Genealogy From The Long Ago

(Old Scrapbook - 1890's)

Editor's Note: We have recently come across an interesting collection of old clippings dealing with Kentucky family history. Since these clippings are about 100 years old, your editor feels they will be of interest to many of our readers. We will continue this column each month until the supply is gone.

Masterson

Mrs. J. M. Conway, of Marshall, Mo., granddaughter of Caleb Masterson, is anxious to hear from any of his descendants. He moved from Virginia to near Paris, Bourbon County, Ky., from there to Missouri. Andrew Jackson moved from Virginia to Bourbon County, Ky., and was married to Lee Anna Masterson, daughter of Caleb Masterson, near Paris, Ky., somewhere near 1824 or 1825.

May

Gabriel May, born in 1761, married Sallie Stokes, a niece of Ethan Allen. They moved to Spencer County, Ky., about 1782: had eleven children—four sons, Humphrey, Stephen, Allen and Gabriel May. The last two moved to Carroll County, Ky. (then Gallatin County), about 1819.

Tucker

Capt. Daniel Tucker, said to have been a native of Devonshire, lived several years in Virginia and in 1616 was appointed first Governor of Bermudas, where he was accompanied by his brothers, Henry and George. Each have numerous descendants. From Capt. David descended John Tucker, Secretary and Provost of Bermuda, 1687, later Chief Justice. He married a daughter of Henry Tucker and had, first, Daniel (ancestor of George, born in Bermuda, 1775, professor and writer, father of Daniel G., Congressman from Ohio); second, Elizabeth, married John Tucker of Bermuda; third, Henry, married Frances Tucker; fourth, Henry Tucker who had a son John, married Elizabeth Tucker, and was ancestor of Henry Tucker, of Henderson, Ky.

George Tucker, brother of Capt. Daniel, had George, of Port Royal Ber-

muda, father of George Tucker, baptized May, 1651, from who descended Henry Tucker, of Port Royal, who married Anne Butterfield, and had Henry (of Bermuda, President of Council and Lieutenant Governor, died February, 1806); Frances, died September 12, 1825; Thomas T., died May 2, 1828, settled in South Carolina and Treasurer of the United States, 1794 until death; Elizabeth, Dr. Nathaniel, St. George, born June 29, 1752, died November, 1827, a Colonel in the Revolution and writer of note.

Henry Tucker, Governor of Bermuda, had Henry and four other sons, all officers in the English army.

St. George Tucker (Judge) married Frances Bland and had Anne F., born June, 1778, and Henry St. George, Nathaniel, Henrietta. He married second Lelia Skipwith and had children, all dying young.

There were other representatives of the family in Virginia. Daniel Tucker died in York County, 1660. Courtney Tucker, of Yorktown, whose family was from Bermuda, married about 1720, John Walker and had Courtney, who married about 1743. John Norton, of London, ancestor of the family of that name in Virginia.

Creig-Craig

One of the Creig (or Craig) girls married Watson, a Continental soldier, who was killed in the Revolution, as were two of her brothers. She afterward married Dodds, with whom, in 1790-91, she emigrated to Kentucky. He dying en route, she continued the journey with their children, and settled in what is now Caldwell County, Ky., near Princeton.

Vinsonhaler-McDonald

George Vinsonhaler came to Ken-

tucky after the war of the Revolution, with Gen. Nathaniel Massey, in 1791. His sword, an heirloom in the family, bears evidence of his service. He married a McDonald or McDonald descendant.

Upshaw

This name was originally Upscher, corrupted into Upshaw, Upsher and Upshur, and is spelled by the various branches in these ways. The tradition in the family is that two brothers, Abel and Arthur Upshaw, aged respectively twelve and fourteen years, ran away from their home in Essex County, England, in 1637; landed in Virginia where they separated, one settling in Northampton County and the other in Essex County, Va. Their descendants spelled the name Upshur and Upshaw.

One branch of the family is the Upshaws, of Essex, Va. The earliest definite information is about three brothers, John, Jeremiah and Richard. The latter, it seems, died childless, in 1764. Jeremiah died in 1746. His wife was a Miss Buckner, of Caroline County Va. They had three children, James, William and Hannah. This James died in 1807, leaving children, James W., member of the House of Delegates, 1793; Arthur, Lewis, Tazwell, and daughters, Maria (who married John Hawkins); Louisa and Sally, and a daughter, name not known, who married William Hawkins. The father, James Upshaw, was one of the signers of the Westmoreland Association, pledging themselves not to use articles imported from England, dated February 27, 1766; afterward member of the House of Delegates and member of the Virginia Convention of 1788 From Essex County, and an officer in the Revolutionary war, and possibly a member of the Cincinnati Society.

His uncle, John Upshaw, born July 21, 1715, died July 23, 1801, was a member of the House of Burgesses from Essex County, 1758, 1759, 1761; also a signer of Westmoreland articles, 1766, a gentleman justice, vestryman and chairman of Essex County committee of safety, 1775-1776. He had three sons (John Horace, Edwin and Dr. William), the latter surgeon in the United States army. He fought a duel with Gen. Winfield Scott, wounding him. He died unmarried. John Horace was a member of the Virginia Senate, 1809-1810. He married Miss Lucy Baylor and had
