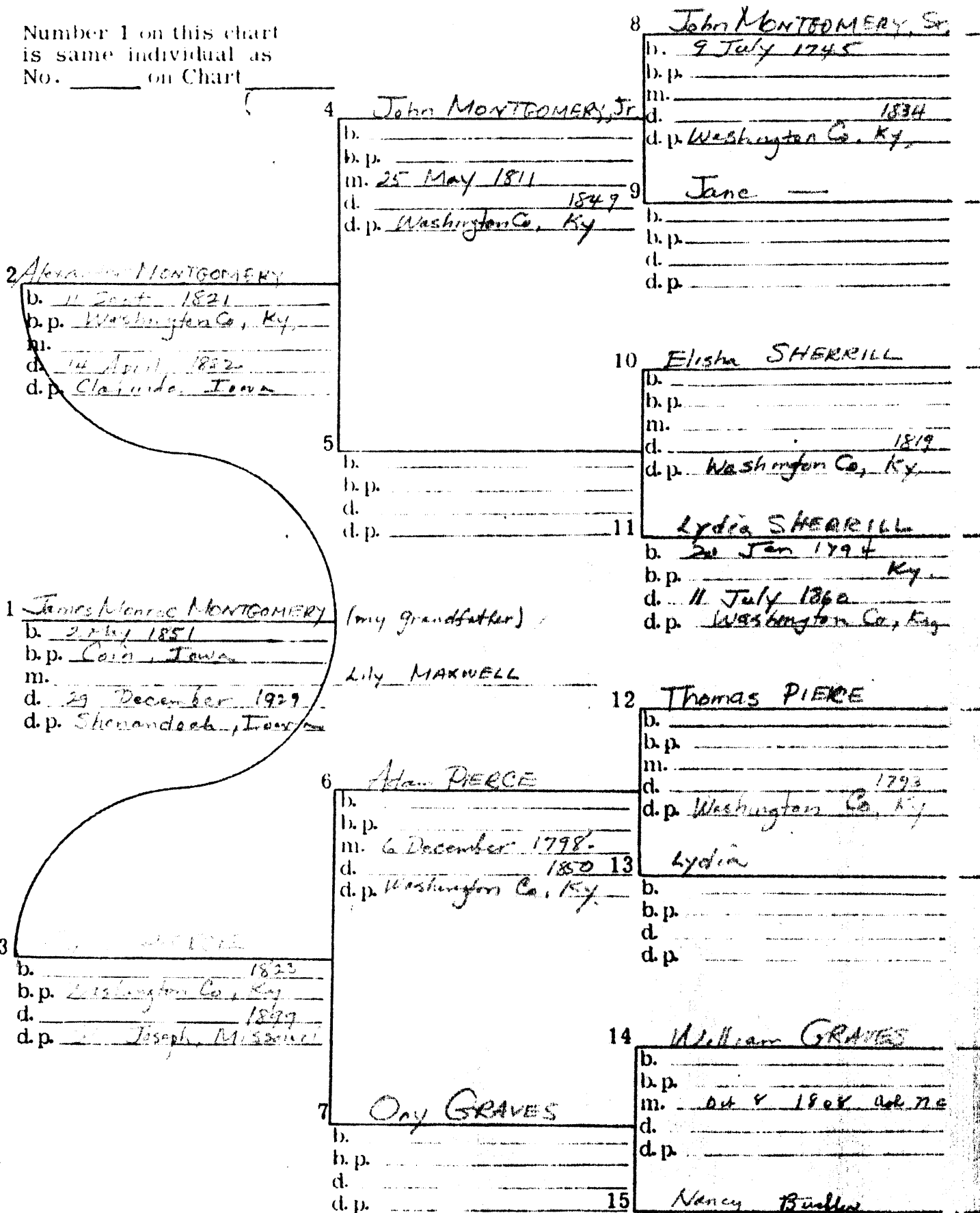

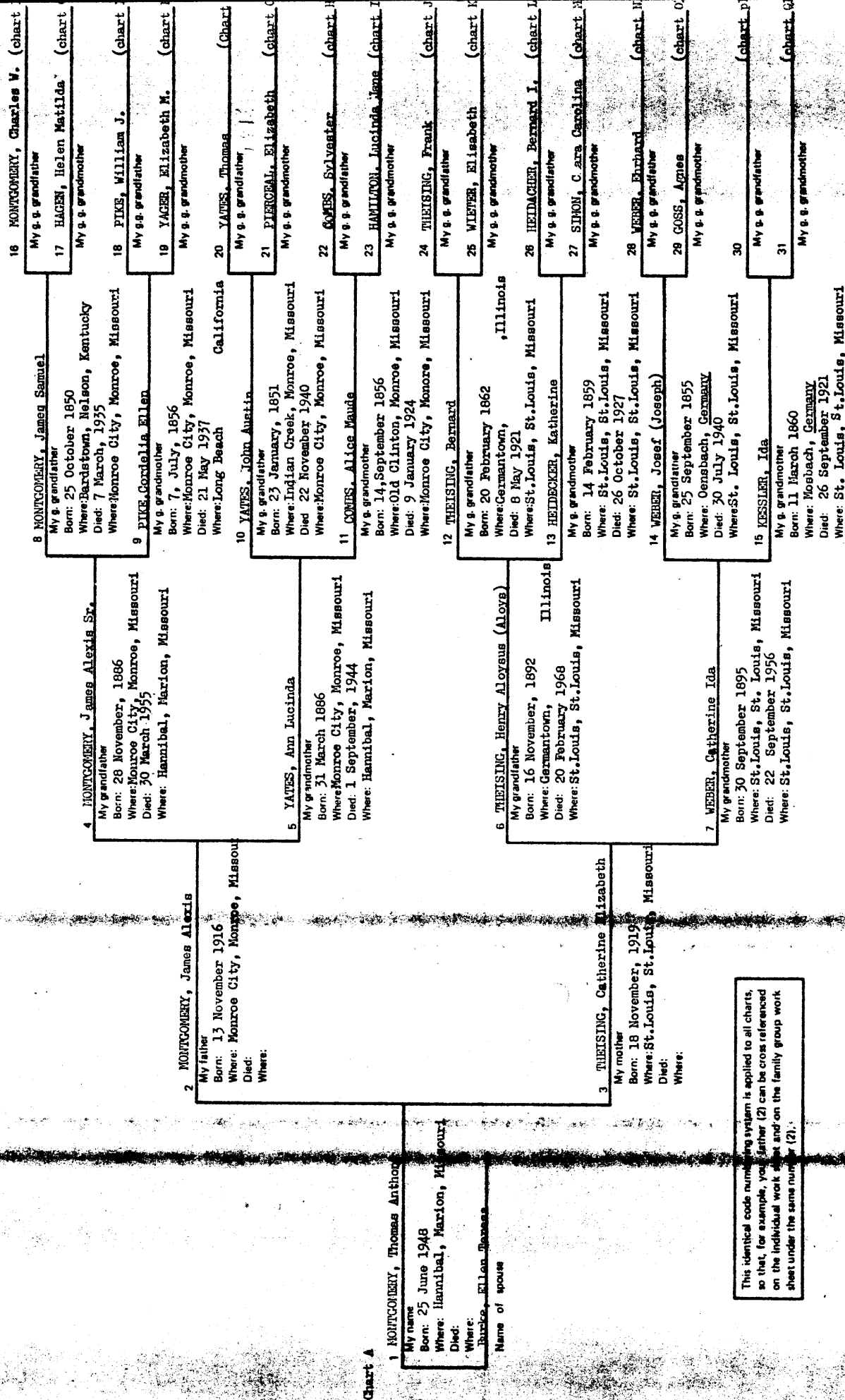

She entered the Loretto Novitiate from Casey County, Ky. from St. Bernard's parish, Clementsville, Ky., in 1827, /at the age of 20 years. M.</sup>, as superior, 1923; to Flagstaff<sup>Ariz.</sup>, as superior, August, 1929; to Visitation<sup>St. Louis, Mo.</sup>, as superior, August 1932; to El Paso, St. Joseph's as superior and teacher, August 1933; to Bernalillo<sup>N. M.</sup>, as superior, September 1935; to Las Vegas<sup>East N. M.</sup>, Immaculate Conception (East) superior, August 1941. Went to El Paso<sup>Texas</sup> for Educational Meeting.

Died suddenly in El Paso February 3, 1942 at El Paso, Texas, while on a visit to Loretto Academy. R. I. P.

Will you kindly fill out this blank for Sister Benita and return to me at once? We do not have the required information here.

The funeral was this morning. Father Rabeyrolle from Las Vegas sang the Mass and Bishop Metzger was in the sanctuary. Everything was very peaceful and impressive. Sister passed away very suddenly and almost without a struggle about eleven o'clock. She and Sister Liliosa arrived at 7:30 a.m. Father Smith was at the depot to meet Bishop Espalage and Father Pax, O.F.M. so he brought the Sisters home. They heard the two Masses received Holy Communion and it was at the breakfast table that Sister first complained of feeling sick. She went upstairs, vomited



some and asked if she might go to bed for a while. When asked if she wanted a doctor, she said "No", but that she had been feeling bad for some time so she would go to the doctor's office in the afternoon. We got her to bed, and left her apparently resting quietly. About ten minutes later, Sister Lua heard a groan, ran to her and found her unconscious. We called the doctor, but Sister was dead when he arrived. However, Bishop Espalage went to her immediately and gave her conditional absolution and a little later Father McGovern anointed her. However, we fear she was already dead before the anointing, but if so, only a few minutes.

Sister Albertina was anointed Sunday morning, heart attack, but she rallied, to her great disappointment.

Dear Mother:

Another heavy burden has been placed upon your shoulders by the death of dear Sister Benita, the finding of a suitable one to take the latter's place is not going to be easy. Sad as Sister's loss is, it could have been tragic, as the trip from Vegas to Santa Fe was made in the bus alone; suppose the call had come then, how different it would have been for Sister! As it was, the dear soul had the privilege of assisting at the Bishop's Mass here at the Academy, at which she received what proved to be her Holy Viaticum; after making their thanksgiving, both Sister Benita and her companion, Sister Lilliosa, went down to breakfast; Sister seemed to enjoy her meal for a while, then asked to be excused. At ten o'clock, after giving some simple remedies, for what she supposed was indigestion, Sister Lua left Sister comfortably in bed in the latter's room, and went down the hall to clean and press Sister Benita's habit; in a few minutes, a strange sound reached Sister Lua's ears, and she fairly ran down to the room, only to find Sister unconscious, though still with a pulse of sixty-five, Doctor and priest were summoned, but the patient was gone. Conditional absolution and Extreme Unction were administered, however, as the body was still warm when the priest came.

Sisters Theophania and Ceciliana arrived here last evening; also, Sisters Florita and Eudocia. The funeral will be at some time Thursday. Sister Felicitas is much pleased with the plot selected in the cemetery since it will not be necessary to move the other graves. Sister Olivette helped to select it.

They are all at the big ceremony at the Cathedral this morning, I preferred remaining home, having been out nearly all day yesterday. The Cathedral School was visited in the forenoon, then a visit to the hospital to see Sister Matthias who is better; then over to St. Joseph's Academy where it was my intention to drop in for a few minutes and visit some of the classes, but when I received there the word about Sister Benita, home seemed the best place, so Sister Marineil accompanied me.

Father Johnson called Sunday to see me, as the bishop has appointed him Superintendent of schools; Father is wisely refraining from any kind of activity, believing that the logical one for this position is the young bishop, as he is the only one who can handle the very complicated situation that exists here. I have certainly learned a great deal in the three weeks already spent here; Father Johnson gave me a splendid picture of the whole set-up.

Sister Lilliosa seems to feel that the new bishop is going to be very helpful.

Dear Sister:

Do any of your Sisters know name and address of any living half-brothers or sisters or dear Sister Mary Benita? If so, kindly let us have same.

Sister gave her mother's maiden name as Nora Lancaster, convert, while the Baptismal Record of St. Lawrence, Daviess County, gives the name as Mary Minerva (or Menora) Allen. We thought possibly the baptismal record (copy of which we have, typed) had not been correctly rendered in the typing and we wrote asking the present pastor to check it. He reports that it is correctly rendered in our typed copy. Sister was born in 1867. In 1870, October 20, another child - Elcomora - was born to Mr. Austin Leo Montgomery and M. Minerva Allen and baptized the following November 20.

In 1839, Sister's father married Rose Ann Varrico. Their nine children - five boys and four girls - were of course Sister Mary Benita's half-brothers and sisters. If any of these live they would be able to explain to us the discrepancy between Sister's record and that recorded in St. Lawrence's.

At this juncture, looking again over the typed copy of Baptismal and Marriage Record, I believe I may have discovered the solution. On September 4 1864, is recorded the marriage of Mr. A. L. Montgomery to Mrs. Midora Allers (Allen?). This widow is very likely the "Nora Lancaster" as given by Sister Mary Benita as her mother. The pastor in writing us stated that the name (we presume it is poorly penned) might be Minova or Minora instead of Minerva.

Your name has been given me by one of the Sisters in East Las Vegas, New Mexico, as being that of a sister of our late Sister Mary Benita. Please accept our sincere sympathy in this your loss of your dear sister who, because of her gentle, kindly manner, had many friends in the Society to which she was ever loyal and true.

Sister gave in her mother's name, many years ago, as Nora Lancaster. In the baptismal record of St. Lawrence, Daviess County, Kentucky, the mother's name is recorded as Mary Midora or Minora, Allen, and the marriage record of Mr. Austin Leo Montgomery gives the name as "Allers". I would like to correct the copy which we have and show the name as it should be and will very much appreciate the information from you. Your air-mail of the fifth just read. I have filled out the form which you enclosed in your letter and you should sign where you will find red-check. The right-hand side of the paper is for the physician- also the last section on the reverse- if he so desires. The first and second sections on the reverse do not apply in this case.

In looking up Sister's data at the time we received notice of her death, I found something that I am endeavoring to find solution for- Sister gave her mother's name as Nora Lancaster, while in typed copy of the baptismal records of St. Lawrence, Daviess County, Kentucky, which we have, we find her mother's name given as "Mary Minerva Allen". We have written to the priest now at St. Lawrence's to know whether the typed copy we have of this item has been correctly recorded. Sister's father had before her time been married to Rose Ann Carrico, in 1839, and they had seven children. If any of these half-brothers and sisters still live, we may get the explanation from them in event we do not get it from the priest at St. Lawrence.

Dear Sister Mary Benita- a devoted Lorette! God rest her kind soul! In the case of sudden death, it is said that the soul may remain in the body after death appears to have taken place. A retreat master- Father John Poland, said in our chapel that science had utterly failed to find positive proof of death short of advanced putrefaction, which could not take place inside of forty-eight hours- therefore- ancient. May we be ready- nothing else matters. God bless you - pray for me- in Jesus and Mary

Benedict Hagan married Mary Chloe Montgomery, daughter of Joseph & Mary Ann \_\_\_\_\_ Montgomery, at St. Mary's Church, Bryantown, Charles County, Maryland on February 16, 1793. There was a dispensation granted of the impediment of consanguinity from the 3rd to 4th - meaning they were third cousins. I believe Mary Ann was a Hagan, but have not been able to prove her last name.

After death of Benedict, Mary Clotilda Montgomery Hagan, married Thomas Thompson on January 5, 1801 in Washington Co., Ky. (Copy of bond attached) he was a son of J. B. and Ann Thompson.

I have six large binders, each about 3 or 4 inches thick, on the family of Montgomery from Maryland and Kentucky. To the best of my knowledge and a quick check thru my records, I do not have a Dorothea Montgomery.

I have lines on many branches and families, but there are the families of Joshua Montgomery, Elisha and Bazil, who are members of the same family, but I have not been able to prove from which Montgomery they descend. However, all are somehow descendants of Peter Montgomery of Charles Co.

After Chloe married Thomas Thompson I did not do any further work on her. I do not have any children for her, if she had any in my research they have not appeared, but as stated, I did not follow her on the Thompson line.

The last time I was in the Hall of Records in Annapolis, they were micro-filming the early Jesuit Records of southern Maryland which covered Charles and St. Marys and other counties. There are many of these early church records in this collection, but I did not get to see them. I was later told that the originals were sent to the University in St. Louis where they are currently held. You might try to contact someone there and find out more about these very valuable records. I have been interested in them for sometime, but have not had a chance to get to St. Louis.

If I get a chance, I will go over my records more closely and see if I can find anything to help you further.

Charles W. Montgomery

One of the industrious farmers and well respected citizens of Indian Creek township must be set down as the subject of the present sketch, Charles W. Montgomery. Mr. Montgomery, a son of William P. and Mary (Yates) Montgomery, was born in Washington County, Ky., September 1, 1823, and was reared in that county. His parents are both now deceased; his father died of cholera during the terrible cholera epidemic of 1833. His mother survived until 1874 and died of dropsy. They had six children, four of whom are living: William P., Mary R., Martha E., and Charles W. Montgomery, who, 11 years after his father's death, December 20, 1844, was married to Miss Helen M. Hagen, of Kentucky. This union lasted many years and to them were given 12 children. But at last the shadow of death fell upon their pathway and beneath its dark pall the spirit of the devoted and beloved wife took its flight to its home beyond the skies. Mr. Montgomery's present wife was a Miss Mary E. Grant, of the same name as the greatest general in the Union armies of the great war, and probably distantly related to him. She was born and reared in Marion county, Ky. Mr. Montgomery, who has resided in Monroe County for many years, and is one of the sterling good citizens of Indian Creek township, has a neat farm of about 100 acres, in an excellent state of cultivation and improvement. By his first wife he has 10 children living: Mary G., Martha A., Sarah F., James S., John H., Elizabeth J., Alice I., Charles W., George E., and Thomas G.

Notes taken in conversations with my Dad (Info from John Montgomery-Chicago)

He gave the following info to me just after I found a biographical sketch of Grandfather Chas. Wm. Montgomery at the Newberry Library in Chicago:

Of Chas. Wm.'s children, Thos. G. went to Colorado Springs and probably died there. James Sam'l married Adelia (called Deeley) Pike and lived in Monroe City, Mo. He was a railroad bridge gang foreman. Lived next door to the old Episcopal church on the main street. They had 6 boys and 3 girls. One day James Sam'l was on the job and one of his coworkers told him of a woman and a bunch of kids who had just moved into town near him and that the boys were the meanest bunch he'd ever seen. The town was Monroe City, the time was just after James Sam'l and his family moved there. James Sam'l had little to say because he knew that it was his boys that the man was talking about!

Dad said that Chas. Wm. went back to Kentucky to marry his second wife, Mary E. Grant. She was reputed to be a relative of General Grant. The family called her Aunt Emmy and she smoked a corncob pipe. *is this Grandmother Emmy? yes*

More on Chas. Wm.'s children: Dad told me of the death of John Henry M., which I've recorded elsewhere. He married Mary (Molly) E. Pike, sister of Adelia, and was the mother of my second cousin, Joe T. Montgomery. She used to lead the family rosary and would sometimes fall asleep in the middle of it. She would say "blessed out there among women", or, at any rate, it sounded like that according to Dad.

Martha was Aunt Matt who married "Curl" Wimsatt who died of blood poisoning resulting from a hunting accident when he was tragically shot by Geo. Montgomery, a brother of my cousin Joe. Matt and Curl has one son, Wm., and she never remarried.

Sarah's husband, Geo. Stayton, went mad and killed his brother, John. I have a little more on that elsewhere.

Aunt Kitty (I must try to ascertain her real name) lived in Indian Creek and took in Mary E. Grant after Chas. Wm. died. She was another daughter of Chas. Wm.'s.

That's all for the moment for Chas. Wm.'s children.

- Children of John Henry Montgomery: Elmer, Charlie, Bob, Geo., Wm., Joe, Anna (Mother of Martin Adam, 636 2nd St., Monroe City 63456, to whom I sent info on the family) and Aggie (Margaret?). Also Martin and Mammie (Spalding)

\*Note below

John Henry's son, Charlie, was a scrapper. He ran a store in Clapper, Mo., and it was at this store that he fought Tobe Priest, the local bully. Tobe pulled a pistol on Charlie who allowed that he would take it from him and insert it in his derriere. They grappled, rolled off the loading platform and Charlie had the gun as well as Tobe's pants down when Charlie's wife Minnie (Hagan) appeared and pleaded with him to stop. Since she was well along with the first of their two children, Charlie abandoned his project and let Tobe go. Charlie also went to Mass one Sunday and, after the service, got into a fight with Riley Parsons that lasted all day with no decision.

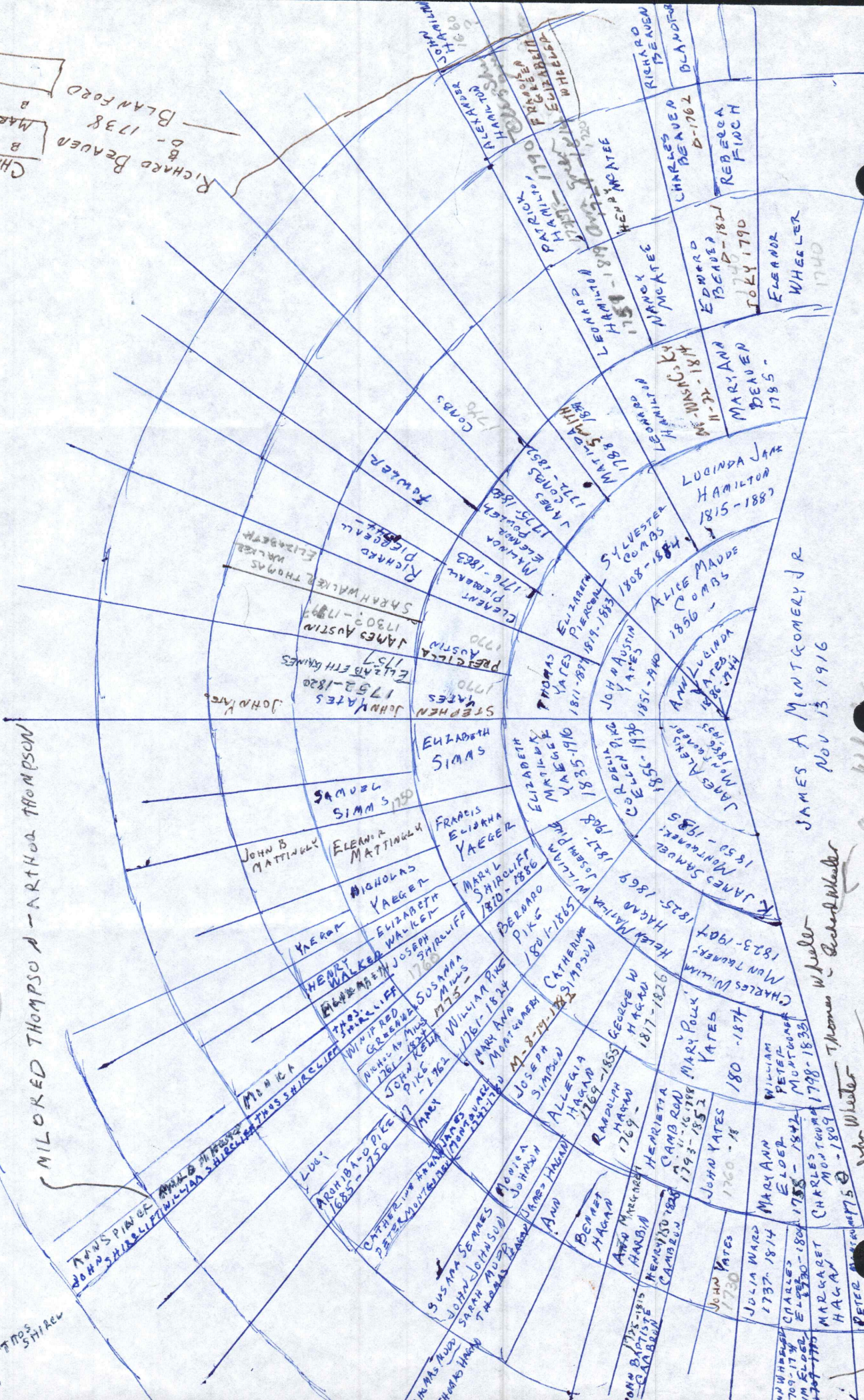

## YATES

I have been accumulating for a number of years genealogical information on the ancestors of my mother Ann Lucinda Yates Montgomery. I will assemble this narrative in chronological order with known facts, conditions at these times, and some as yet unproven suppositions, in hope that other genealogists may derive benefits from my findings. I hope that they can help me complete, as yet unverified facts, and possibly add information to my findings.

My oldest findings in Maryland were of a Robert Yates, emigrant and merchant, at Wicomico, whose first wife was Rebecca Young. They produced Charles Yates I, who married Jane Bryan. They were parents of Charles Yates II, who fathered James Yates, who was the father of Elizabeth Yates, who married George Dent (b. 1773, d. 1833).

Charles county, Maryland census of 1775-78 shows a Francis Yates in Port Tobacco, East Hundred, along with Hamiltons, Montgomerys, Comes & Hagans; all direct ancestors of mine. I have a record of a Robert Yates, witnessing land documents of my g.g.g.g.grandfather Peter Montgomery, French emigrant, in 1730 living in Charles county Maryland. The first record I have of my direct Yates ancestry is a will of John Yates, born in Caroline county, Virginia in 1752. He died July , 1820 in Adair county, Kentucky, where he is buried. He was married in Culpepper county, Virginia in 1772 to Elizabeth Gaines, who was born in 1757 and who survived her husband . He was a soldier in the American Revolutionary War.

I have records from Ann Arundel, Frederick, Hartford, and St. Marys counties, from 1768 to 1779 of Yates, Yets, and Yeates, of marriages, baptisms, and census records of Joshua, Joseph, John, Susannah, Sarah, Mary Rebecca, Edward, William, Bernard, Enoch and others, but no tie to my own family. I have a record of sale of property on 9 August 1798 by Thomas Yates, Stephen Yates, William Yates, and John Yates of the county of Washington, Kentucky to David Barr of the county of Washington, Maryland, consisting of fifty acres called "Grandfather's Gift" in Washington county Maryland. It is my belief that these four Yates brothers were the four older brothers whose names were not mentioned in the will of John Yates leaving property to eleven children. Culpepper, Virginia is only 50-60 miles from Portobacco, Maryland. Washington county, Maryland is 40 miles northwest of Baltimore and west of Frederick county Maryland. When the exodus of Catholic families from Maryland to Kentucky (1785 to 1800) occurred, most of them came overland from Charles and St. Marys counties to northern Maryland. They then passed over the mountains to the Pittsburgh area and thence down the Ohio river to Kentucky. This John Yates was in Washington county, Kentucky and all four brothers bought land in Washington and Marion counties Kentucky in the 1795-1798 time span.

John Yates of the four brothers (my g.g.g.grandfather, carried through the Montgomery line) married Henrietta Cambron. They became parents of Mary Polly Yates, who married William Peter Montgomery, my g.g.grandfather, a grandson of Peter Montgomery, the French emigrant.

My g.g.grandfather, Stephen Yates, a brother of this John Yates, purchased land in Washington county Kentucky on April 5, 1796. On Oct.5, 1818 Stephen Yates and his wife Prescilla Austin Yates sold 43 1/4 acres in Washington county Kentucky, near Rolling Fork, to Matthew Smith for \$350. On the same date they also sold 54 1/2 acres to Jeremiah Herbert for \$173. The ground in this area was very poor and most of it had been purchased without seeing it from land agents in Maryland and Virginia.

On May 2, 1819 William and Mary Raley Yates sold to Enoch Yates 98 1/2 acres for \$200 on the south fork of the Rolling Fork, Washington county, Kentucky.

It is my supposition that these two brothers left at the same time heading for Missouri, where they could obtain cheaper and better land, but I still find Stephen in the 1820 census of Kentucky.

In the time between 1810-1820, several earlier Maryland to Kentucky Catholic families then moved on to Missouri, to the St Louis and Florissant areas. These included Carricos and Miles. These two families had lived near the Yates in Kentucky and settled in Florissant, Mo. I believe that Stephen and William, and their families, came through Florissant, stayed a short period, and then went on up the Missouri River to Montgomery or Callaway counties, Missouri.

To refresh this period of history in our minds, in 1795 Missouri had only 5000 residents. In 1804 it had 10,350, half American and half French.

In 1800 Spain ceded this Louisiana territory to France and in 1803 France sold it to the United States. In 1805, Missouri was given territorial rank and was called Territory of Louisiana. In 1805 Zebulon Montgomery Pike started from St Louis up the Missouri river on his expedition to Colorado and the west. In 1810 Missouri had a population of 20,845. In 1812 five counties were mentioned for the first time; St. Charles, St. Louis, Ste. Genevieve, Cape Girardeau, and New Madrid. 1811-1812 marked the great New Madrid earthquake. Also during this period was the so named War of 1812.

In 1818 Missouri petitioned for statehood. In 1821 Missouri was admitted to the union. In 1826 St. Charles was the temporary capitol of Missouri. More than half of the new settlers moved along the Missouri river from St. Charles to the western borders of the state and up the Mississippi to the northern borders of the state settling on the banks of the Salt river, now Ralls and Monroe counties. Franklin, opposite what is now Boonville, Missouri was founded in 1817. In 1820 it had a population of 1000 and was the second largest city in the state. Within ten years the Missouri washed it away.

St. Louis had a population of 5000 in 1820. By 1821 Missouri had 25 counties. Amongst those in 1818 were Montgomery and Pike counties which came into being. In 1820 Boone, Callaway, Ralls and others were formed. In 1831 Monroe county was formed. This illustrates the status of the population and dates of formation of counties in the Missouri area in which we are interested in this genealogical study of the Yates.

Back to our original known ancestor John Yates, who died in Adair county, Kentucky in July, 1820. In his will, he requested that his two slaves, Adam and Biney, be sold and that the proceeds go to his two sons George and Francis; that a negro woman, named Biney or Betsy, be given to his daughter Sallie Estes, and that a negro woman, Sharot (Charlott) and a girl she now has with her, be given to son James.

To their daughter Polly Browning, a negro woman, Sukey, and a negro boy Simon. To their daughter Betsey Wallace, three negroes Nan, Austin and Bill. To son John Yates, Caesar and Tom, two negro boys, one bed and furniture, my rifle, gun, and cross cut saw and large Bible; also two ploughs and a shear and shovel.

To my wife Betsey Yates during her lifetime all the above mentioned negroes, my son John's negroes excepted, together with land, stock of all kinds, household and kitchen furniture and at her death I give unto my son John the above mentioned negro Lewis.

It is my will that at the death of my wife that all personal property or all that may be left be sold, and the money be divided equally among my eleven children or their descendants. Lastly, I do constitute and appoint as my executors of my last will and testament my son John Yates and my son-in-law William Wallace. In witness thereof I have set my hand and seal this 21st day of July, 1820.

I find records in Washington county, Kentucky where Raphael Yates, son of Stephen and Prescilla Yates, married Nancy Bolds Jan. 1, 1820. And I find in St Ferdinands parish, Florissant, Missouri where James Yates, son of Raphael and Nancy, was baptized Nov. 5, 1820. I also find in St Ferdinands records, where Elizabeth Yates, daughter of Stephen and Prescilla, married Richard Miles, son of Josiah Miles and Teresa Carrico Miles on Oct. 18, 1825. I later found where this same Richard Miles, or Uncle Dick, was living at 81 years in Indian Creek, Monroe county in 1884.

I have the following marriage records from Washington county, Kentucky: Oct 30, 1816 Enoch Yates to Mary Jarboe, widow, Feb. 28, 1823 John Yates to Charity Powell, Oct.. 21, 1823 Thomas Yates to Matilda Carrico, Oct. 6, 1829 Enoch Yates to Ann Statia Miles Oct. 5, 1833 William C. Yates to Mary Ann Montgomery, Oct. 16, 1833 Edward Yates to Rosannah Austin.

I have records of Vincent Yates, son of Stephen and Prescilla, married to Nancy Eastes, daughter of Moses

Eastes and Betsey Reilly, on Sept. 9, 1827 in St Ferdinand. (Florissant records)

I find the following land deeds in Fulton, Callaway county Missouri, June 15, 1831: Vincent Yates and his wife, Nancy Estes sold 80 acres of Sec. 36 to William Garrett for \$150 in Callaway county. Aug. 13, 1831 Raphael Yates purchased 80 acres for \$250 in Callaway county from Oliver O'Neal and Nancy his wife from Cole county, Missouri. On May 30, 1834 Raphael Yates and his wife, of Monroe county, Missouri sold 80 acres in Callaway county to John Phillips for \$400, witnessed by John Speaks and Stephen Yates.

I find many instances from 1829 to 1840 where a John Yates bought and sold land in Fulton and in Portland (in Callaway county) as did a William Yates. In family tradition, Stephen Yates had a son John who became a Jesuit priest.

In researching Jesuit archives in St Louis I found no John Yates, but had record of James Yates who came from Springfield, Kentucky and whose family lived on a nearby Florissant farm to the Jesuit Seminary. He became the first Jesuit brother at that seminary and was a teacher at St Louis College when it was formed. He joined the order on April 14, 1827, was a good carpenter and shoe cobbler before he became a teacher. He died in 1833.

The second Jesuit brother was George Miles, a native of Bardstown, Kentucky, and a son of Josiah Miles and Teresa Carrico who lived on a farm adjoining and to the north of the (Bishops Farm) or St. Stanislaus Seminary.

I have for months searched at the seminary and in Jesuit records for the burial spot of Brother James and only today, April 26, 1986 found in a book by Fr. Faherty noting the following information: Father Verhaegen had invited Bishop Rosati to Florissant to dedicate a new cemetery at the "Old Mound." Fr. Verhaegen had laid out the plat and transferred the bodies of Father van Lommel and Brother Yates from the St. Ferdinand village cemetery in August 1839. The new cemetery was dedicated April 7, 1840.

The first new burial was Father Bartholomew Krgnen. I have visited this cemetery and found the gravesite of Father van Lommel and beside it a granite marker that is eroded to such an extent that it is illegible.

The Catholic priests stationed at St. Ferdinand's parish in Florissant during the early 1800 period ministered to the entire area: outstate Missouri and on up the Missouri and Mississippi rivers.

In 1819 Father de la Croix made his first visit to Cote-sans-Dessein and Franklin, opposite the Osage river, where there was a large settlement of Osage indians.

On June 21, 1819, the first steamboats, Independence & Western Engineer sailed up the Missouri river for Franklin, Callaway counties and beyond. Callaway county was not formed until 1820, carved out of part of Montgomery county, which came into existence in 1818.



Unverified reports are that Stephen Yates owned land on "Hancocks Prairie". Hancocks Prairie, according to an old Jesuit map of that period, was in what is now part of Montgomery and part of Callaway counties. Callaway county has no record of his owning land and Montgomery county records of that period 1820-1830 were destroyed in a fire. I have checked there and no records exist. It is my belief that Stephen and William Yates, and their families, came to Florissant and then on to Callaway county, in about 1820, as one son Raphael had purchased land there in 1831 and later sold it in 1834 after he had moved to Monroe county Missouri.

Also, one son Vincent sold land there in 1831. I do not know who James Yates the Jesuit was; I believe he was the son of Stephen, though he could have been the son of William. Stephen Yates was in the census of Monroe county in 1840, living with son Vincent.

The 1830 census in Ralls county, Missouri shows a John Yates, a Samuel Smith and John B. Smith in the vicinity of St. Pauls (Leakes settlement). Ralls county marriage records show Samuel Smith married Patsy Yates on Sept. 11, 1828, and that John B. Smith married Sally Yates, June 4, 18\_\_.. I have not found as yet who were the parents of these three Yates.

Stephen Yates and Prescilla Austin Yates, my g.g.grandparents, had the following children: John or James, Susan, born 1795 in Maryland, married Edward Hardesty Feb. 7, 1837 St. Stephens, Monroe county, Missouri. Vincent born -- married Nancy Ann Eastus Sept. 9, 1827 Callaway county, Missouri; died 1847. This may seem controversial that they were married in Callaway county when I have records that they were married at St. Ferdinand's church but that parish at that time embraced all of outstate Missouri. Raphael born 1798 married Lenny -----; died 1845/1858? Elizabeth Yates born Sept. 6, 1804 Washington county, Kentucky, married Richard Miles Oct. 18, 1825, Florissant, St. Louis county, Missouri (St Ferdinand parish records) Thomas Yates (my g. grandfather, born Jan. 23, 1811, Washington county, Kentucky, married Elizabeth Pierceall, Dec. 14, 1835 at St Stephens, Monroe county, Missouri. This was first marriage in this parish. They are both buried in St Stephens cemetery. They were parents of Rozella (Rose) b. 1836, who married William David Spalding. Lucretia (Lucy) b. 1839, and married Martin Flannagan. Eliza Ann, b. 1841, married 1) Charles Green Spalding, 2) William Morrison. Mary Elizabeth, b. 1843, married Henry Green. Thomas James, b. 1845, married Margaret Bick. William Rosemond (Butler), b. 1847, married Josephine McLeod. John Austin, b. 1851, married Alice Maude Combs. David Alfred, b. 1857, married Mary Ann Elzea. Sarah Ellen, b. 1854 married Fielder Hagan.

My grandfather was John Austin Yates. He was born Jan. 23, 1851 at Indian Creek, St. Stephens, Monroe county, Missouri, and married Alice Maude Combs, who was born Sept.

14, 1856 at Old Clinton, in Monroe county, Missouri. They were married at St. Stephens church April 15, 1879. He died Nov. 22, 1940 and she died Jan. 9, 1924. They are buried at St. Stephens cemetery.

To them were born: George Loren Yates Oct. 17, 1880, who married Olive Buckman. John Clarence Yates born Mar. 27, 1883. Ann Lucinda Yates, b. Mar. 31, 1886, married James A. Montgomery. Thomas Claude Yates, b. Apr. 2, 1889, married Mabel Lewis. James Roy Yates, b. Feb 2, 1892, married Rose Lanham. Mary Cecelia Yates, born Apr. 21, 1895, married Richard Asbury. Frances Agnes Yates b. Mar. 28, 1898 married Dailey Crandall. John William Yates, b. 1901 d. 1902.

I have more information on children of the above, and other miscellany, that someone who wishes information on a certain period might find informative. If any one of my readers has additional information or verification of some of my guesses, please get in touch with me.
