...was. Our dad was very social. There was not a card game daddy didn't like, and at dinner he would not help out with, especially if he could do the cooking. Most of these occasions were fundraisers for various charities in the community. Dad was also an avid hunter and a sportsman. He enjoyed attending "suppers" in the "holler" with his friends.

Our dad was stern; he disciplined his children with heart and hand. There was a kid in Bradfordsville who wasn't afraid of him. His grocery store was in the community. We girls delivered groceries to most every residence in town. Our dad would keep a tab for them, and they would pay when they came, usually when they sold their tobacco crop. Daddy expected honesty from all who did business with him, and most of the people made good on their debts.

Daddy had many businesses. In fact, he started out with his skunk enterprise when he went into the hauling business with his Pappy. From there he started a bar and forged his Mamma's name on the note. After he sold the bar (on his Mamma's orders) he started a creamery, picking up cream from the surrounding counties. One of those counties (Russell) he visited with his future wife, Maxine Cunningham. He then joined the Navy during World War II and served in the Caribbean at Treasure Island, California. After the war he came back to his beloved Marion County and Bradfordsville, where he and his wife started family life. He had always wanted to be a farmer before the war, so he even went to farming school at the Wesley Wilson Agriculture College in Columbia, KY. He soon found out he was allergic to most everything to do with farming. In 1952, he bought a residence, a gas station/grocery store from Mr. West on Main Street and started in the grocery business. Our family lived in the attached rooms behind the restaurant. What a time we had! Mom, Sharon, Jacquie, and Patti, and Sandy didn't come along until

later.) Soon our family was too big to live behind the store, so Daddy built a store and called it Mullins' ShopWorth. Daddy never lost sight of being a farmer. He bought and sold farms, cattle, horses, goats, and most anything that could be bought and sold. He truly is a horse trader. Always was, always will be.

Daddy married Maxine Cunningham 1 Nov. 1944. She was working for her father in his general store when they met. They got married at the Justice of the Peace. Mom worked with Daddy at the restaurant and then at the General Store. Mom knew all the residents of Bradfordsville; some were her favorite rascals, i.e. T. C. Rakes, Ray Bright, Waldo Pendergrast, Lee Murphy, and Bugger Tungate. T. C. would always look out for Mom. It was the neatest thing; if a stranger came in the store, T. C. was right there protecting Mom. Mom, Edna Rakes, and Mattie Followell kept the store going when Daddy was away horse trading. She was the spirit of the store in the heart of Bradfordsville. Mom loved to travel. Dad was afraid to fly but that did not stop Mom. She visited her daughters in California, Hawaii, and Germany. She loved to go

to State Fairs and World Fairs. She went to the Knoxville World Fair and the Olympics in Los Angeles. After their retirement, Mom and Daddy wintered in Florida. They would live there for six months, and there was no negotiation on the length of time Mom stayed: six months to the day. She didn't like the cold, wet winters in KY. Daddy liked Florida, too. There was fishing, and poker playing, and much socializing. No one knew his nickname. He was James, and he liked that name.

Daddy and Momma were married for 62 years. She passed away 17 May 2007.

Our father is a community-involved person. He served as Bradfordsville Fire Chief, a Peoples' Bank director, a distinguished life member of the Kentucky Beef Association, and a Kentucky Colonel.

Daddy celebrated his 90th birthday with an all-community party. At that time Mayor David Edelen and John G. Mattingly, Marion County Judge Executive, proclaimed his birthday to be James T. Mullins day by Proclamation and Resolution. Magistrate Jackie Wicker read the decree and presented it on July 10, 2010, to recognize a life

and Berusha Peyton, 10 Aug. 1959. Mary Ruth was born 31 May 1928 and died 7 Mar. 2010.

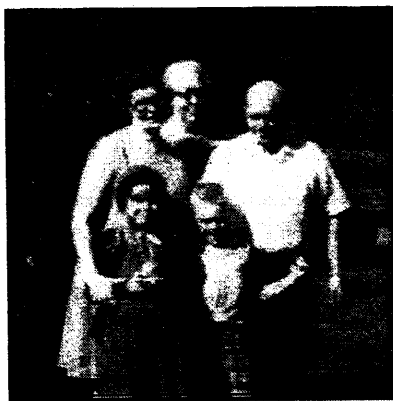

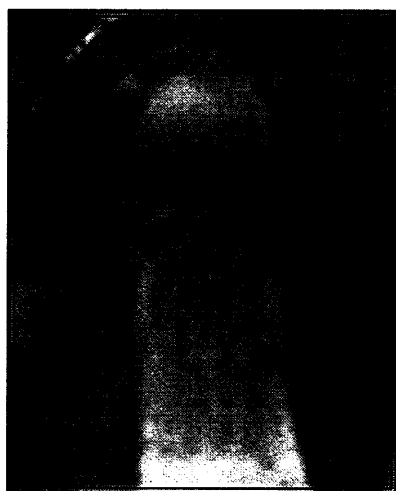

This made him four years older than he actually was, old enough to enlist in the army in 1861. Mark died 5 May 1934 from pneumonia. Mark married Sarah "Sallie" Irene J. Paul 15 May 1866. Sallie was born in 1850 and died 23 Feb. 1925.

Also at this time was a relative, James H. Mullins. All four of these were assigned to Company H. 1st Cavalry, and they all furnished their horses and equipment.

James Hardin served in the army until Dec. 1864, at which time he was given an honorable discharge at Camp Boone, KY.

On the way to the Battle of Perryville in 1862, while James Hardin was riding the cavalry saddle from Bowling Green, KY, he got a saddle bruise on his thigh. This resulted in an abscess which caused the muscles of the thigh to atrophy. Because of this trouble, James received a government pension of \$10 dollars per month. He was a private in the army at the time of his discharge.

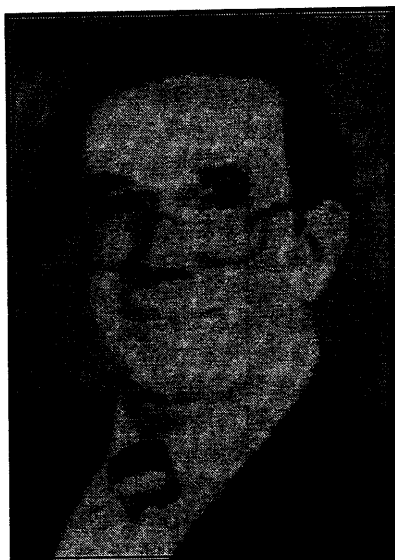

William Wesley Mullins

William Wesley Mullins, the son of James Hardin Mullins and Johanna Purdom, was born in 1840 and died 8 Aug. 1864 in the Civil War.

Wesley Mullins, who enlisted in the army with his father James Hardin, became a Corporal. He was captured on 14 Nov. 1863 at Maryville, TN. He was confined at Richmond, VA. In Dec. 1863 and later was sent to Andersonville, GA.

At the Andersonville prison, for the year 1863 to 1864 there were 52,345 Union soldiers imprisoned in a 27-acre uncovered enclosure. Overcrowding, lack of food, and poor health facilities led to the death of 26% of these men. At the end of the war, the Superintendent of the Confederate camp was hung for maltreatment of the prisoners.

Wesley was admitted to the hospital at Andersonville on 14 Feb. 1864. About two months later, on 27 Apr. 1864 he was sent to the pest house, where he died 8 Aug. 1864 of variola (smallpox). A pest house was for those infected with contagious diseases.

James Tilford Mullins was an initial citizen of Bradfordsville, KY. He was born to Henry Herman ("HH") and Marie (Sullivan) Mullins 7 July 1902. He came into this world a sickly baby, soon became the talk of his family for all his antics. He was such a person his mother used to double-sock his legs so he wouldn't appear so sick. James was an entrepreneur at a young age. He got his nickname, Skunk, remarkably. He was removing the odor from a skunk when it woke up suddenly at old Dr. Morgan's veterinary clinic, and the skunk sprayed him. Our Granny was so upset at the stench, she made him sleep in the building. He slept out there for two weeks until he ceased to sneeze. By this time, all of Bradfordsville heard the tale, and hence the nickname Skunk, which he has carried with him this day. The thing about having a name is the person with the name hardly ever likes it. We girls were a licking if we called him Skunk.

Zelinda Field; Wharton Ransdell, 1783-1/18/1850, in Callaway County, Missouri, married Elizabeth "Polly" Browning, 11/14/1803; Henry Henley born in 1784, married Jane Russell; Charles Chilton, 12/1/1789-8/3/1860, is buried in the Moore Graveyard, Fayette County, Kentucky, was a captain in the War of 1812, and lived at "Forest Retreat" Fayette County, Kentucky; Elizabeth (Betsey), 3/7/1791-7/18/1840, married Henry Brite on 12/22/1809, and is thought to be buried in Red River County, Texas; Nancy, married Judge Benjamin Young on 11/5/1811; and James M.

William Moore served the entire length of the Revolutionary War, start-

ing as Sergeant, rising to 1st Lieutenant. He served in many major battles, including Middlebrook, Pumpton Plains, Camp White Plains, Paramus, New Jersey, Valley Forge Newark and Germantown. After serving several years in battle, he was granted 4,000 acres in Kentucky. He re-enlisted and served three more years as 1st Lieutenant. He was then given a Military Warrant for 2,666 more acres in Kentucky.

William and Hannah Moore are buried on the brow of a beautiful hill overlooking the old stone house which was home for them and their children. Hannah died in 1810. William Moore

died in 1818.

On August 24, 1812, after the death of his wife, Hannah Ransdell Moore, William Moore married Margaret Browning, his second wife. They had one child, Susan Moore, who later married Silas Wilson. William and Margaret Moore continued to live on the old Moore place until his death on 5/10/1818. Burial was beside Hannah Ransdell Moore, his first wife, and the burial site continues until today. The will of William Moore was duly probated and part of the homeplace was left to his second wife, Margaret.

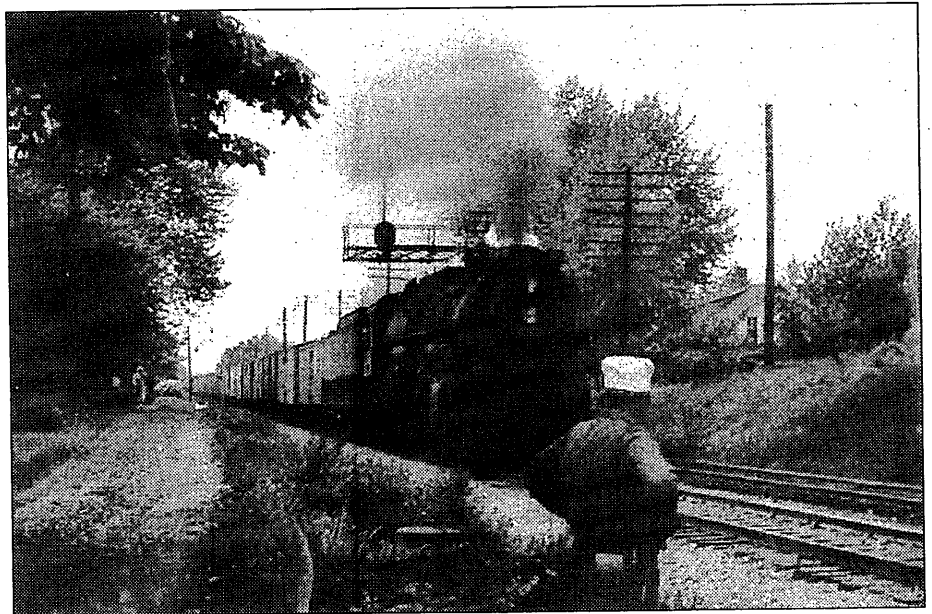
The first Mullins to settle in Virginia was a Huguenot named Moulin, or Moulines (given name not remembered), who came hither from France about 1685 with the Huguenot colony that settled that year at Manakin-Town, Virginia. Other information concerning him may be found in Vol. 3 of the Virginia Historical Society's publication: *The Huguenot Emigration to Virginia*. His great-grandson, Matthew Mullins, served in the French and Indian War in 1758, in the Albemarle militia, and also served in Col. James Wood's Virginia regiment in the Revolution. He married Mary Maupin, also of Huguenot descent, and they had nine children: (1) William, killed in the Revolution and left a son, William, who went early to Madison County, Kentucky, where he married Nancy Woods; went to Missouri in 1812. (2) John, died unmarried. (3) Gabriel, married in Virginia, Rachel Ballard, niece of Bland Ballard, settled in Madison County, Kentucky, about 1790, and shortly afterward settled in Pendleton County, Kentucky. (4) Matthew, who served in the Revolutionary War, married Sarah Clark, in Virginia, and settled in Madison County, Kentucky, in 1791, where he died in 1836. (5) Richard, married Mary Clark, in Virginia, settled in Madison County, Kentucky. (6) Margaret, married Jeremiah Yancey, of Albemarle County, Virginia; one of their sons, Joel Yancey, married a Miss Rodes, in Virginia, and settled in Barren County, Kentucky, where he was several times elected to the United States Congress. (7) Jane married Benjamin Clark of Albemarle County, Virginia, and settled in Madison County, Kentucky. (8) Mary married Lewis Gillispie of Madison County, Kentucky. (9) Elizabeth, married William Chenault, of Huguenot descent, in Albemarle County, Virginia,

in 1770. William Chenault served in the Revolutionary War, 1776-78, in Col. Josiah Parker's Fifth Virginia regiment, and in 1786 settled in Madison County, Kentucky, and was the founder of the well-known Chenault family of Central Kentucky. He had ten children: David, William, Mary Jane, Garland, Waller, John, Elizabeth, Sarah, Anderson, and Nancy.

Richardson

Samuel Price died May 30, 1824, aged 84 years. He married Elizabeth Richardson, born May 29, 1747 (daughter of William Richardson, of Maryland, and Isabella Calmes, daughter of Marquis Calmes, the immigrant, and

Winifred Waller). William Richardson, son of Joseph Richardson, born April 3, 1678, died August 6, 1746; married, October 25, 1705, Sarah Thomas, who was born March 13, 1689, died November 27, 1724 (daughter of Samuel Thomas and Mary Hutchins). Joseph Richardson, son of William Richardson, immigrant, died May 1698. A case in which a Federal official was charged in connection with the highway death last year of a Marion County woman, officially ended November 19, in Louisville when a Federal judge dismissed a manslaughter indictment against the official.

Reports from Federal officials who investigated the case indicated Commonwealth's Attorney Lester Spaulding of Lebanon told them he was "too busy" with an upcoming election and did not want the indictment in the first place.

A civil suit against the United States of America has now been filed by the estate of the dead woman and is now pending in Federal Court.

By order of the United States District Court, Louisville, the involuntary manslaughter indictment returned by the 1969 September Term of the Marion County grand jury was dismissed against Arthur Joe Hardy.

The Order of dismissal terminated over 13 months of legal maneuvering to rid Hardy of the criminal charges against him as a result of the death of Edna Lorene Mullins, 31, of Bradfordsville on September 4, 1969. Miss Mullins was driving her automobile north towards Lebanon on Kentucky Highway 49 at 10:15 p.m. on September 3, 1969, when a vehicle driven south by Hardy collided head on with her in the north bound lane four miles south of Lebanon. Miss Mullins, who was driving to work, was an employee of Cedar of Lebanon Rest Home. She was dead on arrival just after midnight on September 4, 1969. At the University of Kentucky Medical Center, Lexington, she was pronounced dead and her death was certified by Dr. J. H. Smith, Jr., of the University of Kentucky Medical Center, Lexington.

On direct examination by Henry Boldrick, County Attorney, Richardson, a state trooper for 18 years, was unable to describe Hardy's appearance. Assistant U. S. District Attorney Jackie Smith, son of County Judge Henry Smith and representing Hardy, finally requested Judge Smith to dismiss the three warrants which were obtained.
