Good Morning,

Daniel Crossgrove (my maternal line) is shown on the 1800 Tax list at Salt Lick Fork, Washington County (now Marion County), KY. The listings on either side of Daniel give a location of Rolling Fork River. He is shown as owning >100 acres of land, at that time.

Because of the Salt Lick Fork reference, I presume him to be located somewhere around Raywick. Is this valid, in your estimation?

I have not been able to locate any reference to Daniel's first wife. I know they had one son Charles who later removed to Natchez or Port Gibson Miss. and then to Concordia Parish, LA. Charles was my g.g.grandfather. I believe they may have had a daughter, Elizabeth, who later, 1833, married in Natchez. It is however possible that this marriage was to the Mary Elizabeth, shown below, who married James Carrico at St. Rose R.C. church in 1824, at Lebanon, KY.

Charles was born, according to his tombstone in the Natchez cemetery, on May 23, 1798. A family rumor has Charles being born at "Harrodsburg", KY. I doubt he was born at that fort, but used the designation of Harrodsburg, as that part of State within which he was born.

Daniel married his second (?) wife, Nancy Bailey, on April, 1801. Using the Census of 1810, for age and sex, and James' contested will in 1850 (Charles is executor by court order) for the names of his siblings, we reconstruct the family of Daniel and Nancy, as follows:

Helen	1806	Married Wm. Pickerell 1850 Census shows her and son George w/Leaks.

Margaret	1812	"Femme Sole": Charles.
Mary Elizabeth	1813	Marries James Carrico at St. Rose Church, 1824.
Thomas	1814	Dies in CA 1848-51 during trial for James estate.

Daniel died in Washington Co. (now Marion County) in July 1814. Will proved 11 July, 1814. He wills a cow and a horse to Charles. Charles did at least two six months hitches with the KY militia during the War of 1812. Some documentation exist that he did a third hitch at the Battle of New Orleans.

I need your advice to do further research into these pioneers. Where should I go and what documents should I request to answer the following questions?

- 1). From where did Daniel Migrate?
- 2). From whom did he acquire the land? Over 100 acres.
- 3). What was the name of his first wife?
- 4). Where did she die? Why? Indians? Childbirth? Cholera?
- 5). Daniel, Jr. is shown on the Tax list of 1840. in Marion County, page 327. There are two females aged 20-30 censused with him. Where in Marion County did Daniel live? The old homestead?


If you charge a fee for research, please let me know so we can reach an agreement for your time.
