will of Henry Davis dated 17 Oct 1771 proved 21 April 1772 Surry VA names: his father William Davis; his son William Davis (to be educated); his wife (Amith Davis) & "all my children" (not named). The will named slaves, one was York, same as above. Exesutors: Amith Davis; William Crews; John Hartwell Cocke. One Clinch will a James Davis signed the inventory.

David & Amy must have moved to Pitt county NC ca 1780. Had land in Martinborough (now Greenville; 300A George Evans plantation south side of Tar River & north side Coneto Creek. 500A North side Tar River & 1/2 interest in grist mill on Coneto Creek. 16 Sep 1785 David Donnan deeded the above to his five children who were named; 17 Sep 1785 he deeded the same lands to Thomas H. Hall. 07 Jan 1787 the 200A Evans farm was sold to satisfy a judgement against David Donnan. Donnan was also disbarred as an attorney in NC. He was not present at some court cases in 1785/6 and is believed to have moved to Bryan's Station KY by 1790. His four sisters also came to KY. They married (location not listed) men named Heizer; Pruett; South & Jackson.

George Mouser was eldest child of Fred & Betsy (Donnan) Mouser

Norman Mouser was born in Hart County on the 21st of September, 1840. He is the oldest in a family of four sons, William N., Joshua, James H. and Henry A. and one daughter, Ellen F., born to Frederick and Nancy E. (Powell) Mouser, the former of whom was born in 1831 and is a native of Hart County; the latter was born in Green County in 1820. This marriage occurred in 1847 and both are living. Frederick Mouser has, during life, followed the occupation of a farmer, residing on the farm which he owns, lying on the waters of Knox Creek, in Hart County. George Mouser, the father of Frederick, was a native of Virginia and one of the first settlers of Marion County, Ky., whence he removed to Hart County, where he died in 1877, aged eighty-one years. William N. Mouser was reared on his father's farm, received as good an education as was afforded by the schools of his home district and at the age of nineteen apprenticed himself with J. C. Baird to learn blacksmithing. He remained with Mr. Baird for something more than three years, and in 1874 he fitted up a shop in the town of Munfordville, Ky., where he has since carried on the business very successfully. He was united in marriage with Miss Lizzie Bransford Dodd on the 25th day of December, 1873. She is a daughter of William F. Dodd, a Kentuckian by birth and a resident of Barren County. Her mother is a Tennessean and was of a family named Kenner. Both Mr. and Mrs. Mouser are members of the Methodist Church South. In politics Mr. Mouser is a Democrat, but is liberal in his views.

THOMAS H. MUSTAIN was born at Munfordville, Hart Co., Ky., September 7, 1818, and is the third child and eldest son in a family of ten children born to James W. and Sallie H. (Shelton) Mustain, both natives of Virginia and of French and English descent, respectively. Of their children, one daughter, Caroline T., died in 1834; there was no death in the family for over fifty years, when another daughter, Susan C., died December 31, 1885. James W. Mustain married in Virginia, came to Kentucky in 1815, settled in Hart County and was elected its first jailor, which position he held for several years. About 1820 he moved to Barren County where he bought a farm, upon which he resided until his death in April, 1850, in his sixty-second year. He had learned the carpenter's trade in early life, which he continued to follow to some extent in connection with other business all his life. He was a soldier of the war of 1812, and was a life-long and devoted member of the Christian Church. His father and one of his

brothers emigrated from France to the colony of Virginia about the middle of the last century, during the persecution of the Huguenots. Mrs. Sallie H. Mustain departed this life in January, 1887, in her seventieth year. She also was a devoted member of the Christian Church. Her father, Thomas Shelton, was a native of Virginia, where he was extensively engaged in merchandising for many years; later he moved to Mississippi, and afterward to west Tennessee, where he resided until his death, at the age of one hundred and four years. Thomas H. Mustain commenced in life without a dollar, and with no fortune but a stout heart and willing hand, but by close attention to business, energy and economy has amassed a handsome fortune. In 1850 he established the first general store ever opened at Horse Cave, and has since continued to conduct a flourishing and extensive business. At one time he was postmaster, express and railroad agent and also owned and operated a flouring-mill and tobacco warehouse in connection with his store. During all this time he has also been extensively engaged in agricultural pursuits. He has been three times married; first, July 16, 1840, to Miss Mary J. Willis, born in Barren County, Ky., in May 1823, and a daughter of George and Elizabeth (Thompson) Willis. She bore him ten children, only six of whom are now living, and died in 1858, in her thirty-fifth year. From girlhood she was a member of the church, first of the Baptist and later of the Christian Church. Mr. Mustain was next married, February 27, 1850, to Miss Mary B. Hodgen, a native of Green County, Ky., born in 1833, and a daughter of Dr. William T. and Ann (Williams) Hodgen. This union was blessed by six children, all of whom are yet living. The death of Mrs. Mary B. occurred September 23, 1881. She also was a consistent member of the Christian Church. Mr. Mustain was last married, December 20, 1883, to Mrs. Emily Moss, of Falls City, Neb., and a sister of his first wife. She is a devoted member of the Baptist Church. Mr. Mustain also has been a church member from his seventeenth year; first of the Baptist and then of the Christian Church, having been a ruling elder in the latter for many years. His entire family, save the youngest child, which is yet too young, are also members of the Christian Church. He is also a member of the Masonic fraternity, and in politics is a Democrat. James T. Mustain, the seventh child and fourth son of Thomas H. and Mary J. (Willis) Mustain, was born near Horse Cave, May 18, 1852. He was employed on his father's

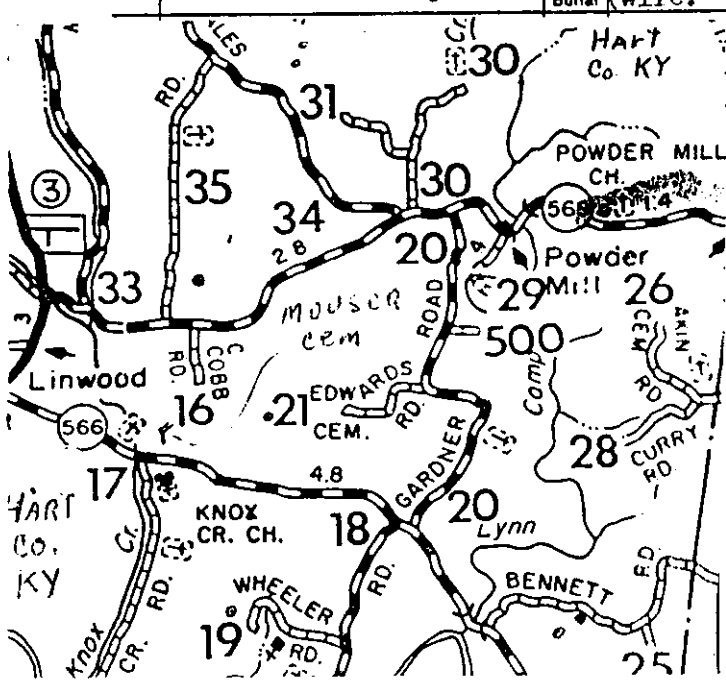

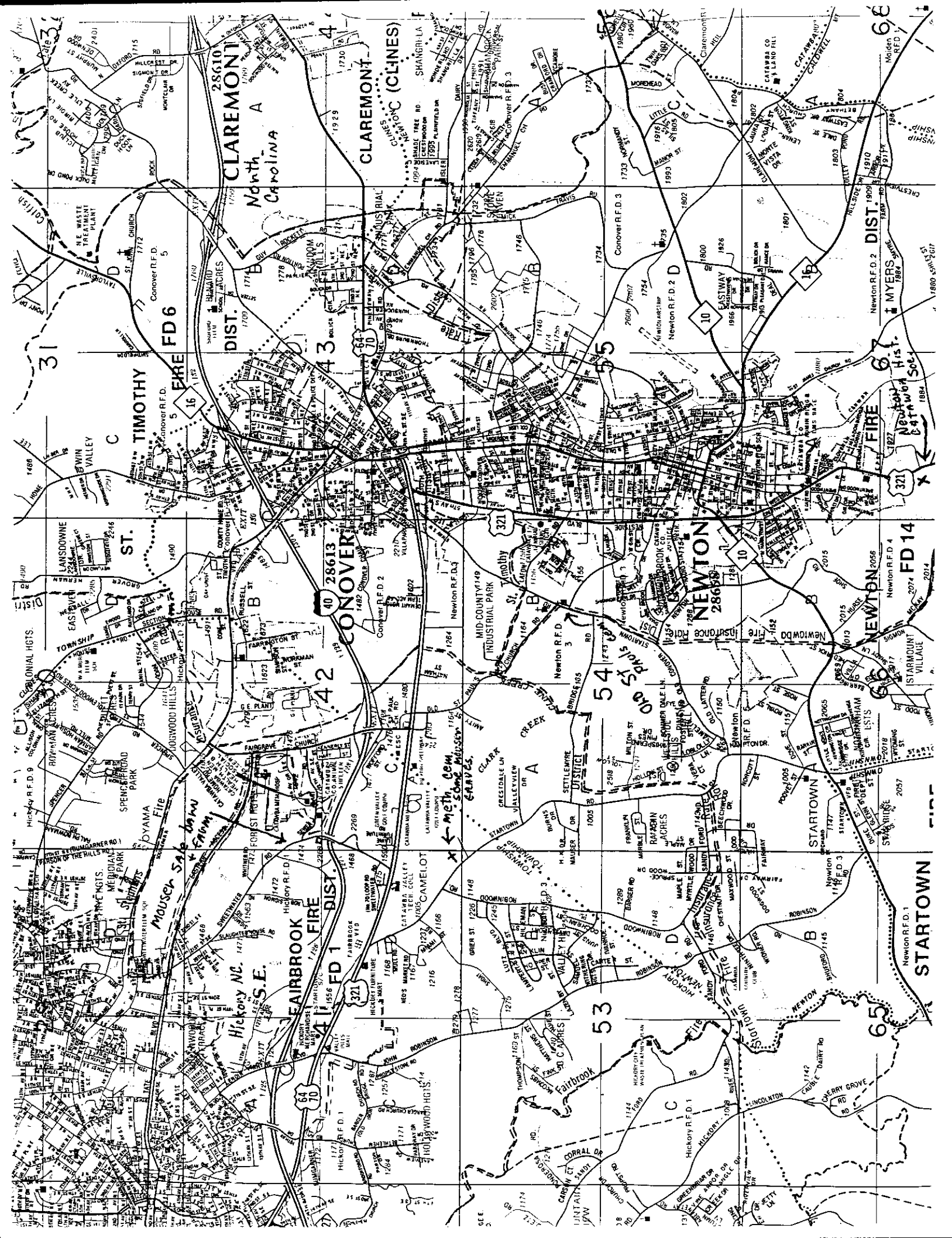

She had a lot of very valuable papers, but one time when she was visiting her other daughters where you lived, two men came from England and asked for them saying they were needed to settle a large estate and that they would see she got her share. And Grandma Moore gave them the papers. When she returned and Grandma told what she had done, mother said she said, "Oh Elizabeth, Elizabeth, what have you done, what have you done". father of John, was born in North Carolina, and came to Kentucky when a boy and located in Nelson (now Marion) County, he was a farmer and came from German descent, and died prior to 1850; his grandfather, a native of Germany, came to America and settled in the Virginia colony as early as 1750. John W. Mouser was born on a farm in Marion County, and at the age of nineteen visited the State of Texas, where he remained until the beginning of the civil war, when he returned to Kentucky, and soon after joined the Federal Army, enlisting in Company D, of the Tenth Kentucky Volunteer Infantry, in November, 1861; during the three years and two months that he served participated in the engagements at Mill Springs, was wounded at Chickamauga, Mission Ridge, Tunnel Hill, Resaca, Atlanta, Kenesaw, and Jonesboro, and many minor engagements. He was discharged from the service at Louisville, Ky., in November, 1864, and on the 10th of October, 1865, was united in marriage to Miss Sallie A. Brown. To this marriage have been born three sons: Otis U., Zenas A. and Edward B. Sallie (Brown) Mouser was born October 16, 1837. Her father, Alexander Brown, was descended from English ancestors; he was born in Nelson (now Marion) County, Ky.; his wife was a Miss Margaret Mouser, whose parents were of German extraction. Mr. and Mrs. John W. Mouser are members of the Methodist Episcopal Church, with which they united in 1876. Mr. Mouser's political views are Republican. He held the office of United States Internal Revenue storekeeper from May, 1880, to September, 1885; since that time he has been engaged in agricultural pursuits on the farm that he owns, lying near Riley's Station.

W. A. MULLINS, son of B. G. and Elizabeth (Kennedy) Mullins, was born August 19, 1867. B. G. Mullins, now a farmer and shorthorn cattle breeder, served three years in the Confederate cavalry under John Morgan; was captured in Ohio and imprisoned twenty-two months. He is a son of Williamson G. and Mary Ann (Graves) Mullins, who had a family of six: John G., William Jordan (deceased), Benjamin G., Martha (deceased), Emily (deceased), and Mary L. Samuel G. Mullins, a brother of Williamson G., was president of the Madison Female Institute, and also of the Daughters Female College, at Harrodsburg. Mary A. (Graves) Mullins was a sister of William J. Graves, member of Congress, whose duel at Bladensburg, Md., with Jonathan Cilley, member of Congress, from Maine, is a mat-

to Miss Mollie E., daughter of Richard W. and Rosana M. (Hurt) Wallace. Mr. Wallace is a Christian minister and was a soldier in the Mexican war. He is still living and was a son of William Wallace, who came from Virginia and settled in Adair County many years ago. Mrs. Mollie E. Morgan died in 1878, a member of the Christian Church.

JOHN W. MOUSER was born, January 12, 1840; his father, John Mouser, in 1811, and now resides on the old homestead near Riley's in Marion County. His life has been spent in the pursuits of the farm, but he retired from active work in 1870. His wife, to whom he was married in 1833, was a Miss Nancy Hardgrove of Boyle County; nine children blessed this union; six of the number are living, namely: Frederick, of Dallas County, Tex.; John W., Mary E. (Sparrow) of Marion County; Edward G. of Lynn County, Mo.; Gabriel T. of Madison County, Tex., and Redford M. of Marion County. Nancy (Hardgrove) Mouser was born in the State of Kentucky, in 1812; she was reared in Boyle County, Ky., and is yet living, aged seventy-four years. I am still digging the Mouser "roots". I wrote to and received info from Mr. Anthar Mouser of Houston, TX. He is from the George Mouser, oldest brother of John 1811. I had thought since George and his children lived in Green and Hart counties that your John 1827 might have been from this line. But the info we have does not list him.

Frederick 1772/1776 who was the father of George 1797 & John 1811 had other sons David 1799 and Gabriel 1801 and may have had a son Fred too. Fred 1772/1776 also had a brother John who stayed in Catawba county N.C. and bought the home farm. We have found the deed dated 1816 where "Frederick of Kentucky" along with three of his sisters, Sallie Moser, Catherine Smith, Elizabeth Bolick (Bolack) deeded their part to John who stayed on the farm. Four other brothers must have already deeded their portion to John; Michael, Abraham, George, Henry as they did not sign the 1816 deed. Mrs. Ben Mouser in her book has guessed that John was born about 1764. He may be the father of the John Moser I found in TN. I will list what I found on the TN John further on in this letter.

We found a will we think is for John who bought the farm. He mentions Catherine, his wife, five sons: Henry, Elias, Jacob, John & David. He mentions five daughters but not by name and his mother who was still living. The will is dated 26 Sept 1822. *This John died soon after he wrote will.*

I found in a book printed a few years ago called "TN Cousins" some info about a Moser family who lived in Monroe county TN.

If you subtract 23 from 1850 you would get about 1827. I don't know if this John could be your John 1827.

We also have a R'd Mouser who had a family near Fred 1740 in Catawba county NC (which was part of Lincoln county at the time). I don't know who R'd's children were.

We also found another Fred who lived in Orange county NC, left a will naming sons John, Frederick, Jacob, Michael, Abraham Phillip, Nicholas and daughters: Catherine Kimbro, Barbara Huffman, Elizabeth Sharp, Eve Sharp, Magdalane Bulcher. This Fred died in 1799 also and we think he was some kin to my Fred 1740, probably an uncle. I found what I believe is his marriage in PA where he married 22 April 1750 Barbara Luser in the New Hanover Lutheran Church in New Hanover township of Montgomery co PA. In this same church an Eva Moser m. 1763 to Baltzer Traut, and an Anna Maria Moser m. 11 April 1769 Henry Fuchs. My Fred 1740

→ The 1830 Monroe county TN census listed a Peter Moser age 40/50 which would have made him born between 1780/90

→ had a sister Anna Maria born 1746 who would have been 23 when this marriage took place in 1769. I think this is the sister. *As you can see we are still guessing. I need the name of Fred 1740's wife to help tie to the PA MOUSERS. You might look this including MARRIED NAMES of the daughters to see if your family had any of for an aunt or uncle.*

Hans Michael Mauser born 11 June 1707. Lived Oeschingen, Wuerttemberg, Germany (a very small town about 30/40 miles south of Stuttgart and about 40/50 miles north of the Swiss border.) Hans Michael married in Germany Agatha, daughter of Hans Jerg Gomminger of Ofterdingen, Germany. The family received Communion in the church 2 May 1751 because they were going to the "New World". Frederick and there was a Philipp Frederick Meyer who came over on the ship "Edinburgh" which landed in Philly the same day as the ship "Nancy", 16 Sept 1751.
4. Johann Jacob Mauser born 12 April 1743 (He may have married 26 May 1766 Catherine Shedaker)
5. Anna Marie Mauser born 2 Jan 1746 (She may have married 11 April 1769 Henry Fuchs, New Hanover Lutheran church, Montgomery co PA)
6. Niclaus Mauser born 28 May 1749 or 12 Jan 1750 died 25 Sept 1826 (May have married Catherine Henninger)

Several of the younger children including #3. Fred 1740 were born at or near Charlottenhof, Germany which I am told is the name of a house or farm.

We think Fred 1740 & wife moved to N.C. before 1772, perhaps in the 1760's. He died 23 April 1799 and has a stone in Old St. Pauls Lutheran cemetery near Newton, N.C. He had at least three farms, some on Clarks Creek nearby. I have a copy of the clerk's record of his estate sale 25 July 1799, five long pages, which names several of the children and the widow who bought at the sale. We have not found the name of his widow.

I believe his son, (D) Fred 1772/1776 moved to KY before his father died, married in Lincoln county KY 25 June 1797 Elizabeth "Betsy" Clinch Donan. Her father was killed during the Revolutionary War. We believe they must have moved to near Riley, Marion co, KY soon after their marriage. One account states that Betsy was born near Bradfordsville, KY.

I am from their son (E) John (Jack) Mouser born 26 Nov 1811 died 23 Aug 1895. Buried about a mile west of Riley on the old Edward's farm next to the iron fence around the Bigger lot. Married Nancy L. (Lou) Hargrave (Hardgrove) in 1833. Nancy was born 2 Sept 1812 died 24 June 1888.

We don't have the date of death for Fred 1772/76 but found a deed where his son Gabriel deeded his share of Fred's land to John 1811. This deed is dated 28 Jan 1861. It mentions Fred 1772/6 is deceased, and Gabriel is living in Pike county Indiana.

Another deed dated 14 Mar 1814 tells that "Fred of Washington" (now Mario county purchased 12 acres of land from the Slaughters. So we know Fred was living in the county before 1814. There may be an earlier deed for some of his land in the courthouse in Washington county, Springfield.

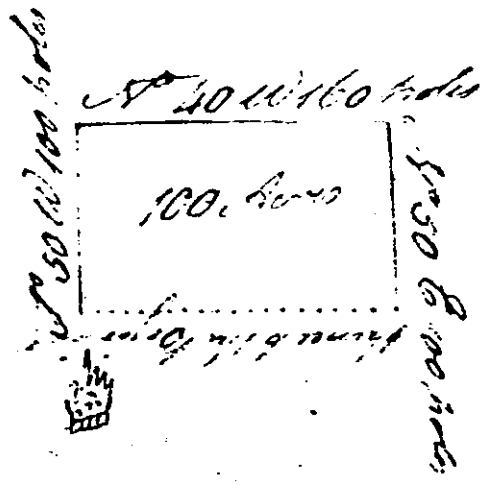

JOHN W. Mouser was born January 12, 1840; his father John Mouser, in 1811 and now resides on the old homestead near Riley in Marion County. His life has been spent in the pursuits of the farm, but he retired from active work in k 1870. His wife, to whom he was married in 1833, was a Miss Nancy Hardgrove of Boyle County; nine children blessed this union; six of ~~whom~~ Mary E. (Sparrow) of Marion County; Frederick, of Dallas County, Texas; John W., of Madison County, Texas, and Redford M. of Marion County, Mo.; Gabriel T., grove) Mouser was born in the State of Kentucky in 1812; she was reared in Boyle County, Ky., and is yet living, aged seventy-four years. Her parents were of English descent and by birth Virginians. Frederick Mouser, the father of John, was born in North Carolina, and came to Kentucky when a boy and located in Nelson (now Marion) county, he was a farmer and came from German descent, and died prior to 1850; his grandfather, a native of Germany, came to America and settled in the Virginia colony as early as 1750. John W. Mouser was born on a farm in Marion County, and at the age of nineteen visited the State of Texas, where he remained until the beginning of the civil war, when he returned to Kentucky, and soon after joined the Federal Army, enlisting in Company D, of the Tenth Kentucky Volunteer Infantry, in November 1861; during the three years and two months that he served he participated in the engagements at Mill Springs, was wounded at Chickamauga, Mission Ridge, Tunnel Hill, Resaca, Atlanta, Kenesaw, and Jonesboro, and many minor engagements. ~~at~~ He was discharged from the service at Louisville, Ky., in November 1864, and on the 10th of October 1865 was united in marriage to Miss Sallie A. Brown. To this marriage have been born three sons: Otis U., Zenas A. and Edward B. Sallie (Brown) Mouser was born October 16, 1837. Her father, Alexander Brown, was descended from English ancestors; he was born in Nelson (now Marion) County, Ky.; his wife was a Miss Margaret Mouser, whose parents were of German extraction. Mr. and Mrs. John W. Mouser are members of the Methodist Episcopal Church, with which they united in 1876. Mr. Mouser's political views are Republican. He held the office of the United States Internal Revenue storekeeper from May 1880 to Sept. 1885; since that time he has been engaged in agricultural pursuits on the farm that he owns, lying near Riley's Station.

Michael Mauser and son Johannes were listed on the ship "Nancy" (9-16-1751). Females and children under 16 were not listed. The family settled in Northampton County, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, where Michael received a survey for 25 acres July 27, 1752. By the mid 1760's all Mauser sons were in Buck County, Pennsylvania. Michael's son Frederick lived to be 58 years old. He is buried at Old St. Paul's Cemetery in Newton, North Carolina. St. Paul's Church is just northwest of Newton and was organized about 1759. It is generally believed that the people who used the church were of the Lutheran and Reformed faiths. Newton or at least the area where the church is may have been a part of Rowan County at one time. Many settlers came from Rowan County North Carolina to Marion County, Kentucky. In North Carolina by the mid 1760's we have record of a Mouser marrying a Moyer later spelled Myers. Again both names a popular in the eastern end of Marion County in the early 1800's. Frederick's son Fred came to Marion County, Kentucky sometime in the late 1790's or early 1800's. There is a deed in Washington Co dated 1814 where the land is purchased on the Beech Fork by Fred Mouser. Later the sale in 1861 of Fred Mouser's land (he is deceased) by Gabriel to John Mouser. The second "Thank You" goes to our good friend, Ann Moore Dellinger, for copying all the Deeds on Moyers, Mouser, Perkins, and Hildebrand in Lincoln Co., NC.

4B FRONICA MOYERS b.cal770 Lincoln Co., NC d.after 1850 census, Wayne Co., MO. Author's Note: This child was listed on deed partitions 1802-06 as male (his X mark) and 1850 census as Male in home of Henry & Sarah Yount Myers. We have no proof of marriage, but believe him to be our "missing link" to the Moyers family. The name "Francis" comes down in the Henry Myers line as a male name. Henry also had a daughter named Esther. Fronica purchased at his mother Esther's estate sale 1807. I had sometimes wondered if this was a girl, but all records I have been able to uncover list him as male, except possibly the 1840 Wayne Co., MO census which gives an aged female with comparable age in the home of Henry and Sarah Yount Myers. Much help is needed to sort out this and 5B.

5B JOHN MOYERS b.cal772 Lincoln Co., NC d. possibly 1806 Cape Girardeau Co., MO. Author's Note: This too could be our line, but I have no proof. There is an estate file in Cape Girardeau Co., MO 1806, but it is empty. I have had no time to read court minutes to determine what happened to him. He did not purchase at his mother's estate sale 1807 and apparently left NC soon after his father died in 1800, as he claimed no share of the land as his own. It is possible that the estate file is a transfer of the records of John d.1800 since Esther, the widow, went there between July 1806 and January 1807. It is possible he stopped over in Tennessee for a time and it is his children who are the "extras" in MO. This all needs further study. Perhaps someone can provide the missing information we need.
