#### Election Day Fight

There was a fight in Court Square near the Standard office Monday night between George Wilson MURPHY on one side and an unknown number of men, estimated at half a dozen on the other. MURPHY achieved prodigies of scientific pugilism, knocking down five or six of his assailants. He had four of them down at one time, and came off an easy winner. Several of the assailants were arrested and two, WRIGHT and SMOTHERS, were sent to jail.

#### Deplorable Accident

A private dispatch received here last night brought the painful intelligence that the wife of James M. BALLARD, Esq., Sheriff of this county, was dreadfully burned yesterday afternoon. Mr. Ballard's house near Loretto took fire, but the fire was quickly extinguished. While Mrs. BALLARD was engaged in removing some articles from a press, a powder horn exploded and set fire to her clothing. Her injuries were of such a character that they were expected to prove fatal. Mr. BALLARD was in Lebanon yesterday and had started home about a quarter of an hour before the telegram arrived.

## DIES SUDDENLY IN BUGGY.

While coming to town Saturday, Lee Tharp died suddenly in his buggy on the Danville pike, just this side of Grimes' hill. The deceased had complained the day before of a dizzy spell which disturbed him some, but on the day of his death he had felt unusually well and was in the best of spirits. At the time the fatal summons came he was driving along in company with his brother-in-law, Mr. Murphy, when suddenly his head fell forward on his chest and the lines dropped from his hands. His brother-in-law noticing this asked him what was the matter and receiving no answer he soon discovered that Mr. Tharp was in a dying condition. Hurrying on to town he drove to Dr. Thornton's office where it was found that life was extinct. His remains were taken to the office of Bosley & Hughes, the undertakers, and prepared for burial. Funeral services were conducted at his residence on Pope's Creek Monday by Rev. T. F. Walton, of Bradfordsville, after which the interment took place at Bethel Union. The deceased was 24 years old and is survived by his wife and two children, who have the sympathy of many friends in their bereavement.

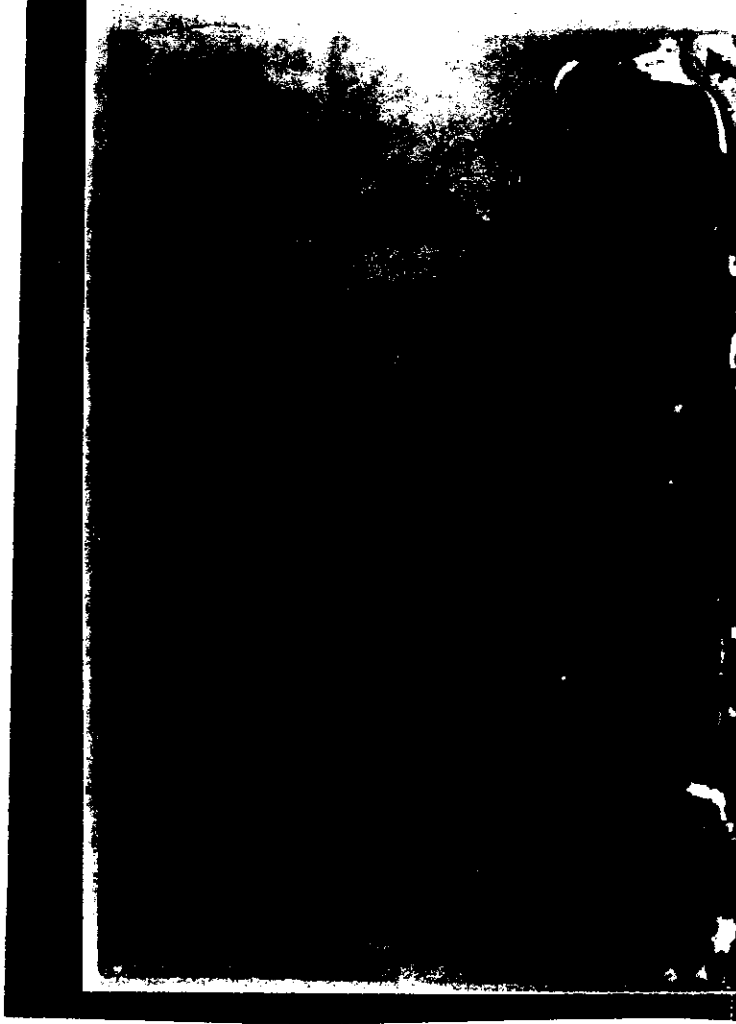

### Foolish Order.

In pursuance of a foolish order from the Louisville Board of Health, the baggage of all persons going from this section to Louisville has to be examined before it is put on the cars, and a certificate given that it contains only wearing apparel. The order causes much inconvenience to travelers, as well as station agents, and is the subject of general unfavorable comment.

### Election Day Fight.

There was a fight in Court Square near The Standard office Monday night between George Wilson Murphy on one side and an unknown number of men, estimated at half a dozen on the other. Murphy achieved prodigies of scientific pugilism, knocking down five or six of his assailants. He had four of them down at one time, and came off an easy winner.

Several of the assailants were arrested and two, Wright and Smith, were sent to jail.

### Deploable Accident.

A private dispatch received here last night brought the painful intelligence that the wife of James M. Ballard, Esq., Sheriff of this county, was dreadfully burned yesterday afternoon. Mr. Ballard's house near Loretto took fire, but the fire was extinguished. While Mrs. Ballard was engaged in removing some articles from a press, a powder horn exploded and set fire to her clothing. Her injuries were of such a character that they were expected to prove fatal. Mr. Ballard was in Lebanon yesterday and had started home about a quarter of an hour before the telegram arrived.
