In the name of God Amen, I David Miller of the County of Marion and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory, thanks be to the Almighty disposer of human events for the same calling to mind the mortality of the body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows

lst My body to be decently burried at my decease in a Christian like manner at the desention of my executors to be hereafter named, and such property as it has pleased God to put in my hands I do give and bequeath as follows

2nd I will that my beloved wife Elmyra Miller have all the land I possess at my death and all other property household & Mitchen furniture, stock of all kinds farming utentials and all other articles belonging to me except such as I may hereafter name and specify.

3rd It is my will that my daughter Mary E Miller have the Bay Morgan filly two years old, one bed, sted and covering for same. One Cow and calf the sewing machine at the death of her mother in case of her death it is to fall back to the surviving brothers & <u>Cisters</u>, She is to have a home here on my farm, and a support from same during her single life.

the I will to my son Henry Miller one bead & bedding, he already having received his horse it is allso my wish and will that my son Henry remain on the farm with his mother & Cister & that he sew & grass all the farm that will not be especially needed for grain, and at the death of his mother I wish him to still remain on the farm & if he is able to buy out the interest of the other Heirs If he should not be able at that time to buy it & any other one of my sons will come on it and buy it I would prefer they would do so as I wish the farm to remain in the family. It is my will that my farm be sold at my wifes death & that no person outside of my children or grand child can be bidders, and which ever child or grand child may buy it that they shall have a reasonable credit on same say not less than ten years (they paying interest on it) I will to my Grand child James, William Miller a good English education a good horse saddle and bridle one bead and bedding and a home here on the place until he becomes of age. If his Father is willing for him to remain if he does not remain he is still to have what I have specified and willed him.

I wish my Executor to sell a sufficiency of my personal property such as my wife may think she can best spare to pay all my just debts

I have already given to my Son James M. Miller, Mariah Jane Russell, Isabell Aabell, Lucinda Burdett, John Miller, Artemetia Shadowens, Harriet Fulks & William D. Miller the same amt of property when they left me that I have willed to those who are single and who are herewith me now I do appoint my wife Elmyra Miller and my son Henry Miller Executors of this my last Will and Testament revoking all others heretofore made.





## The Miller Family

I have been requested to give a short brief history of the Miller family. When I say the Miller family I mean the late David Miller who lived and died on the road leading to the Horse Shoe Bend in Marion County, Kentucky, but I am asked to go back and include in this history and tell what I know of the Miller family of old, that is, David Miller's father andmother and their family. This carries one back a long ways and the more I think of the task now before me the greater the task seems but perhaps it may interest some one to read it.

I cannot give exact dates. About the year Seventeen hundred and fifty-Six or fifty-Eight a vessel of some kind came across the ocean andlanded at New York or near there. On this vessel was a family by the name of Miller. Belonging to this Miller family was a boy whose name was David and at that time young David was about Sixteen years old. On this same vessel was a family by the name of Rook. In the Rook family was a young girl whose given name was Debora. This Miller family and Rook family located somewhere in the East--I think New York State or Pennsylvania.

Now when young David Miller and Miss Debora Rook grew to manhood and womanhood they got married and left the East and went to the far west. At that time the far west was in Kentucky. So young David Miller and his bride located in What is now Nelson County, Kentucky; but they only remained in Nelson County two years. They then moved to what is now Marion County, Kentucky; but at that time it was a part of Washington County, Kentucky. David Miller and his wife bought a parcel of land near and just east of where Mrs. Cora Peterson now lives and built a hewed log house. One large room, one small room, and one open and wide fireplace in the large room, large stone chimney at end of house. In that log house this couple: David Miller andhis wife Debora, raised a family of twelve children.

When grown they all left Kentucky except two. Some went to Texas, some to Missouri, and some to Indiana. Of those who moved away the writer knows very little, except to say about forty years ago the writer visited one John Miller who was living near Sherman, Texas. Had raised a large family there. All of them at that time were married and seemed to be doing well so far as the goods of this world is concerned. Of the two that remained in Kentucky one was a girl. She got married to one Pollard Abell who was the father of the late Peter Abell.

It will be remembered by many that Peter Abell got drowned in the Rolling Fork River some thirty-five or forty years ago, near what is now known as the Theodore Spalding bridge.<sup>3</sup> Peter Abell raised a large family of children. Some of them I will speak of later on.

The other one that remained in Kentucky was David Miller, the one spoken of in the beginning of this sketch. David Miller, Jr., son of David Miller, Sr., was born in the year Seventeen hundred and ninety-nine, he beging the youngest child of the twelve raised by the senior David Miller and his wife Debora. He was raised and grown up to manhood in the log house spoken of above. Time has caused the old house to decay and fall. Nothing remains on that sacred spot to show that a house ever stood there except the pile of stone which was once the massive stone chimney.

The writer has in the long ago been in the old log house lots of times. The ground on which stood the old log house now belongs to Mrs. Cora Peterson.

The late David Miller was married at the age of twentyfour or twenty-five to Elmira Thomas who was sixteen. this union was born fourteen children: seven boys and seven 👟 Two of the boys: one, David, one Wm. Brown, died when One girl, Martha Ellen, died at the age of nine or ten years old. These all died before the writer was born. One boy, Lafayette died at the age of twenty-one or twentytwo. My best recollection Lafayette died about the year Eighteen fifty-eight. The other ten children all lived to rather old age, but all of the ten are gone except two: the writer and Henry F. Miller. The writer now lives in Tennessee, and Henry F. is in Louisville, Kentucky. Out of the family of sixteen counting parents only two remain and we like the rest will soon follow. Sad but true. The late J. M. Miller4 was the oldest child. Mariah, wife of John C. Russell was second; then comes, I think, Isabelle, wife of the late Sylvester Abell. Lucinda, wife of the late Robert Burdett, mother of the Burdette brothers now living in Marion County. John M. Miller who lived and died in state of Kansas. Artie, wife of Tke Chadoin, who lived and died in Texas. Harriet, wife of Robert Fulks. And Mary who passed away some three years ago, and the writer, Wm. D. Miller, now in Tennessee, and H. F. Miller, now in Louisville, Kentucky.

I will speak of an incident that happened to my Grandma while she andmy Grandfather was still living at the old log house above referred to. Their twelve children were all gone and the old people were living alone. I think my Grandma at this time was Eighty-five or Ninety years old. At this time I speak of, Grandfather was very old and feeble. Grandma went out to milk her cow and in some way the cow knocked her down and broke her hip. Grandfather at this time was unable to render her any assistance and my Father lived about one quarter of a mile's distance. Grandfather managed in some way to hobble to my Father's and let it be known that Grandma was badly hurt when assistance was immediately rendered. Now this happened at night and at that time the nearest physician lived at Springfield, a distance of eighteen miles so they waited until the next morning and started a man on horse back to Springfield after the doctor. Of course it took all day to go and come but the doctor reached there late in the evening. So the poor old woman laid there with a broken or misplaced hip twenty-four hours without any medical assistance. But to the great surprise of all she got well and was able to ride horseback and it was said she even run a horse race after she got well. She was a very wonderful woman, full of life, full of energy, If all her children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren could be seen together, and I will include her great-great-grandchildren, could be seen together, it would be a multitude. My grandmother Debora is the great-great-grand mother of both Willard Cowherd and wife, also the great-great-grandmother of Henry Collins and wife. Also the great-great-grandmother of Nat Tandy's wife. It will be remembered the wife of Henry Collins is the granddaughter of the late J. M. Miller. After my Grandmother got crippled my father moved the old people to his house to take care of them in their old age, where they died.

Grandfather died in the year 1848 at the age of 104. He died of old age. I have heard my mother say that Grandfather was laying on the bed, had not been sick, but made this remark: "The Lord has called and I must go." and passed away without a struggle. My Grandmother lived some time after the death of my Grandfather and died at the age of 102. So ended the life of the two old people. Both came from Germany when children. They understood the German language and talked it fluently up until their death; so I was told by my Mother and Father.

I could write for a week, but space forbids, but I desire to call attention to an old family relick; it is what is called a corner cupboard or corner press. It was made to fit the corner of a room at the time my Father moved the old people to his house, he moved, of course, what belongings the old couple had, and they owned this cupboard or press. Now that was before I was born. I was born in the year 1848, the same year my Grandfather died. My Father has told me this old corner cupboard was made during the two years that my grandparents lived in Nelson County. It is hand-made, no machine

work. I think it was put together with wood pegs instead of iron screws. It has four doors, two below and two above; two shelves below and three above. This piece of furniture has been in constant use for not less than One hundred and fifty years. (150 years)

Now, reader, if any one of us owned all the good victuals that have passed through this cupboard we would not be hunting up any kind of tobacco association in order to get a good price for our tobacco. The truth is, we would not grow any more tobacco. We would have plenty to retire on. When I left my old Kentucky home I let my two nieces, the two Burdett sisters now living in Raywick, Kentucky, have the old relick. My object in giving it to them was I wanted it to be perpetuated in the Miller family. They own this cupboard now and any one who looks at this old cupboard may fully realize that he is looking at a piece of furniture that has been in use at least 150 years.

I will state here my Father died at the age of 73 or 74. My Mother died at the age of 84. She died in September, 1891. Had been a widow Eighteen years. Both passed away at the old home now on the farm of John Clarkson.



### THE MILLER FAMILY

I have been requested to give a short brief history of the Miller family. When I say the Miller family I mean the late David Miller who lived and died on the road leading to the Horse Shoe Bend in Marion County, Kentucky, but I am asked to go back and include in this history and tell what I know of the Miller family of old, that is, David Miller's father and mother and their family. This carries one back a long ways and the more I think of the task now before me the greater the task seems but perhaps it may interest some one to read it.

I cannot give exact dates. About the year Seventeen hundred and fifty-Six or fifty-Eight a vessel of some kind came across the ocean and landed at New York or near there. On this vessel was a family by the name of Miller. Belonging to this Miller family was a boy whose name was David and at that time young David was about Sixteen years old. On this same vessel was a family by the name of Rook. In the Rook family was a young girl whose given name was Debora. This Miller family and Rook family located somewhere in the East--I think New York State or Pennsylvania.

Now when young David Miller and Miss Debora Rook grew to manhood and womanhood they got married and left the East and went to the far west. At that time the far west was in Kentucky. So young David Miller and his bride located in what is now Nelson County, Kentucky; but they only remained in Nelson County two years. They then moved to what is now Marion County, Kentucky; but at that time it was a part of Washington County, Kentucky. David Miller and his wife bought a parcel of land near and just east of where Mrs. Cora Peterson now lives and built a hewed log house. One large room, one small room, and one open and wide fireplace in the large room, large stone chimney at end of house. In that log house this couple: David Miller and his wife Debora, raised a family of twelve children.

When grown they all left Kentucky except two. Some went to Texas, some to Missouri, and some to Indiana. Of those who moved away the writer knows very little, except to say about forty years ago [c. 1881] the writer visited one John Miller who was living near Sherman, Texas. She got married to one Pollard Abell who was the father of the late Peter Abell. Peter Abell raised a large family of children. Some of

The other one that remained in Kentucky was David Miller, the one spoken of in the beginning of this sketch. David Miller, Jr., son of David Miller, Sr., was born in the year Seventeen hundred and ninety-nine, he being the youngest child of the twelve raised by the senior David Miller and his wife Debora. He was raised and grown up to manhood in the log house spoken of above. Time has caused the old house to decay and fall. Nothing remains on that sacred spot to show that a house ever stood there except the pile of stone which was once the massive stone chimney.

The writer has in the long ago been in the old log house lots of times. The ground on which stood the old log house now belongs to Mrs. Cora Peterson.

The late David Miller was married at the age of twenty-four or twenty-five to Elmira Thomas who was sixteen. To this union was born fourteen children: seven boys and seven girls. Two of the boys: one, David, one Wm. Brown, died when young. One girl, Martha Ellen, died at the age of nine or ten years old. These all died before the writer was born. One boy, Lafayette died at the age of twenty-one or twenty-two. My best recollection Lafayette died about the year Eighteen fifty-eight. The other ten children all lived to rather old age, but all of the ten are gone except two: the writer and Henry F. Miller. The writer now lives



Dear Bill:

I was unable to find a listing for JOHN LUTHER MILLER in the "Report of the Adjutant General of the State of Kentucky: Civil War -Confederate" vol. 1 and 2. I found J.L. MILLER on several pages; however both entries were enlisted at Camp Boone, TN in Co I, Third Regiment with one entry having: Company I, Third Regiment temporarily attached to Company D by order of Brigadier General William Preston; and the other entry: Company I, Third Regiment Infantry (Mounted), Kentucky Volunteers, Confederate States Army. I found two listings for JAMES MILLER (neither enlisted in Lebanon, KY): One enlisted at Beaver, Ky. in Company I, Fifth Regiment Infantry, Kentucky Volunteers and the other enlisted in Mulberry, TN in Company E, Ninth Regiment Infantry, Kentucky Volunteers.

I ask a local Civil War historian if he knew the Regiments that took enlistments in Lebanon, KY and he said most recruiting was done in Washington County (Springfield, KY), however for a short period of time two units were operating out of Lebanon. From Sept. 7, 1862 to Oct. 5, 1862, W.W. Cleaver's unit and a Colonel Scott's unit were at Lebanon. I have enclosed copies of Cleaver's regiment; however there were so many entries under the Surname Scott, without knowing what his first name was I did not know which entry was the right one.

I am sorry I could not find more information. I hope this will be helpful to you.
