MINOR FAMILY GENEALOGY

- 1. Meindort Doodes, a Dutch sea captain, settled along the Rappahannock River in Eastern Virginia about 1650 in a section which was included in the County of Middlesex when it was formed from Lancaster County in 1673. According to the late Charles Minor Blackford, of Lynchburg, a descendant of his, he had previously married Mary Geret, member of a family of some social and political distinction in Holland. His will was proved in Middlesex County December 13, 1677. Four years previously, he had been naturalized by Act of the House of Burgesses. At the same time, his son, Meindort Doodes, Jr., was also naturalized, adopting the name of Doodes Minor. In an article contributed to the Virginia Magazine of History and Biography (Vol. X, page 97), Charles Minor Blackford said that whether Minor was another term for Younger or whether it was a corruption of Meindort was not apparent. Meindort appears also in the records as Meinnert and Meinute.
- 2. In the Genealogy of Members of the Sons of the Revolution in the State of Virginia, Doodes Minor (1640-1694-5) is listed as having married Elizabeth Cocke (probably a daughter of Maurice Cocke, of Middlesex). Other authorities credit him with having married Mary Montague, daughter of Peter Montague, son of Peter Montague, immigrant, founder of the Virginia family of that name. Doodes Minor's will was proved in Middlesex County May 27, 1695. Mentioned in the will were one daughter, Elizabeth, who married Tobias Mickleborough, and five sons, Minor (1), William, Garrett (corruption of Geret), John and Peter.
- 3. Garrett Minor who became justice of the peace and sheriff of Middlesex married Diana Vivian, daughter of John Vivian and Margaret, his wife, October 17, 1706. She died April 16, 1718. Baptized April 13, 1679, he died February 2, 1720.
- 4. John Minor (1707-1755), of Caroline County, married Sarah Carr, daughter of Thomas Carr and Mary Dabney, his wife. John Minor's will was proved September 2, 1755. By his marriage to Sarah Carr, he had the following issue: John Minor, Thomas Carr Minor, William Minor, Garrett Minor, James Minor, Dabney Minor, Vivian Minor, Peter Minor, Mary Minor, Elizabeth Minor.
- 5. Garrett Minor (1743-1799), of "Sunning Hill," Louisa County, married Mary Overton Terrell, of Louisa, May 8, 1769. To this union were born the following children: Rebecca Minor, Ann Minor, Elizabeth Minor, Peter Minor, James Minor, Louisa Minor, Samuel Minor, Mary Minor, Sally Minor, Patsy Minor, Garrett Minor, Mildred Minor, Thomas Minor, and Jane Minor. Mary Overton Terrell (1750-1830) was a daughter of Richmond Terrell and Mary Overton, his wife. Garrett Minor, her husband, served as major of militia in the Revolution.
- 6. Peter Minor married Lucy Gilmer, daughter of George Gilmer, soldier of the Revolution, who marched from Charlottesville to Williamsburg

with a company of volunteers of which he was lieutenant at the outbreak of the war in 1775. Hugh Minor, of Cannel City, Kentucky, was admitted to membership in the Society of the Sons of the Revolution in the State of Kentucky by establishing his descent from George Gilmer through Peter Minor and Lucy Gilmer, his wife.

7. William Minor, elder brother of Garrett Minor (1743-1799), was born August 30, 1738. Trace of him appears to have been lost. It is possible that he may have been the father of Jacob Minor who enlisted for service in the Revolution at Chesterfield County Courthouse September 2, 1780. Though Jacob Minor gave Powhatan as the county of his residence, he was listed as a native of Amelia County. There is no record in Amelia County, however, disclosing the name of his father, nor is there any record of his family in Powhatan, so far as can be ascertained. There is a partial sketch of the Minor family in Malcolm Harris History of Louisa County, but the name of Jacob Minor does not appear in it.

Kentucky Branch - Minor Family

8. Jacob Minor was the individual from whom the Minors in Kentucky had their beginning. The following information (indented) with respect to him was furnished by The National Archives, Washington, D. C.

Parents: Names are not stated.

Birth: Date and place are not stated. In a document dated September 14, 1829, the veteran's age appears as about 70 years.

Service (in Revolutionary War): When this veteran applied for pension in September 1829 it was stated: That he enlisted in the year 1780 "in the Virginia Line", served as Private under Captains Turpin and Harrison in Colonel Davis' Regiment, was transferred to Captain S. Stribling's Company and continued to serve until January 18, 1782, when he was discharged at Salisbury, North Carolina, having served 18 months.

Pension: Certificate No. 20 092 was issued January 23, 1830, to Jacob Minor, rate \$8 per month, commenced January 23, 1830, acts of March 18, 1818, and May 1, 1820, Kentucky Agency.

Family: In 1829 the veteran stated that his wife had died "some years ago", also that his children "married many years ago & left him." However, he did not mention any of their names. In October 1829 Larkin Minor

stated in Green County, Kentucky, that he was acquainted with the veteran in 1780. He did not mention any relationship to him.

Residences: He was "in the State of Virginia" when he entered service, exact residence not shown. In 1829 he resided in Casey County, Kentucky.

Death: Date and place are not stated.

Lineage Book, Daughters of the American Revolution, Volume 95, page 232, shows the following: "Jacob Minor (1761-1838), soldier of the Revolution, married Pittman. He served as a private in Captains Turpin, Harrison, and Stribling Companies, Colonel Davis' Virginia Regiment and was allowed a pension for his services in 1829 while a resident of Casey County, Ky."

Records in the archives division of the State Library of Virginia show that Jacob Minor of Powhatan County, Virginia, enlisted as a soldier of infantry September 2, 1780, at Chesterfield County Courthouse for a term of one year and six months. He gave his age as 17 and he was recorded as being five feet, eight inches tall, with dark hair and gray eyes. (C. S. 12-28). The records show further that on March 12, 1783, he was paid 36 pounds for his services, the money being delivered at the State Auditor's Office to William Elam. (War 4264). These records do not show what became of him after his service in the war. Moreover, there is a discrepancy in the year of birth in that if he was 17 years old at the time of his enlistment in 1780, as the records state, he was born in 1763, whereas, the year of birth of Jacob Minor in Casey County, Kentucky, was given as 1761. It seems evident that a mistake exists in one or the other, and may have come about through a misstatement of his age at the time of enlistment or in remembering in his old age the year of his birth. Also it is evident that the Jacob Minor who enlisted as shown in this record and the Jacob Minor who applied for a pension from Casey County, Kentucky, in 1829 are one and the same since the records available show but one Jacob Minor from Virginia who served in the Revolutionary War.

Sometime after his discharge from service in 1782, and it may be assumed after March 12, 1783, when he was paid 36 pounds for his service, Jacob Minor went to Kentucky. I (Claude Dryden Minor) have often heard my father say that "Old Jacob", as he always called him, located on Minor's Branch, a tributary of the North Rolling Fork, in Casey County, Kentucky. Jacob married a woman by the name of Pittman, whose first name is not shown by available records. They had two children: a son named William and a daughter. Apparently there is no information concerning the name of the daughter or what became of her. However, William Minor married Mary Rains and they had 12 children, as is shown subsequently.

It is unfortunate that the records do not show the names of the parents of Jacob Minor, as this makes a gap in the family line from Meindort Doodes down to the present generations. It is a logical presumption, however, that his father was William Minor (7 above). This presumption is strengthened by the fact that Jacob named his son William, it being a somewhat universal practice in those days for a son to give his father's name to his first born son; thus the grandson took the name of the grandfather. Also it is unfortunate that there is nothing in the records to show the name of William Minor's wife, the mother of Jacob. The presumption under discussion is further strengthened by the fact that William, Jacob's father, had an elder brother named Garrett. This name in the family was perpetuated when Milton Minor, one of Jacob's grandsons, named one of his sons Garrett Logan.

- 9. William Minor (Jacob's son) married Mary Rains. Mary Rains was the daughter of James Rains. James Rains was a soldier of the Revolution, was born in March 1757, and died in March 1846. He married Nancy Owens, a daughter of a sister of Simon Kenton. William Minor and Mary Rains Minor had 12 childred as follows:
 - Addison Minor, married Nancy Goode, had 12 children; Mary E. Minor, married John D. Johnson, 12 children; Timothy Minor, died single; Cecelia Minor, married John Isham, no children; Julia Minor, married Joseph Shannon, 5 children, second marriage, Josh Myers, 8 children; James Minor, married Elizabeth Weatherford, had children (names and number unknown); Lafayette Minor, married Sarah Johnson, 2 children; John B. Minor, married Marion Woodson, 2 children; Aaron B. Minor, married Mollie Penn, 6 children; Martha Minor, married J. L, Rawlins, 7 children; Tabitha Minor, married Brack Overstreet, 5 children; Ann Lou Minor, married Lycurgus Elder, 1 child; Ellen Minor, married Hence Burk, 4 children.
 - (muster (netholist) Reuben Minor, married Ellen Findley, had three children: Rebecca A. Minor, married William Rains, 14 children; Mary E. Minor, married James Curtis, 9 children; Reuben Minor, married Paralee Elder, 9 children.
 - Jacob Minor, died single at the age of 23 years.
 - (4) Milton Minor, who was born June 15, 1815, and died July 1, 1867, married Elizabeth Prewitt, who was born June 15, 1814, and died August 4, 1895. They had 9 children as follows: William H. Minor, who was born July 6, 1837, married Minerva Philipps, 1 child; Nancy J. Minor, was was born May 29, 1839, married Abe Whitenack, 10 children; James Marrey Minor who was born May 25 1861 oct 186 Harvey Minor, who was born May 25, 1841, married Sarah Taylor, 6 children; Garrett Logan Minor, who was born January 13, 1844, married municipality Nancy Logan Johnson, 10 children; Thomas H. Minor, who was born Minor, who was born October 4, 1848, married Hamilton May, 7 children; Mary Tittitha Sarah E. Minor, who was born February 22, 1851 Sarah E. Minor, who was born February 22, 1851, married Hardin Purdom, is now were a sum of the sum

5 children; Milton M. Minor, who was born February 24, 1854, drowned when he was about 3 years of age; Frances Ellen Minor, who was born December 29, 1856, married William T. May, 5 children.

Note: Information as to the dates of birth of the children of Milton and Elizabeth Minor are taken from the records in the old family Bible of Garrett Logan Minor (which bears publisher's date of 1891). Said dates are not in his handwriting but believed to be accurate.

- (5) James Minor, married Martha Taylor. They had one child, John W. Minor, who died at the age of 23 years.
- (6) Obediah Minor, first married Nancy Prewitt, had one child; married second, Ellen Russell, had 5 children. His children were: Susanne Minor, married George Mills, 5 children; Laban J. Minor, died single; Christopher Columbus Minor, married Alice Survant, one child; Amanda Minor, married Clinton K. Purdom, 3 children; William R. Minor, married Minnie Gibson, one child; Rebecca Minor, married George Gibson, 6 children.
- (7) Elizabeth Minor, married D. M. Purdom, had 8 children as follows: Louisa Purdom, died at 12 years of age; Margaret Purdom, married Ralph Ellis, 6 children; Sarah Purdom, married John McCarty, 11 children; Robert Purdom, married Baker, 5 children; William Purdom, married Belle Powar, 3 children; James Purdom, married Letha, 4 children; Melissa Purdom, married Green, no children; Nancy Purdom, married Len Taylor, 6 children.
- (8) Margaret Minor, married Hiram Goode, had 8 children, as follows: Frances Goode, married Dood Hourigan, 3 children; Beersheba Goode, married Henley Crowders, no children; Elizabeth Goode, married Henley Nash, 3 children; Delila Godde, married in Texas but no information as to whom she married or whether there were children; William Goode, no information as to marriage or children; John K. Goode, no information as to marriage or children; Martha Goode, no information as to marriage or children.
 - (9) Mary J. Minor, married Garrett Clarkson, had 12 children as follows: Nancy M. Clarkson, married Appolus Hourigan, 7 children; Thomas Clarkson, married first Martha Guthrie, 3 children, married second Miss Hamner, no children; Happy Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children; William R. Clarkson, married Fanny Sinkhorn, no children; Mary Clarkson, married William Taylor, 4 children; George Clarkson, married Elizabeth Kirkland, 2 children; Martha Clarkson, married Isaac Spiers, 7 children; Richard Clarkson, died at age of 21; James Clarkson, married Elizabeth Anderson, 4 children; Jane Clarkson, married Robert Overstreet, 3 children; John Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children; Sam Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children.

- (10) Beersheba Minor, married W. F. Clarkson, had 7 children as follows: U. C. Clarkson, married a Miss Murrell, 6 children; J. A. Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children; Mary M. Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children; Elizabeth Clarkson, married

 Johnson, no information as to children; Millard F. Clarkson, twice married but no information as to names of his wives, said to have had 3 children; Sophronia Clarkson, married

 Wingate, 1 child; Frank Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children.
- (11) Gilbert Minor, married Lucinda Purdom, had 4 children as follows: Robert W. Minor, who never married; Abe J. Minor, married Ellen Rogers, 1 child; Jefferson D. Minor, who never married; Lee Minor, married Elizabeth Whitehouse, 3 children.
- (12) William Minor, married Martha Taylor, had 7 children as follows: Taylor Minor, no information as to whom he married but said to have married and had 3 children; Mollie Minor, married J. C. B. Harmon, 5 children; Sam Minor, no information as to marriage or children; John Minor, married Mary Baxter, 2 children; Ella Minor, no information as to marriage or children; Lula Minor, no information as to marriage or children.

Note: Much of the information as to the children of William and Mary Rains Minor came from "History of Rains-Minor Family as Compiled by Captain William Rains", first published in the March 14, 1897, issue of the Louisville Courier-Journal, and subsequently published in the July 24, 1931, issue of the Harrodsburg Herald, Harrodsburg, Kentucky. Captain Rains was a soldier in the Mexican War and was Captain of Company B, First Kentucky Cavalry, Wooford's Regiment, in the War Between the States. The information as compiled by Captain Rains is not only incomplete, as appears above, but unquestionably it is inaccurate to some degree. The allegation as to inaccuracy is made because I found it to be incorrect in several instances of which I have accurate, personal knowledge.

Genealogy of Garrett Logan Minor Family

10. Milton M. Minor (father of Garrett Logan Minor) was son of William Minor and Mary Rains Minor and grandson of Jacob Minor and Pittman Minor. He was born June 15, 1815, in Casey County, Kentucky, and died July 1, 1867, in Boyle County, Kentucky. He married Elizabeth Prewitt (who was the mother of his nine children, as stated previously) who was born June 15, 1814, in Marion County, Kentucky, and died August 4, 1895, in Boyle County, Kentucky.

William Green Johnson (father of Nancy Logan Johnson, who became the wife of Garrett Logan Minor) was born February 6, 1823, in Casey County, Kentucky. He died December 20, 1890, in Casey County, Kentucky. He married Lucinda Peyton, who was born September 2, 1829, in Casey County, Kentucky, and died in that County and State November 30, 1894. William Green Johnson and Lucinda Peyton Johnson had

13 children as follows: Nancy Logan Johnson, who married Garrett Logan Minor, 10 children; Belle Johnson, who married Clay Bottoms, 3 children; Sarah Johnson, who married Lafayette Minor, 2 children; Martha Johnson, who married James Matthew Kirkland, 3 children; Mary Johnson, who married Joel Weatherford, 2 children; Georgie Johnson, who married Frank Penn, 2 children; Hester Johnson, who married Milton May, 3 children; Dillie Johnson, who married Andrew J. May, no children; John Crittenden Johnson, who married Lula Raley, no children; Robert Johnson, who married Florence Minks, 5 children; James Johnson, who married Melvina Spiers, 5 children; Samuel Johnson, who married Sarah Penn, 5 children; Kelly Johnson, who died single at age of about 21.

Note: The foregoing information as to whom the children of William Green Johnson and Lucinda Peyton Johnson married and the number of children they had is entirely from my memory (except as to Nancy Logan Johnson). In some instances the data may be inaccurate as to the number of children they had. (C. D. M. October 1957).

- 11. Garratt Logan Minor was born January 13, 1844, in Boyle County, Kentucky. He died September 3, 1934, at Perryville, Boyle County, Kentucky, where he is buried. He married Nancy Logan Johnson, who was born June 9, 1849, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died June 15, 1917, at Perryville, Boyle County, Kentucky, where she is buried. Garrett Logan Minor and Nancy Logan Johnson were married by John Kirk, a Methodist minister, on August 30, 1866, at the home of William Green Johnson on Little South Fork, in Casey County, Kentucky. They had 10 children as follows:
 - (1) William Milton Minor, who was born July 29, 1867, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died at Bowling Green, Kentucky, July 3, 1938, where he is buried. He married Lula Murphy of Casey County, Kentucky, January 29, 1891, who died February 16, 1955, at Bowling Green, Kentucky, where she is buried. They had 5 children, three of whom are living.
 - (2) Lillie Bell Minor, who was born September 10, 1868, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died May 11, 1917, at Wichita Falls, Texas, where she is buried. She married James A. Thornton of Bradfordsville, Marion County, Kentucky, May 31, 1893, and who died within recent years, exact date unknown to me. They had 3 children, two of whom are living.
 - (3) Martha Ellen Minor, who was born October 27, 1870, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died December 9, 1948, at Lebanon, Kentucky, where she is buried. She married Quint Anderson of Casey County, Kentucky, December 20, 1888, and who died March 26, 1948, at Lebanon, Kentucky, where he is buried. They had 3 children, two of whom are living.
 - (4) John Harvey Minor, who was born May 8, 1872, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died at or near Bradenton, Florida, January 27,

1947, where he is buried. He married Juda Lane of Casey County, Kentucky, September 26, 1895, and who died September 12, 1912, on Little South Fork, Casey County, Kentucky, where she is buried. They had 3 children, all of whom are living. John married a second time but information as to name of woman he married (in Florida) and date are unknown to me. No children from second marriage.

- (5) Mittie Lee Minor, who was born December 25, 1873, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died June 28, 1945, at Junction City, Kentucky, where she is buried. She married John D. Alstott of Casey County, Kentucky, March 22, 1893, and who died June 7, 1915, and is buried at Perryville, Kentucky. They had 5 children, 3 of whom are living.
- (6) Hester Ann Minor, who was born May 21, 1876, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died November 20, 1946, on Little South Fork in Casey County, Kentucky, where she is buried. She married George W. Porter of Casey County, Kentucky, November 7, 1893, who died 19___, on Little South Fork in Casey County, Kentucky, where he was buried. They had 3 children, one of whom is living.
- (7) Samuel T. Minor, who was born January 3, 1878, and died September 14, 1883, in Casey County, Kentucky.
- (8) Sonia M. Minor, who was born May 8, 1879, and died September 21, 1883, in Casey County, Kentucky.
- (9) Bettie L. Minor, who was born April 11, 1885, and died September 18, 1886, in Casey County, Kentucky.
- (10) Claude Dryden Minor, who was born January 15, 1888. He married Lens Robertson Hooe January 22, 1911, who died June 3, 1952, at Rich-Mond, Virginia, and is buried at Perryville, Kentucky. They had no children, but adopted a son. Second married was to Martha Virginia Hannah of Richmond, Virginia, on April 29, 1953.

Note: Most of the foregoing information with respect to the family of Garrett Logan Minor is taken from the records he made in the old family Bible, which bears publisher's date of 1891. All names and dates in such record are in his handwriting, except those dates after 1930.

On the basis of this genealogy, any descendant of William Minor and Mary Rains Minor is eligible to become a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, if a woman, or the Society of the Sons of the Revolution or the Sons of the American Revolution, if a man. This is true because eligibility for membership in those organizations is contingent upon the fact that the applicant is a descendant of one who was a soldier who saw service on behalf of the Colonies in the Revolutionary War. As shown above, Jacob Minor, from whom the Kentucky branch of the Minor family descended, was such a soldier; and, Mary Rains, who married William Minor (Jacob's son), was the daughter of

James Rains who was such a soldier. In fact, I am a member of the Society of the Sons of the Revolution, and for the past several years I have been Chancellor of the Virginia Branch or Society of that organization.

In order that this genealogy may be as accurate as possible, I should say that the information with respect to Meindort Doodes, Doodes Minor, Garrett Minor, John Minor, Garrett Minor of "Sunning Hill", Peter Minor, and William Minor (Items 1 through 7 - the Virginia Minors) was furnished me by John Patterson Madison of Richmond, Virginia, in 1944, about the time I became a member of the Society of the Sons of the Revolution. Mr. Madison was born August 26, 1874, and died some six or eight years ago. He was considered an authoritative genealogist and did the research for me in an effort to determine, if possible, the names of the parents of Jacob Minor.





Stephens-Humphreys

The Stephens and Humphreys were intermarried with the Boones. They lived in Union Township, west of Amity, near Exeter. When Joshua Stephens, Jr., lived in Kentucky, Daniel Boone was a frequent visitor at his house and always styled him "cousin." After the Stephenes moved to Ohio, John Stephens often went back to Kentucky on visits to the Humphreys, near Lexington. The families of Jonathan and Joshua Humphreys lived in the vicinity of Lexington. In a letter from B. A. Cecil Stephens, secretary of the Historical Society of southern California, he says:

"Dr. Lyman C. Draper, the Wisconsin historian, assured me that Boone was born in Berks County, Pennsylvania, and cited me a large number of Boone manuscripts, which he had in his possession at his home in Madison Exeter Township; which was settled by George Boone, the grandfather of Daniel, in 1717. Amity Township joins it on the south. In that township lived the Lincolns, the ancestors of the president, who were intermarried with the Boones."

Darke

William Darke was born in Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania, in 1736. In 1740 his parents moved to Virginia. He was with Virginia troops at Braddock's defeat in 1755, and a captain at the beginning of the Revolutionary War. He was taken prisoner at Germantown and released, and was colonel commanding at the surrender of Cornwallis. He, in 1791, commanded

Stout

John Stout, son of Col. Joseph, was born 1706, died July 27, 1761; and married Catharine Stout, daughter of Richard Stout, who was the second son of Richard and Penelope Van Princis Stout. John and Catharine Stout had a daughter, Mary, who married Obadiah Holmes, grandson of Obadiah Holmes, who was put in stocks in Boston for preaching. Ruth Stout, another daughter, married Rev. John Sutton. They came to Kentucky in 1788 and settled at or near Mortons-ville, Woodford County, Kentucky. Here John Sutton led off an emancipation movement. John and Ruth had John Sutton, born September 15, 1772, married Mary De Loch; David; Jehu, went to Indiana; Rhoda, married a Wilson, went to Woodford County, Kentucky; Katie, married a Petty, went to Anderson County, Kentucky; and Isaac, married a Jefries.

Minor-Gatewood

Thomas Henry Gatewood was the son of Lucy (Street) and William Kemp Gatewood and grandson of William Kemp Gatewood, Sr., and his. wife, Barbara Minor; daughter of Maj. John Minor, of Caroline County, Virginia. The mother of William K. Gatewood, Sr., was a Dandridge. Thomas Henry Gatewood married Sallie Watson Crutchfield, daughter of Stapleton Crutchfield and Mary Ann Alsop. Stapleton Crutchfield's parents were Stapleton Crutchfield, Sr., and Elizabeth Lewis Minor of Sunning Hill, Louisa

County, Virginia. His grandparents were William Crutchfield and Jane Norman.

Smith

William Smith was born January 7, 1775. He married Mary Birans, who was born July 2, 1777. They were married on November 3, 1801. They were of Scotch-English descent and lived in Frederick, Maryland. After their marriage they moved to Bourbon or Nicholas County, Kentucky.

MINOR FAMILY GENEALOGY

- 1. Meindort Doodes, a Dutch sea captain, settled along the Rappahannock River in Eastern Virginia about 1650 in a section which was included in the County of Middlesex when it was formed from Lancaster County in 1673. According to the late Charles Minor Blackford, of Lynchburg, a descendant of his, he had previously married Mary Geret, member of a family of some social and political distinction in Holland. His will was proved in Middlesex County December 13, 1677. Four years previously, he had been naturalized by Act of the House of Burgesses. At the same time, his son, Neindort Doodes, Jr., was also naturalized, adopting the name of Doodes Minor. In an article contributed to the Virginia Magazine of History and Biography (Vol. X, page 97), Charles Minor Blackford said that whether Minor was another term for Younger or whether it was a corruption of Meindort was not apparent. Meindort appears also in the records as Meinnert and Meinute.
- 2. In the Genealogy of Members of the Sons of the Revolution in the State of Virginia, Doodes Minor (1640-1694-5) is listed as having married Elizabeth Cocke (probably a daughter of Maurice Cocke, of Middlesex). Other authorities credit him with having married Mary Montague, daughter of Peter Montague, son of Peter Montague, immigrant, founder of the Virginia family of that name. Doodes Minor's will was proved in Middlesex County May 27, 1695. Mentioned in the will were one daughter, Elizabeth, who married Tobias Mickleborough, and five sons, Minor (1), William, Garrett (corruption of Geret), John and Peter.
- 3. Garrett Minor who became justice of the peace and sheriff of Middlesex married Diana Vivian, daughter of John Vivian and Margaret, his wife, October 17, 1706. She died April 16, 1718. Baptized April 13, 1679, he died February 2, 1720.
- 4. John Minor (1707-1755), of Caroline County, married Sarah Carr, daughter of Thomas Carr and Mary Dabney, his wife. John Minor's will was proved September 2, 1755. By his marriage to Sarah Carr, he had the following issue: John Minor, Thomas Carr Minor, William Minor, Garrett Minor, James Minor, Dabney Minor, Vivian Minor, Peter Minor, Mary Minor, Elizabeth Minor.
- Mary Overton Terrell, of Louisa, May 8, 1769. To this union were born the following children: Rebecca Minor, Ann Minor, Elizabeth Minor, Peter Minor, James Minor, Louisa Minor, Samuel Minor, Mary Minor, Sally Minor, Patsy Minor, Garrett Minor, Mildred Minor, Thomas Minor, and Jane Minor. Mary Overton Terrell (1750-1830) was a daughter of Richmond Terrell and Mary Overton, his wife. Garrett Minor, her husband, served as major of militia in the Revolution.
- 6. Peter Minor married Lucy Gilmer, daughter of George Gilmer, soldier of the Revolution, who marched from Charlottesville to Williamsburg

stated in Green County, Kentucky, that he was acquainted with the veteran in 1780. He did not mention any relationship to him.

Residences: He was "in the State of Virginia" when he entered service, exact residence not shown. In 1829 he resided in Casey County, Kentucky.

Death: Date and place are not stated.

Lineage Book, Daughters of the American Revolution, Volume 95, page 232, shows the following: "Jacob Minor (1761-1838), soldier of the Revolution, married Pittman. He served as a private in Captains Turpin, Harrison, and Stribling Companies, Colonel Davis' Virginia Regiment and was allowed a pension for his services in 1829 while a resident of Casey County, Ky."

Records in the archives division of the State Library of Virginia show that Jacob Minor of Powhatan County, Virginia, enlisted as a soldier of infantry September 2, 1780, at Chesterfield County Courthouse for a term of one year and six months. He gave his age as 17 and he was recorded as being five feet, eight inches tall, with dark hair and gray eyes. (C. S. 12-28). The records show further that on March 12, 1783, he was paid 36 pounds for his services, the money being delivered at the State Auditor's Office to William Elam. (War 4264). These records do not show what became of him after his service in the war. Moreover, there is a discrepancy in the year of birth in that if he was 17 years old at the time of his enlistment in 1780, as the records state, he was born in 1763, whereas, the year of birth of Jacob Minor in Casey County, Kentucky, was given as 1761. It seems evident that a mistake exists in one or the other, and may have come about through a misstatement of his age at the time of enlistment or in remembering in his old age the year of his birth. Also it is evident that the Jacob Minor who enlisted as shown in this record and the Jacob Minor who applied for a pension from Casey County, Kentucky, in 1829 are one and the same since the records available show but one Jacob Minor from Virginia who served in the Revolutionary War.

Sometime after his discharge from service in 1782, and it may be assumed after March 12, 1783, when he was paid 36 pounds for his service, Jacob Minor went to Kentucky. I (Claude Dryden Minor) have often heard my father say that "Old Jacob", as he always called him, located on Minor's Branch, a tributary of the North Rolling Fork, in Casey County, Kentucky. Jacob married a woman by the name of Pittman, whose first name is not shown by available records. They had two children: a son named William and a daughter. Apparently there is no information concerning the name of the daughter or what became of her. However, William Minor married Mary Rains and they had 12 children, as is shown subsequently.

5 children; Milton M. Minor, who was born February 24, 1854, drowned when he was about 3 years of age; Frances Ellen Minor, who was born December 29, 1856, married William T. May, 5 children.

Note: Information as to the dates of birth of the children of Milton and Elizabeth Minor are taken from the records in the old family Bible of Garrett Logan Minor (which bears publisher's date of 1891). Said dates are not in his handwriting but believed to be accurate.

- (5) James Minor, married Martha Taylor. They had one child, John W. Minor, who died at the age of 23 years.
- (6) Obediah Minor, first married Nancy Previtt, had one child; married second, Ellen Russell, had 5 children. His children were: Susanne Minor, married George Mills, 5 children; Laban J. Minor, died single; Christopher Columbus Minor, married Alice Survant, one child; Amanda Minor, married Clinton K. Purdom, 3 children; William R. Minor, married Minnie Gibson, one child; Rebecca Minor, married George Gibson, 6 children.
- (7) Elizabeth Minor, married D. M. Purdom, had 8 children as follows: Louisa Purdom, died at 12 years of age; Margaret Purdom, married Ralph Ellis, 6 children; Sarah Purdom, married John McCarty, 11 children; Robert Purdom, married Baker, 5 children; William Purdom, married Belle Powar, 3 children; James Purdom, married Letha children; Melissa Purdom, married Green, no children; Nancy Purdom, married Len Taylor, 6 children.
- (8) Margaret Minor, married Hiram Goode, had 8 children, as follows: Frances Goode, married Dood Hourigan, 3 children; Beersheba Goode, married Henley Crowders, no children; Elizabeth Goode, married Henley Nash, 3 children; Delila Godde, married in Texas but no information as to whom she married or whether there were children; William Goode, no information as to marriage or children; John K. Goode, no information as to marriage or children; Martha Goode, no information as to marriage or children; James Goode, no information as to marriage or children.
 - (9) Mary J. Minor, married Garrett Clarkson, had 12 children as follows: Nancy M. Clarkson, married Appolus Hourigan, 7 children; Thomas Clarkson, married first Martha Guthrie, 3 children, married second Miss Hamner, no children; Happy Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children; William R. Clarkson, married Fanny Sinkhorn, no children; Mary Clarkson, married William Taylor, 4 children; George Clarkson, married Elizabeth Kirkland, 2 children; Martha Clarkson, married Isaac Spiers, 7 children; Richard Clarkson, died at age of 21; James Clarkson, married Elizabeth Anderson, 4 children; Jane Clarkson, married Robert Overstreet, 3 children; John Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children; Sam Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children; Sam Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children.

13 children as follows: Nancy Logan Johnson, who married Garrett Logan Minor, 10 children; Belle Johnson, who married Clay Bottoms, 3 children; Sarah Johnson, who married Lafayette Minor, 2 children; Martha Johnson, who married James Matthew Kirkland, 3 children; Mary Johnson, who married Joel Weatherford, 2 children; Georgie Johnson, who married Frank Penn, 2 children; Hester Johnson, who married Milton May, 3 children; Dillie Johnson, who married Andrew J. May, no children; John Crittenden Johnson, who married Lula Raley, no children; Robert Johnson, who married Florence Minks, 5 children; James Johnson, who married Melvina Spiers, 5 children; Samuel Johnson, who married Sarah Penn, 5 children; Kelly Johnson, who died single at age of about 21.

Note: The foregoing information as to whom the children of William Green Johnson and Lucinda Peyton Johnson married and the number of children they had is entirely from my memory (except as to Nancy Logan Johnson). In some instances the data may be inaccurate as to the number of children they had. (C. D. M. October 1957).

- 11. Garrett Logan Minor was born January 13, 1844, in Boyle County, Kentucky. He died September 3, 1934, at Perryville, Boyle County, Kentucky, where he is buried. He married Nancy Logan Johnson, who was born June 9. 1849, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died June 15, 1917, at Perryville, Boyle County, Kentucky, where she is buried. Garrett Logan Minor and Nancy Logan Johnson were married by John Kirk, a Methodist minister, on August 30, 1866, at the home of William Green Johnson on Little South Fork, in Casey County, Kentucky. They had 10 children as follows:
 - (1) William Milton Minor, who was born July 29, 1867, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died at Bowling Green, Kentucky, July 3, 1938, where he is buried. He married Lula Murphy of Casey County, Kentucky, January 29, 1891, who died February 16, 1955, at Bowling Green, Kentucky, where she is buried. They had 5 children, three of whom are living.
 - (2) Lillie Bell Minor, who was born September 10, 1868, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died May 11, 1917, at Wichita Falls, Texas, where she is buried. She married James A. Thornton of Bradfordsville, Marion County, Kentucky, May 31, 1893, and who died within recent years, exact date unknown to me. They had 3 children, two of whom are living.
 - (3) Martha Ellen Minor, who was born October 27, 1870, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died December 9, 1948, at Lebanon, Kentucky, where she is buried. She married Quint Anderson of Casey County, Kentucky, December 20, 1888, and who died March 26, 1948, at Lebanon, Kentucky, where he is buried. They had 3 children, two of whom are living.
 - (4) John Harvey Minor, who was born May 8, 1872, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died at or near Bradenton, Florida, January 27,

James Rains who was such a soldier. In fact, I am a member of the Society of the Sons of the Revolution, and for the past several years I have been Chancellor of the Virginia Branch or Society of that organization.

In order that this genealogy may be as accurate as possible, I should say that the information with respect to Meindort Doodes, Doodes Minor, Garrett Minor, John Minor, Garrett Minor of "Sunning Hill", Peter Minor, and William Minor (Items 1 through 7 - the Virginia Minors) was furnished me by John Patterson Madison of Richmond, Virginia, in 1944, about the time I became a member of the Society of the Sons of the Revolution. Mr. Madison was born August 26, 1874, and died some six or eight years ago. He was considered an authoritative genealogist and did the research for me in an effort to determine, if possible, the names of the parents of Jacob Minor.



Some of the approximately 45 graves marked by field stone are identified. Known to be buried on this farm about one mile east of this cemetery is a *Cooley* man's grave that is piled with stones.

MINOR FAMILY GENEALOGY

- 1. Meindort Doodes, a Dutch sea captain, settled along the Rappahannock River in Eastern Virginia about 1650 in a section which was included in the County of Middlesex when it was formed from Lancaster County in 1673. According to the late Charles Minor Blackford, of Lynchburg, a descendant of his, he had previously married Mary Geret, member of a family of some social and political distinction in Holland. His will was proved in Middlesex County December 13, 1677. Four years previously, he had been naturalized by Act of the House of Burgesses. At the same time, his son, Meindort Doodes, Jr., was also naturalized, adopting the name of Doodes Minor. In an article contributed to the Virginia Magazine of History and Biography (Vol. X, page 97), Charles Minor Blackford said that whether Minor was another term for Younger or whether it was a corruption of Meindort was not apparent. Meindort appears also in the records as Meinnert and Meinute.
- 2. In the Genealogy of Members of the Sons of the Revolution in the State of Virginia, Doodes Minor (1640-1694-5) is listed as having married Elizabeth Cocke (probably a daughter of Maurice Cocke, of Middlesex). Other authorities credit him with having married Mary Montague, daughter of Peter Montague, son of Peter Montague, immigrant, founder of the Virginia family of that name. Doodes Minor's will was proved in Middlesex County May 27, 1695. Mentioned in the will were one daughter, Elizabeth, who married Tobias Mickleborough, and five sons, Minor (1), William, Garrett (corruption of Geret), John and Peter.
- 3. Garrett Minor who became justice of the peace and sheriff of Middlesex married Diana Vivian, daughter of John Vivian and Margaret, his wife, October 17, 1706. She died April 16, 1718. Baptized April 13, 1679, he died February 2, 1720.
- 4. John Minor (1707-1755), of Caroline County, married Sarah Carr, daughter of Thomas Carr and Mary Dabney, his wife. John Minor's will was proved September 2, 1755. By his marriage to Sarah Carr, he had the following issue: John Minor, Thomas Carr Minor, William Minor, Garrett Minor, James Minor, Dabney Minor, Vivian Minor, Peter Minor, Mary Minor, Elizabeth Minor.
- 5. Garrett Minor (1743-1799), of "Sunning Hill," Louisa County, married Mary Overton Terrell, of Louisa, May 8, 1769. To this union were born the following children: Rebecca Minor, Ann Minor, Elizabeth Minor, Peter Minor, James Minor, Louisa Minor, Samuel Minor, Mary Minor, Sally Minor, Patsy Minor, Garrett Minor, Mildred Minor, Thomas Minor, and Jane Minor. Mary Overton Terrell (1750-1830) was a daughter of Richmond Terrell and Mary Overton, his wife. Garrett Minor, her husband, served as major of militia in the Revolution.
- 6. Peter Minor married Lucy Gilmer, daughter of George Gilmer, soldier of the Revolution, who marched from Charlottesville to Williamspurg

- with a company of volunteers of which he was lieutenant at the outbreak of the war in 1775. Hugh Minor, of Cannel City, Kentucky, was admitted to membership in the Society of the Sons of the Revolution in the State of Kentucky by establishing his descent from George Gilmer through Peter Minor and Lucy Gilmer, his wife.
- 7. William Minor, elder brother of Garrett Minor (1743-1799), was born August 30, 1738. Trace of him appears to have been lost. It is possible that he may have been the father of Jacob Minor who enlisted for service in the Revolution at Chesterfield County Courthouse September 2, 1780. Though Jacob Minor gave Powhatan as the county of his residence, he was listed as a native of Amelia County. There is no record in Amelia County, however, disclosing the name of his father, nor is there any record of his family in Powhatan, so far as can be ascertained. There is a partial sketch of the Minor family in Malcolm Harris History of Louisa County, but the name of Jacob Minor does not appear in it.

Kentucky Branch - Minor Family

8. Jacob Minor was the individual from whom the Minors in Kentucky had their beginning. The following information (indented) with respect to him was furnished by The National Archives, Washington, D. C.

Parents: Names are not stated.

- Birth: Date and place are not stated. In a document dated September 14, 1829, the veteran's age appears as about 70 years.
- Service (in Revolutionary War): When this veteran applied for pension in September 1829 it was stated: That he enlisted in the year 1780 "in the Virginia Line", served as Private under Captains Turpin and Harrison in Colonel Davis' Regiment, was transferred to Captain S. Stribling's Company and continued to serve until January 18, 1782, when he was discharged at Salisbury, North Carolina, having served 18 months.
- Pension: Certificate No. 20 092 was issued January 23, 1830, to Jacob Minor, rate \$8 per month, commenced January 23, 1830, acts of March 18, 1818, and May 1, 1820, Kentucky Agency.
- Family: In 1829 the veteran stated that his wife had died "some years ago", also that his children "married many years ago & left him." However, he did not mention any of their names. In October 1829 Larkin Minor

stated in Green County, Kentucky, that he was acquainted with the veteran in 1780. He did not mention any relationship to him.

Residences: He was "in the State of Virginia" when he entered service, exact residence not shown. In 1829 he resided in Casey County, Kentucky.

Death: Date and place are not stated.

Lineage Book, Daughters of the American Revolution, Volume 95, page 232, shows the following: "Jacob Minor (1761-1838), soldier of the Revolution, married Pittman. He served as a private in Captains Turpin, Harrison, and Stribling Companies, Colonel Davis' Virginia Regiment and was allowed a pension for his services in 1829 while a resident of Casey County, Ky."

Records in the archives division of the State Library of Virginia show that Jacob Minor of Powhatan County, Virginia, enlisted as a soldier of infantry September 2, 1780, at Chesterfield County Courthouse for a term of one year and six months. He gave his age as 17 and he was recorded as being five feet, eight inches tall, with dark hair and gray eyes. (C. S. 12-28). The records show further that on March 12, 1983, he was paid 36 pounds for his services, the money being delivered at the State Auditor's Office to William Elam. (War 4264). These records do not show what became of him after his service in the war. Moreover, there is a discrepancy in the year of birth in that if he was 17 years old at the time of his enlistment in 1780, as the records state, he was born in 1763, whereas, the year of birth of Jacob Minor in Casey County, Kentucky, was given as 1761. It seems evident that a mistake exists in one or the other, and may have come about through a misstatement of his age at the time of enlistment or in remembering in his old age the year of his birth. it is evident that the Jacob Minor who enlisted as shown in this record and the Jacob Minor who applied for a pension from Casey County, Kentucky, in 1829 are one and the same since the records available show but one Jacob Minor from Virginia who served in the Revolutionary War.

Sometime after his discharge from service in 1782, and it may be assumed after March 12, 1783, when he was paid 36 pounds for his service, Jacob Minor went to Kentucky. I (Claude Dryden Minor) have often heard my father say that "Old Jacob", as he always called him, located on Minor's Branch, a tributary of the North Rolling Fork, in Casey County, Kentucky. Jacob married a woman by the name of Pittman, whose first name is not shown by available records. They had two children: a son named William and a daughter. Apparently there is no information concerning the name of the daughter or what became of her. However, William Minor married Mary Rains and they had 12 children, as is shown subsequently.

It is unfortunate that the records do not show the names of the parents of Jacob Minor, as this makes a gap in the family line from Meindort Doodes down to the present generations. It is a logical presumption, however, that his father was William Minor (7 above). This presumption is strengthened by the fact that Jacob named his son William, it being a somewhat universal practice in those days for a son to give his father's name to his first born son; thus the grandson took the name of the grandfather. Also it is unfortunate that there is nothing in the records to show the name of William Minor's wife, the mother of Jacob. The presumption under discussion is further strengthened by the fact that William, Jacob's father, had an elder brother named Garrett. This name in the family was perpetuated when Milton Minor, one of Jacob's grandsons, named one of his sons Garrett Logan.

- 9. William Minor (Jacob's son) married Mary Rains. Mary Rains was the daughter of James Rains. James Rains was a soldier of the Revolution, was born in March 1757, and died in March 1846. He married Nancy Owens, a daughter of a sister of Simon Kenton. William Minor and Mary Rains Minor had 12 childred as follows:
 - (1) Addison Minor, married Nancy Goode, had 12 children; Mary E. Minor, married John D. Johnson, 12 children; Timothy Minor, died single; Cecelia Minor, married John Isham, no children; Julia Minor, married Joseph Shannon, 5 children, second marriage, Josh Myers, 8 children; James Minor, married Elizabeth Weatherford, had children (names and number unknown); Lafayette Minor, married Sarah Johnson, 2 children; John B. Minor, married Marion Woodson, 2 children; Aaron B. Minor, married Mollie Penn, 6 children; Martha Minor, married J. L, Rawlins, 7 children; Tabitha Minor, married Brack Overstreet, 5 children; Ann Lou Minor, married Lycurgus Elder, 1 child; Ellen Minor, married Hence Burk, 4 children.
 - u muster (netholist) (2) Reuben Minor, married Ellen Findley, had three children: Rebecca A. Minor, married William Rains, 14 children; Mary E. Minor, married James Curtis, 9 children; Rauben Minor, married Paralee Elder, 9 children.
 - Jacob Minor, died single at the age of 23 years. (3)
 - (4) Milton Minor, who was born June 15, 1815, and died July 1, 1867, married Elizabeth Prewitt, who was born June 15, 1814, and died August 4, 1895. They had 9 children as follows: William H. Minor, who was born July 6, 1837, married Minerva Philipps, 1 child; Nancy J. Minor, was was born May 29, 1839, married Abe Whitenack, 10 children; James north Harvey Minor, who was born May 25, 1841, married Sarah Taylor, 6 children; Garrett Logan Minor, who was born January 13, 1844, married municipality Nancy Logan Johnson, 10 children; Thomas H. Minor, who was born Minor, who was born October 4, 1848, married Hamilton May, 7 children; Mary Tittitha Sarah E. Minor, who was born February 22 January 3, 1846, married Kate Anderson, no children; Mary Tittitha Sarah E. Minor, who was born February 22, 1851, married Hardin Purdom,

5 children; Milton M. Minor, who was born February 24, 1854, drowned when he was about 3 years of age; Frances Ellen Minor, who was born December 29, 1856, married William T. May, 5 children.

Note: Information as to the dates of birth of the children of Milton and Elizabeth Minor are taken from the records in the old family Bible of Garrett Logan Minor (which bears publisher's date of 1891). Said dates are not in his handwriting but believed to be accurate.

- (5) James Minor, married Martha Taylor. They had one child, John W. Minor, who died at the age of 23 years.
- (6) Obediah Minor, first married Nancy Prewitt, had one child; married second, Ellen Russell, had 5 children. His children were: Susanne Minor, married George Mills, 5 children; Laban J. Minor, died single; Christopher Columbus Minor, married Alice Survant, one child; Amanda Minor, married Clinton K. Purdom, 3 children; William R. Minor, married Minnie Gibson, one child; Rebecca Minor, married George Gibson, 6 children.
- (7) Elizabeth Minor, married D. M. Purdom, had 8 children as follows: Louisa Purdom, died at 12 years of age; Margaret Purdom, married Ralph Ellis, 6 children; Sarah Purdom, married John McCarty, 11 children; Robert Purdom, married Baker, 5 children; William Purdom, married Belle Powar, 3 children; James Purdom, married Letha children; Melissa Purdom, married Green, no children; Nancy Purdom, married Len Taylor, 6 children.
- (8) Margaret Minor, married Hiram Goode, had 8 children, as follows: Frances Goode, married Dood Hourigan, 3 children; Beersheba Goode, married Henley Crowders, no children; Elizabeth Goode, married Henley Nash, 3 children; Delila Godde, married in Texas but no information as to whom she married or whether there were children; William Goode, no information as to marriage or children; John K. Goode, no information as to marriage or children; James Goode, no information as to marriage or children.
 - (9) Mary J. Minor, married Garrett Clarkson, had 12 children as follows: Nancy M. Clarkson, married Appolus Hourigan, 7 children; Thomas Clarkson, married first Martha Guthrie, 3 children, married second Miss Hamner, no children; Happy Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children; William R. Clarkson, married Fanny Sinkhorn, no children; Mary Clarkson, married William Taylor, 4 children; George Clarkson, married Elizabeth Kirkland, 2 children; Martha Clarkson, married Isaac Spiers, 7 children; Richard Clarkson, died at age of 21; James Clarkson, married Elizabeth Anderson, 4 children; Jane Clarkson, married Robert Overstreet, 3 children; John Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children; Sam Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children.

- (10) Beersheba Minor, married W. F. Clarkson, had 7 children as follows: U. C. Clarkson, married a Miss Murrell, 6 children; J. A. Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children; Mary M. Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children; Elizabeth Clarkson, married

 Johnson, no information as to children; Millard F. Clarkson, twice married but no information as to names of his wives, said to have had 3 children; Sophronia Clarkson, married

 Wingate, 1 child; Frank Clarkson, no information as to marriage or children.
- (11) Gilbert Minor, married Lucinda Purdom, had 4 children as follows: Robert W. Minor, who never married; Abe J. Minor, married Ellen Rogers, 1 child; Jefferson D. Minor, who never married; Lee Minor, married Elizabeth Whitehouse, 3 children.
- (12) William Minor, married Martha Taylor, had 7 children as follows: Taylor Minor, no information as to whom he married but said to have married and had 3 children; Mollie Minor, married J. C. B. Harmon, 5 children; Sam Minor, no information as to marriage or children; John Minor, married Mary Baxter, 2 children; Ella Minor, no information as to marriage or children; Lula Minor, no information as to marriage or children.

Note: Much of the information as to the children of William and Mary Rains Minor came from "History of Rains-Minor Family as Compiled by Captain William Rains", first published in the March 14, 1897, issue of the Louisville Courier-Journal, and subsequently published in the July 24, 1931, issue of the Harrodsburg Herald, Harrodsburg, Kentucky. Captain Rains was a soldier in the Mexican War and was Captain of Company B, First Kentucky Cavalry, Wooford's Regiment, in the War Between the States. The information as compiled by Captain Rains is not only incomplete, as appears above, but unquestionably it is inaccurate to some degree. The allegation as to inaccuracy is made because I found it to be incorrect in several instances of which I have accurate, personal knowledge.

Genealogy of Garrett Logan Minor Family

10. Milton M. Minor (father of Garrett Logan Minor) was son of William Minor and Mary Rains Minor and grandson of Jacob Minor and Pittman Minor. He was born June 15, 1815, in Casey County, Kentucky, and died July 1, 1867, in Boyle County, Kentucky. He married Elizabeth Prewitt (who was the mother of his nine children, as stated previously) who was born June 15, 1814, in Marion County, Kentucky, and died August 4, 1895, in Boyle County, Kentucky.

William Green Johnson (father of Nancy Logan Johnson, who became the wife of Garrett Logan Minor) was born February 6, 1823, in Casey County, Kentucky. He died December 20, 1890, in Casey County, Kentucky. He married Lucinda Peyton, who was born September 2, 1829, in Casey County, Kentucky, and died in that County and State November 30, 1894. William Green Johnson and Lucinda Peyton Johnson had

13 children as follows: Nancy Logan Johnson, who married Garrett Logan Minor, 10 children; Belle Johnson, who married Clay Bottoms, 3 children; Sarah Johnson, who married Lafayette Minor, 2 children; Martha Johnson, who married James Matthew Kirkland, 3 children; Mary Johnson, who married Joel Weatherford, 2 children; Georgie Johnson, who married Frank Penn, 2 children; Hester Johnson, who married Milton May, 3 children; Dillie Johnson, who married Andrew J. May, no children; John Crittenden Johnson, who married Lula Raley, no children; Robert Johnson, who married Florence Ninks, 5 children; James Johnson, who married Melvina Spiers, 5 children; Samuel Johnson, who married Sarah Penn, 5 children; Kelly Johnson, who died single at age of about 21.

Note: The foregoing information as to whom the children of William Green Johnson and Lucinda Peyton Johnson married and the number of children they had is entirely from my memory (except as to Nancy Logan Johnson). In some instances the data may be inaccurate as to the number of children they had. (C. D. M. October 1957).

- 11. Garratt Logan Minor was born January 13, 1844, in Boyle County, Kentucky, tucky. He died September 3, 1934, at Perryville, Boyle County, Kentucky, where he is buried. He married Nancy Logan Johnson, who was born June 9, 1849, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died June 15, 1917, at Perryville, Boyle County, Kentucky, where she is buried. Garrett Logan Minor and Nancy Logan Johnson were married by John Kirk, a Methodist minister, on August 30, 1866, at the home of William Green Johnson on Little South Fork, in Casey County, Kentucky. They had 10 children as follows:
 - (1) William Milton Minor, who was born July 29, 1867, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died at Bowling Green, Kentucky, July 3, 1938, where he is buried. He married Lula Murphy of Casey County, Kentucky, January 29, 1891, who died February 16, 1955, at Bowling Green, Kentucky, where she is buried. They had 5 children, three of whom are living.
 - (2) Lillie Bell Minor, who was born September 10, 1868, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died May 11, 1917, at Wichita Falls, Texas, where she is buried. She married James A. Thornton of Bradfordsville, Marion County, Kentucky, May 31, 1893, and who died within recent years, exact date unknown to me. They had 3 children, two of whom are living.
 - (3) Martha Ellen Minor, who was born October 27, 1870, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died December 9, 1948, at Lebanon, Kentucky, where she is buried. She married Quint Anderson of Casey County, Kentucky, December 20, 1888, and who died March 26, 1948, at Lebanon, Kentucky, where he is buried. They had 3 children, two of whom are living.
 - (4) John Harvey Minor, who was born May 8, 1872, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died at or near Bradenton, Florida, January 27,

1947, where he is buried. He married Juda Lane of Casey County, Kentucky, September 26, 1895, and who died September 12, 1912, on Little South Fork, Casey County, Kentucky, where she is buried. They had 3 children, all of whom are living. John married a second time but information as to name of woman he married (in Florida) and date are unknown to me. No children from second marriage.

- (5) Mittie Lee Minor, who was born December 25, 1873, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died June 28, 1945, at Junction City, Kentucky, where she is buried. She married John D. Alstott of Casey County, Kentucky, March 22, 1893, and who died June 7, 1915, and is buried at Perryville, Kentucky. They had 5 children, 3 of whom are living.
- (6) Hester Ann Minor, who was born May 21, 1876, in Casey County, Kentucky, and who died November 20, 1946, on Little South Fork in Casey County, Kentucky, where she is buried. She married George W. Porter of Casey County, Kentucky, November 7, 1893, who died

 19___, on Little South Fork in Casey County, Kentucky, where he was buried. They had 3 children, one of whom is living.
- (7) Samuel T. Minor, who was born January 3, 1878, and died September 14, 1883, in Casey County, Kentucky.
- (8) Sonia M. Minor, who was born May 8, 1879, and died September 21, 1883, in Casey County, Kentucky.
- (9) Bettie L. Minor, who was born April 11, 1885, and died September 18, 1886, in Casey County, Kentucky.
- (10) Claude Dryden Minor, who was born January 15, 1888. He married Lena Robertson Hooe January 22, 1911, who died June 3, 1952, at Rich-Mond, Virginia, and is buried at Perryville, Kentucky. They had no children, but adopted a son. Second married was to Martha Virginia Hannah of Richmond, Virginia, on April 29, 1953.

Note: Most of the foregoing information with respect to the family of Garrett Logan Minor is taken from the records he made in the old family Bible, which bears publisher's date of 1891. All names and dates in such record are in his handwriting, except those dates after 1930.

On the basis of this genealogy, any descendant of William Minor and Mary Rains Minor is eligible to become a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, if a woman, or the Society of the Sons of the Revolution or the Sons of the American Revolution, if a man. This is true because eligibility for membership in those organizations is contingent upon the fact that the applicant is a descendant of one who was a soldier who saw service on behalf of the Colonies in the Revolutionary War. As shown above, Jacob Minor, from whom the Kentucky branch of the Minor family descended, was such a soldier; and, Mary Rains, who married William Minor (Jacob's son), was the daughter of

James Rains who was such a soldier. In fact, I am a member of the Society of the Sons of the Revolution, and for the past several years I have been Chancellor of the Virginia Branch or Society of that organization.

In order that this genealogy may be as accurate as possible, I should say that the information with respect to Meindort Doodes, Doodes Minor, Garrett Minor, John Minor, Garrett Minor of "Sunning Hill", Peter Minor, and William Minor (Items 1 through 7 - the Virginia Minors) was furnished me by John Patterson Madison of Richmond, Virginia, in 1944, about the time I became a member of the Society of the Sons of the Revolution. Mr. Madison was born August 26, 1874, and died some six or eight years ago. He was considered an authoritative genealogist and did the research for me in an effort to determine, if possible, the names of the parents of Jacob Minor.
