I am trying to find any information on an old Kentucky family by the name of Million.

More specifically any information on two sisters, Nancy Million born in 1825, and Frances Marie Million born in 1834. Both were born in Kentucky. Their parents were originally from Virginia, but they "removed from Virginia to Kentucky where they were extensive slave owners and cotton planters." 1

Very little is known about Nancy and Frances Marie Million's childhood, their parents, brothers or sisters, and relatives living in Kentucky.

I have enclosed photocopied pages of a book entitled "St. Paul, Oregon 1830 - 1890". These pages contain a brief history of Nancy Millions' where-abouts in latter life. I have also enclosed a family group sheet listing her husband and children.
